The operation of the provisions of Part II (Regulation of Exposure and Movement of Sheep in Compulsory Dipping Areas) of the Sheep-Scab (Compulsory Dipping Areas) Order of 1905 shall be suspended in their application to the Compulsory Dipping Area described in the schedule to this Order from and after the fourth day of December, nineteen hundred and five, until the fifteenth day of April, nineteen hundred and six.
