after giving to the Incumbent and the church-wardens of the parish of Amersham, ten days' previous notice of their intention to make such representation, have made a representation stating that they are of opinion that so much of the Order of Her late Majesty in Council of the twenty-first day of July, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-five, as varied by the Order in Council of the thirteenth day of August, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-five, as relates to burials in the Parish Church and churchyard of Amersham, in the county of Buckingham, should be further varied, so as to provide:—

- (a) That burials should be discontinued forthwith and entirely in the catacombs in the North Transept of the said church; and
- (b) That notwithstanding anything in the said Orders in Council, it should be lawful to re-inter in the portion of the said church-yard which has never previously been used for burials, and which is situate on the north side of the said church, at or below the depth of five feet below the surface of the ground, certain human remains which have been or are about to be removed from the catacombs in the North Transept of the said church.

Now, therefore, His Majesty in Council is pleased hereby to give notice of such representation, and to order that the same be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Lords of His Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, on the twenty-seventh day of November next.

And His Majesty is further pleased to direct that this Order be forthwith published in the London Gazette, and that copies thereof be affixed on the doors of the churches or chapels of, or on some conspicuous places within, the parish affected by such representation one month before the said twenty-seventh day of November.

And whereas the said Statute has this day been laid before His Majesty in Council, the same is published in the London Gazette in pursuance of the said Act.

And notice is hereby given, that it is lawful for the bodies or persons authorized so to do in that Act, within two months from the date of the publication of this notification, to petition His Majesty in Council to withold His approval from the whole or any part of such Statute.

That the following alterations be made to the Statutes, namely:—

Statute XV. For the words "Subordinate November next.

School hereinafter mentioned substitute the words "Lower School of Lawrence Sheriff, Rugby."

Statute XVII. For the words "Subordinate School" substitute the words "Lower School."

Statute XLIII. In place of the present Statute, which is hereby repealed, substitute the following:—The words "Trust Income" shall be taken to mean that portion of the Income of the Rugby Charity founded by Lawrence Sheriff, Grocer, of London, which by the Scheme made by the Governing Body on the 25th day of July, 1873, was appropriated to the purposes of the School, after payment thereout to the Governors of the Lower School of Lawrence Sheriff, Rugby, of the annual payments and proportion of income provided for by the Rugby Lower School (Transfer) Act, 1906.

Statute XLII. This Statute, which is replaced by the new Act, to be repealed.

Statutes V, XXVI and XXVII. To be repealed as obsolete.

The Statutes to be renumbered where necessary.
