## WILD BIRD (ENGLAND).

The Wild Birds Protection (North Riding of Yorkshire) Order, 1907.

Dated 10th June, 1907.

In pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Wild Birds Protection Acts, 1880 to 1904, and upon application by the County Council of the administrative County of the North Riding of Yorkshire, I hereby make the following Order:—

*Title.*

I. This Order may be cited as the Wild Birds Protection (North Riding of Yorkshire) Order, 1907.

*Close Time Extended.*

II. The time during which the killing or taking of Wild Birds is prohibited within the Administrative County of the North Riding of Yorkshire shall be extended so as to be between the last day of February in any year and the 1st day of September following, except with respect to the following birds:—

Mallard or Wild Duck, Golden Plover, Snipe, Teal, Widgeon, and Woodcock.

The time during which the killing or taking of the Birds so excepted is prohibited shall be extended so as to be between the last day of February in any year and the 12th day of August following.

*All Birds Protected during the whole of the Year within certain Areas.*

III. During the period between the 11th day of August in any year and the 1st day of March following the killing or taking of all Wild Birds is prohibited on the sands and sea shore to the limit of low-water mark

(a) Within, and adjacent to, the Borough of Scarborough, from a point known as White Nab on the South to Scalby Beck on the North:

(b) Within the limits of the Port of Whitby, which extends one mile and a half westward, and one mile eastward, from the existing Lighthouse on the northern extremity of the West Pier of the Harbour.

*Repeal of former Order.*

IV. The Order of the 25th July, 1906, is hereby repealed.

#### MOTOR CAR ACT, 1903.

Borough of Bromley.

WHEREAS by sub-section (1) of section 9 of the Motor Car Act, 1903, it is enacted that within any limits or place referred to in regulations made by the Local Government Board, with a view to the safety of the public, on the application of the local authority of the area in which the limits or place are situate, a person shall not drive a motor car at a speed exceeding ten miles per hour:

A PROCLAMATION.

Isle of Man to wit.

Whereas by a Proclamation dated the 29th day of January, 1907, made by the Lieutenant-Governor, with the advice and consent of two members of the Council, under the powers conferred by "The Cattle Diseases Prevention Acts," certain Orders were made for regulating the importation of sheep into this Island:

And whereas it is desirable to modify the Order numbered one in such Proclamation, so far as the same relates to the importation into this Island of sheep intended for slaughter:

Now I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, by and with the advice and consent of two members of the Council, do hereby order as follows:—

1. Any person desiring to import into this Island from the United Kingdom sheep intended for slaughter, shall, before importing the same, give at least twelve hours' notice to the Chief Constable of this Isle, and to John Q. Cannell, C.P., of Ballacarnane, Michael, Isle of Man, the duly appointed inspector of scab, of the port at which it is intended to land the sheep, and of the boat by which it is proposed to import them.

2. A Certificate from either the Veterinary Inspector of the Cattle Market at which the sheep have been purchased, or the Government Veterinary Inspector at the port of embarkation, that such sheep are free from scab, shall accompany each consignment of sheep imported for slaughter, which Certificate shall be produced on landing to either the Inspector of scab or to any Officer of Police. No sheep shall be allowed to be landed unless such Certificate be first produced.

3. All sheep imported for slaughter shall, on being landed, be at once removed to ground in the occupation of the person importing them, contiguous to some slaughter-house.

4. All sheep imported for slaughter shall be slaughtered within ten days from the date of landing.

5. The Order numbered one in the Proclamation of 29th January, 1907, relating to applications for permission to import sheep, is modified to the extent in this Proclamation set forth.

1. Notwithstanding the provisions of the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1903, or of any Order by which such provisions are applied to any scheduled area, swine may be moved to the exhibition mentioned in the Schedule hereto, and from such exhibition to any place of destination in Great Britain situate in any scheduled area, if accompanied by a Licence authorising such movement.

2. In the case of movement to the said exhibition the Licence shall be one granted by some person authorised in that behalf by the Edinburgh City Council, and in the case of movement from the said exhibition the Licence shall be one granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the place of destination is situate.

3. The swine shall be moved by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay to the exhibition or place of destination specified in the Licence and not elsewhere, and while being so moved shall not be subject to Regulations made by a Local Authority under any Order of the Board relating to Swine-Fever.

## BOROUGH OF GLOSSOP.

BYE-LAWS AND REGULATIONS made by the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough of Glossop, in the County of Derby, acting by the Council, as the Local Authority, with respect to tramways within the said Borough, under Section 46 of the Tramways Act, 1870.

1. For the purpose of these Bye-laws and Regulations the term "car" shall mean any carriage using any tramway laid down within the said borough, and the terms "driver" and "conductor" shall respectively mean the driver and conductor or other person having charge of a car.

2. The driver of every car shall so drive the same that it shall not follow the preceding car at a less distance than 50 yards.

3. Subject to the requirements of Bye-laws Nos. 2 and 4, the driver or conductor of a car shall stop the same for the purpose of setting down or taking up passengers at such points as shall be approved from time to time by the Council, such points to be indicated by notices affixed to the tramway or lamp posts.

4. Except at a passing place or terminus, no car shall be stopped at the intersection or junction of two or more streets or roads, or within fifteen yards of a car on an adjoining line of rails.

5. The driver of a car on coming in sight of a vehicle standing or travelling on any part of the road so as not to leave sufficient space for the car to pass, shall sound his bell or whistle as a warning to the person in charge of such vehicle, and that person shall, with reasonable dispatch, cause such vehicle to be removed so as not to obstruct the car.

6. No person shall in any way impede or interfere with the traffic on the tramways, nor shall any driver or conductor needlessly cause interruption to the ordinary road traffic.

7. Every driver, conductor, or other person offending against any of these Bye-laws or Regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding forty shillings for each offence, and not exceeding for any continuing offence ten shillings for every day during which the offence continues.

8. The conductor of every car shall carry with him a copy of these Bye-laws, and shall, on request of any passenger, produce the same to, and shall permit the same to be perused by such passenger, and the owners or lessees of the tramways shall affix and keep affixed in each of their offices and waiting rooms within the borough a printed copy of the same for the use of the public.

9. These Bye-laws shall come into force on the first day of September, 1907.
