A PROCLAMATION.

EDWARD R. & I.

Whereas Our Parliament stands prorogued to Thursday, the twenty-sixth day of December, one thousand nine hundred and seven; We, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, hereby issue Our Royal Proclamation, and publish and declare that the said Parliament be further prorogued to Wednesday, the twenty-ninth day of January, one thousand nine hundred and eight; and We do hereby further, with the advice aforesaid, declare Our Royal Will and pleasure that the said Parliament shall, on the said Wednesday, the twenty-ninth day of January, one thousand nine hundred and eight, assemble and be holden for the despatch of divers urgent and important affairs; and the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and the Knights, Citizens and Burgesses, and the Commissioners for shires and burghs, of the House of Commons, are hereby required and commanded to give their attendance accordingly at Westminster on the said Wednesday, the twenty-ninth day of January, one thousand nine hundred and eight.

Given at Our Court at *Buckingham Palace*, this twenty-first day of *December*, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and seven, and in the seventh year of Our Reign.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have in pursuance of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter thirty-seven, sections six and eight, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a scheme bearing date the seventh day of November, in the year one thousand nine hundred and seven, in the words following, that is to say:—

“We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her said late Majesty, chapter thirty-seven, sections six and eight, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme for authorising the sale and disposal of certain property formerly belonging to the Dean and Chapter of the cathedral church of Gloucester, and now vested in us.

“Whereas under ‘The Ecclesiastical Commission Act, 1868,’ and by virtue of an Order of Her said late Majesty in Council, made under the provisions of the same Act, bearing date the eighteenth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four, and duly published in the *London Gazette* on the thirty-first day of the same month, certain lands and hereditaments which are more particularly described in the aforesaid Order, being the property of the said Dean and Chapter of Gloucester, were transferred to and became absolutely vested in us for the purposes and subject to the provisions applicable to other hereditaments vested in us.

“And whereas the property aforesaid is not subject to any outstanding lease or grant but some portions thereof are on account of their character or situation unsuitable or inconvenient to be held or applied for the purposes for which estates vested in us are applicable under the Acts by which our proceedings are governed.

“And whereas with a view to the more advantageous appropriation of the said property or of the proceeds thereof for the ultimate improvement of our common fund it is expedient that the said property, or such part or parts thereof as we shall at any time and from time to time think fit, should be sold or disposed of, and accordingly that we should be empowered to sell or dispose of our interest therein, or in any part or parts thereof, in such manner as shall appear to us advisable.

“Now, therefore, we humbly recommend and propose that we may be authorized and empowered by Instrument or Instruments in writing, duly executed according to law, from time to time to sell or dispose of and duly to convey, according to the provisions of the said Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her said late Majesty's reign, all or any part of the said property heretofore belonging to the said Dean and Chapter of Gloucester, and so transferred to and vested in us as aforesaid with its appurtenances and all our estate, right, title and interest therein or in any part or parts thereof unto and to the use of any person or persons desirous or willing to purchase the same and his, her or their heirs, executors and administrators or assigns or otherwise as he, she or they shall direct or appoint, and for such consideration as shall upon due calculation and inquiry appear to us to be just and reasonable, it being our intention to invest the proceeds of such sales from time to time as occasion may arise in the purchase of other lands, tithe rent charges, tenements or

hereditaments or of some estate or interest therein convenient to be held by us for the purposes of the Acts by which our proceedings are governed as aforesaid, and in the meantime to invest the said proceeds in some Government or Parliamentary stock or other public securities in England.

“And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any other Act of Parliament.”

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council: Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the *London Gazette* pursuant to the said Act; and His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of Gloucester.

“We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the thirty-third and thirty-fourth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter thirty-nine, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say the Act of the third and fourth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and thirteen, the Act of the fourth and fifth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter thirty-nine, and the Act of the thirty-first and thirty-second years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and fourteen, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the church and cure (hereinafter called ‘the said benefice’) of Legsby, in the county of Lincoln, and in the diocese of Lincoln.

“Whereas the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Legsby, is vested for an estate in fee simple in Robert Nassau Sutton Nelthorpe, of Scawby Hall, near Brigg, in the county of Lincoln, Esquire, subject to a mortgage and further

charge upon the said advowson and other hereditaments in favour of Alexander Samuel Leslie Melville, of Branston Hall, in the county of Lincoln, Esquire, and Richard John Ward, of the city of Lincoln, Esquire, but otherwise free from incumbrances.

"And whereas the said Robert Nassau Sutton Nelthorpe is desirous that the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Legsby now vested as aforesaid should be transferred to and be vested in the Bishop for the time being of the said diocese of Lincoln and the said Alexander Samuel Leslie Melville and Richard John Ward have agreed to concur in these presents for the purpose of enabling the said advowson to be transferred as aforesaid freed and released from their said mortgage and further charge.

"And whereas the Right Reverend Edward, now Bishop of Lincoln, is willing to accept such transfer, and in token of such his willingness and also in token that the same transfer has that consent of the Bishop of the diocese which by the Acts in the hereinbefore mentioned Act recited or by some or one of them is made necessary he, the said Edward, Bishop of Lincoln, has executed this scheme as hereinafter mentioned.

"And whereas the transfer of the patronage of the said benefice of Legsby, which is hereinbefore mentioned and hereinafter recommended and proposed will in our opinion tend to make better provision for the cure of souls in the parish or district in or in respect of which the right of patronage or advowson so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid arises or exists, that is to say, in the parish of Legsby.

"Now therefore with the consent of the said Robert Nassau Sutton Nelthorpe, Alexander Samuel Leslie Melville and Richard John Ward (in testimony whereof they have respectively signed and sealed this scheme) and with the consent of the said Edward, Bishop of Lincoln (in testimony whereof he has signed this scheme and sealed the same with his episcopal seal), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Legsby, shall be transferred to the said Edward, Bishop of Lincoln, and his successors in the same bishoprick, and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Edward, Bishop of Lincoln, and by his successors in the same bishoprick for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council: now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and

His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Lincoln.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the third and fourth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter one hundred and thirteen, of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her said late Majesty, chapter thirty-seven, and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and four, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the twenty-first day of November, in the year one thousand nine hundred and seven, in the words following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the third and fourth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter one hundred and thirteen, of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her said late Majesty, chapter thirty-seven, and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and four, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme for constituting a separate district for spiritual purposes to be taken out of the new parish (sometime district) of Saint Luke, Pallion, within the original limits of the parish of Bishopwearmouth, in the county of Durham and in the diocese of Durham.

"Whereas we are satisfied that the said new parish of Saint Luke, Pallion, is a cure wherein or in parts whereof the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof, and it has been made to appear to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular part of the said new parish of Saint Luke^o Pallion, which is hereinafter mentioned and described should be constituted a separate district in the manner which is hereinafter set forth.

"And whereas there is not at present within the limits of the said proposed separate district any consecrated church or chapel in use for the purposes of Divine worship.

And whereas certain hereditaments and premises situate within the said parish of Bishopwearmouth have become vested in us under the provisions of and for the purposes of the herein mentioned Acts or of some or one of them, and we have in respect of such hereditaments and premises agreed to make and pay out of the common fund created by the firstly herein mentioned Act a grant of one hundred and fifty pounds per annum to the Minister of the said proposed separate district so soon as a Minister shall have been duly licensed in accordance with the provisions of the secondly herein mentioned Act and to his successors.

"And whereas the said grant of the said yearly sum of one hundred and fifty pounds will after the publication in the London Gazette of an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this

scheme be made and secured by an Instrument to be executed by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, under our common seal in accordance with the provisions of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and eleven.

"Now therefore with the consent of the Right Reverend Handley Carr Glyn, Bishop of Durham (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme) we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that all that part of the said new parish of Saint Luke, Pallion, which is described in the schedule hereunder written, all which part together with the boundaries thereof is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, shall upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme as aforesaid become and be constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes and that the same shall be named 'The District of Saint Mary Magdalene, Millfield.'

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or any of them or any other Act of Parliament.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"The District of Saint Mary Magdalene, Millfield, being:—

"All that part of the new parish (sometime district) of Saint Luke, Pallion, in the county of Durham, and in the diocese of Durham, which is bounded upon the south partly by an isolated portion of the parish of Bishopwearmouth, and partly by the new parish of Saint Mark, Millfield, upon the east by the new parish of Saint Andrew, Deptford, all in the said county and diocese, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the north, upon the north-west, and upon the west, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint Andrew, Deptford, from the said new parish of Saint Luke, Pallion, at the centre of the level-crossing where the line of the Lambton Railway intersects Lisburn-terrace, and extending thence westward along the middle of the said line of railway for a distance of twelve chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the middle of Railway-street, and extending thence first south-eastward to the middle of Railway-street (thereby crossing the Painshaw branch line of the North Eastern Railway) and then south-eastward along the middle of Railway-street for a distance of ten chains or thereabouts to its junction with East Moor-road, and extending thence south-westward along the middle of East Moor-road for a distance of eight chains and a half or thereabouts to its junction with the roadway running between the houses on the eastern side of Brady-street and the houses on the western side of Rutland-street, and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of the said roadway for a distance of seven chains or thereabouts to its junction with the roadway running along the backs of the houses on the northern side of Dene-street, and extending thence westward along the middle of the last mentioned roadway for a distance of eleven chains or thereabouts to its junction with the roadway running along the backs of the houses on the eastern side of Saint Luke's-terrace and of Peacock-street West, and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of the last

mentioned roadway for a distance of seventeen¹¹ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Hylton-road West, upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint Luke, Pallion, from the said isolated portion of the parish of Bishopwearmouth."

And whereas drafts of the said scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the secondly hereinbefore mentioned Act, been transmitted to the Patron and to the Incumbent of the cure out of which it is intended that the district recommended in such scheme to be constituted shall be taken, and such Patron and Incumbent have respectively signified their assent to such scheme.

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council: now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Durham.

WHEREAS it is expedient to amend in certain particulars the regulations prescribed by the Orders in Council dated the twenty-first day of March one thousand eight hundred and ninety, and the twenty-ninth day of May one thousand nine hundred and five, respecting the employment and remuneration of clerks of the Second Division of His Majesty's Civil Service; and to alter and amend in certain other particulars the regulations respecting the established Civil Service:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered as follows:—

I.—SECOND DIVISION.

1. The scale of salary of persons who shall receive certificates of qualification for the Second Division of the Civil Service on or after the first day of April one thousand nine hundred and eight (except as provided in Clause 8 of this Order) shall commence at seventy pounds per annum, and shall rise by annual increments as follows, viz:—

From seventy pounds to one hundred and thirty pounds, by annual increments of seven pounds ten shillings.

From one hundred and thirty pounds to two hundred pounds, by annual increments of ten pounds.

From two hundred pounds to three hundred pounds, by annual increments of ten pounds.

2. The increments of salary shall not be allowed without an annual certificate from the immediate superior of each clerk, countersigned by the Head of the Department, or such officer as he may designate for the purpose, to the effect that such clerk's conduct during the year immediately preceding the date of such report has been approved.

3. Except as provided in Clause 8 of this Order, when the salary of any clerk of the Second Division certificated on or after the first day of April one thousand nine hundred and eight shall reach the sum of one hundred and thirty pounds a report in writing on the competence, character, and diligence of such clerk shall be required from the immediate superior under whom the clerk is serving, and until this report has been countersigned as satisfactory by the Head of the Department, or such officer as he may designate for the purpose, the clerk shall not receive any further increment of salary.

4. No increment of salary beyond two hundred pounds per annum shall be allowed to a clerk of the Second Division certificated on or after the first day of April one thousand nine hundred and eight (except as provided in Clause 8 of this Order), without a report in writing from his

immediate superior, countersigned by the Head of the Department, or such officer as he may designate for the purpose, to the effect that such clerk is competent to perform efficiently the highest duties ordinarily assigned to clerks of the Second Division in the Department in which he is serving.

5. A clerk of the Second Division certificated before the first day of April one thousand nine hundred and eight may elect on or before that date either to continue on the scale of salary prescribed by the Orders in Council in force before the date of this Order, or to be placed on the scale of salary prescribed by this Order.

6. The following provisions shall apply to clerks who elect under the foregoing Clause 5 to be placed on the scale of salary prescribed by this Order, viz:—

(i) As from the first day of April one thousand nine hundred and eight they shall receive such salary as they would have attained at that date had the new scale been applicable to them from the dates at which they respectively commenced service in the Second Division, together with such proportion of annual increment, calculated on the new scale, as would have accrued on that date.

(ii) The next increment of salary shall accrue on the first day of April one thousand nine hundred and nine, and shall be determined in accordance with Clause 1 of this Order.

(iii) The provisions as to increments contained in Clauses 2, 3, and 4 of this Order shall be deemed to apply to them.

7. Save as provided in Clause 8 of this Order, Clauses 3, 4, 5 and 6 of the Order in Council of the twenty-first day of March one thousand eight hundred and ninety, and Clause 3 of the Order in Council of the twenty-ninth day of May one thousand nine hundred and five shall have no application to Second Division clerks first assigned for duty in a Department on or after the first day of April one thousand nine hundred and eight, and shall cease to have application to those clerks who elect under Clause 5 of this Order to be placed on the scale of salary prescribed by this Order.

8. Any person who, as a result of the examination held in September one thousand nine hundred and seven, shall be assigned to a Department as a clerk of the Second Division on or after the first day of April one thousand nine hundred and eight, may, within twelve months of his being so assigned, elect to be placed on the scale of salary prescribed by the Orders in Council in force before the date of this Order; and in that case shall be treated in like manner as if he had been certificated before the first day of April one thousand nine hundred and eight.

9. From and after the date of this Order any clerk who is, or who has been a Second Division clerk, may be appointed, without a further certificate of qualification to any clerkship in the Department in which he is serving, provided that:—

(a) Such clerkship is not one which is ordinarily filled by open Competition under the scheme known as "Class I," or under special regulations; and

(b) the maximum salary of such clerkship does not exceed five hundred pounds per annum.

10. Any clerk of the Second Division who has been or may hereafter be appointed to a Minor

Staff Clerkship the maximum salary of which does not exceed three hundred and fifty pounds per annum, shall be, in all respects other than that of salary, subject to the regulations governing the Second Division; and if the maximum of the Minor Staff Clerkship is less than three hundred and fifty pounds may, at such time after he has attained the said maximum as the Commissioners of the Treasury may decide, be placed upon the scale of the Second Division at the point represented by such maximum, and may proceed by the usual annual increments to a maximum of three hundred and fifty pounds if appointed to the Minor Staff Clerkship before the date of this Order, or of three hundred pounds if appointed to such clerkship after the date of this Order.

11. Clause 11 of the Order in Council of the twenty-ninth day of November one thousand eight hundred and ninety-eight shall be read, from and after the date of this Order, as if the words "The consent of the Civil Service Commissioners" were substituted for the words "The same consent and approval."

II.—GENERAL.

12. Clauses 17 and 18 of the Order in Council of the fifteenth day of August, one thousand eight hundred and ninety, are hereby repealed.

13. A clerk of the class known as "Assistant Clerks" or "Abstractors" may, with the consent of the Civil Service Commissioners, be transferred from one Department to a similar situation in another, without a further certificate of qualification.

14. From and after the date of this Order the provisions of Clause 11 of the Order in Council of the twenty-first day of March, one thousand eight hundred and ninety, and Clause 11 of the Order of the fifteenth day of August of the same year, shall be extended to apply to all persons in the established Civil Service of the State.

And whereas it has been made to appear to His Majesty that it is desirable in the interests of the Military Service of the Crown that the vehicles hereinafter named should be excepted from the provisions of the said Act in the manner and to the extent hereinafter appearing.

Now, therefore, His Majesty in exercise of the powers vested in Him by the said section 5, sub-section (4) of the Lights on Vehicles Act, 1907, is pleased to direct that the provisions of the said Lights on Vehicles Act, 1907, shall not apply to the vehicles employed in the

Military Service of the Crown named in the first part of the Schedule hereto, and shall not apply to any of the vehicles employed in the Military Service of the Crown named in the second part of the Schedule hereto if and whenever any of such vehicles named in the second part of the said Schedule are employed in connection with the field training or manœuvres of any portion of the Military Forces of the Crown, or if and whenever the military necessities of the public service in the discretion of the General Officer Commanding-in-Chief that portion of the Military Forces of the Crown with which any of such vehicles are employed or in the discretion of His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the War Department require that any of such vehicles named in the second part of the said Schedule shall not for the time being carry or display the light or lights required to be carried or displayed by vehicles in accordance with the provisions of the said Lights on Vehicles Act, 1907.

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue of the power vested in Him by the said Act, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to direct that the fees specified in the schedule hereto annexed shall be taken accordingly in substitution for the fees specified in the schedule to the Order in Council dated the twelfth day of January, one thousand nine hundred and five.

YORKSHIRE (SWINE-FEVER) ORDER OF
1907 (No. 3).

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1903, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

PART I.

Withdrawal of Regulations as to Movement of Swine from Markets and Saleyards in East Riding.

1. The provisions of the Yorkshire (Swine-Fever) Order of 1906 (No. 2) shall cease to apply in relation to any market or saleyard in the area described in the First Schedule hereto.

PART II.

Restriction on Movement of Swine from West Riding into East Riding.

2.—(1.) For the purpose of movement of swine from any premises in the area described in the First Schedule hereto into the area described in the Second Schedule hereto those areas shall be deemed separate Scheduled Areas within the meaning of the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1903, except that no further licence shall be necessary for the movement into the area described in the First Schedule of swine which are being moved with a licence under the Yorkshire (Swine-Fever) Order of 1906 (No. 2) from any market or saleyard to which that Order continues to apply.

(2.) For any other purpose those areas shall be one Scheduled Area within the meaning of the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1903.

Revocation of Orders.

3. The Orders described in the Third Schedule hereto are hereby revoked from and after the commencement of this Order.

Commencement.

4. This Order shall come into operation on the sixth day of January, nineteen hundred and eight.

Short Title.

5. This Order may be cited as the YORKSHIRE (SWINE-FEVER) ORDER OF 1907 (No. 3).

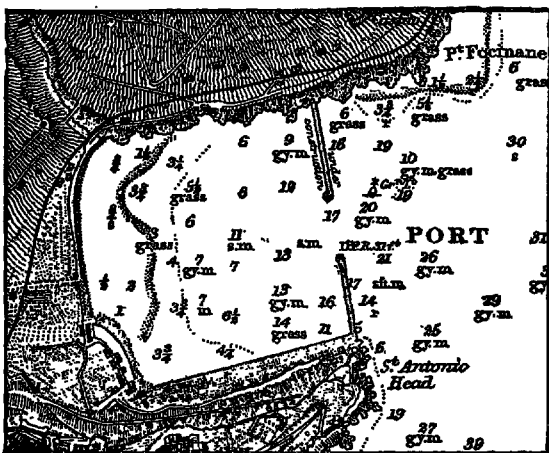
