"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England in pursuance of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria chapter thirty-seven, sections six and eight have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme for authorizing the sale and disposal of certain property situate in the parish of Saint Mary Lambeth in the county of Surrey and now vested in us.

"Whereas under and by virtue of a certain indenture bearing date the seventh day of August in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-six and made or expressed to be made between the London Brighton and South Coast Railway Company of the one part, and us the Ecclesiastical Commissioners of the other part a certain piece of land containing five perches or thereabouts situate at Norwood in the parish of Saint Mary Lambeth in the county of Surrey, which piece of land is more particularly described in the said indenture and is for the better identification thereof delineated and coloured pink on the plan drawn on the said indenture became with its appurtenances and is now vested in us.

"And whereas the said land is not subject to any outstanding beneficial lease or grant, but is now in our possession, but some portion thereof, on account of its character and situation is unsuitable or inconvenient to be held or applied for the purposes for which estates vested in us are applicable under the Acts by which our proceedings are governed.

"And whereas with a view to the advantageous appropriation of the same, or of the proceeds thereof, for the ultimate improvement of our common fund, it is expedient that the said land or such part or parts thereof as we shall at any time and from time to time think fit should be sold or disposed of, and accordingly that we should be empowered to sell or dispose of our interest in such land or in any part or parts thereof, in such manner as shall appear to us advisable.

"Now therefore we humbly recommend and propose that we may be authorized and empowered by instrument or instruments in writing, duly executed according to law from time to time to sell or dispose of, and duly to convey according to the provisions of the said Act, all or any of the said land so vested in us as aforesaid, with its appurtenances, and all our estate right title and interest therein or in any part or parts thereof unto and to the use of any person or persons desirous or willing to purchase the same and his or their heirs executors administrators or assigns or otherwise as he or they shall direct or appoint, and for such consideration as shall, upon due calculation and inquiry appear to us to be just and reasonable, it being our intention to invest the proceeds of such sale from time to time as occasion may arise in the purchase of other lands, tithes, rent-charges, tenements, or hereditaments or of some estate or interest therein convenient to be held by us, for the purposes of the Acts by which our proceedings are governed as aforesaid, and in the meantime to invest the said proceeds in some Government or Parliamentary Stock or other public securities in England.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council: now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Act: and His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the diocese of Canterbury.

"Whereas by the authority of an Order of Her said late Majesty in Council, bearing date the fourteenth day of August, in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine and published in the London Gazette on the twenty-second day of the same month, a certain part of the new parish of Saint Michael and All Angels, Bromley, in the said county of Middlesex and in the said diocese of London, was constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes and such district was named, 'The District of All Hallows, East India Docks.'

"And whereas the said district of All Hallows, East India Docks, has become a new parish of the character contemplated by the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her said late Majesty, chapter thirty-seven, by the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and four, and by the above mentioned Act of the thirty-second and thirty-third years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-four.

"And whereas it has been represented to us and it appears to us to be expedient that the boundaries of the said new parish of All Hallows, East India Docks, shall be altered in the manner which is hereinafter mentioned.

"Now therefore with the consent of the Right Honourable and Right Reverend Arthur Foley, Bishop of London (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme or representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly

represent, recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme or representation and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, the boundaries of the said new parish of All Hallows, East India Docks, shall be altered so that all that portion of the parish of Poplar, in the said county of Middlesex and in the said diocese of London, which is described in the schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto annexed and is thereon coloured pink, shall be dissevered from such parish and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said new parish of All Hallows, East India Docks.

"And we further represent, recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from representing, recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme or Representation has reference.

"The territory to be dissevered from the parish of Poplar, in the county of Middlesex and in the diocese of London, and to be annexed to the new parish of All Hallows, East India Docks, in the said county and diocese, being all that portion of the said parish of Poplar which is bounded upon the south by the middle of the River Thames, upon the east by the new parish of Saint Luke, Victoria Docks, upon the north by the new parish of the Holy Trinity, Barking-road, both in the county of Essex and in the diocese of Saint Albans, upon the north-west partly by the last named new parish and partly by the said new parish of All Hallows, East India Docks, and upon the remaining side, that is to say, upon the west, by an imaginary line commencing at the point where the boundary which divides the said new parish of All Hallows, East India Docks, from the said parish of Poplar crosses the water's edge of the eastern side of the East India (Import) Dock, and extending thence south-eastward and in a straight line for a distance of one chain and three-quarters or thereabouts to the middle of the north-western end of the lock connecting the East India (Import) Dock Basin, and extending thence first south-eastward along the middle of the said lock, then south-eastward across the western end of the East India Dock Basin (thereby keeping generally at the same distance as before from the water's edge of the western side of the said Basin) and then southeastward along the middle of the westernmost of the two locks connecting the East India Dock Basin with the River Thames for a distance in all of fifteen chains or thereabouts to the southern end of the last mentioned lock, and extending thence in a straight line due south to a point in the middle of the River Thames upon the boundary which divides the said county of Middlesex from the county of Kent."

And whereas drafts of the said scheme or representation have been transmitted to the Patrons and to the Incumbents of the cures affected by the arrangements which are contemplated by such scheme or representation and such Patrons and Incumbents have respectively signified their assent thereto.

And whereas the said scheme or representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council: now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby

to ratify the said scheme or representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of London.

"Whereas by the authority of an Order of Her said late Majesty in Council bearing date the thirteenth day of May, in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-five, and published in the London Gazette on the following day, a district chapelry was assigned to the consecrated church of Saint Mark, situate in the parish of Saint Woolos, Newport, in the said county of Monmouth and in the said diocese of Llandaff, and the said district chapelry was named 'The District Chapelry of Saint Mark, Newport.'

"And whereas by the authority of another Order of Her said late Majesty in Council bearing date the eighteenth day of July, in the year one thousand eight hundred and ninety-eight, and published in the London Gazette on the following day, a separate district for spiritual purposes was constituted and such district was named 'The District of Saint John the Baptist,

"And whereas the said district chapelry of Saint Mark, Newport, and the said district of Saint John the Baptist, Newport, have become new parishes of the character contemplated by the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her said late Majesty, chapter thirty-seven, by the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and four,

and by the above mentioned Act of the thirty-second and thirty-third years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-four.

And whereas it has been represented to us, and it appears to us to be expedient that the boundaries of the said new parish of Saint Mark, Newport, and the said new parish of Saint John the Baptist, Newport, shall be altered in the manner which is hereinafter mentioned.

"Now therefore with the consent of the Right Reverend Joshua Pritchard, Bishop of Llandaff (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme or representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme or representation and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the boundaries of the said new parish of Saint Mark, Newport, and the said new parish of Saint John the Baptist, Newport, shall be altered, so that (firstly) all those portions of the said new parish of Saint Mark, Newport, which are described in the first schedule hereunder written and are delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto annexed and are thereon coloured pink shall be dissevered from such new parish and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said new parish of Saint John the Baptist, Newport, and (secondly) all that portion of the said new parish of Saint John the Baptist, Newport, which is described in the second schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth upon the said map or plan hereunto annexed and is thereon coloured green shall be dissevered from such new parish and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said new parish of Saint Mark, Newport.

"And we further represent; recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from representing recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

"The SCHEDULES to which the foregoing Scheme or Representation has reference.

" The FIRST SCHEDULE.

"The territory to be dissevered from the new parish of Saint Mark, Newport, in the county of Monmouth and in the diocese of Llandaff, and to be annexed to the new parish of Saint John the Baptist, Newport, in the said county and diocese, being:—

"I. All that portion of the said new parish of Saint Mark, Newport, which is bounded upon the south-west and upon part of the south-east by the said new parish of Saint John the Baptist, Newport, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the remaining part of the south-east, upon the north-east and upon the north-west by an imaginary line commencing at the point where the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint John the Baptist, Newport, from the said new parish of Saint Mark, Newport, crosses the middle of Oakfield-road, and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of Oakfield-road for a distance of four chains and a half or thereabouts to a point opposite to the south-eastern end of the wall or fence forming the north-eastern boundary of the premises of Saint John's Institute, and extending thence first

north-westward to and along the said wall or fence and then south-westward along the wall or fence forming the north-western boundary of the said premises for a distance of eight chains and a half or thereabouts to the south-western end of the last mentioned wall or fence upon the north-eastern side of the footpath leading from the house known as Ty-llwyd into Oakfield-road near Saint John's Church, and continuing thence in precisely the same direction and in a straight line to a point in the middle of the said footpath upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint Mark, Newport, from the said new parish of Saint John the Baptist, Newport.

"II. Also all that portion of the said new parish of Saint Mark, Newport, which is bounded upon the south-west and upon the south-east by the said new parish of Saint John the Baptist, Newport, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the north-east and upon the north-west by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint John the Baptist, Newport, from the said new parish of Saint Mark, Newport, at the junction of Llanthewy-road with Spencer-road, and extending thence north-westward along the middle of Spencer-road for a distance of four chains or thereabouts to its junction with Bryngwyn-road, and extending thence south-westward along the middle of Bryngwyn-road for a distance of five chains and a half or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint Mark, Newport, from the said new parish of Saint John the Baptist, Newport.

"III. And also all that portion of the said new parish of Saint Mark, Newport, which is bounded upon the south-east and upon the south by the said new parish of Saint John the Baptist, Newport, and upon the remaining side, that is to say, upon the north-west by an imaginary line commencing near Saint John's Church and Schools at the most southerly point at which the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint John the Baptist, Newport, from the said new parish of Saint Mark, Newport, crosses Bryngwyn-road, and extending thence northeastward along the middle of Bryngwyn-road for a distance of five chains and a half or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint Mark, Newport, from the said new parish of Saint John the Baptist, Newport.

"The SECOND SCHEDULE.

"The territory to be dissevered from the said new parish of Saint John the Baptist, Newport, and to be annexed to the said new parish of Saint Mark, Newport, being:—

"All that portion of the said new parish of Saint John the Baptist, Newport, which is situate to the north-west of a line drawn along the middle of Bryngwyn-road."

And whereas drafts of the said scheme or representation have been transmitted to the Patrons and to the Incumbents of the cures affected by the arrangements which are contemplated by such scheme or representation and such Patrons and Incumbents have respectively signified their assent thereto.

And whereas the said scheme or representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council: Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme or representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall

have been duly published in the London Gazett^e pursuant to the said Acts; and His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Llandaff.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the fifty-ninth year of His late Majesty King George the Third, chapter one hundred and thirty-four; of the Act of the second and third years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter forty-nine; of the Act of the eleventh and twelfth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter thirty-seven; and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter fifty-five, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a representation, bearing date the fifth day of November, in the year one thousand nine hundred and eight, in the words following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the fifty-ninth year of His late Majesty King George the Third, chapter one hundred and thirty-four; of the Act of the second and third years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter forty-nine; of the Act of the eleventh and twelfth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter thirty-seven; and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter fifty-five, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following representation as to the assignment of a district chapelry to the consecrated church of Saint Barnabas, situate at Newcastle-upon-Tyne, in the new parish (sometime particular district) of Jesmond, in the county of Northumberland and in the diocese of Newcastle.

"Whereas it appears to us to be expedient that a district chapelry should be assigned to the said church of Saint Barnabas, situate at Newcastle-upon-Tyne as aforesaid.

"Now therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Norman Dumenil John, Bishop of the said diocese of Newcastle (testified by his having signed and sealed this representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all that part of the said new parish of Jesmond which is described in the schedule hereunder written, all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be assigned as a district chapelry to the said church of Saint Barnabas, situate at Newcastle-upon-Tyne as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The District Chapelry of Saint Barnabas, Newcastle-upon-Tyne.'

"And with the like consent of the said Norman Dumenil John, Bishop of the said diocese of Newcastle (testified as aforesaid), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, further represent that it appears to us to be expedient that banns of matrimony should be published, and that

marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials should be solemnized or performed at the said church of Saint Barnabas, situate at Newcastle-upon-Tyne as aforesaid, and that the fees to be received in respect of the publication of such banns and of the solemnization or performance of the said offices should be paid and belong to the Minister of the same church for the time being: Provided always, that nothing herein contained shall be construed as expressing any intention on the part of us the said Commissioners to concur in or approve the taking of any fee for the performance of the said office of baptism or for the registration thereof.

"We, therefore, humbly pray that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into Your Royal consideration, and to make such Order with respect thereto as to Your Majesty in Your Royal wisdom shall seem meet.

"The District Chapelry of Saint Barnabas' Newcastle-upon-Tyne, being:—

"All that part of the new parish (sometime particular district) of Jesmond, in the county of Northumberland and in the diocese of Newcastle, which is bounded upon the south-east partly by the district chapelry of Saint Gabriel, Heaton, Newcastle-upon-Tyne, and partly by the new parish of Saint Silas, Byker, upon the southwest by the consolidated chapelry of Saint Jude, Shieldfield, all in the said county and diocese, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the north-west and upon the north, by an imaginary line commencing at the point where the boundary which divides the said consolidated chapelry of Saint Jude, Shieldfield, from the said new parish of Jesmond meets the south-eastern side of Sandyford-road, and extending thence first north-westward to the middle of Sandyfordroad and then north-eastward along the middle of such road for a distance of twenty-seven chains and a half or thereabouts to its junction with Jesmond-road, and extending thence eastward in a straight line (thereby passing to the north of the house and premises known as Sandyford Park) for a distance of eighteen chains or thereabouts to the junction of the road called Northumberland-gardens with the road called Lansdowne-gardens, and extending thence the middle of Lansdowneeastward along gardens for a distance of four chains and threequarters or thereabouts to the point where such road turns northward, and continuing thence eastward in precisely the same direction and in a straight line for a distance of six chains and a half or thereabouts to a point in the middle of the Ouse Burn upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of Jesmond from the said district chapelry of Saint Gabriel, Heaton, Newcastle-upon-Tyne."

And whereas the said representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council: now, therefore, His Majesty by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Newcastle.

"His Majesty in Council, it shall be lawful for
"His Majesty in Council to make an Order for "carrying such scheme, or modification thereof, as the case may be, into effect."

And whereas the Right Reverend Charles

And whereas the Right Reverend Charles John, Lord Bishop of Chichester, hath, pursuant to the enactment aforesaid, represented in a writing dated the eighth day of August, one thousand nine hundred and eight, to the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Randall Thomas, Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, as follows:—

Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, as follows:—
"I, the Right Reverend Charles John, Lord
Bishop of Chichester, do hereby represent to

your Grace :-

"That there is in the county of Sussex and my diocese of Chichester the rectory of Westmeston otherwise Westmerston otherwise Westmynston otherwise Westmynston with the chapel of Chiltington comprising the parish of Westmeston and the hamlet or parish of East Chiltington the boundaries whereof are well known and defined and which is hereinafter referred to as the rectory or parish of Westmeston.

"That the said hamlet or parish of East Chiltington lies wholly detached from the said paish of Westmeston the parishes of Plumpton and Streete lying between Westmeston and East Chiltington along their whole breadth and that the church or chapel situate at East Chiltington which is now a chapel-of-ease to the parish church of Westmeston aforesaid is distant from the said parish church three miles or thereabouts.

"That the population of the said hamlet or parish of East Chiltington amounts according to the census of one thousand nine hundred and one to three hundred and ninety persons for whom the said chapel affords sufficient accommo-

dation.

"That the said hamlet or parish of East Chiltington appears to have been immemorially treated as a separate parish for all civil purposes and also that baptisms churchings marriages and burials have heretofore been and are now

performed in the said chapel.

"That there is also in the said county and my diocese of Chichester another detached por-tion of the said parish of Westmeston known as Novington comprising three hundred and thirtythree acres one rood and twenty-four perches or thereabouts and lying immediately to the south of the said hamlet or parish of East Chiltington which it is contiguous along its whole northern boundary and which contains a population of about fifty persons and which is situate about two miles from the parish church of Westmeston from which parish it is also divided by the whole breadth of the parishes of Plumpton and Streete.

"That there is also in the said county and my said diocese the said parish of Plumpton the boundaries whereof are well known and defined and which is contiguous along its whole eastern boundary to the said parish of East Chiltington and the said detached portion of the parish of Westmeston known as Novington.

"That the geographical position of the said parishes of Westmeston East Chiltington and Plumpton appears upon the plan which accompanies this representation and that on such plan the parish of Plumpton is coloured blue the parish of Westmeston is coloured pink the said detached portion of the parish of Westmeston known as Novington being coloured brown and the hamlet or parish of East Chiltington being coloured green.

"That according to the last census the population of the said parish of Westmeston exclusive of Novington and East Chiltington amounts to two hundred and thirty-four persons and the population of the said parish of Plumpton

is five hundred and ninety-five persons.

"That it does not appear that any of the inhabitants or landowners of the said hamlet or parish of East Chiltington or of the said detached portion of the parish of Westmeston known as Novington possess any legal right by faculty or otherwise to the exclusive right of any pews or sittings in the chapel of Chiltington aforesaid or in the said parish churches of Westmeston or Plumpton respectively.
"That the patronage of the said benefice of

Westmeston with the chapel of Chiltington belongs to William Henry Campion of Danny Sussex Esquire C.B., and the patronage of the rectory of Plumpton to the Reverend John

Peckham Skirrow Woodward.

"That the Incumbent of the said benefice of Westmeston with the chapel of Chiltington is the Reverend Algernon Charles Lucey and the rector of the said benefice of Plumpton is the said John Peckham Skirrow Woodward.

"That it appears to me that the said hamlet or parish of East Chiltington and also the said detached portion of the parish of Westmeston aforesaid known as Novington may under the provisions of the Pluralities Act 1838 be advantageously separated from the said rectory of Westmeston and be united to the rectory of Plumpton for ecclesiastical purposes.

"That pursuant to the directions contained in the twenty-sixth section of the said Act of Parliament I have drawn up a scheme in writing appended to this representation describing the mode in which it appears to me that the alterations above proposed may best be effected and how the changes consequent on such alteration in respect to ecclesiastical jurisdiction glebe lands tithes rent charges and other ecclesiastical dues rates and payments and in respect to patronage and rights to pews may be made with justice to all parties interested and I do submit the same to your Grace together with the consents in writing of the said William Henry Campion the Patron of the said benefice of Westmeston of the said John Peckham Skirrow Woodward as the Patron and Incumbent of the said rectory of Plumpton and of the said Algernon Charles Lucey as Incumbent of the said benefice of Westmeston to the intent that your Grace may if after full enquiry and consideration you should be satisfied with the said scheme certify the same and such consents by your report to His Majesty in Council."

And whereas the said scheme drawn up by the said Bishop and the consents referred to in the said representation are as follows:-

"SCHEME.

"That there shall be separated from the said rectory of Westmeston with the chapel of East Chiltington and be united to the said rectory of Plumpton for ecclesiastical purposes all that the hamlet or parish of East Chiltington aforesaid and also all that the said detached portion of the said parish of Westmeston known as Novington coloured respectively green and brown on the plan which accompanies this representation.

"That the said hamlet or parish of East Chiltington and the said detached portion of the parish of Westmeston known as Novington shall respectively be subject to the same ecclesiastical jurisdiction as the said rectory of Plumpton and the Incumbent of the said rectory of Plumpton shall have exclusive cure of souls within the

limits of the same.

"That there shall be assigned and attached to the said rectory of Plumpton the yearly rent charges of three hundred and twenty-one pounds ten shillings and eleven pence per annum given in lieu of the tithes of the lands within the hamlet or parish of East Chiltington and the said detached portion of the parish of Westmeston known as Novington under the provisions of the Act for the Commutation of Tithes in England and Wales being the aggregate of the several sums assessed upon the aforesaid lands by the instrument of tithe apportionment for the said parish of Westmeston.

"That all fees and other ecclesiastical dues and payments for churchings marriages and burials and other ecclesiastical offices solemnized or performed within the chapelry or chapel of East Chiltington and the parish or parish church of Plumpton in respect of the said chapelry and the said detached portion of the parish of Westmeston known as Novington respectively shall from henceforth belong to the Incumbent of the

said rectory of Plumpton.

"That the inhabitants of the said chapelry of East Chiltington and of the said detached portion

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of the parish of Westmeston known as Novington respectively shall not in future be entitled to any accommodation in the said parish church of Westmeston and shall be exonerated from all liability to repair the said parish church but shall be entitled in common with the parishioners of the said parish of Plumpton to accommodation in the parish church of Plumpton and shall be liable subject to the provisions of the Compulsory Church Rates Act 1868 to the repairs of the ancient chapel of East Chiltington and of the said parish church of Plumpton.

"CONSENTS.

"We William Henry Campion of Danny in the county of Sussex, Esquire, C.B., the patron or person entitled to present to the rectory of Westmeston with the chapel of Chiltington in the county of Sussex and diocese of Chichester in case the same were now vacant and the Reverend Algernon Charles Lucey, Clerk, Incumbent of the said benefice and the Reverend John Peckham Skirrow Woodward, Clerk, Rector of the rectory of Plumpton in the same county and diocese and the patron or person entitled to present thereto if the same were now vacant, do hereby respectively signify to your Grace our consent to the scheme hereinbefore proposed and set forth and to every matter and thing therein contained.

"That pursuant to the directions contained in the said Act the said Lord Bishop has drawn up a scheme in writing describing the mode in which it appears to him that the proposed alterations may best be effected and how the changes consequent on such alterations in respect to ecclesiastical jurisdiction glebe lands tithes rent charges and other ecclesiastical dues rates and payments and in respect to patronage and rights to pews may be made with justice to all parties interested, which scheme together with the con-sents thereto in writing of William Henry Campion the patron or person entitled to present to the rectory of Westmeston with the chapelry of Chiltington in case the same were now vacant and the Reverend Algernon Charles Lucey, Clerk, Incumbent of the said benefice and the Reverend John Peckham Skirrow Woodward, Clerk, Rector of the rectory of Plumpton and also the patron or person entitled to present thereto if the same were now vacant, has been transmitted to us by the said Lord Bishop for our consideration.

"The representation and scheme of the said Lord Bishop and the consents above referred to

are hereunto annexed.

"And we the said Archbishop being on full consideration and inquiry satisfied with the said scheme do hereby pursuant to the said Pluralities Act, 1838, certify the same and such consents as aforesaid to Your Majesty in Council to the intent that Your Majesty in Council may in case Your Majesty in Council shall think fit so to do make and issue an Order for carrying the said scheme into effect.

Restriction on Movement of Bushes in Scheduled District.

1. No bushes shall be moved from any premises in the District described in the First Schedule to this Order (hereinafter referred to as "the Scheduled District") to any other premises, whether within the Scheduled District or not, except in accordance with the provisions of this Order, and where any premises in the same occupation are divided by a highway the several parts shall for the purposes of this Order be treated as separate premises.

Licences Necessary for Movement of Bushes.

 - (3.) If the movement is from premises which are "infected premises" the following provisions and conditions shall apply:—
 - (a) The Licence shall be in the Form C set forth in the Second Schedule hereto or to the like effect.
 - (b) An application for a Licence shall be signed by the respective occupiers of the premises from which, and the premises to which, the bushes are to be moved and made on a Form supplied by the Board.
 - (c) The bushes shall be moved between the dates specified in the Licence to the place of destination specified in the Licence, and be there permanently planted.
 - (d) The bushes during movement shall be accompanied by the Licence, which after the

3. No bush shall be moved from any premises in the Scheduled District which is diseased or suspected of being diseased, or which has not been pruned in such manner as may have been required by an Inspector of the Board.

Fowers of Inspection of Licences and Labels.

4: Any Inspector or other officer appointed in that behalf by the Local Authority, and any Inspector of the Board, may upon production if so required of his appointment or authority inspect any consignment or parcel of bushes which is being moved in the Scheduled District and take a copy of any Licence or label attached thereto.

Notification of Order.

5. This Order shall be published by each Local Authority affected by advertisement in a newspaper circulating in the District of the Local Authority and in such other manner as the Local Authority consider best fitted to insure publicity for the same.

Offences.

- 6. Every person shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding ten pounds, who—
 - (1) moves any bush in contravention of this Order; or
 - (2) fails to comply with the conditions inserted in a-Licence under this Order; or
 - (3) wilfully obstructs or impedes any Inspector or other officer in the course of his duties under this Order.

Execution of the Order.

7. The Local Authority of each District comprising any area forming part of the Scheduled District shall carry into effect this Order within that area and shall appoint such Inspectors or other officers for that purpose as may be necessary.

Definitions.

Special Provision for regulating landing of Animals brought from the United States of America.

- 1.—(1.) Notwithstanding the provisions of the Foreign Animals Order of 1903, or any Order amending the same, animals brought from the United States of America may be landed at a Foreign Animals Wharf in Great Britain in accordance with the provisions of this Order and not otherwise.
- (2.) so as to prevent the introduction or spreading of foot-and-mouth disease by him or his clothes.

Landing or Transhipment subject to Permission of Inspector.

6. Animals to which this Order applies shall not be landed or transhipped except with the permission of an Inspector of the Board, which permission will only be given when the Inspector is satisfied that sufficient lairage and other accommodation is available for the landing and slaughter of the animals in accordance with the provisions of this Order.

Transhipment.
