The Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, the following translations of five Circulars, issued

by the Imperial and Royal Marine Board at Trieste on dates from October 6 to 12:—

Owing to cases of cholera having been verified in Southern Italy and Russia, the importation and transit of the following goods and articles from Bari and Foggia, in Italy, and from Russia, is, by Ordinance of the 28th September, 1910 (B.L.J. No. 172 & 173), of the Ministries of the Interior, Commerce, and Finance, in accord with the Royal Hungarian Government, prohibited:—

(1) Used body-linen, old and worn clothes (personal effects), used bed-linen.

Whenever such articles are forwarded as luggage, or owing to change of domicile, they will be subjected, on crossing the frontier, to the special regulations prescribed by the sanitary police for their examination and treatment.

(2) Shreds and rags (Stracci e cenci), with exception of those hydraulically pressed, imported for wholesale commerce.

The importation of fresh shreddings from spinning, weaving, clothing, and bleaching manufactories, artificial wool, shoddy, and cuttings from new paper is, however, permitted.

The transit of the aforesaid goods is allowed when they are packed in such manner as to preclude all danger of contamination during the journey. The present Ordinance enters into force on the day of its receipt by the relative custom-houses and port and maritime offices.

The above is participated for instruction and guidance, with the observation that the aforesaid goods, in common with those suspected which may be imported into the Austrian Monarchy during the time the present Ordinance remains in force, will be removed to the nearest Lazaretto at the expense of the parties concerned, and there subjected to disinfection or destruction—as the Authorities may decide—at the expense of such parties. No account will be taken of the depreciation the goods may suffer, neither will any claim for compensation be allowed.

In partial modification of the Circular d.d. of September 30 last, No. 2451 2, which entered into effect by telegraphic order of the Imperial and Royal Ministry of Commerce d.d. of October 6 inst. No. 29810, it is ordained as follows:—

Passengers proceeding from towns or places in Hungary infected with Cholera shall be subjected at place of arrival to a sanitary surveillance of five days. To this end passengers from towns or places in Hungary infected with Cholera will have to submit to a medical visit at port of arrival.

The following towns or places shall be considered as being infected with Cholera:—  
Pressburg, town, Comitatus *Bacs-Bodrog*: Ada. Bacsszentiván, Obecse, Temerin; *Baranya*: Csuza, Kisköszeg, Vörösmart, Lányosök, Mohacs; *Esztergom* (Gran): *Fejér* (Stunlweissenburg): Nagyperkata, Ráczalmás; *Győr* (Raab): Györgyö Nagybajes, Zamyoly; *Komárom* (Komorn): Acz, Bagota, Duna Almás, Kiskessi, Szöny; *Post-Pilis-Solt-Hiskum*: Békásmegyör, Ercsi, Kalocsa, Dunnegyháza, Dunavecse, Harta, Tökö, Kunszentmiklos; *Possony* (Pressburg): Doborgar, Pénteksür, Püspöki, Ujnelyjoka; Tolna: Duna
