CORONATION OF THEIR MAJESTIES.

COURT OF CLAIMS.

The Right Honourable the Commissioners appointed by His Majesty to hear and determine all Claims of Services to be performed at the time of the ensuing Coronation (except those dispensed with by His Majesty's Royal Proclamation of the 19th day of July last), and of fees to be received for the same, at their last meeting held at the Council Office, Whitehall, on the 16th day of December last, resolved as follows:—

1. All Claims must be made by Petition. Petitions may be sent under cover to the Clerks of the Court of Claims, Privy Council Office, Downing Street, London, S.W.

2. Petitioners are not required to appear in person unless summoned.

3. Petitioners may appear by Counsel, Solicitors, or Agents.

4. If a Claim was admitted in 1901-2, all that is required from the Petitioner (or his present representative) is a short formal

Petition (without Appearance) stating that he is the same Petitioner, or his representative (and if representative in what capacity), and that the Petition was allowed in 1901-2, in order that there may be a record.

5. No Claim excluded by the Court in 1901-2 as inappropriate to the Coronation by reason of the Royal Proclamation, and inappropriate for the same reason to the forthcoming Coronation, will be placed on the list.

6. Any Claim now made, which was referred by the Court in 1901-2 to the Executive Committee for the purposes of arrangements for the Coronation, shall be referred to the same Committee.

7. Petitioners to be requested to present their Claims on or before the 14th January, 1911.

The Court stands adjourned till 11 a.m. on Friday, the 27th day of January next.

The Commissioners are required by the Proclamation to exclude from their consideration such Claims as may be submitted to them in respect of rights or services connected with the parts of the Ceremonial heretofore performed in Westminster Hall and with the Procession, the Ceremony being confined to Westminster Abbey.

REMOVAL OF MATERIALS PROHIBITED.

WHEREAS the Board of Trade, acting in pursuance of the Harbours Act, 1814, as amended by the Harbours Transfer Act, 1862, find it necessary for the protection of the Port of Limerick to prohibit the taking or removing of any shingle or ballast from the shores or banks of Carrigaholt Bay, between the Old Quay on the north side of the mouth of the Moyarta River at Carrigaholt and the New Quay at Carrigaholt Point, being within the said Port:

Now the Board of Trade do hereby by this Order prohibit the taking or removing of any shingle or ballast from the shores or banks of Carrigaholt Bay between the points above mentioned.

NOTE.—Any person removing shingle or ballast in contravention of this Notice is liable, on conviction, to a penalty not exceeding £10.

Whereas the Board of Trade, acting in pursuance of the Harbours Act, 1814, as amended by the Harbours Transfer Act, 1862, found it necessary for the protection of the harbour or haven of the River Humber and of the shores and banks thereof to issue an Order, dated the 1st day of August, 1868, prohibiting the taking or removing of any shingle or ballast from the shores or banks at Spurn Point from the Low Lighthouse southward to the extreme of the Point at low water and northward two and a half statute miles on both sides of the Spurn Point.

And whereas for the further protection of the said harbour or haven or port and also for the protection of the shores or banks of the Port of Kingston-upon-Hull and of the works thereof the Board of Trade did by an Order dated the 6th day of September, 1869, pro-

hibit the taking or removing of any shingle or ballast from the shores or banks of the said harbour or haven or from the shores or banks of the Port of Kingston-upon-Hull and the works thereof between the northernmost boundary of the parish of Hornsea and the limits north of Spurn Point defined by the said Order of the 1st of August, 1868.

And whereas by Indenture dated the 9th day of July, 1900, the Board of Trade leased to the Urban District Council of Withernsea the foreshore below high-water mark adjacent to the urban district of Withernsea with the exception therein mentioned.

And whereas the said Urban District Council desire to construct certain sea defence works at Withernsea and are desirous of removing for that purpose 3,000 tons or thereabouts of shingle and ballast, and have applied to the Board of Trade to revoke the said Order so far as it prohibits the taking or removing of any shingle or ballast from the said shores or banks within the limits hereinafter specified.

Now, therefore, the Board of Trade do hereby by this Order revoke the said Order of the 6th September, 1869, so far only as that Order prohibits the taking or removing of any shingle or ballast from the shores or banks between two points situated respectively 200 feet north of the seaward end of the road known as Northgate and 500 feet south of the seaward end of Pier Road within or adjacent to the said urban district of Withernsea.
