investigate the working of the Railway Conciliation and Arbitration Scheme, signed on behalf of the principal Railway Companies and of three Trade Unions of Railway employés at the Board of Trade on November 6th, 1907, and to report what changes (if any) are desirable with a view to the prompt and satisfactory settlement of differences:

And for the better effecting the purposes of this Our Commission, We do by these Presents give and grant unto you, or any two or more of you, full power to call before you such persons as you shall judge likely to afford you any information upon the subject of this Our Commission; and also to call for, have access to and examine all such books, documents, registers and records as may afford you the fullest information on the subject, and to inquire of and

concerning the premises by all other lawful ways and means whatsoever:

And We do by these Presents authorize and empower you, or any two or more of you, to visit and personally inspect such places as you may deem it expedient so to inspect for the more effectual carrying out of the purposes aforesaid:

And We do by these Presents will and ordain that this Our Commission shall continue in full force and virtue, and that you, Our said Commissioners, or any two or more of you, may from time to time proceed in the execution thereof, and of every matter and thing therein contained, although the same be not continued from time to time by adjournment:

And We do further ordain that you, or any two or more of you, have liberty to report your proceedings under this Our Commission from time to time if you shall judge it expedient so to do:

And Our further will and pleasure is that you do, with as little delay as possible, report to Us, under your hands and seals, or under the hands and seals of any two or more of you, your opinion upon the matter herein submitted for your consideration.

WILD BIRD (ENGLAND).

The Wild Birds Protection (Administrative County of East Sussex) Order, 1911.

Dated 26th August, 1911.

In pursuance of the powers conferred on me by the Wild Birds Protection Acts, 1880 to 1908, and upon application by the Council of the Administrative County of East Sussex, I hereby make the following Order:—

Title.

I. This Order may be cited as the Wild Birds Protection (Administrative County of East Sussex) Order, 1911.

BIRDS.

Close Time Extended.

II. The time during which the killing or taking of Wild Birds is prohibited by the Act of 1880 shall be extended so as to be between the last day of February and the 1st day of September in any year, except with respect to the following birds:—

Curlew, Godwit, Wild Goose, Lapwing, Plover, Redshank and other Sand Pipers, Snipe, Wild Swan, Mallard, Teal and other Wild Duck, Whimbrel, Widgeon, Woodcock.

Additions to the Schedule of the Act of 1880.

III. The Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, shall apply within the Administrative County of East Sussex to the following species of Wild Birds in the same manner as if those species were included in the schedule to the Act:—

Blue-throat, Black-headed Bunting, Cirl Bunting, Corn Snow Bunting, Bunting, Reed Bunting, Yellow Bunting (Yellow CornCommon Buzzard, Bustard, Hammer), Buzzard, Chiffchaff, Corn Honey Crake Rail), Spotted Crake, Golden-eyed (Land Peregrine Falcon, Flycatcher (both species), Montagu's Harrier, Heron, Hobby, Glossy Ibis, Kestrel, Martin (both species), Merlin, Nuthatch, Osprey, Water Pipit, Kentish Plover, Pratincole, Raven, Redstart, Red-backed Shrike, Tree Sparrow, Stonechat, Swallow, Swift, Bearded Tit, Blue Tit, Coal Tit, Crested Tit, Great Tit, Long-tailed Tit, Marsh Tit, Wagtail (all species), Blackcap Warbler, Dartford Warbler, Garden Warbler, Grasshopper Warbler, Reed Warbler, Sedge Warbler, Willow Warbler, Wood Warbler, Wheatear, Whinchat, White-throat, Lesser Whitethroat, Fire-crested Wren, Golden-crested Wren, Wryneck.

IV. The Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, shall apply within the undermentioned area in the Administrative County of East Sussex to the Linnet (Brown and Green) in the same manner as if those species were included in the schedule to the Act.

The area referred to is bounded on the north by a line beginning on the sea coast at the boundary between the county borough of Hastings and the borough of Bexhill, proceeding along such boundary to its junction with the main road from Hastings to Bexhill, thence along the northern side of such main road, through Bexhill, Ninfield, Horsebridge, and Laughton, to the boundary of the borough of Lewes, thence along the northern boundary of that borough to its junction with the main road leading from Lewes to Offham, thence along the northern side of such main road through Ditchelling and Hurstpierpoint to the county boundary between Albourne and Woodmancote and is outlined in blue on a map deposited with the Clerk of the County Council, sealed with the Home Office seal, and dated the 26th August, 1911.

The House Sparrow deprived of protection.

V. The whole of the Administrative County of East Sussex is hereby exempted from the operation of the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, so far as the House Sparrow is concerned.

Certain Birds protected during the whole of the Year.

VI. During that period of the year to which the protection afforded by the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, as extended, so far as certain birds are concerned, by Clause II of this Order, does not apply, the killing or taking of any of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the Administrative County of East Sussex:

Avocet, Blue-throat, Chough, Spotted Crake, Crossbill, Stone Curlew (Great Plover, Thick-knee), Common Bittern, Little Bittern, Common Buzzard, Honey Buzzard, Goldeneyed Duck, Pied Flycatcher, Goldfinch, Great Crested Grebe, Greenshank, Montagu's Harrier, Heron, Hoopoe, Glossy Ibis, Kingfisher, Common Kite, Wood Lark, Nightjar (Goat Sucker), Oriole, Osprey, Owl (all species), Grey-necked Phalarope, Red-necked Phalarope, Water Pipit, Ringed Plover, Pratincole, Raven, Redpole, Dusky Redshank, Spotted Sandpiper, Wood Sandpiper, Siskin, Tree Sparrow, Spoonbill, Temminck's Stint, Common Tern, Bearded Tit, Dartford Warbler, Wheatear, Green Woodpecker, Great Spotted Woodpecker, Lesser Spotted Woodpecker.

All Birds protected on Sundays except within a certain Area.

VII. During that period of the year to which the protection afforded by the Wild Birds Protection Act of 1880, as extended, so far as certain birds are concerned, by Clause II of this Order, does not apply, the killing or taking of Wild Birds on Sundays is prohibited within the Administrative County of East Sussex, except in so much of the Poor Law Union of Cuckfield as is comprised in the parishes of Bolney and Twineham, which area is outlined

IV. The Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, | in red on the map referred to in Clause IV of all apply within the undermentioned area | this Order.

Eggs.

All Eggs protected in certain Areas.

VIII. The taking or destroying of the Eggs of any species of Wild Birds is prohibited for a period of five years from the date of this Order within the undermentioned areas which are outlined in orange on the map referred to in Clause IV:—

- (a.) An area bounded on the west by a line drawn due south from the eastern extremity of the sea wall at Seaford, on the east by the western boundary of the county borough of Eastbourne, on the north by the front edge of the sea cliffs extending between those limits, and on the south by the sea.
- (b.) An area bounded on the west by a line drawn due south from the western boundary of the parish of Rottingdean, on the east by a line drawn due south from the eastern extremity of the sea cliffs in the urban district of Newhaven, on the north by the front edge of the sea cliffs extending between those limits, and on the south by the sea.
- (c.) An area bounded on the west by the western side of the main road running from Eastbourne to Hailsham from the boundary of the county borough of Eastbourne at a point near Ratton via Willingdon and Polegate and Hailsham, and by the western side of the continuation of that road to its junction with the Lewes and Battle main road at or near Upper Horsebridge; on the north by the northern side of the Lewes and Battle main road running from the said point at or near Upper Horsebridge through Gardner Street, and Boreham Street to Ninfield, by the north-eastern side of the main road leading from Ninfield to Bexhill through Sidley, and by the northern side of the main road from Bexhill to the boundary of the county borough of Hastings at Bulverhythe; on the east by the western boundary of the borough of Hastings; and on the south by the northern boundary of the county borough of Eastbourne and by the sea.
- (d.) An area bounded on the west by the eastern boundary of the county borough of Hastings from the sea to the point at which the South Eastern and Chatham branch line of railway from Hastings to Ashford leaves the county borough near Coghurst; on the west and north by the eastern and southern boundary of such branch line of railway leading through Rye to the Kent and Sussex county boundary; on the east by such county boundary, and on the south by the sea.

Certain Eggs protected throughout the Administrative County.

IX. The taking or destroying of the Eggs of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the Administrative County of East Sussex:—

Avocet, Common Bittern, Blue-throat, Common Buzzard, Honey Buzzard, Spotted Crake, Crossbill, Stone Curlew (Great Plover, Thick-knee), Peregrine Falcon, Goldfinch, Great Crested Grebe, Montagu's Harrier, Heron, Hobby, Hoopoe, Kestrel, Kingfisher, Common Kite, Wood Lark, Nightingale, Nightjar (Goat Sucker), Oriole, Owl (all species), Grey-necked Phalarope, Red-

necked Phalarope, Water Pipit, Kentish Plover, Ringed Plover, Raven, Wood Sandpiper, Red-backed Shrike, Spoonbill, Common Tern, Bearded Tit, Dartford Warbler, Wheatear, Green Woodpecker, Great Spotted Woodpecker, Lesser Spotted Woodpecker, Goldencrested Wren, Wryneck.

Repeal of former Order,

X. The Order of the 16th day of February, 1910, is hereby repealed.

In pursuance of the powers conferred on me by the Wild Birds Protection Acts, 1880 to 1908, and upon application by the Council of the Administrative County of Denbigh, I hereby make the following Order:—

Title.

I. This Order may be cited as "The Wild Birds Protection (Administrative County of Denbigh) Order, 1911.

BIRDS.

Partial Extension of Close Time.

II. The period during which the killing or taking of Wild Birds is prohibited by the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, shall be extended throughout the Administrative County of Denbigh so far as concerns the undermentioned birds so as to be between the last day of February and the 1st day of October in any year:—

Auk, Avocet, Bee Eater, Bittern, Bonxie, Colin, Cornish Chough, Coulterneb, Cuckoo, Dotterel, Dunlin, Fulmar, Gannet, Godwit, Grebe, Greenshank, Guillemot, Hoopoe, Loon, Marrot, Merganser, Murre, Nightingale, Nightjar (Fern Owl, Goatsucker, or Night Hawk), Oriole, Oxbird, Oyster Catcher, Petrel, Phalarope, Ploverspage, Puffin, Purre, American Quail, Razorbill, Redshank, Reeve or Ruff, Roller, Sanderling, Sandpiper, Scout, Sealark, Sea Parrot, Sea Swallow, Shearwater, Sheldrake, Smew, Solan Goose, Spoonbill, Stint, Stone Curlew (Thick Knee), Stonehatch, Summersnipe, Tarrock, Tern, Tystey, Whaup, Whimbrel, Willock, Woodpecker.

Additions to the Schedule of the Act of 1880.

III. The Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, shall apply within the Administrative County of Denbigh to the following species of Wild

Birds in the same manner as if those species were included in the Schedule to the Act:—

Yellow Bunting, Peregrine Falcon, Pied Flycatcher, Hedge Sparrow, Raven, Redstart, Robin Redbreast, Red-backed Shrike, Starling, Thrush, Treecreeper, Wagtail, Blackcap Warbler, Wheatear, Common Wren, Goldencrested Wren.

Certain Birds protected during the whole of the Year.

IV. During that period of the year to which the protection afforded by the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, does not extend, the killing or taking of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the Administrative County of Denbigh:—

Common Buzzard, Goldfinch, Heron, Kingfisher, Lark, Linnet (brown and green), Owl,

Siskin.

Repeal of former Order.

V. The Order of the 20th December, 1904, is hereby repealed.

The Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch, dated the 11th August, from His Majesty's Ambassador at Constantinople, stating that the following decisions were taken at a meeting of the Constantinople Board of Health, held on the 8th August:—

1. The measures in force against the Mediterranean ports of Egypt, with the exception

of Port Said, suppressed.
2. The medical visit in force against Adalia suppressed, as no further case of plague has occurred there.

3. The measures in force against the Gulf of Smyrna, from Foglieri to Vourla, reduced to medical visit and disinfection, the delay not to exceed 24 hours.

4. Cholera having appeared at Silivri, the "contaminated zone" round Constantinople is extended to that port; and consequently the measures in force against Constantinople are now applicable to the coast between Constantinople and Silivri.

5. Arrivals from Naples, Salerno and Palermo, who have undergone disinfection in the Italian lazaret of Catania, and who are 5 days out, will be given pratique in Turkish

ports where there is a medical officer, after favourable medical visit.

6. The same favour is granted to arrivals in Turkish ports of the Adriatic from Constantinople, who shall have undergone in a Greek lazaret the measures in force against Constantinople.

The Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch, dated the 22nd August, from His Majesty's Minister at The Hague, transmitting the following translation of a Decree, dated the 19th August, issued by the Netherlands Ministries of the Interior and of Finance, prohibiting, on and after the 20th August, the importation and transit of rags, used articles of clothing, &c., from Genoa, Leghorn, Salerno, and Trieste:

The Ministers of the Interior and of Finance: Having regard to Article 1 of the Royal Decree of October 10, 1910;

Bring to the notice of the public that on and after August 20, 1911, the importation and transit of rags, used articles of clothing, and unwashed underclothing and bedding from Genoa, Leghorn, Salerno and Trieste shall be prohibited.

Luggage which travellers bring with them shall be included in this prohibition in so far as unwashed underclothing and bedding are

concerned.

This prohibition shall not apply:

I. As regards importation and transit: to goods which have arrived from Genoa, Leghorn, Salerno or Trieste, but of which it appears sufficiently clearly that they have another origin, and which are packed in such a manner, and have been so transported, that they cannot have been in contact with infected objects;

II. As regards transit: to goods which are packed in such a manner that they cannot have undergone any kind of manufacture or treat-

ment on the way.

Regulations under Section 9 (1).

COUNTY OF THE WEST RIDING OF YORKSHIRE.

Burley in Wharfedale and Ilkley Urban

Districts.

To the County Council of the West Riding of Yorkshire;—
And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS/by sub-section (1) of section 9 of the Motor Car Act, 1903 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act"), it is enacted that, within any limits or place referred to in Regulations made by Us, the Local Government Board, with a view to the safety of the public, on the application of the local authority of the area in which the limits or place are situate, a person shall not drive a motor car at a speed

exceeding ten miles per hour;
And whereas the County Council of the
West Riding of Yorkshire having made
applications to Us to make Regulations in pursuance of the said sub-section putting the above-mentioned provisions of that sub-section in force within the limits comprising certain roads or parts of roads situate within the Urban Districts of Burley in Wharfedale and Ilkley, We directed a Local Inquiry to be held into the matter by one of Our Inspectors, and the Inquiry was held accordingly, and Report has been made to Us thereon:

NOW THEREFORE, in pursuance of the powers given to Us in that behalf, We do, by this Our Order, make the following Regula-

ARTICLE I.—The provisions of sub-section (1) of section 9 of the Act with respect to the driving of a motor car at a speed not exceeding ten miles per hour shall apply and have effect within the limits comprising the roads or parts of roads which are specified in the Schedule

ARTICLE II.—These Regulations shall come into operation on the third day of September, one thousand nine hundred and eleven.



The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in

Movement into, out of, or within Scheduled District.

1. No cattle, sheep, goats or swine shall be moved into or out of, the District described in the Schedule to this Order, hereinafter referred to as the Scheduled District, or be moved along, over or across, or be allowed by the owner or person in charge thereof to stray upon, a highway or thoroughfare within the Scheduled District; provided that nothing in this Order shall be deemed to apply to the movement of animals into or out of the Scheduled District where they are moved through such District by railway from a place outside such District to another place outside such District without unnecessary delay and without the animals being untrucked within such District.

Local Authority, to enforce Order.

2. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Offences.

3. If an animal is moved in contravention of this Order, the owner of the animal, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the animal, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the animal is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Short Title.

4. This Order may be cited as the DERBY-DISTRICT (FOOT-AND-MOUTH AND DISEASE) ORDER OF 1911.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1911, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

Movement of Animals into Scheduled District for Immediate Slaughter.

1.—(1.) Notwithstanding anything in the Derbyshire and District (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1911, an animal may be moved by railway from outside the District described in the Schedule to that Order to a railway station in such District and thence to the nearest available slaughterhouse (not being situate in any of the parishes of West Hallam, Kirk Hallam, Stanley, and Dale Abbey, in

the administrative county of Derby), subject to the following conditions:—

- (i.) The animal, while being moved from the railway station to the slaughterhouse, shall be accompanied by a Movement Licence granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the railway station is situate.
- (ii.) The animal shall be moved to the slaughterhouse specified in the licence by the route therein described, and not elsewhere, and shall be there detained, and shall be slaughtered within four days of its arrival thereat.
- (iii.) The animal during the movement to the slaughterhouse shall, so far as is practicable, be kept separate from all animals not being moved with a licence under this Order.
- (iv.) After completion of the movement the licence shall forthwith be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest police station in the same district by the person in charge of the animal at the time of completing such movement.
- (2.) A Movement Licence granted under this Order shall be in force for not more than four days, inclusive of the day of issue, and shall be in the form set forth in the Schedule hereto or to the like effect.
- (3.) A copy of a licence granted under this Order shall be sent by the Inspector granting the same to the police station nearest to the slaughterhouse specified in the licence, in any case in which the slaughterhouse is situate in another District.

Exception of Certain Animals from Provisions as to Movement.

- 2. Nothing in this Order shall be construed as authorising—
 - (i.) movement of an animal the movement of which is prohibited by notice of an Inspector of the Local Authority or of the Board given under any Order of the Board; or
 - (ii.) movement of an animal along, over, or across a highway or thoroughfare in any of the parishes of West Hallam, Kirk Hallam, Stanley, and Dale Abbey, in the administrative county of Derby; or
 - (iii.) movement of an animal the movement of which is subject to any Order of the Board relating to any disease other than Foot-and-Mouth Disease.

Production of Licences; Names and Addresses.

- 3.—(1.) Any person in charge of an animal being moved, where under this Order a Movement Licence is necessary, shall, on demand of a Justice, or of a constable, or of an Inspector or other officer of the Board or of a Local Authority, produce and show to him the Licence, if any, necessary for the movement, and shall allow it to be read, and a copy of or extract from it to be taken by the person to whom it is produced.
- (2.) Any person so in charge shall, on demand as aforesaid, give his name and address

to the Justice, or constable, or Inspector or other officer.

Commencement.

4. This Order shall come into operation on the thirtieth day of August, nineteen hundred and eleven.
