NATIONAL HEALTH INSURANCE.

Order, dated 30th January, 1913, made by the Welsh Insurance Commissioners under Sections 78 and 82 of the National Insurance Act, 1911 (1 & 2 Geo. V, c. 55), making further provision with reference to the constitution of the Insurance Committee for the County Borough of Merthyr Tydfil.

Whereas by Section 59 of the National Insurance Act, 1911 (in this Order called "the Act"), read with Section 82 of the Act, it is amongst other things enacted that an Insurance Committee shall be constituted in Wales for every county and county borough, and that every such committee shall consist of such number of members as the Welsh Insurance Commissioners, having regard to the circumstances of each case, determine, but in no case less than forty or more than eighty, and that those members shall be appointed or elected in such manner as is provided in that section:

And whereas, by Section 78 of the Act, read with Section 82 of the Act, it is amongst other things provided that if any difficulty arises with respect to the constitution of Insurance Committees in Wales, the Welsh Insurance Commissioners, with the consent of the Treasury, may by Order make any appointment and do anything which appears to them necessary or expedient for the establishment of such committees, and that any such Order may modify the provisions of the Act so far as may appear necessary or expedient for carrying the Order into effect:

And whereas by the National Health Insurance (Wales) (County Borough of Merthyr Tydfil Insurance Committee) Order, 1912 (in this Order referred to as the "principal

Order"), it was provided that the Insurance Committee to be constituted under Section 59 of the Act for the County Borough of Merthyr Tydfil (in this Order referred to as the "County Borough") should, subject to the provisions and conditions as to time and otherwise contained in the principal Order, consist of the persons whose names are set out in the Schedule to the principal Order, together with such further persons, if any, as might be appointed by any further Order made under Section 78 of the Act to be members of the Committee:

And whereas it is expedient that further persons should be appointed as members of the Insurance Committee for the County Borough to represent the insured persons resident in the County Borough:

And whereas it is not at the date of this Order possible to make arrangements for the appointment of persons to represent insured persons on the committee in the manner prescribed by paragraph (a) of sub-section (2) of Section 59 of the Act read with Section 82 of the Act:

And whereas by reason of the premises a difficulty has arisen with respect to the constitution of the Insurance Committee for the County Borough:

Now, therefore, the Welsh Insurance Commissioners, in pursuance of the powers conferred on them by Section 78 of the Act read with Section 82 of the Act, with the consent of the Treasury, hereby order as follows:

1. This Order may be cited as the National Health Insurance (Wales) (County Borough of Merthyr Tydfil Insurance Committee) Order, 1913.

2. The principal Order shall have effect as if the persons whose names are set out in the Schedule to this Order were included among

the persons whose names are set out in Part III of the Schedule to the principal Order.

NATIONAL HEALTH INSURANCE.

The National Health Insurance (Payments to Insurance Committees) (Wales) No. 2 Order, 1913, dated 30th January, 1913, made by the Welsh Insurance Commissioners under sections 78 and 82 of the National Insurance Act, 1911 (1 and 2 Geo. V, c. 55).

Whereas by section 82 of the National Insurance Act, 1911 (in this Order called "the Act"), it is, amongst other things, enacted that the sums required to meet expenditure properly incurred by Insurance Committees (in this Order referred to as "Committees") for the purposes of the administration of benefits under Part I of the Act to insured persons resident in Wales shall be paid out of the Welsh National Health Insurance Fund (in this Order referred to as "the Fund"):

And whereas it is necessary that payment should be made out of the Fund to meet expenditure properly incurred by Committees for the purposes of administration, and it is not immediately possible to ascertain the amounts available for each Committee respectively for the said purposes out of the moneys derived as aforesaid:

And whereas by section 78, read with section 82 of the Act, it is, amongst other things, provided that if any difficulty arises in bringing Part I of the Act into operation in Wales the Welsh Insurance Commissioners, with the consent of the Treasury, may by Order make any appointment and do anything which appears to them necessary or expedient for bringing Part I of the Act into operation in Wales, and any such Order may modify the provisions of the Act so far as may appear necessary or desirable for carrying the Order into effect:

And whereas doubts have arisen as to whether payments can be made out of the Fund to Committees before the amounts available for such Committees for the purpose of administration have been ascertained, and a difficulty

has thereby arisen within the meaning of the said section 78:

Now, therefore, the Welsh Insurance Commissioners, in pursuance of the powers conferred on them by the Act and all other powers enabling them in that behalf, with the consent of the Treasury, hereby order as follows:—

1. There may be paid out of the Fund in respect of the sums falling to be credited to any Committee in respect of expenses of administration for the period ending the 12th day of January, 1913, such sums as the Welsh Insurance Commissioners may in any case direct for the purpose of meeting expenditure incurred by that Committee for the purposes of administration: Provided always that any sums so paid to a Committee, together with any sum paid to that Committee under and by virtue of Paragraph 1 (c) of the National Health Insurance (Wales) (Payments to Societies and Committees) Order, 1912, and of the National Health Insurance (Wales) (Payments to Insurance Committees) Order, 1913, shall not exceed the sum of one pound and ten shillings for every thousand persons resident, according to the last census, in the area of the Committee.

2. All payments under this Order, so far as they are payments which could properly have been made out of the Fund under the provisions of the Act, read with any Order or Orders made thereunder, if the amounts available for the several Committees had been duly ascertained, shall be deemed to have been duly and properly made thereunder, and shall be treated as advances to Committees in respect of any sums which may be properly payable to such Committees under and by virtue of any provision or provisions in that behalf contained in the Act read with any Order or Orders made thereunder.

3. This Order may be cited as the National Health Insurance (Wales) (Payments to Insurance Committees) No. 2 Order, 1913.

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF
AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 3RD FEBRUARY 1913.)

KETTERING (ALLOTMENT GARDENS)
(SWINE-FEVER) ORDER OF 1913.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1911, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. Article 3 of the Kettering (Allotment Gardens) (Swine-Fever) Order of 1912 is hereby revoked and the following provisions substituted therefor:—

“ Movement of Swine from Premises to which this Order applies.

3.—(1.) Swine (not being in a Swine-Fever Infected Place and their movement not being prohibited by Notice of an Inspector of the Local Authority or of the Board given under any Order of the Board) may be moved from any premises to which this Order applies under and in accordance with the following provisions.

(2.) Swine may be moved to a slaughterhouse for the purpose of immediate slaughter if accompanied by a licence in the Form D set forth in the First Schedule to the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908 authorising such movement, granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the county of Northampton.

(3.) Before a licence (Form D) is granted by an Inspector under this Article the owner of the swine, or his agent authorised in writing for this purpose, shall sign, and deliver or send by post to the Inspector a declaration in the Form E set forth in the First Schedule to the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908, which shall be retained by the Inspector.

(4.) The swine shall, before the movement is commenced, be marked by and at the expense of the owner by the painting with an indelible composition of red colour of a broad line down the back and another broad line across the loins of each of the swine thus +, each line being not less than nine inches long.

(5.) Swine may also be moved from any premises to which this Order applies to any other premises, not being situate in a Scheduled Area to which the Swine-Fever (Special Areas) Order of 1911 applies, if accompanied by a licence in the Form A set forth in the First Schedule to the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908 authorising such movement, granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the place of destination specified in the licence is situate, but no such licence shall be expressed to be granted for movement for breeding purposes.

(6.) Before a licence (Form A) is granted by an Inspector under this Article, the owner of the swine, or his agent authorised in

writing for this purpose, shall sign and deliver or send by post to the Inspector, a declaration in the Form B set forth in the First Schedule to the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908, countersigned as hereinafter provided.

(7.) The declaration (Form B) shall not be effective until it is countersigned by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the county of Northampton, who, before countersigning the declaration, shall, so far as is practicable, satisfy himself as to the correctness of the statements contained therein.

(8.) The declaration (Form B) shall be retained by the Inspector granting the licence thereon.

(9.) Swine moved with a licence (Form A) under this Article shall not, for a period of twenty-eight days after arrival at the place of destination specified in the licence, be moved from such place of destination, except as hereinafter provided.

(10.) Where swine are moved with a licence (Form A) to a market, fairground or saleyard, specified in the licence, the swine shall be moved from such premises only if accompanied by a licence in the Form C set forth in the First Schedule to the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908, authorising such movement granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the market, fairground or saleyard is situate and only to a slaughterhouse specified in the licence, or to the premises from which the swine were moved to the market, fairground or saleyard.

(11.) Swine required by this Article to be detained for a period of twenty-eight days may be moved before the expiration of that period to a slaughterhouse in the same Scheduled Area if such movement is authorised by a licence in the Form C above mentioned granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the district in which the swine are detained, and the swine are accompanied by the licence.

(12.) Swine while detained under this Article shall be kept separate from all other swine.

(13.) Swine moved under this Article shall be moved by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay, and where they are moved to a slaughterhouse they shall be there detained until they are slaughtered.

(14.) Licences granted under this Article shall be in force for not more than eight days inclusive of the day of issue.

(15.) No licence under the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908 shall be required for the movement into a Scheduled Area for the purposes of that Order of swine which are being moved under and in accordance with a licence granted under this Article.”

Commencement.

2. This Order shall come into operation on the eighth day of February, nineteen hundred and thirteen.

Short Title, &c.

3. This Order may be cited as the KETTERING (ALLOTMENT GARDENS) (SWINE-FEVER) ORDER OF 1913, and shall be read as one with

the Kettering (Allotment Gardens) (Swine-Fever) Order of 1912.
