NATIONAL HEALTH INSURANCE.

The National Health Insurance (Sanatorium Benefit) Order, 1913, dated 31st March, 1913, made under section 78 of the National Insurance Act, 1911 (1 & 2 Geo. 5, c. 55), by the Insurance Commissioners constituted under that Act with reference to the provision of funds to meet expenditure for sanatorium benefit incurred during the period ending 13th January, 1913, and to the calculation of the numbers of insured persons resident in the areas of Insurance Committees at the commencement of the year 1913.

Whereas by section 78 of the National Insurance Act, 1911 (in this Order called "the Act''), it is amongst other things enacted that if any difficulty arises with respect to the bringing into operation of Part I of the Act the Insurance Commissioners (in this Order referred to as "the Commissioners") may with the consent of the Treasury by Order do anything which appears to them necessary or expedient for bringing Part I of the Act into operation, and that any such Order may modify the provisions of the Act so far as may appear necessary or expedient for carrying the Order into effect.

And whereas it is enacted by sub-section (2) of section 16 of the Act that the sums available for defraying the expenses of sanatorium benefit in each year shall be one shilling and three pence in respect of each insured person resident in the county or county borough and such further sum as is mentioned in the said sub-section:

And whereas it is provided by sub-section (1) of section 61 of the Act that all sums available for sanatorium benefit shall be paid or credited to Insurance Committees at the commencement of the year:

And whereas by the National Health Insurance (Sanatorium Benefit, etc.) Order, 1912, it was provided that for the purpose of defraying the expenses of sanatorium benefit during the period between the 15th day of July, 1912, and the 12th day of January, 1913, both inclusive (in this Order referred to as "the initial period "), there should be deducted from the several amounts from time to time standing to the credit of persons who were deposit contributors and from the respective amounts standing to the credit of Approved Societies, such sums (not exceeding the respective amounts specified in the said Order) as might be determined by the Commissioners to be necessary for the purpose of meeting the expenditure incurred in connection with the provision of sanatorium benefit during the initial period:

And whereas it was further provided by the said Order that, as respects the year 1913, the commencement of the year should for the purposes of section 61 of the Act be taken to be the 13th day of January:

And whereas the expenditure incurred by Insurance Committees during the initial period was in the case of most of the Committees less than the aggregate sum which would have been produced by deductions made under the said Order, if those deductions had been made at the maximum rates allowed under the said Order, together with the moneys which would have been provided by Parliament, but most of the said Committees incurred liabilities during the initial period which were not discharged during that period but will fall to be defrayed during the current year:

And whereas for the purpose of enabling Insurance Committees to meet the liabilities which were incurred by them as aforesaid during the initial period and are still outstanding, and which if this Order were not made would have to be met out of funds which should properly be devoted to the expenditure of the current year, it is desirable to make provision for the payment to Insurance Committees of such further amounts as might have been paid to them if the deductions under the said recited Order had been made at the maximum rate:

And whereas difficulties have arisen in ascertaining the numbers of insured persons resident in the areas of Insurance Committees at the commencement of the current year:

And whereas by reason of the premises a difficulty has arisen in bringing Part I of the Act into operation;

Now therefore the Commissioners in pursuance of the powers conferred on them by section 78 of the Act, with the consent of the Treasury, hereby order as follows:—

1.—(1.) For the purpose of defraying the expenses of sanatorium benefit incurred during the initial period there shall be deducted at such times and in such manner as the Commissioners may direct from the several amounts from time to time standing to the credit of persons who were deposit contributors within the meaning of the said recited Order and from the respective amounts standing to the credit of Approved Societies, the respective sums specified in the Schedule to this Order, and all sums so deducted shall be apportioned between the several Insurance Committees in proportion to the number of insured persons resident in their respective areas:

Provided that no deduction shall be made under the foregoing provision from the amount standing to the credit of any deposit contributor in respect of contributions paid while he was a person not entitled to sanatorium benefit, and the contributions paid by any person not entitled to sanatorium benefit shall not be taken into account in calculating the amount to be deducted from the amount standing to the credit of an Approved Society.

ing to the credit of an Approved Society.

(2.) For the purposes of this Order the expression "person not entitled to sanatorium benefit" means an insured person whom the Insurance Committee have no power to recommend for sanatorium benefit.

(3.) For the purpose of calculating the sums to be deducted from the amounts standing to the credit of a deposit contributor, where only three or any less number of contributions have been paid in respect of the contributor, those contributions shall be deemed to be four contributions, and where five or any greater number of contributions have been paid any three or less number of contributions in excess of any multiple of four contributions shall be deemed to be four contributions.

2. For the purpose of ascertaining the sums to be paid to an Insurance Committee for defraying the expenses of sanatorium benefit during the initial period, the number of insured persons resident in the area of the Committee during that period shall be taken to be the number of persons so resident on the 29th day of October, 1912, and for the purpose of ascertaining the sums to be so paid in respect of the year 1913 the number of insured persons so resident at the commencement of the year shall be taken to be the mean between the number of persons so resident on the 29th day of October, 1912, and the number of insured persons so resident on the 14th day of April, 1913

3. This Order may be cited as the National Health Insurance (Sanatorium Benefit) Order, 1913.

NATIONAL HEALTH INSURANCE.

The National Health Insurance (Deposit Contributors Medical and Sanatorium Benefit) Order, 1913, made by the Insurance Commissioners under section 78 of the National Insurance Act, 1911 (1 & 2 Geo. V, c. 55), dated 31st March, 1913.

Whereas by section 78 of the National Insurance Act, 1911 (in this Order called "the Act ") it is amongst other things provided that if any difficulty arises with respect to bringing into operation Part I of the Act the Insurance Commissioners, with the consent of the Treasury, may by Order do anything which appears to them necessary or expedient for bringing that Part of the Act into operation, and that any such Order may modify the provisions of the Act so far as may appear necessary or expedient for carrying the Order into effect:

And whereas by virtue of section 42 (e) of the Act if the amount standing to the credit of a deposit contributor at the beginning of the year is insufficient to provide the sums payable in respect of him for the purposes of medical benefit and sanatorium benefit and towards the expenses of administration, that contributor is not, unless the Insurance Committee consents, and except subject to such conditions as that Committee may impose, entitled to any benefits during that year:

And whereas by the National Health Insurance (Sanatorium Benefit, etc.) Order, 1912, and the National Health Insurance (Deposit Contributors Administration Expenses) Order, 1912, it is provided that as respects the year 1913, the commencement of the year is for the purposes of paragraph (e)

of section 42 of the Act to be taken to be the 13th day of January:

And whereas it was not possible at the beginning of the present year to ascertain whether the amount standing to the credit of a deposit contributor in the Post Office Fund was sufficient to provide the sums aforesaid:

whereas contributions payable in respect of employed persons were in many cases unpaid at the beginning of the year, but such contributions have been paid subsequently or will hereafter be paid:

And whereas by reason of the premises deposit contributors will, unless this Order is made, as respects the year 1913, be deprived of benefits to which they might otherwise be entitled, and accordingly a difficulty has arisen within the meaning of the said section 78:

Now, therefore, the Insurance Commissioners, in pursuance of the powers conferred on them by the Act and all other powers enabling them in that behalf, with the consent of the Treasury, hereby order as follows:-

1.—(1) Notwithstanding anything in section 42 (e) of the Act-

(a) a deposit contributor in respect of whom contributions were paid not later than the 13th day of October, 1912, shall be and shall be deemed always to have been entitled to receive medical benefit during the period from the 15th day of January to the 30th day of April, 1913, both inclusive, and to receive sanatorium benefit during the period from the 13th day of January to the 30th day of April, 1913, both inclusive; and

(b) a deposit contributor in respect of whom contributions were not paid on or before the 13th day of October, 1912, but were paid on any date after the 13th day of October, 1912, and not later than the 12th day of January, 1913, shall be entitled to receive medical benefit and sanatorium benefit during the period from the 1st day of May to the 14th day of July, 1913, both inclusive;

and there shall be deducted from the amount standing to the credit of the deposit contributor in the Post Office Fund a sum equal to the proper proportion for the periods or period during which he is by virtue of the foregoing provisions of this Order entitled to benefit of the sums properly payable under the Act in respect of him for the purposes of medical benefit and sanatorium benefit and towards the expenses of administration for the year 1913, after deducting from those sums such part thereof as is payable out of moneys provided by

Provided that if it appears at any time that the amount so standing to the credit of a deposit contributor, in the case of such a contributor as is mentioned in paragraph (a), on the 13th day of January, 1913, and in the case of such a contributor as is mentioned in paragraph (b) on the 1st day of May, 1913, was not sufficient to provide the sum hereinbefore directed to be deducted from that amount, the Insurance Commissioners may, if they think fit, deduct from any contributions paid by or ia respect of him in respect of the period from the 13th day of January to the 30th day of April, 1913, both inclusive, or in respect of the period from the 1st day of May to the 14th day of July, both inclusive, such sum as together with any sum so standing to his credit as aforesaid will be equal to the proper proportion of the sums so payable in respect of him as aforesaid.

- (2) For the purposes of this Order the expression "deposit contributor" means a deposit contributor who, if the amount standing to his credit in the Post Office Fund were not insufficient for the purposes specified in paragraph (e) of section 42 of the Act, would be entitled to medical and sanatorium benefit.
- 2. The Insurance Commissioners may continue the right to benefit of any such deposit contributor as is mentioned in paragraph 1 of this Order for such further periods up to and including the 14th day of January, 1914, as they may determine, if there is standing to the credit of the deposit contributor in the Post Office Fund before the beginning of each of such further period or periods an amount equal to the proper proportion for such further period or periods of the sums payable in respect of him for the purposes of medical benefit and sanatorium benefit and towards the expenses of administration for the year 1913, excluding so much of those sums as is payable out of moneys provided by Parliament, and there shall be deducted from the amount so standing to his credit a sum equal to the proper proportion for such period or periods of the sums so payable as aforesaid.
- 3. Nothing in this Order shall be deemed to authorize the doing of any act or thing after the 31st day of December, 1913, which could not have been lawfully done if this Order had not been made.
- 4. This Order may be cited as the National Health Insurance (Deposit Contributors Medical and Sanatorium Benefit) Order, 1913.

Regulations under Section 8.

COUNTY OF MIDDLESEX AND BOROUGH OF RICHMOND (SURREY).

To the County Council of Middlesex;— To the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the Borough of Richmond, in the County of Surrey;

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS Richmond Bridge is situate partly within the Urban District of Twickenham, in the County of Middlesex, and partly within the Borough of Richmond, in the

County of Surrey;

And whereas under Regulations made by an Order dated the 7th day of December, 1911, issued by Us, the Local Government Board, under sub-section (1) of Section 9 of the Motor Car Act, 1903, on the application of the County Council of Middlesex and the Town Council of the Borough of Richmond, a motor car may not be driven at a speed exceeding ten miles per hour along Bridge Street, Richmond, and so much of the road passing over Richmond Bridge as extends from its junction with Bridge Street to its junction with Willoughby Road, in the Urban District of Twickenham;

And whereas by Section 8 of the Motor Car Act, 1903, it is provided that We may, in the circumstances there specified, by Regulations made under Section 6 of the Locomotives on Highways Act, 1896, restrict the driving of any motor cars, or of any special kind of motor cars, on any specified highway, or part of a

highway;

And whereas by the Heavy Motor Car Order, 1904, issued by Us in pursuance of the Motor Car Acts, 1896 and 1903, the expression "heavy motor car" in that Order is defined as a motor car exceeding two tons in weight

unladen;

And whereas the County Council of Middle-sex and the Town Council of the Borough of Richmond having applied to Us to make a Regulation in pursuance of the above-cited Sections further restricting the driving of heavy motor cars on the highways aforesaid, We directed a Local Inquiry to be held into the matter by one of Our Inspectors, and an Inquiry was held accordingly, and Report has been made to Us thereon:

NOW THEREFORE, in pursuance of the

powers given to Us in that behalf, We dohereby make the following Regulations:-

ARTICLE I .- The expression "heavy motor car" in this Order shall have the same meaning as the like expression in the Heavy Motor Car Order, 1904.

ARTICLE II .- A person shall not drive a heavy motor car at a speed exceeding five miles per hour on so much of the highway passing over Richmond Bridge as extends for a distance of eighty-three yards in each direction from the centre of the Bridge.

ARTICLE III.—These Regulations shall

come into operation on the seventh day of April, one thousand nine hundred and thir-

teen.

SHEEP-SCAB (NORTH CARDIGAN-SHIRE) ORDER OF 1913.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1911, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Application of Order.

1.—(1.) This Order shall apply to any premises in that portion of the administrative county of Cardigan subject to the Sheep-Scab (North Cardiganshire and Machynlleth District) Order of 1910 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Order") to which it may be applied by a Notice to that effect signed by an Inspector of the Local Authority and served upon the occupier of the premises described in such Notice.

(2.) This Order shall cease to apply to any premises to which it may be applied upon service on the occupier thereof of a Notice to that effect signed by an Inspector of the Board.

(3.) A copy of every Notice served under this Article shall forthwith be sent to the Board by the Inspector signing the same.

Compulsory Dipping in July on Premises to which this Order is applied.

2.—(1.) In addition to the compulsory dipping required by Part II of the principal Order, the owner of any sheep on any premises to which this Order may be applied, between the thirtieth day of June and the first day of August in each year shall cause the same to be dipped between those dates by a thorough immersion in a sheep dip approved by the Board for sheep-scab or purporting to be so approved. This provision shall not apply to sheep moved from such premises under and in accordance with Article 3 of this Order, or slaughtered on such premises between the thirtieth day of June and the first day of August

(2.) The dipping shall be carried out on such date, at such dipping place, and in such manner as shall be required by a notice signed by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the district, and served by post, or otherwise, on the owner or person in charge of the sheep referred to in the notice.

Restriction on Movement from Premises to which this Order is applied.

3. Between the thirtieth day of June and the first day of August sheep shall not be moved from any premises to which this Order may be applied, whether to premises in the Dipping Area to which the principal Order applies or elsewhere, except under the same restrictions as under the principal Order are imposed on movement of sheep out of the Dipping Area.

Local Authority to enforce Order.

4. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Revocation.

5. The Sheep-Scab (North Cardiganshire) Order of 1912 is hereby revoked.

Short Title.

6. This Order may be cited as the SHEEP-SCAB (NORTH CARDIGANSHIRE) ORDER of 1913, and shall be read with the principal Order.
