Whitehall, March 20, 1913.

The KING has been pleased to grant unto Eric de Sioblade Sutherland Rudd, of Knedlington Manor, in the parish of Howden, in the East Riding of the county of York, Esquire, His Royal licence and authority that he and his issue take and henceforth use the surname of Clarke in addition to and after that of Rudd, and that he and they may bear the arms of Clarke quarterly with those of his and their own family, the said arms being first duly exemplified according to the Laws of Arms and recorded in the College of Arms, otherwise the said Royal licence and permission to be void and of none effect.

And to command that the said Royal concession and declaration be recorded in His Majesty's said College of Arms.

The KING has been graciously pleased to grant unto Henry Lethbridge Kingsford, of Wood, in the parish of South Tawton, in the county of Devon, Esquire, second but eldest surviving son of Sampson Kingsford, Clerk in Holy Orders, late Vicar of St. Hilary, in the county of Cornwall (by Helen, his wife, daughter of William Lethbridge, late of Kilworthy, in the parish of Tavistock, in the county of

Devon, and sister of William Lethbridge, of Courtlands, in the parishes of Lympstone and Withycombe Raleigh, of Wood, in the parish of South Tawton aforesaid, and of the city of Exeter, Barrister-at-Law) and brother and heir-at-law of William Lethbridge Lethbridge, late of Wood aforesaid, all deceased, His Royal licence and authority that he may take and henceforth use the surname of Lethbridge, in addition to and after that of Kingsford, and bear the arms of Lethbridge quarterly with those of his own family, and that such surname and arms may in like manner be taken, borne and used by his issue, the said arms being first duly exemplified according to the Laws of Arms and recorded in the College of Arms, otherwise the said Royal licence and permission to be void and of none effect.

And also to command that the said Royal concession and declaration be recorded in His Majesty's said College of Arms.
