The following Scheme for the adjustment of the property, rights, liabilities, etc., of the Urban District Council of Llanelly, in the County of Carmarthen, and for other purposes, as settled by a Committee of His Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, is published in accordance with the provisions of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1882":—

Whereas by the Municipal Corporation Acts, 1882 and 1885, it is enacted that where a Petition for a Charter of Incorporation is referred to the Committee of His Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, and it is proposed by the Charter to extend the Municipal Corporation Acts to the Municipal Borough to be created by the Charter, the said Committee of Council may settle a Scheme for the purposes in the said Acts named and containing such provisions as are in the said Acts particularized.

And whereas in the month of December, One thousand nine hundred and eleven certain inhabitant householders of the Urban District of Llanelly, in the county of Carmarthen, petitioned His Majesty the King, praying for the grant of a Charter of Incorporation.

And whereas the said Petition for a Charter was referred to the Committee of Council, and it was proposed by the Charter to create the

Urban District of Llanelly, hereinafter described "a Municipal Borough," and to incorporate the inhabitants thereof, and to extend the Municipal Corporation Acts to the Municipal Borough to be created by the Charter.

And whereas under and by virtue of the Act 47, George III., Session 2, chapter 107, passed upon the 8th August, 1807, and by the Award of Charles Hassall and William Hopkins, made thereunder and dated the 24th day of October, 1810, certain lands, now known as "the Public Estates," were allotted to and vested in the Trustees for the Burgesses of the Borough of Llanelly for the benefit of the town and port.

And whereas by a Provisional Order of the General Board of Health, dated the 31st day of July, One thousand eight hundred and fifty, and confirmed by the Act 13 and 14 Victoria, chapter 108, "the entire area, hamlets, townships, and places comprised within the boundaries of the Borough of Llanelly" were constituted a District for the purposes of the Public Health Act, 1848, the management and local government of which was vested in a Local Board of Health, and the property powers and authorities of the Trustees for the Burgesses of the Borough of Llanelly were transferred to, and vested in, the said Board (hereinafter called "the Local Board").

And whereas the boundaries of the said Borough of Llanelly were extended by Provisional Order under the hand of one of Her then Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, dated the 17th day of January, 1868, and duly confirmed by the Local Government Supplemental Act, 1868, and in and by the Llanelly Harbour Act, 1878, the said Borough boundaries were more clearly and fully described and defined.

And whereas by a Provisional Order of the Local Government Board, dated the 22nd day of May, 1884, and confirmed by the Local Government Board's Provisional Order Confirmation (No. 7) Act, 1884, the number of members of the Local Board was increased from twelve to eighteen.

And whereas by an Order of the Local Government Board, dated the 27th day of November, 1884, the District was in, and by such Order divided into, three Wards, to be each represented by six elected members.

And whereas under and by virtue of the Local Government Act, 1894, the Local Board became the Urban District Council for the Urban District of Llanelly, hereinafter called "the District Council."

And whereas the Local Government Board did, on the 21st day of January, 1899, under Section 33 of the Local Government Act, 1894, issue an Order by which the District Council were vested with the power to appoint Overseers of the Poor of the Parish of Llanelly (Urban) and the power to appoint and revoke the appointment of Assistant Overseers for such Parish.

And whereas the Education Act, 1902, has come into operation in the Urban District of Llanelly and the District Council thereof is now the Local Education Authority within the said District for the purposes of Part 3 of the said Act, and a Scheme for the constitution of an Education Committee was made by the District Council on the 15th day of July, 1903, and was approved by the Board of Education on the 22nd day of September, 1903.

And whereas a Scheme framed by the Board of Education under the Endowed Schools Acts, 1869 to 1889, for the amendment of the Scheme regulating the Carmarthenshire Intermediate and Technical Education Fund and approved by His Majesty in Council upon the 14th day of May, 1912 (*inter alia*) affects the District and the District Council.

And whereas by a Provisional Order of the Local Government Board, dated the 11th May, 1912, and confirmed by the Local Government Board's Provisional Orders Confirmation (No. 6) Act, 1912, the Llanelly Local Board Act, 1888, was partially repealed and altered.

And whereas the following Acts are now in force within the District, viz.:—

1. An Act (47 Geo. III., Session 2, ch. 107, 8th August, 1807) for enclosing Lands in Llanelly and county of Carmarthen, and for leasing part of the said Lands and applying the rent thereof in improving the Town and Port of Llanelly in the said county.
2. The Burry Navigation and Llanelly Harbour Act, 1858.
3. The Local Government Supplemental Act, 1861.
4. The Local Government Supplemental Act, 1863 (No. 2).
5. The Llanelly Harbour Act, 1864.

6. The Llanelly (Local Board) Waterwork Act, 1865.

7. The Llanelly Harbour Improvement Act, 1868.

8. The Llanelly Harbour Act, 1878.

9. The Llanelly Local Board Act, 1888.

10. The Llanelly (Local Board) Waterworks Act, 1891.

11. The Local Government Board's Provisional Order Confirmation (No. 3) Act, 1893.

12. The Llanelly Harbour Act, 1896.

13. The Llanelly Harbour Act, 1901.

14. The Llanelly Harbour Act, 1904.

15. The Llanelly Waterworks Act, 1909.

16. The Llanelly Harbour Act, 1910.

And whereas the following Acts wholly or in part affect the District, that is to say:—

a. The Local Government Supplemental Act, 1865 (No. 5).

b. The Llanelly Gas Act, 1874.

c. The Great Western Railway (General Powers) Act, 1898.

d. The Llanelly Gas Act, 1908.

And whereas the following Acts have been adopted by the Local Board or by the District Council, and are now in force within the District of the Council, viz.:

1. The Public Health Acts Amendment Act, 1890 (Parts 1, 3, 4 and 5), adopted on the 5th day of January, 1891.

2. The Public Libraries Acts, 1892 and 1893, adopted on the 22nd day of November, 1897.

And whereas by virtue of Orders of the Local Government Board and the Secretary of State for the Home Department, dated respectively the 11th day of October, 1910, and the 18th day of July, 1912, certain parts and sections of the Public Health Acts Amendment Act, 1907, are in force in the District of the Council.

And whereas the following Provisional Orders are now in force within the District of the Council:

1. The Llanelly Tramways Order, 1880, as confirmed by the Tramways Orders Confirmation (No. 1) Act, 1880.

2. The Llanelly Electric Lighting Order, 1891, as confirmed by the Electric Lighting Orders Confirmation (No. 4) Act, 1891.

3. The Llanelly and District Light Railways Order, 1907, as confirmed by the Board of Trade upon the 23rd day of April, 1907.

4. The Llanelly and District Light Railways (Revival and Extension of Time) Order, 1910, as confirmed by the Board of Trade upon the 2nd day of August, 1910.

And whereas under the provisions of the Local Government Act, 1858, the Local Board made Byelaws for regulating, cleansing, occupying and using the Llanelly Market, allowed by Court of General Quarter Sessions of the Peace for the County of Carmarthen on the 5th day of July, 1866, and such Byelaws have been amended by the Urban District Council with the allowance of the Local Government Board obtained upon the 26th day of April, 1906.

And whereas under the provisions of the Public Health Act, 1875, the Local Board on the 4th day of October, 1892, made Byelaws in respect of the cleansing of footways and pavements, the removal of house refuse and the cleansing of earth closets, privies, ashpits and

cesspools, the trade of a soap boiler, the trade of a tallow melter, the trade of a tanner, the trade of a leather dresser, the trade of a fellmonger, all of which Byelaws were allowed by the Local Government Board upon the 28th day of December, 1892.

And whereas under the provisions of the Public Health Act, 1875, the Local Board on the 4th day of October, 1892, made Byelaws in respect of common lodging houses, pleasure grounds, and nuisances, all of which Byelaws were allowed by the Local Government Board upon the 31st day of January, 1893.

And whereas under the provisions of the Tramways Act, 1870, the District Council on the 7th day of February, 1898, made certain Rules and Regulations which were allowed by the Local Government Board upon the 13th day of April, 1898.

And whereas upon the 5th day of June, 1905, the District Council made Byelaws with respect to their slaughterhouse, which Byelaws were confirmed by the Local Government Board upon the 4th day of September, 1905.

And whereas the Local Board on the 2nd day of October, 1888, made Regulations under the Dairies, Cowsheds and Milkshops Order of 1885, which said Regulations were subsequently superseded by the Regulations made by the District Council on the 4th day of September, 1899, under the said Order of 1885.

And whereas under the provision of the Public Health Act, 1875, which incorporates the Markets and Fairs Clauses Act, 1847, the District Council on the 1st day of June, 1911, made a schedule of market tolls, which schedule was approved by the Local Government Board upon the 4th day of July, 1911.

And whereas the Local Board were, and their successors the District Council are, Trustees of certain institutions in the District known as the "Llanelly Athenæum" and the "Nevill Memorial" and the Chairman, ex-Chairman, and Clerk of the District Council are Trustees of a charity affecting the District and known as the "David Morris Charity" as augmented by the charity known as the "Stepney Charity."

And whereas under the provisions of the Llanelly (Local Board) Waterwork Act, 1865, the District Council, upon the 1st day of March, 1909, made regulations for preventing waste, misuse, or contamination of water supplied by the Council.

And whereas the District Council are possessed of a term of 999 years of and in a park or pleasure ground, known as "Parc Howard," situate in the District, and containing an area of about 24½ acres, and the Council made, on the 4th day of November, 1912, byelaws for regulating the user of the park in question, which byelaws were confirmed by the Local Government Board on the 31st day of December, 1912.

And whereas under the provisions of the Public Health Act, 1875, the District Council, on the 4th day of December, 1899, made byelaws with respect to new streets and buildings, which said byelaws were confirmed by the Local Government Board on the 28th day of March, 1900, and did further, under the provisions aforesaid, on the 4th day of November, 1912, make byelaws with respect to new

buildings, which said byelaws were confirmed by the Local Government Board on the 31st day of December, 1912.

And whereas the County Council of Carmarthen have made certain byelaws for the good rule and government of the Administrative County of Carmarthen, and the same are now in force in the Urban District of Llanelly.

And whereas it is intended that arrangements shall be made for the consolidation of the Police Force of the Borough of Llanelly which constituted by Charter with the Police Force of the county of Carmarthen.

And whereas the District Council is a Local Authority within the meaning of the Municipal Corporation Acts, 1882 and 1885.

And whereas this Scheme, before being settled by the Committee of Council, was referred for consideration to His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the Home Department, to the Local Government Board, to the Board of Trade and to the Board of Education.

And whereas it is expedient that a Scheme should be made and settled containing the provisions hereinafter set forth.

Now, therefore, pursuant to the Municipal Corporation Acts, 1882 and 1885, and every other power enabling them in that behalf, the Committee of Council have settled a Scheme containing the provisions herein, and do hereby direct, order and declare as follows:—

This Scheme may be cited for all purposes as "The Borough of Llanelly Scheme, 1913."

The Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough of Llanelly are in this Scheme referred to as "The Corporation."

This Scheme, when confirmed, shall come into operation on the day of the first meeting of the Council of the Municipal Borough, created by the said Charter, and this Scheme shall be construed and applied as if it had been dated and confirmed by Parliament or Order in Council on the day before the day of the said first meeting, and everything thereunder shall be done and had accordingly. This date is hereinafter referred to as "the commencement of this Scheme." So far as may be necessary this Scheme shall operate retrospectively.

From and after the commencement of this Scheme the Municipal Borough, created by the said Charter, shall be placed within the jurisdiction of the Corporation acting by the Council of the Borough as the Sanitary Authority of the said Borough.

The District Council, their powers, duties, rights, obligations, and privileges, shall continue and be deemed to have continued to exist until the commencement of this Scheme, unaffected in any manner whatsoever by the grant of the said Charter or the creation of the said Borough. From and after the commencement of this Scheme the District Council shall be, and the same is hereby abolished, and the powers, duties, rights, obligations and privileges thereof shall cease and determine.

All the jurisdiction, powers, trusts, duties and property vested in or possessed by the District Council, or by any person or body in trust for them, or any of their members, as such (and not otherwise dealt with or trans-

ferred by or under any part of this Scheme) shall vest in the Corporation, and shall be exercised, held and applied for the municipal and public purposes of the said Borough.

All duties and liabilities which immediately before the commencement of this Scheme attached to and were enforceable against the District Council or the property thereof, shall attach to and be enforceable against the Corporation or the property thereof.

Any investigation, legal proceeding or remedy in respect of any debt, liability, penalty or forfeiture due to, or incurred by, or on behalf of, the District Council before the commencement of this Scheme may be continued, prosecuted or enforced by or against the Corporation.

From and after the commencement of this Scheme the Mayor, ex-Mayor, and Town Clerk of the said Borough, shall be, and act as, the Trustees of the David Morris' Charity as augmented by the Stepney Charity, in lieu and instead of the Chairman, ex-Chairman, and Clerk of the District Council.

The term "property" in this Scheme means and includes all property real and personal, and all things in action and all rights of common and commonable rights and rights to toll, and all franchises, privileges, and rights which have any pecuniary value, and all charters, records, deeds, books and documents, and all rights and all claims to relief and all rights to avoid contracts or otherwise, and includes any estate or interest legal or equitable in or in respect of any property so defined.

The District Fund and General District Rate of the Borough of Llanelly shall for all purposes whatsoever (subject to the provisions of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882, with respect to the Borough Fund and Borough Rate and Watch Rate respectively) take the place of and be substituted for the District Fund and General District Rate respectively of the District Council, and all sums of money respectively payable to, from, or out of, and all liabilities charged upon or attaching to the District Fund and General District Rate of the said Urban District shall (subject as aforesaid) be paid to, from, or out of, and shall be charged upon the said District Fund and General District Rate of the said borough respectively.

All the rights, interests, powers, property, privileges, liabilities, or obligations vested in or attached to the District Council under "The Public Health Acts"; "47 George III, Session 2, chapter 107"; "The Burry Navigation and Llanelly Harbour Act, 1858"; "the Local Government Supplemental Act, 1861"; "the Local Government Supplemental Act, 1863, No. 2"; "the Llanelly Harbour Act, 1864"; "the Llanelly (Local Board) Waterwork Act, 1865"; "the Llanelly Harbour Improvement Act, 1868"; "the Llanelly Gas Act, 1874"; "the Llanelly Harbour Act, 1878"; "the Llanelly Local Board Act, 1888"; "the Llanelly (Local Board) Waterworks Act, 1891"; "the Llanelly Electric Lighting Order, 1891," as confirmed by "the Electric Lighting Orders Confirmation (No. 4) Act, 1891"; "the Local Government Board's Provisional Order Confirmation (No. 3) Act, 1893"; "the Llanelly Harbour Act, 1896"; "the Llanelly Harbour Act,

1901"; "the Llanelly Harbour Act, 1904"; "the Llanelly Gas Act, 1908"; "the Llanelly Waterworks Act, 1909"; "the Llanelly Harbour Act, 1910"; "the Local Government Supplemental Act, 1865 (No. 5)"; "the Tramways Orders Confirmation (No. 1) Act, 1880"; "the Public Libraries Acts, 1892 to 1901"; "the Great Western Railway (General Powers) Act, 1898"; "the Llanelly and District Light Railways Order, 1907"; "the Llanelly and District Light Railways (Revival and Extension of Powers) Order, 1910"; "the Local Government Board's Provisional Orders Confirmation (No. 6) Act, 1912," or under any other Statute, Order, Byelaw, or Regulation; shall pass to, devolve upon, be exercisable by or against, vested in or attached to the Corporation acting by the Council as the Sanitary Authority of the borough, and from and after the commencement of this Scheme, the Corporation shall be and continue the legal successors of the Urban District Council of Llanelly for all purposes. The Town Clerk of the borough shall be substituted for and perform the duties of the Clerk to the District Council.

Any rules and regulations under the Public Health Act, 1875; the Llanelly (Local Board) Waterwork Act, 1865; the Tramways Act, 1870; and the Dairies, Cowsheds, and Milkshops Order of 1885; the Order made by the Local Government Board on the 21st day of January, 1899, under Section 33 of the Local Government Act, 1894, and any Byelaws, and any table of fees and charges, and any Schedule of Market Tolls in force within the Urban District of Llanelly at the commencement of this Scheme, shall, unless duly repealed, revoked or varied, continue in force and have operation in the borough in like manner and with like effect as if the Corporation, acting by the Council and their officers, and the borough, were referred to therein instead of the Local Board or the District Council (as the case may be) and their officers, and the District.

The Byelaws for the good rule and government of the Administrative County of Carmarthen, so far as they are in force in the Urban District of Llanelly, shall continue in force and be enforced within the Municipal Borough of Llanelly until the expiration of two years from the commencement of this Scheme, or until other Byelaws for good rule and government made by the Corporation shall have come into force, whichever shall first occur.

As soon as may be convenient after the commencement of this Scheme, the Council of the borough shall prepare and submit to the Board of Education a Scheme for an Education Committee for the borough, in accordance with the provisions of Section 17 of the Education Act, 1902.

Until such Scheme shall have been approved by the Board of Education, the members of the Education Committee of the District Council who are in office immediately before the commencement of this Scheme shall be deemed to have been appointed, and shall be the Education Committee for the Borough of Llanelly.

As soon as the Scheme of the Borough Council shall have been approved by the Board of Education, the Education Committee appointed by the District Council shall be dissolved and cease to exist,

SAVING FOR RATES, ETC.

Notwithstanding the incorporation of the borough and the provisions of this Scheme, all rates, assessments, compositions, charges, mortgages, contracts, leases, conveyances, deeds, documents, acts, matters, and things made, entered into, or done before the commencement of this Scheme, by, to, or with reference to the District Council, shall be as good, valid and effectual to all intents and purposes whatsoever for, against and with reference to the Corporation as if the same had been done, entered into, or done by, to or with reference to the Corporation instead of the District Council, and may be proceeded on or enforced in the same manner in all respects as if the Corporation, instead of the District Council, had been party or privy to the same and had been named or referred to therein.

In case any officer of the District Council who shall have been employed by the District Council shall not be employed by the Council of the said borough, nor offered by the said Council a position in their employ of a similar character and of an equal value to that formerly held by him, he shall be entitled to be paid by way of compensation for the loss of his position out of the funds of, or under the control of, the Corporation acting by the Council as the Sanitary Authority for the said borough, and the amount to be paid in each case shall be determined in accordance with the provisions of Section 120 of the Local Government Act, 1888, and Sub-sections (1) to (7) inclusive of that Section, shall apply as if they formed part of this Scheme, with the substitution of the words "Borough Council" for "County Council," and "this Scheme" for "this Act," and with such other modifications as are necessary to make them applicable hereto.

Provided nevertheless, that if any such officer be so employed by the said Corporation and discharged by them (otherwise than for misconduct) within four years of the commencement of this Scheme he shall be entitled to compensation in the same manner as if he had not been employed by the said Corporation. Provided that the term "Officer" shall include only persons employed by the said Council whose salaries or emoluments are payable at intervals of not less than one month and no other persons.

The accounts of the District Council and their officers shall be (as soon as conveniently may be) audited by the District Auditor in like manner, and subject to the like powers, duties, provisions and right of appeal, as if the Charter had not been granted, and the provisions of Sections 247 and 250 of "The Public Health Act, 1875," as amended by "The District Auditors Act, 1879," and any regulations duly issued by the Local Government Board with respect to the audit of accounts of Local Boards or Urban District Councils, and of their officers, shall apply to such audit; and the provisions of this Scheme, with respect to the District Council, shall be construed so as to admit of such exceptions as may be necessary to enable such audit to be duly made, but such exceptions shall be strictly limited in time, extent, character, and operation to the purposes of such audit; any money certified to be due from any person by the District Auditor at such audit shall be paid by such person to the Treasurer of the Borough.

RULES OF THE SUPREME COURT.

The following draft Rules are published pursuant to the Rules Publication Act, 1893:—

RULES OF THE SUPREME COURT.

PAYMENT INTO COURT.

ORDER XXII.

1. Where any action is brought to recover a debt or damages or in an Admiralty action, any defendant may, before or at the time of delivering his defence, or at any later time by leave of the Court or a Judge, pay into Court a sum of money by way of satisfaction, which shall be taken to admit the claim or cause of action in respect of which the payment is made; or he may, with a defence denying liability (except in actions or counterclaims for libel or slander), pay money into Court which shall be subject to the provisions of Rule 6. Provided that in an action on a bond under the Statute 8 and 9 Will. III, c. 11, payment into Court shall be admissible to particular breaches only and not to the whole action.

2. Payment into Court shall be signified in the defence, and the claim or cause of action in satisfaction of which such payment is made shall be specified therein.

3. With the defence setting up a tender before action, the sum of money alleged to have been tendered must be brought into Court.

4. If the defendant pays money into Court before delivering his defence he shall serve upon the plaintiff a notice specifying both the fact that he has paid in such money, and also the claim or cause of action in respect of which such payment has been made. Such notice shall be in the Form No. 3 in Appendix B, with such variations as circumstances may require.

5. In the following cases of payment into Court under this Order, viz.:—

(a) When payment into Court is made before delivery of defence;

(b) When the liability of the defendant, in respect of the claim or cause of action in satisfaction of which the payment into Court is made, is not denied in the defence;

(c) When payment into Court is made with a defence setting up a tender of the sum paid,

the money paid into Court shall be paid out to the plaintiff on his request, or to his solicitor on the plaintiff's written authority, unless the Court or a Judge shall otherwise order.

6. When the liability of the defendant, in respect of the claim or cause of action in satisfaction of which the payment into Court has been made, is denied in the defence the following Rules shall apply:—

(a) The plaintiff may within the time limited in Rule 7 accept, in satisfaction of the claim or cause of action in respect of which the payment into Court has been made, the sum so paid in, in which case he shall be entitled to have the money paid out to him as hereinafter provided, notwithstanding the defendant's denial of liability, whereupon all further proceedings in respect of such claim, or cause of action, except as to costs, shall be stayed, or the plaintiff may refuse to accept the money in satisfaction and reply accordingly, in which case the

money shall remain in Court subject to the provisions hereinafter mentioned.

(b) If the plaintiff accepts the money so paid in he shall after service of such notice in the Form No. 4 in Appendix B as is in Rule 7 mentioned, or after delivery of a reply accepting the money, be entitled to have the money paid out to himself on request or to his solicitor on the plaintiff's written authority unless the Court or a Judge shall otherwise order.

(c) If the plaintiff does not accept in satisfaction of the claim or cause of action in respect of which the payment into Court has been made, the sum so paid in, but proceeds with the action in respect of such claim or cause of action or any part thereof, the money shall remain in Court and be subject to the order of the Court or a Judge and shall not be paid out of Court except in pursuance of an order. Such order may be made at any time before or at or after the trial of the action. If the plaintiff proceeds with the action in respect of such claim or cause of action or any part thereof and recovers less than the amount paid into Court the amount paid in shall, subject to the set off of costs hereinafter provided for, be applied, so far as is necessary, in satisfaction of the plaintiff's claim, and of any costs awarded to the plaintiff, and the balance (if any) shall under such order be repaid or credited to the defendant. If the defendant succeeds in respect of such claim or cause of action the whole amount shall under such order be repaid or credited to him.

The order for payment out of the money so in Court shall not, except on special grounds, be made until after the taxation of the costs of the action, and the money shall then be paid out to the party or parties entitled after setting off damages and the costs allowed to either party and after proper credits have been given for all sums recovered by or ordered to be paid to either of the parties in the action or counterclaim if any. A plaintiff who does not accept money paid into Court with a denial of liability but proceeds to trial and does not recover more than the sum paid into Court shall not be allowed his costs of the issues as to liability unless the Judge is satisfied that there were reasonable grounds for not accepting the sum paid in.

7. The plaintiff, when payment into Court is made before delivery of defence, may within seven days after the receipt of notice of such payment, or when such payment is first signified in a defence, may, before reply, or where no reply is ordered, within ten days from delivery of defence or the last of the defences, accept in satisfaction of the claim or cause of action in respect of which such payment has been made the sum so paid in, in which case he shall give notice to the defendant in the Form No. 4 in Appendix B., and shall be at liberty, in case the entire claim or cause of action is thereby satisfied, to tax his costs after the expiration of four days from the service of such notice, unless the Court or a judge shall otherwise order, and in case of non-payment of the costs within 48 hours after such taxation to sign judgment for his costs so taxed.

8. Where money is paid into Court in two or more actions which are consolidated, and the

plaintiff proceeds to trial in one, and fails, the money paid in and the costs in all the actions shall be dealt with under this Order in the same manner as in the action tried.

8A. When in an action against two or more defendants money is paid into Court by one or some but not all of them in respect of a cause of action for which the defendants are sued jointly and the plaintiff accepts the sum so paid in he shall in addition to giving the notice in the Form 4 in Appendix B., give notice to the other defendants of his having accepted the money so paid in, and thereupon all further proceedings in respect of the joint cause of action, except as to costs, shall be stayed and the Court or Judge may upon application by any party make such order as may appear to be just as to the costs of the plaintiff and of the defendants (other than the defendant or defendants who has made the payment into Court) incurred in respect of the cause of action satisfied by such payment. If the plaintiff does not accept the money so paid in by one of two or more defendants in respect of a joint cause of action, but proceeds to trial and recovers less than the amount paid into Court, the Court or Judge may make such order as may appear to be just in respect of the costs of the joint cause of action as between the plaintiff and the defendants other than the defendant or defendants who has or have made the payment.

9. A plaintiff or any person made defendant to a counterclaim may, in answer to a counterclaim, pay money into Court in satisfaction thereof, subject to the like conditions as to costs and otherwise as upon payment into Court by a defendant.

10. Where money is paid into Court in the King's Bench Division under the certificate of a master or associate, such payment must be expressly authorised in such certificate.

11. Money paid into Court under an order of the Court or a Judge or certificate of a master or associate shall not be paid out of Court except in pursuance of an order of the Court or a Judge. Provided that, where before the delivery of defence, money has been paid into Court by the defendant pursuant to an order under the provisions of Order XIV, he may (unless the Court or a Judge shall otherwise order) by his pleading appropriate the whole or any part of such money, and any additional payment if necessary, to the whole or any specified portion of the plaintiff's claim, or if he pleads a tender may appropriate the whole or any part of the money in Court as payment into Court of the money alleged to have been tendered; and the money so appropriated shall thereupon be deemed to be money paid into Court pursuant to the preceding Rules of this Order relating to money paid into Court or money paid into Court with a plea of tender as the case may be, and shall be subject in all respects thereto.

ORDER XXXIX.

Rules 1 to 8 (both inclusive) of Order XXXIX of the Rules of the Supreme Court, 1883, are hereby repealed, and the following Rules shall stand in lieu thereof, viz.:—

NEW TRIAL.

Application for New Trial to be made to Court of Appeal.

1. Every application for a new trial or to set aside a verdict, finding, or judgment where

there has been a trial with or without a jury shall be made to the Court of Appeal.

On hearing of Application Court of Appeal to have Same Powers as upon hearing of an Appeal.

2. Every such application shall be brought before the Court of Appeal in like manner as an Appeal, and on the hearing of such application the Court of Appeal shall have all such powers as are exercisable by it upon the hearing of an Appeal.

Mode of Application for New Trial, &c.

3. Every such application shall be made by notice of motion. The notice of motion shall state whether the whole or part only, and if part only what part, of the verdict, finding, or judgment is complained of; and when there has been a trial with a jury shall also state the grounds of the application, but where there has been a trial without a jury it shall not be necessary in the notice of motion to ask specifically for a new trial or to state the grounds of the application.

Time for Service of Notice of Motion.

4. The notice of motion shall be a fourteen days' notice, and shall be served within six weeks after the trial, or where the trial has been adjourned for further consideration, within six weeks after judgment has been given on such further consideration.

Amendment of Notice of Motion.

5. The notice of motion may be amended at any time in such manner and upon such terms as the Court of Appeal shall think fit.

New Trial not to be granted on Ground of Misdirection, &c., unless Substantial Wrong or Miscarriage thereby occasioned.

6. A new trial shall not be granted on the ground of misdirection or of the improper admission or rejection of evidence, or because the verdict of the jury was not taken upon a question which the Judge at the trial was not asked to leave to them, unless in the opinion of the Court of Appeal some substantial wrong or miscarriage has been thereby occasioned; and if it appears to the Court of Appeal that such wrong or miscarriage affects part only of the matter in controversy or some or one only of the parties, the Court of Appeal may give final judgment as to part thereof or as to some or one only of the parties and direct a new trial as to the other part only or as to the other party or parties.

New Trial may be ordered on any one question.

7. A new trial may be ordered on any question without interfering with the finding or decision upon any other question.

New Trial not to be granted on Wrong Rulings as to Stamps.

8. A new trial shall not be granted by reason of the ruling of any Judge that the stamp upon any document is sufficient, or that the document does not require a stamp.

COUNTY OF HERTFORD.

KNEBWORTH.

To the County Council of Hertford:—
And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by sub-section (1) of Section 9 of the Motor Car Act, 1903 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act"), it is enacted that, within any limits or place referred to in Regulations made by Us, the Local Government Board, with a view to the safety of the public, on the application of the local authority of the area in which the limits or place are situate, a person shall not drive a motor car at a speed exceeding ten miles per hour;

And whereas the County Council of Hertford, having made application to Us to make a Regulation in pursuance of the said sub-section putting the above-mentioned provisions of that sub-section in force within the limits comprising parts of certain roads situate in Knebworth, in the county of Hertford, We directed a Local Inquiry to be held into the matter by one of Our Inspectors, and the Inquiry was held accordingly, and Report has been made to Us thereon:

NOW THEREFORE, in pursuance of the powers given to Us in that behalf, We do, by this Our Order, make the following Regulations:—

ARTICLE I.—The provisions of sub-section (1) of Section 9 of the Act with respect to the driving of a motor car at a speed not exceeding ten miles per hour shall apply and have effect within the limits comprising so much of the Great North Road as extends from a point 100 yards north of its junction with the road leading to Knebworth Station to a point 50 yards south of its junction with Swangley Lane.

ARTICLE II.—These Regulations shall come into operation on the seventh day of July, one thousand nine hundred and thirteen.
