**IT is this day Ordered by Her Majesty in Council. That the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Treasury do prepare an Advertisement to be Inserted in next Mondays Gazette, to give Notice, That the Commission and Draft of a Charter for the Corporation of the Bank of England, is Approved and Signed by Her Majesty in Order to pass the Great Seal of England.**

**In pursuance of the foregoing Orders, These are to give Notice, That the Warrant for the said Commission, Signed by Her Majesty, will forthwith be passed under the Great Seal of England, with a Schedule thereunto annexed, containing the substance of the Charter, which is to pass in like manner immediately after the first day of August next, if the Sum of Twelve Hundred Thousand Pounds, or one Moiety, or more thereof, shall be Subscribed by that time, or sooner if the whole Twelve Hundred Thousand Pounds shall be sooner Subscribed. And that Their Majesties Commissioners, will, within very few days, meet at Mercers Chappel in Cheapside, London, to receive, as well the said Subscriptions, as the first Fourth part of the Money which shall be**

**Genoa, May 16.** The Governor of Milan arrived here yesterday, being accompanied by the Count de Breiner, Commissary General of the Emperors Forces in Italy; His Excellency has been Complimented by 6 Gentlemen in the Name of the Republick, and is lodged in the Palace of the Duke de San Pietro. And from hence he intends to go to Final to view the Garrison and Fortifications of that place. A considerable Supply of Money has been lately remitted hither from Spain, for the Service of the State of Milan.

**Venice, May 21.** The Count de Steinau, who is going to serve this Republick as General of their Land Forces in the Levant, delights to pass thither with the next Convoy, which may be ready to Sail towards the end of this month; About which time, the Popes Gallies, and those of Malta, are expected at Missina, where they are to joyn, and to proceed together to the Levant.

**Turin, May 24.** The Marquis de Leguerez is come hither from Final, to concert with his Royal Highness several Matters relating to the Campaign; and to Morrow his Excellency returns to Milan; From whence the Spanish Forces will in few days begin their march towards Piemont. The Vaudois defeated the last week a French Party in the Valley of St. Martin, of whom several were killed, 22 taken, and about 70 drowned in a River which they endeavoured to pass; and since that they have cutoff another French Party, that was conducting the Baggage of some French Officers to Pignerol. The French Troops are drawing together about Susa.

**Warsaw, May 20.** The last Letters from the Court at Zolkiew give an account, that the Treaty of Marriage between the Elector of Bavaria and the Princess of Poland, was concluded, and that the Baron de Meyer, his Electoral Highness's Envoy Extraordinary, was on his departure from thence, in order to his return to Brussels. The same Letters say, that the ceremonies of the Marriage are to be performed in this City about the beginning of August; and that the King and Queen of Poland intend to accompany the Princess as far as Dantzicke, where she will be received by the Ambassadors of his Electoral Highness, and conducted by Sea to Flanders.

**Vienna, May 26.** The Rendezvous of the Imperial Forces in Hungary is appointed to be at Bata on the River Drave, where as we are assured by the Advices from those parts, the whole Army will be assembled by the middle of the next month. General Caprara, who is to Command them this Campaign, is shortly expected from Piedmont; and in the mean time, General Staremberg, Governor of Eszacke, has the care of ordering all matters, with relation to the incamping of the Troops as they arrive, and the making the necessary Provision for them. The Letters from Peter Waradin advise, That several Turkish Barks and Gallies, who are to be employed on the Danube, were come to Belgrade; That 4 or 5000 Turks were arrived in the Neighbourhood of that place; and that the whole Ottoman Army would be in the Field by the end of June.

**Halsbrun, June 1.** The Confederate Forces continue to draw together near this place; Most of the Foot lies at Gradach, and the Horse at Vabingen on the River Ens; Three Regiments of the Elector Palatine's Troops are come to Gundelshheim, two hours march from hence; and these, with several other Regiments, who are on their march, will joyn the Army in few days, which will then pass the Neckar, and march to the Camp that is marked out for them at Simzheim, in order whereunto several Bridges are laid over that River. The French Troops that are to act on the Rhine are marching to their Camp near Neustadt, where the Marechal de Lorge was, by our last advice, daily expected: Monsieur de Melas lies with 5000 French at Aflrip near the Rhine.

**Frankfort, June 2.** The Forces of the Landgrave of Hesse are on their march, and part of them are already arrived in the Country of *Wetteravia*: Those of *Saxony* expect every hour Orders to leave their Quarters, and to join the Confederate Army; 'Tis said that his Electoral Highness has made choice of the Margrave of *Bavaria* to Command them.

**Dublin, June 4.** On Saturday last arrived here the *Soesdyke* Yacht, Captain *Phineas Pett* Commander, from *Chester*, who brought over the Lord Chancellor *Porter*, the Lord Chief Justice *Reynell*, and several Officers belonging to the new Regiments now raising here. The day before there came up with them a Ship under *Ostend* Colours, carrying 14 Guns and 6 Patereroes; but soon after she put up French Colours, and bearing down upon the Yacht, as if she would have boarded her, poured into her a Volley of great and small Shot. Capt. *Pett*, who had put every thing into a readiness to receive the Enemy, staid till they had first fired, and then plied them with five Guns he had brought to bear upon them, and with all the small Shot he could make, both of Seamen and Passengers, which so gauled the Privateer, (several of whose Men were seen to drop) that she tackt and stood away right before the Wind: The Yacht having lost in this Rencontre but 3 Men, who were killed by one great Shot in the Stair-Room Yesterday Morning the *Monmouth* and *Soesdyke* Yachts, with an English Privateer of 18 Guns, who was in this Harbor, went out to look after the said French Privateer.

**Falmouth, June 4.** On the 2d instant in the evening came into this Port the *Kent* of *London*, in 7 Weeks from *Nevis*. Yesterday was brought in here by Their Majesties Ship the *Portsmouth*, a French Privateer, of 12 Guns, called the *Joyeuse* of *St. Malo*; who was taken the 31st past; and two days before the *Portsmouth* retook a Ship of *Bristol*, and sent her to *Plimouth*. The same day came in the *Joseph* Brigantine, *John Howard* Master, from *Guinea*; from whence he came about 3 Months ago, and says, That he then heard but of one French Man of Wars being on that Coast, who had retaken *Senegal*. Last night came into Port, the *William* and *Hannibal* Privateers of *Flushing* from *Cruising*.

**Plimouth, June 5.** The Fleet passed by this Port yesterday to the Westward; The same day came in the *Adventure* with a French Prize, laden with Salt for *Dunkirke*.

**Bristol, June 6.** This day arrived here the *Talent* of this place from the *Barbadoes*; having been 6 Weeks in her passage: That Island was very Healthy when she came away.

**Yarmouth, June 8.** On Wednesday and yesterday morning passed through our Road above 400 Sail of laden Colliers for *London*, under Convoy of two Men of War.

**Portsmouth, June 9.** This morning sailed from *St. Helens* the Fleet of Merchant Ships bound to the *West Indies*, under the Convoy of several Men of War; and with them Colonel *Ruffel* takes his Passage; who is going to his Government of *Barbadoes*.

**London, June 9.** The great Fleet of Colliers is arrived in the River.

**Whitehall, June 10.** We have an account from Captain *Kiggins*, Commander of Their Majesties Ship the *Muntague*, who was cruising to the Northward with the *Oxford* and *Henry* Prize, that they had taken a French Ship of 250 Tun, and 28 Guns, called the *Tyger* of *Dunkirk*, and bound thither with Corn from *Dantzicke*. And by Letters from *Harwich* of yesterday, we are informed,

That the said Prize was brought in there by the *Henry* Prize, together with a small Vessel bound to *Dunkirke* from the Northward.
