At the Court at *Buckingham Palace*, the 16th day of *February*, 1917.

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by Section 21 of the Pluralities Act, 1838, after reciting that, "Whereas from the increase of population, or from other circumstances, it may be expedient that two or more Benefices which have been heretofore united, or which may be hereafter united, under the provisions of this Act should be disunited," it is, amongst other things, enacted "that when two or more Benefices shall have been united, or may be hereafter united into one Benefice, and with respect to his own Diocese it shall appear to the Archbishop of the Province, or the Bishop of any Diocese shall represent to the said Archbishop of the Province, that one or more of the Benefices within his Diocese, of which such United Benefice shall consist, may be separated therefrom with advantage to the interests of religion, the said Archbishop shall inquire into the circumstances of the case, and, if on such Inquiry, it shall appear to him that such union may be usefully dissolved, so far as respects such Benefice or Benefices, he shall, six weeks at least before certifying such Inquiry to His Majesty as hereinafter directed,

cause, with respect to his own Diocese a Statement in writing of the facts, and in all other cases a Copy in writing of the aforesaid Representation to be affixed on or near the principal outer door of the Church or in some public and conspicuous place in each of the Benefices forming part of the United Benefice, with notice to any person or persons interested that he, she, or they may, within such six weeks, show cause in writing under his, her, or their hands to the said Archbishop against any such Disunion, and, if no sufficient cause be shown within such time, the Archbishop shall certify the Inquiry and Consent, when the Patron's Consent is necessary, to His Majesty in Council, and thereupon it shall be lawful for His Majesty to issue an Order for separating such last-mentioned Benefice or Benefices from such United Benefice, and for declaring the rights of patronage of the several Patrons, if there be more than one Patron, and such Order shall be registered in the Registry of the Diocese to which such United Benefice shall belong, which Order the Registrar of such Diocese, immediately on the receipt thereof, is hereby required to register accordingly, and thereupon immediately, if such United Benefice shall be then vacant, otherwise on the first avoidance thereof, such Union shall be *ipso facto* dissolved, so far only as regards such Benefice or Benefices so proposed.

to be separated from such United Benefice, but in all other respects shall remain in full force and effect, and thenceforward such last-mentioned Benefice or Benefices shall be and be deemed and taken to be a separate and distinct Benefice or Benefices to all intents and purposes whatever as if no such Union had taken place, and the Patron or Patrons thereof shall and may according to the terms of such Order present or nominate thereto respectively, and so, from time to time, upon each and every avoidance of the same: Provided always, that no Benefices which have been united for more than sixty years before the passing of this Act shall be disunited without the consent in writing of the Patron or Patrons thereof:—

And whereas by Section 23 of the said Act it is further enacted that “whenever two or more Benefices which have at any time been united into one Benefice shall be disunited and become separate Benefices under the provisions of this Act, whether the Order for Disunion shall extend to the whole number of Benefices of which such United Benefice consisted or to one or more of such Benefices only, it shall be lawful for His Majesty in Council, on the recommendation of the Archbishop of the Province, with the Consent of the Patron or Patrons of such Benefices respectively, (such Consent to be signified in writing under the hands of such Patron or Patrons) to assign and attach such portion of the Glebe Lands, Tithes, Moduses, Rent-Charges, or other Endowments or Emoluments belonging to or arising or accruing within the limits of such United Benefice to each of such Benefices respectively as to His Majesty in Council shall seem fit notwithstanding such proportion of Glebe Lands, Tithes, Rent-Charges, Moduses, or other Endowments or Emoluments, or any part thereof, may not arise or accrue within the limits of the Benefice to which the same shall be so assigned and attached as aforesaid, or may not have belonged thereto, and also to divide and apportion between such Benefices all such charges and outgoings as before the Disunion thereof were imposed upon the whole United Benefice:—

And whereas the Right Reverend Edwyn, Lord Bishop of Southwell, hath made a Representation in writing dated the 5th day of June, 1916, to the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Randall Thomas, Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, as follows:—

“I, Edwyn, Bishop of Southwell, do hereby represent to Your Grace that it appears to me that the Disunion of the United Benefice consisting of the Vicarage of Ault Hucknall and the Vicarage of Heath, both in the County of Derby, and in the Diocese of Southwell, by the separation of the Vicarage of Ault Hucknall from the Vicarage of Heath, may be made with advantage to the interests of religion. “EDWYN, SOUTHWELL.”

And whereas, on the 6th day of June, 1916, the said Archbishop inquired into the circumstances of the case:

And whereas, on the 7th day of October, 1916, the said Archbishop certified to His Majesty in Council, as follows, that is to say:—

“We, the undersigned, Randall Thomas, Archbishop of the Province of Canterbury, Primate of all England and Metropolitan, do hereby certify to Your Majesty in Council:—

“That the Right Reverend Edwyn, Lord

Bishop of Southwell, as Bishop of the Diocese within which is situate the United Benefice consisting of the Vicarage of Ault Hucknall and the Vicarage of Heath, both in the County of Derby, having represented unto us that the Disunion of the said United Benefice by the separation of the Vicarage of Ault Hucknall from the Vicarage of Heath may be made with advantage to the interests of religion, we inquired into the circumstances of the case:

“That on such Inquiry it appeared to us that such Union might be usefully dissolved, and that the Most Noble Victor Christian William, Duke of Devonshire, K.G., being the Patron or Person entitled to present to the said United Benefice if the same was now vacant, consents to the proposed Disunion:

“That six weeks and upwards before certifying such Inquiry and Consent to Your Majesty in Council we caused a Copy in writing of the aforesaid Representation of the said Lord Bishop to be affixed on the principal outer door of each of the Parish Churches of the said United Benefice, with notice to any person or persons interested that he, she, or they might, within such six weeks, show cause in writing under his, her, or their hand or hands to us, the said Archbishop, against such Disunion, and no such cause has been shown:

“The Representation of the said Lord Bishop of Southwell, our Inquiry into the circumstances of the case, the Statement of Circumstances in reply thereto, the Consent in writing of the Patron, and the copies of the Representation and Notice before mentioned, are hereunto annexed:

“And we do hereby certify the Inquiry and Consent aforesaid to Your Majesty in Council, to the intent that Your Majesty in Council may, in case Your Majesty in Council shall think fit so to do, make and issue an Order for separating the said Vicarage of Ault Hucknall from the said Vicarage of Heath, and that each Benefice when disunited shall retain its own original endowments and emoluments, and bear its own charges and outgoings.

“RANDALL, CANTUAR.”

Now, therefore, His Majesty in Council, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the said United Benefice consisting of the Vicarage of Ault Hucknall and the Vicarage of Heath, situate in the County of Derby, and Diocese of Southwell shall be disunited by separating the said Vicarage of Ault Hucknall from the said Vicarage of Heath.

And His Majesty in Council, by and with the advice of His said Council, is further pleased, on the recommendation of the Archbishop, with the Consent of the Patron of the said Benefices, to assign and attach to each of such Benefices respectively its own original endowments and emoluments, and to direct that each Benefice shall bear its own charges and outgoings.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by Section 26 of the Pluralities Act, 1838, after reciting that “Whereas in some instances Tithings, Ham-

lets, Chapelries, and other Places or Districts may be separated from the Parishes or Mother Churches to which they belong with great advantage, and Places altogether extra-parochial may, in some instances, with advantage be annexed to Parishes or Districts to which they are contiguous, or be constituted Separate Parishes for ecclesiastical purposes," it is, amongst other things, enacted, "That when with respect to his own Diocese it shall appear to the Archbishop of the Province, or when the Bishop of any Diocese shall represent to the said Archbishop, that any such Tithing, Hamlet, Chapelry, Place or District within the Diocese of such Archbishop, or the Diocese of such Bishop, as the case may be, may be advantageously separated from any Parish or Mother Church, and either be constituted a Separate Benefice by itself or be united to any other Parish to which it may be more conveniently annexed, or to any other adjoining Tithing, Hamlet, Chapelry, Place or District, parochial or extra-parochial, so as to form a Separate Parish or Benefice, or that any Extra-Parochial Place may with advantage be annexed to any Parish to which it is contiguous, or be constituted a Separate Parish for ecclesiastical purposes; and the said Archbishop, or Bishop, shall draw up a Scheme in writing (the Scheme of such Bishop to be transmitted to the said Archbishop for his consideration) describing the mode in which it appears to him that the alteration may best be effected, and how the changes consequent on such alteration in respect to Ecclesiastical Jurisdiction, Glebe Lands, Tithes, Rent Charges, and other Ecclesiastical Dues, Rates and Payments, and in respect to Patronage and Rights to Pews, may be made with justice to all parties interested; and if the Patron or Patrons of the Benefice or Benefices to be affected by such alteration shall consent in writing under his or their hands to such Scheme, or to such modification thereof, as the said Archbishop may approve, and the said Archbishop shall, on full consideration and inquiry, be satisfied with any such Scheme, or modification thereof, and shall certify the same and such Consent as aforesaid, by his Report to His Majesty in Council, it shall be lawful for His Majesty in Council to make an Order for carrying such Scheme or modification thereof, as the case may be, into effect: "

And whereas the Right Reverend Edgar Charles Sumner, Lord Bishop of Gloucester, hath made a Representation in writing, dated the 4th day of September, 1916, to the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Randall Thomas, Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, as follows:—

"I, Edgar Charles Sumner, by Divine Permission Bishop of Gloucester, do, in pursuance of the 26th Section of the Pluralities Act, 1838, hereby represent to Your Grace as follows:—

"1. There is in the City of Gloucester and County of Gloucester, and within my Diocese of Gloucester, the Vicarage of Barnwood, the Parish whereof contains according to the Census of 1911 a population of 1,462; the net annual value of this Benefice arising from tithe-rent-charge, glebe rents, income payable by the Ecclesiastical Commissioners, and fees and other sources, is £300 or thereabouts:

"2. There is also in the same City and County, and within my said Diocese, the Vicarage of Saint Catharine, the Parish whereof contains according to the Census of

1911 a population of 3,704; the net annual value of this Benefice arising from tithe-rent-charge, glebe rents, income payable by the Ecclesiastical Commissioners, and fees and other sources, is £292 or thereabouts:

"3. There is also in the said City of Gloucester and County of Gloucester, and within my said Diocese, the Perpetual Curacy of Saint Mark, the Parish whereof contains according to the Census of 1911 a population of 3,306; the net annual value of this Benefice arising from income payable by the Ecclesiastical Commissioners, and fees and other sources, is £296 or thereabouts:

"4. There is also in the same City and County, and within my said Diocese, the Perpetual Curacy of All Saints, the Parish whereof contains according to the Census of 1911 a population of 6690; the net annual value of this Benefice arising from income payable by the Ecclesiastical Commissioners and Queen Anne's Bounty, and fees and other sources, is £308 or thereabouts:

"5. There is also in the City of Gloucester and County of Gloucester, and within my said Diocese, the Vicarage of Saint Mary de Lode with Holy Trinity (hereinafter called "Saint Mary de Lode" only), the Parish whereof contains according to the Census of 1911 a population of 3964; the net annual value of this Benefice arising from glebe rents, and income payable by the Ecclesiastical Commissioners, and fees and other sources, is £218 or thereabouts:

"6. There is also in the County of Gloucester, and within my said Diocese, the Vicarage of Hartpury, the Parish whereof contains according to the Census of 1911 a population of 691; the net annual value of this Benefice arising from tithe-rent-charge, and fees and other sources, is £200 or thereabouts:

"7. Certain portions of the said Parish of Barnwood are isolated from it and are situate in the Wotton District, and adjoin the said Parish of Saint Catharine, to the Church of which last-mentioned Parish they are nearer than they are to the Parish Church of Barnwood:

"8. Another small portion of the said Parish of Barnwood is isolated from it and situate in the Sandhurst Road District, and surrounded by the said Parish of Saint Mary de Lode, to the Church of which last-mentioned Parish it is nearer than it is to the Parish Church of Barnwood:

"9. A portion of the said Parish of Barnwood is situate in the Old T-Station District, and adjoins the said Parish of All Saints, to the Church of which last-mentioned Parish it is nearer than it is to the Parish Church of Barnwood:

"10. A portion of the said Parish of Saint Mary de Lode is isolated from it and is situate in the Old T-Station District, and adjoins the said Parish of Barnwood, to the Church of which last-mentioned Parish it is nearer than it is to the Parish Church of Saint Mary de Lode:

"11. Two portions of the said Parish of Saint Mary de Lode are situate in the Heathville Road District and are entirely isolated from the said Parish, and adjoin the said Parish of Saint Mark, to the Church of which last-mentioned Parish they are nearer than they are to the Parish Church of Saint Mary de Lode:

"12. A portion of the said Parish of Saint Catharine is situate in the Denmark Road District and adjoins the said Parish of Saint Mark, from the Church of which last-mentioned Parish it is distant about half a mile:

"13. A portion of the said Parish of Saint Mary de Lode is isolated from it and situate in the Woolridge District, and adjoins the said Parish of Hartpury, to the Church of which last-mentioned Parish it is nearer than it is to the Parish Church of Saint Mary de Lode:

"14. Certain districts, four in number, situate in the said City of Gloucester, and within my said Diocese, are extra-parochial, and adjoin the said Parish of Saint Catharine:

"15. It appears to me that under the provisions of the said Pluralities Act, 1838, the following alterations in the contents of the above-mentioned Parishes may advantageously be made:—

(a) The separation of the Wotton District portions of the said Parish of Barnwood, referred to in the preceding paragraph numbered 7, from the said Parish of Barnwood, and their annexation to the said Parish of Saint Catharine to which they are contiguous.

(b) The separation of the Sandhurst Road District portion of the said Parish of Barnwood, referred to in the preceding paragraph numbered 8, from the said Parish of Barnwood, and its annexation to the said Parish of Saint Mary de Lode to which it is contiguous.

(c) The separation of a portion of the said Parish of Barnwood, situate in the Old T-Station District, and referred to in the preceding paragraph numbered 9, from the said Parish of Barnwood, and its annexation to the said Parish of All Saints to which it is contiguous.

(d) The separation of a portion of the said Parish of Saint Mary de Lode, situate in the Old T-Station District, and referred to in the preceding paragraph numbered 10, from the said Parish of Saint Mary de Lode, and its annexation to the said Parish of Barnwood to which it is contiguous.

(e) The separation of the Heathville Road District portions of the said Parish of Saint Mary de Lode, referred to in the preceding paragraph numbered 11, from the said Parish of Saint Mary de Lode, and their annexation to the said Parish of Saint Mark to which they are contiguous.

(f) The separation of the Denmark Road District portion of the said Parish of Saint Catharine, referred to in the preceding paragraph numbered 12, from the said Parish of Saint Catharine, and its annexation to the said Parish of Saint Mark to which it is contiguous.

(g) The separation of the Woolridge District portion of the said Parish of Saint Mary de Lode, referred to in the preceding paragraph numbered 13, from the said Parish of Saint Mary de Lode, and its annexation to the said Parish of Hartpury to which it is contiguous.

(h) The annexation of the four Extra-Parochial Districts, referred to in the preceding paragraph numbered 14, to the said Parish of Saint Catharine to which they are contiguous.

"16. The Benefice of Barnwood is in the

patronage of the Dean and Chapter of Gloucester.

The Benefice of Saint Catharine is in my patronage as Bishop of Gloucester.

The Benefice of St. Mark is in my patronage as Bishop of Gloucester.

The Benefice of All Saints is in my patronage as Bishop of Gloucester.

The Benefice of Saint Mary de Lode is in the patronage of the Dean and Chapter of Gloucester.

The Benefice of Hartpury is in my patronage as Bishop of Gloucester.

"17. The Reverend Francis Harvie Fowler is the present Incumbent of the Benefice of Barnwood.

The Reverend Samuel Richmond Robertson is the present Incumbent of the Benefice of Saint Catharine.

The Reverend Leonard Augustus Lyne is the present Incumbent of the Benefice of Saint Mark.

The Reverend Aubrey Chastel de Boinville is the present Incumbent of the Benefice of All Saints.

The Reverend William Christian Macklin is the present Incumbent of the Benefice of Saint Mary de Lode.

The Reverend Nathan Jones is the present Incumbent of the Benefice of Hartpury.

"18. Pursuant to the directions contained in the 26th Section of the said Pluralities Act, 1838, I, the said Bishop, have drawn up a Scheme in writing, annexed to this Representation, describing the several Districts so as aforesaid proposed to be annexed to the said Parishes of Saint Catharine, Saint Mary de Lode, All Saints, Barnwood, Saint Mark, and Hartpury, and the mode in which it appears to me the alterations may best be effected, and how the changes consequent thereon in respect of Ecclesiastical Jurisdiction, Glebe Lands, Tithes, Rent Charges, and other Ecclesiastical Dues and Payments, and in Respect of Patronage and Rights to Pews, may be made with full justice to all Parties interested, and I do hereby submit the same to Your Grace, together with the Consents in writing of the said Patrons and Incumbents, to the intent that if Your Grace shall on full consideration and inquiry be satisfied with such Scheme, you may certify the same and such Consents by your Report to His Majesty in Council.

And whereas the said Scheme drawn up by the said Bishop, and the Consents referred to in the said Representation, are as follows:—

"THE SCHEME.

"That certain portions shall be separated from the said Parish of Barnwood, and annexed for ecclesiastical purposes to the contiguous Parish of Saint Catharine. The said portions (seven in number) are delineated and described in *Plan A* hereunto annexed, and therein coloured *yellow* and lettered *A*, and consist of the District known as the Wotton District.

"That a District shall be separated from the said Parish of Barnwood, and annexed for ecclesiastical purposes to the contiguous Parish of Saint Mary de Lode. The said District is delineated and described in *Plan B* hereunto annexed, and therein coloured *yellow* and lettered *B*, and consists of the District known as the Sandhurst Road District.

"That a District shall be separated from the

said Parish of Barnwood, and annexed for ecclesiastical purposes to the contiguous Parish of All Saints. The said District is delineated and described in *Plan C* hereunto annexed, and therein coloured *green* and lettered C, and is part of the District known as the Old T-Station District.

"That a District shall be separated from the said Parish of Saint Mary de Lode, and annexed for ecclesiastical purposes to the contiguous Parish of Barnwood. The said District is delineated and described in *Plan C* hereunto annexed, and therein coloured *violet* and lettered D, and is part of the District known as the Old T-Station District.

"That certain portions shall be separated from the said Parish of Saint Mary de Lode, and annexed for ecclesiastical purposes to the contiguous Parish of Saint Mark. The said portions (two in number) are delineated and described in *Plan D* hereunto annexed, and therein coloured *blue* and lettered E, and consist of the District known as the Heathville Road District.

"That a District shall be separated from the said Parish of Saint Mary de Lode, and annexed for ecclesiastical purposes to the contiguous Parish of Hartpury. The said District is delineated and described in *Plan E* hereunto annexed, and therein coloured *pink* and lettered G, and consists of the District known as the Woolridge District.

"That four Extra-Parochial Districts shall be annexed to the contiguous Parish of Saint Catharine. The said Districts are delineated and described in *Plan A* hereunto annexed, and therein cross-hatched with *blue* and lettered H.

"That the respective Incumbents of the *Parishes* to which such several Districts shall be annexed shall have the sole and exclusive Cure of Souls within the said Districts.

"That the Parishioners of such several Districts shall be entitled to accommodation in the respective Churches of the *Parishes* to which the said Districts shall be annexed, and shall cease to be entitled to accommodation in the respective Churches of the *Parishes* from which the said Districts shall be separated, excepting nevertheless any person or persons possessing a legal right by faculty or otherwise to any pew or sitting in either of the said Parish Churches, and who may not be willing to relinquish and give up the same.

"That marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials, shall be solemnized and performed as follows:—

(a) For the Inhabitants of the Wotton District in the said Parish Church of Saint Catharine.

(b) For the Inhabitants of the Sandhurst Road District in the said Parish Church of Saint Mary de Lode.

(c) For the Inhabitants of the part of Old T-Station District (lettered C) in the said Parish Church of All Saints.

(d) For the Inhabitants of the part of the Old T-Station District (lettered D) in the said Parish Church of Barnwood.

(e) For the Inhabitants of the Heathville Road District in the said Parish Church of Saint Mark.

(f) For the Inhabitants of the Denmark Road District in the said Parish Church of Saint Mark.

(g) For the Inhabitants of the Woolridge

District in the said Parish Church of Hartpury.

(h) For the Inhabitants of the four Extra-Parochial Districts (lettered H) in the said Parish Church of Saint Catharine.

"That all Fees, Dues, Ecclesiastical Offerings, and Emoluments, (excepting Tithe-Rent-Charge) arising from each of the Districts shall henceforth belong to the Incumbent of the Parish to which such District shall be annexed.

"That no alteration shall be made in the Patronage of the said Benefices, or either of them.

" CONSENTS.

"The said Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of the Holy and Indivisible Trinity in Gloucester, being the Patrons or Persons entitled to present to the Benefice of Barnwood, in the County of Gloucester, and Diocese of Gloucester, in case the same were now vacant, The Reverend Francis Harvie Fowler, being the Incumbent of the same Parish, The said Bishop of Gloucester, being the Patron or Person entitled to present to the Benefice of Saint Catharine, in the City and County of Gloucester, and Diocese of Gloucester, in case the same were now vacant, The Reverend Samuel Richmond Robertson, being the Incumbent of the same Parish, The said Bishop of Gloucester, being the Patron or Person entitled to present to the Benefice of Saint Mark, in the City and County of Gloucester, and Diocese of Gloucester, in case the same were now vacant, The Reverend Leonard Augustus Lyne, being the Incumbent of the same Parish, The said Bishop of Gloucester, being the Patron or Person entitled to present to the Benefice of All Saints, in the City and County of Gloucester, and Diocese of Gloucester, in case the same were now vacant, The Reverend Aubrey Chastel de Boinville, being the Incumbent of the same Parish, The said Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of the Holy and Indivisible Trinity in Gloucester, being the Patrons or Persons entitled to present to the Benefice of Saint Mary de Lode, in the City and County of Gloucester, and Diocese of Gloucester, in case the same were now vacant, The Reverend William Christian Macklin, being the Incumbent of the same Parish, The said Bishop of Gloucester, being the Patron or Person entitled to present to the Benefice of Hartpury, in the County of Gloucester, and Diocese of Gloucester, in case the same were now vacant, The Reverend Nathan Jones, being the Incumbent of the same Parish, do hereby respectively signify to Your Grace our several Consents to the Scheme above proposed and set forth, and to every matter and thing therein contained.

"In testimony whereof the said Dean and Chapter have caused their Common Seal to be affixed hereto, and the other parties above mentioned have hereunto set their respective hands this 4th day of September, 1916.

“ That the Right Reverend Edgar Charles Sumner, Bishop of Gloucester, has represented to us amongst other things :—

“ That there are in the City of Gloucester, and his Diocese of Gloucester, the several Benefices set forth below, the population and values of the Parishes whereof are respectively set opposite to the name of each, *videlicet* :—

(b) The separation of an isolated portion of the Sandhurst Road District of the said Parish of Barnwood from the said Parish of Barnwood, and its annexation to the said Parish of Saint Mary de Lode to which it is contiguous.

(c) The separation of a portion of the said Parish of Barnwood situate in the Old T-Station District from the said Parish of Barnwood, and its annexation to the said Parish of All Saints to which it is contiguous.

(d) The separation of an isolated portion of the said Parish of Saint Mary de Lode situate in the Old T-Station District from the said Parish of Saint Mary de Lode, and its annexation to the said Parish of Barnwood to which it is contiguous.

(e) The separation of two isolated portions of the Heathville Road District of the said Parish of Saint Mary de Lode from the said Parish of Saint Mary de Lode, and their annexation to the said Parish of Saint Mark to which they are contiguous.

(f) The separation from the Denmark Road District of a portion of the said Parish of Saint Catharine, and its annexation to the said Parish of Saint Mark to which it is contiguous.

(g) The separation from the Woolridge District of an isolated portion of the said Parish of Saint Mary de Lode, and its annexation to the said Parish of Hartpury to which it is contiguous.

(h) The annexation of four Extra-Parochial Districts situate in the City of

Gloucester to the said Parish of Saint Catharine to which they are contiguous.

“ That pursuant to the directions contained in the said Act of Parliament the said Lord Bishop has drawn up a Scheme in writing, annexed to his Representation, describing the several areas or districts so as aforesaid proposed to be respectively annexed to the said several Parishes, and the mode in which it appears to him that the proposed alterations may best be effected, and how the changes consequent on such alterations in respect to Ecclesiastical Jurisdiction, Glebe Lands, Tithes, Kent Charges, and other Ecclesiastical Dues, Rates, and Payments, and in respect to Patronage and Rights to Pews, may be made with justice to all Parties interested, which Scheme has been transmitted to us by the said Lord Bishop for our consideration together with the following Consents thereto in writing, *videlicet* :—The Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of the Holy and Indivisible Trinity in Gloucester, being the Patrons or Persons entitled to present to the said Benefice of Barnwood in case the same were now vacant, The Reverend Francis Harvie Fowler, being the Incumbent of the same Parish, The said Bishop of Gloucester, being the Patron or Person entitled to present to the said Benefice of Saint Catharine in case the same were now vacant, The Reverend Samuel Richmond Robertson, being the Incumbent of the same Parish, The said Bishop of Gloucester, being the Patron or Person entitled to present to the said Benefice of Saint Mark in case the same were now vacant, The Reverend Leonard Augustus Lyne, being the Incumbent of the same Parish, The said Bishop of Gloucester, being the Patron or Person entitled to present to the said Benefice of All Saints in case the same were now vacant, The Reverend Aubrey Chastel de Boinville, being the Incumbent of the same Parish, The said Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of the Holy and Indivisible Trinity in Gloucester, being the Patrons or Persons entitled to present to the said Benefice of Saint Mary de Lode in case the same were now vacant, The Reverend William Christian Macklin, being the Incumbent of the same Parish, The said Bishop of Gloucester, being the Patron or Person entitled to present to the said Benefice of Hartpury in case the same were now vacant, and The Reverend Nathan Jones, being the Incumbent of the same Parish.

“ The Representation and Scheme of the said Lord Bishop, and the Consents above referred to, are hereunto annexed.

“ And we, the said Archbishop, being on full consideration and inquiry satisfied with the said Scheme, do hereby pursuant to the said Pluralities Act, 1838, certify the same, and such Consents as aforesaid, to Your Majesty in Council, to the intent that Your Majesty in Council may, in case Your Majesty in Council shall think fit so to do, make and issue an Order for carrying the said Scheme into effect.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 59th year of His late Majesty King George the Third, Chapter 134, of the Act of the 2nd and 3rd years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 49, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Representation, bearing date the 25th day of January, in the year 1917, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 59th year of His late Majesty King George the Third, Chapter 134, of the Act of the 2nd and 3rd years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 49, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Representation as to the assignment of a District Chapelry to the Consecrated Church of All Saints, Brighton, situate in the Parish of Brighton, in the County of Sussex, and in the Diocese of Chichester:

"Whereas it appears to us to be expedient that a District Chapelry should be assigned to the said Church of All Saints, Brighton, situate as aforesaid:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Charles John, Bishop of Chichester, (testified by his having signed and sealed this Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all that part of the said Parish of Brighton, which is described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth on the *Map or Plan* hereunto annexed, should be assigned as a District Chapelry to the said Church of All Saints, Brighton, situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The District Chapelry of All Saints, Brighton.'

"And with the like consent of the said Charles John, Bishop of Chichester, (testified as aforesaid), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, further represent that it appears to us to be expedient that banns of matrimony should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials should be solemnized or performed at the said Church of All Saints, Brighton, situate as aforesaid, and that the fees to be received in respect of the publication of such banns, and of the solemnization or performance of the said offices, should be paid and belong to the Minister of the same Church for the time being: Provided always that nothing herein contained shall be construed as expressing any intention on the part of us the said Commissioners to concur in or approve the taking of any fee for the performance of the said office of baptism, or for the registration thereof.

"We, therefore, humbly pray that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into Your Royal Consideration, and to make such Order with respect thereto as to Your Majesty, in Your Royal Wisdom, shall seem meet.

"THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The District Chapelry of All Saints, Brighton, being:—

"All that part of the Parish of Brighton, in the County of Sussex, and in the Diocese of Chichester, which is bounded upon the north by the New Parish of Saint Luke, Prestonville, upon the north-west by the New Parish of Saint Patrick, Hove, upon part of the south-west by the District Chapelry of Saint Stephen, Brighton, all in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the remaining part of the south-west, upon the south, and upon the east, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said District Chapelry of Saint Stephen, Brighton, from the said Parish of Brighton, at the junction of the roads called Windlesham Avenue, Vernon Terrace, and Clifton Hill, and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of Clifton Hill for a distance of 5½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Powis Road upon the boundary which divides the said Parish of Brighton from the New Parish of Saint Nicholas, Brighton, in the said County and Diocese, and extending thence first south-eastward, then north-eastward, then again south-eastward, then eastward, then southward, then again eastward, and then northward along the last-mentioned boundary (thereby following the middle of Clifton Hill, Clifton Road, Dyke Road, West Hill Road, Buckingham Road, Gloucester Road, and Queen's Road) for a distance of 45 chains or thereabouts to the junction (at the entrance of the Brighton Railway Station) of Queen's Road with Guildford Road, and extending thence westward along the middle of Guildford Road for a distance of 2 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Terminus Road, and extending thence first northward and then north-westward along the middle of Terminus Road for a distance of 11 chains or thereabouts to its junction with the roads called Buckingham Place and Howard Place, and extending thence north-westward along the middle of Howard Place for a distance of 14 chains or thereabouts to its junction with New England Road, and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of New England Road for a distance of 10 chains or thereabouts to the western side of the viaduct which carries the main line of the London, Brighton, and South Coast Railway across New England Road and Old Shoreham Road, and extending thence northward along the western side of the said viaduct for a distance of 1 chain or thereabouts to a point near the northern side of Old Shoreham Road upon the boundary which divides the said Parish of Brighton from the said New Parish of Saint Luke, Prestonville."

And whereas the said Representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased to ratify the said Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Chichester.

And whereas by Section one, sub-section two, of the said Act, it is provided that any List of persons and bodies of persons, incorporated or unincorporated, with whom such trading is prohibited by a Proclamation under the said Act may be varied or added to by an Order made by the Lords of the Council on the recommendation of a Secretary of State, such List as so varied or added to being in the last mentioned Proclamation referred to as the "Statutory List":

And whereas the List contained in the last mentioned Proclamation has been varied and added to by subsequent Orders of Council:

And whereas there was this day read at the Board a recommendation from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs to the following effect:—

That the "Statutory List" of persons and bodies of persons, incorporated or unincorporated, with whom trading is prohibited, should be further amended by the variation and addition of the names set forth in the Schedule hereto.

Now, therefore, Their Lordships, having taken the said recommendation into consideration, are pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the same be approved.

Whereof the Right Honourable Arthur James Balfour, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, the Controller of the Foreign Trade Department, and all other persons whom it may concern, are to take notice and govern themselves accordingly.

NOTE (1).—All persons or firms resident, carrying on business or being in the United Kingdom are prohibited from having any dealings with any of the persons or firms mentioned in this List, or in any List issued under the Trading with the Enemy (Statutory List) Proclamation, 1916, No. 3. A List (The Consolidating List No. 19a), consolidating all previous Lists revised to date and including the amendments in the Schedule annexed hereto is issued concurrently with this Order. This Consolidating List contains all the names which up to this date are included in the Statutory List.

Additions to and variations in these Lists will be published at intervals approximately of two weeks.

The Lists are published in the London Gazette and reproduced in the Board of Trade Journal, and separate copies of all Lists may be obtained at a small cost from the Superintendent of Publications, His Majesty's Stationery Office, Imperial House, Kingsway, W.C.

NOTE (2).—Where a person or firm mentioned in the List has more than one address in the same country, all dealings in that country with such person or firm are prohibited, even in cases where one only of the addresses is specifically mentioned.

NOTE (3).—Trading is prohibited under the Trading with the Enemy Proclamations of 25 June, and 10 November, 1915, with any person or firm of enemy nationality resident or carrying on business in China, Siam, Persia, Morocco, Liberia or Portuguese East Africa. Persons or firms in the United Kingdom are therefore prohibited from trading with any person or firm of enemy nationality in any of those countries, even though such person or firm is not mentioned by name in the Statutory List.

NOTE (4).—In order to minimise as far as possible any inconvenience which may be caused to British traders by the dislocation of export trade owing to the inclusion in the Statutory List of a former connection, the Foreign Trade Department is collecting and classifying the names of non-enemy firms who may be able to act as substitutes for firms mentioned in the

Statutory List. A considerable amount of information is already available at the Foreign Trade Department, and it is in many cases possible to suggest the names of satisfactory substitutes without the necessity of referring the matter abroad. The Department is, however, prepared on application to enquire of His Majesty's Representatives abroad for the names of suitable substitutes. When the applicant wishes this done by telegraph he is required to undertake to pay the cost of telegraphic correspondence. It would greatly facilitate the work of the Foreign Trade Department if applicants in making enquiries would specify the particular trade or trades for which substitutes are required.

NOTE (5).—The Statutory List for each country is telegraphed, on the day of issue, to His Majesty's Representative in that country who is instructed to notify accordingly British Consular Officers, to whom persons abroad should apply for information as to names on the List. Persons and firms in the United Kingdom with agencies or branches abroad would, however, be well advised to furnish such agencies or branches with issues of the List as they appear. The Lists for all countries in Central or South America are also telegraphed to His Majesty's Ambassador at Washington, who transmits them to H.M. Consul-General at New York and to other centres in the United States likely to be interested.

For conspicuous gallantry and enterprise during a bomb attack by aircraft on an important enemy railway bridge. A subsequent reconnaissance showed that the whole of the centre section of the bridge had collapsed into the river, thereby interrupting important enemy railway communications.

Flight Lieut. Edward Rochfort Grange, R.N.A.S.

For conspicuous gallantry and skill on several occasions in successfully attacking and bringing down hostile machines, particularly on the 4th January, 1917, when during one flight he had three separate engagements with hostile machines, all of which were driven down out of control.

On the 5th January, 1917, he attacked three hostile machines, one of which was driven down in a nose-dive.

On the 7th January, 1917, after having driven down one hostile machine, he observed two other enemy aircraft attacking one of our scouts. He was on the way to its assistance when he was attacked by a third hostile scout. He was hit in the shoulder by a bullet from this machine, but landed his aeroplane safely in an aerodrome on our side of the lines.

Flight Sub-Lieut. Robert Alexander Little, R.N.A.S.

For conspicuous bravery in successfully attacking and bringing down hostile machines on several occasions. On 11th November, 1916, he attacked and brought down a hostile machine in flames. On 12th December, 1916, he attacked a German machine at a range of 50 yards; this machine was brought down in a nose-dive. On 20th December, 1916, he dived at a hostile machine, and opened fire at 25 yards range; the observer was seen to fall down inside the machine, which went down in a spinning nose-dive. On 1st January, 1917, he attached an enemy scout, which turned over on its back and came down completely out of control.

The KING has further been graciously pleased to approve of the award to the under-mentioned officer of a Bar to his Distinguished Service Cross:—

Flight Lieut. Daniel Murray Boyne Galbraith, D.S.C., R.N.A.S.

For conspicuous gallantry. On 23rd November, 1916, he attacked single-handed a formation of six hostile aircraft, no other allied machines being in the vicinity. One hostile machine was shot down, a second was driven down under control, and the remaining four machines then gave up the fight and landed.

In several other combats in the air Flight Lieutenant Galbraith has displayed exceptional gallantry, particularly on 10th and 16th November, 1916, on each of which days he successfully engaged and shot down an enemy machine.
