A PROCLAMATION
FOR A BANK HOLIDAY.

GEORGE, R.I.

WE, considering that it is desirable that Monday, the Second day of July next, should be observed as a Bank Holiday throughout the United Kingdom, and in pursuance of the provisions of "The Bank Holidays Act, 1871," do hereby, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, and in exercise of the powers conferred by the Act aforesaid, appoint Monday, the Second day of July next, as a special day to be observed as a Bank Holiday throughout the United Kingdom, under and in accordance with the said Act, and We do, by this Our Royal Proclamation, command the said day to be so observed, and all Our loving subjects to order themselves accordingly.

Given at Our Court at *Buckingham Palace*, this Twenty-eighth day of *June*, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and seventeen, and in the Eighth year of Our Reign.

A PROCLAMATION

RELATING TO THE IMPORTATION OF CERTAIN ARTICLES INTO THE UNITED KINGDOM.

GEORGE, R.I.

WHEREAS by Section forty-three of the Customs Consolidation Act, 1876, it is provided that the importation of arms, ammunition, gunpowder, or any other goods may be prohibited by Proclamation:

And whereas by certain Proclamations entitled Prohibition of Import Proclamations the importation of certain goods has been prohibited accordingly:

And whereas it is expedient that the importation into the United Kingdom of certain other goods should be prohibited:

Now, therefore, We, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, in pursuance of the said Act and of all other powers enabling Us in that behalf, do hereby proclaim, direct and ordain as follows:—

As from and after the date hereof, subject as hereinafter provided, the importation into the

United Kingdom of the following goods is hereby prohibited, viz. :—

- Carbons for arc lamps.
- Carbons for searchlights.
- Cartridges of all kinds and parts thereof.
- Electric dry cells and carbons therefor.

Provided always, and it is hereby declared, that this prohibition shall not apply to any such goods which are imported under licence given by or on behalf of the Board of Trade, and subject to the provisions and conditions of such licence.

This Proclamation may be cited as the Prohibition of Import (No. 17) Proclamation, 1917.

WHEREAS by an Order in Council, dated the twenty-eighth day of November nineteen hundred and fourteen, His Majesty was pleased to make regulations (called the "Defence of the Realm Regulations") under the Defence of the Realm Consolidation Act, 1914, for securing the public safety and the defence of the realm:

And whereas the said Act has been amended by the Defence of the Realm (Amendment) Act, 1915, the Defence of the Realm (Amendment) (No. 2) Act, 1915, and the Munitions of War Act, 1915, and other enactments:

And whereas the said regulations have been amended by various subsequent Orders in Council:

And whereas it is expedient further to amend the said regulations in manner hereinafter appearing:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the following amendments be made in the said regulations:—

1. At the end of regulation 2b the following paragraph shall be inserted:—

"The Food Controller may, as respects articles to which his powers under regulations 2f to 2j extend, exercise the like powers as are by this regulation conferred on the Admiralty, Army Council, and Minister of Munitions."

2. In subsection (4) of regulation 2g, for the words "prosecution under this regulation" there shall be substituted the words "prosecution under such of these regulations as relate to the powers and duties of the Food Controller."

3. At the end of regulation 7 the following paragraph shall be inserted:—

"The Food Controller may, as respects any factory or workshop in which any article to which the powers of the Food Controller under regulations 2f to 2j extend is or may be manufactured produced or adapted for sale, exercise

the like powers as are by this regulation conferred on the Admiralty, Army Council, and the Minister of Munitions."

4. After regulation 9A the following regulation shall be inserted:—

"9AA.—(1) In any area in respect of which the operation of section one of the Defence of the Realm (Amendment) Act, 1915, is for the time being suspended, the competent naval or military authority may make orders prohibiting or restricting—

(a) The holding of or taking part in meetings, assemblies, or processions in public places;

(b) the use or wearing in public places of uniforms of a naval or military character, or of uniforms indicating membership of any association or body specified in the order; and

(c) the carrying in public places of weapons of offence or articles capable of being used as such.

(2) Any order under this regulation may be made so as to apply generally to the whole of the area aforesaid or to any special localities in that area, and so as to prohibit the doing of all or any of the acts aforesaid absolutely or subject to such exceptions or save upon such conditions as may be specified therein.

(3) If any person acts in contravention of, or fails to comply with, any provision of any order made under this regulation, or fails to comply with any condition subject to which anything is authorised under any such order, he shall be guilty of an offence against these regulations."

5. Regulation 14 shall be amended—

(1) By substituting for the words "the competent naval or military authority may by order" the words "the competent naval or military authority may with the consent of the Admiralty or Army Council by order";

(2) By substituting for the words, "Provided that if the person with respect to whom it is proposed to make such an order as aforesaid undertakes" the words "Any order made as aforesaid may require the person in respect of whom it is made";

(3) By substituting for the words "as to reporting" the words "as to residence, reporting";

(4) By omitting the words "the order may, instead of requiring him to cease to reside in any locality, authorise him to continue to reside therein if he complies with such conditions as to the matters aforesaid as may be specified in the order";

(5) By inserting as a new paragraph at the end of the regulation the words "The Admiralty or Army Council may from time to time revoke or vary any order made under this regulation."

6. After regulation 27A the following regulation shall be inserted:—

"27B. Where a Secretary of State, after consultation with the Admiralty or Army Council, is satisfied that any newspaper, periodical, book, circular, or other printed publication contains reports or statements the publication of which in the United Kingdom would be a contravention of regulation 27, he may prohibit the importation thereof, including, in the case of a newspaper or periodical, any subsequent issues thereof; and any printed matter which is sent or conveyed to the United King-

dom in contravention of such an order may be detained and destroyed."

7. After regulation 29B the following regulation shall be inserted:—

"29C. As from the first day of July nineteen hundred and seventeen it shall not be lawful for any person being the owner of a ship, or employed as a ship's agent, shipbroker, or ship's husband, or as an inspector or surveyor of ships or their machinery, if he is not a natural-born British subject, or if his father is or was at any time the subject of a State at war with His Majesty, to enter or be upon any shipbuilding yard without the permission in writing of the Admiralty or Army Council, and it shall be the duty of the occupier of every shipbuilding yard to take such steps as may be practicable to prevent the admission to his shipbuilding yard of any such person save upon the production of such permission as aforesaid.

If any such person enters or is in or upon a shipbuilding yard without such a written permission, or if the occupier of a shipbuilding yard fails to take such steps as aforesaid, or if any officer, servant, or agent of the occupier fails to comply with any directions given by the occupier for the prevention of the admission of such persons, he shall be guilty of a summary offence against these regulations.

For the purposes of this regulation 'shipbuilding yard' means any premises in which any seagoing ships, boats, or vessels are made, equipped, finished, or repaired."

8. After regulation 38A the following regulation shall be inserted:—

"38B. Where any ammunition or explosive substance is carried on board any merchant ship for defensive purposes it shall be lawful for such ship to enter any dock, harbour or port in the United Kingdom, notwithstanding any restrictions imposed by statute or byelaw relating to explosive substances in force in the dock, harbour, or port, if all regulations made by the Admiralty for the safety of such ammunition and explosive substance are duly observed on board the ship; and if any person refuses to admit, or hinders or obstructs the entry of any such ship in respect of which all such regulations are observed into the dock, harbour, or port on the ground that she is carrying any ammunition or explosive substance, he shall, notwithstanding such restrictions as aforesaid, be guilty of a summary offence against these regulations."

9. After Regulation 39BB the following regulation shall be inserted:—

"39BBB (1) The Shipping Controller may make orders regulating or giving directions with respect to the nature of the trades in which ships are to be employed, the traffic to be carried therein, and the terms and conditions on which the traffic is to be carried, the ports at which cargo is to be loaded or discharged or passengers embarked or disembarked (including directions requiring ships to proceed to specified ports for the purpose of loading or unloading cargo or embarking or disembarking passengers), the ports at which consignees of cargo are to take delivery thereof, the rates (maxima or minima) to be charged for freight or hire of ships and the carriage of passengers, the form of bills of lading and passenger tickets, and other matters affecting shipping, where it appears to the Controller necessary or expedient to make any such order for the purpose of making shipping available

for the needs of the country in such manner as to make the best use thereof having regard to the circumstances of the time:

Provided that any order made under this regulation shall have effect subject to any regulations made or orders given under regulations 37, 38 or 39.

(2) Any order made under this regulation may contain such provisions as to entry, inspection of books and documents, or otherwise as may appear to the Controller necessary or expedient for the purposes of his duties.

(3) The Shipping Controller may by order requisition or require to be placed at his disposal, in order that they may be used in the manner best suited for the needs of the country, any ships, or any cargo space or passenger accommodation in any ships, or any rights under any charter, freight engagement, or similar contract affecting any ship, and require ships so requisitioned to be delivered to the Controller or any person or persons named by him at such times and at such places as the Controller may require, where it appears to the Controller necessary or expedient to make any such order for the purpose of making shipping available for the needs of the country in such manner as to make the best use thereof having regard to the circumstances of the time.

Such compensation shall be paid in respect of the use of a ship or cargo space or passenger accommodation requisitioned under this regulation and for services rendered during the use thereof, and for loss or damage thereby occasioned as in default of agreement may be determined by the Board of Arbitration constituted under the Proclamation of the third day of August, nineteen hundred and fourteen, respecting the requisitioning of ships by the Admiralty.

(4) Any order made under this regulation affecting any ship may be served on the owner of the ship, and shall be deemed to be sufficiently served if sent by registered post addressed to the managing owner or other person to whom the management of the ship is entrusted by or on behalf of the owner at his registered address.

(5) Any order under this regulation may be made either so as to apply generally to all ships or to apply to ships belonging to any particular owner, or to ships of any class or description, or so as to apply to any specified ship, and any such order may direct that all contracts or any class of contracts or any special contract affected by the order shall be abrogated, or shall remain in force notwithstanding anything in the order, but subject to any exceptions or modifications for which provision may be made by the order.

(6) If the Owner, Master or other person in charge of a ship or any other person affected by an order under this regulation acts in contravention of or fails to comply with any provisions of the order, or aids or abets any other person, whether or not such other person is in the United Kingdom, in doing anything which if done in the United Kingdom would be a contravention of any such provision, he shall be guilty of a summary offence against these regulations, and if such person is a company, every director and officer of the company shall also be guilty of an offence against these regulations unless he proves that the contravention took place without his knowledge or consent.

(7) The powers conferred by this regulation shall be in addition to and not in derogation of

any prerogative right or other powers of His Majesty, and where before the twenty-eighth day of June, nineteen hundred and seventeen, any ship or any cargo space or passenger accommodation in any ship or any rights under any charter, freight engagement, or similar contract affecting any ship has been requisitioned by the Shipping Controller this regulation shall, after that date, apply as if the same had been requisitioned in pursuance of this regulation."

10. In Regulation 39A after the words "Army Council" there shall be inserted the words "or the Shipping Controller."

11. In Regulation 39C after the words "issue instructions" there shall be inserted the words "subject to any instructions of the Shipping Controller."

12. In regulation 40B, at the end of paragraph (b) of sub-section (1), there shall be inserted the words "and that in the case of prescriptions issued for national health insurance purposes on the form provided by the Insurance Committee the medical practitioner's address and qualifications and the words 'Not to be repeated' need not be marked on the prescription."

In paragraph (c) of the same subsection the words "except in pursuance of fresh directions duly endorsed on the prescription by the medical practitioner by whom it was originally issued, and signed with his name in full, and dated," shall be deleted.

For paragraph (d) of the same subsection the following paragraph shall be substituted:—

(d) The prescription shall be marked with the date on which it is dispensed, and shall (unless issued for national health insurance purposes on the form provided by the Insurance Committee) be retained by the person, firm, or body corporate by whom the prescription is dispensed, and shall be kept on the premises where it is dispensed, and shall be open to inspection by any person authorised for the purpose by a Secretary of State.

13. In regulation 48, after the words "prohibited by these regulations" and the words "contravention of these regulations" there shall be inserted the words "or any order, rules, or other instrument made thereunder"; and at the end of the same regulation there shall be inserted the words "or, if the act constituted or would have constituted a summary offence against these regulations, of a summary offence against these regulations."

14. In regulation 62, for the words "States acting in co-operation" there shall be substituted the words "States acting in naval or military co-operation."

"And whereas Honorary Lieutenant Joseph Reed, R.N., performed the duties of Chief Officer of the Royal Hospital School, Greenwich, for nearly 19 years, and resigned his appointment on the 7th April, 1917, owing to failing health:

"And whereas this appointment does not confer any claim to a pension or gratuity:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction the payment to Lieutenant Reed of a gratuity of £100 from the funds of Greenwich Hospital in recognition of his meritorious service under that Department."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed. And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

"And whereas by the Regulations for the government of Your Majesty's Naval Service an Allowance of 1s. to 2s. 6d. a day is payable, at our discretion, in Ships of 3,000 indicated horse power and upwards, to the Senior Engineer Officer, if not above the rank of Engineer Lieutenant-Commander, or to the Chief Petty Officer of the Engine Room acting as such:

"And whereas we consider that in certain special types of Vessels, such as Repair Ships, and Depot Ships, payment of this Allowance should not be dependent solely upon the power of the propelling machinery:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that

Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to authorize us to grant, at our discretion, and as from the 18th May, 1917, Senior Engineer's Allowance in exceptional cases in which the indicated horse power of the main machinery of the ship or establishment may be less than 3,000; the rate of the Allowance in such cases to be half the rate of charge pay which is payable to the Engineer Officer in charge of the machinery of the Ship or Establishment.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."

The scale of pay to be as follows:—

(1) On promotion 11s. a day with subsequent biennial increments of 6d. a day to a maximum of 13s.

(2) Pensions, pensions for hurts and wounds, widow's pension and compassionate allowances for children, to be granted at the rates and under the conditions, applicable to Commissioned Writers.

(3) The number of Commissioned Masters at Arms to be one pending the operation of the rule under which deserving Warrant Officers belonging to Classes in which Com-

missioned Warrant Rank is attainable are promoted to Commissioned Warrant Rank after 15 years' service as Warrant Officer.

(4) The established number of Chief Masters at Arms to be inclusive of Commissioned Masters at Arms.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals."

"And whereas we consider that Warrant Officers, Non-Commissioned Officers, and Men, of the Royal Marines, who may receive the Military Cross, or the Medal for Distinguished Conduct, while serving with the Army should receive similar monetary awards:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to approve of Warrant Officers, Non-Commissioned Officers, and Men of the Royal Marines who receive the Military Cross, or the Medal for Distinguished Conduct in the Field, while serving with the Army being granted, at our discretion, an additional pension of 6d. a day if discharged to pension, or a gratuity of £20 if discharged without pension, transferred to the Reserve, or promoted to a Commission, provided—

(1) That an additional pension under this Regulation shall in no case be paid to a

Warrant Officer, Non-Commissioned Officer, or Man to whom the Conspicuous Gallantry Medal may have been, or may hereafter be, awarded, concurrently with an annuity in respect of the latter distinction.

(2) That the receipt of an annuity or an additional pension or a gratuity in respect of one of these medals shall not disqualify a holder of both medals from receiving a gratuity in respect of the other.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the Ministry of Pensions Act, 1916, shall extend to the Isle of Man, subject to the following adaptations:—

The Naval and Military War Pensions, &c., Act, 1915, referred to in the Ministry of Pensions Act, 1916, shall be deemed to be the said Act as extended to, and adapted for, the Isle of Man by Order in Council of the 27th day of June, 1916.

In Sub-section (5) of Section 6, after the words "*Documentary Evidence Act, 1882*," there shall be read the words "*(being Acts of the Imperial Parliament)*."

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the Regulations amending the Defence of the Realm (Consolidation) Regulations, 1914 made by the Order of His Majesty in Council dated the 2nd May, 1917, shall extend to the Isle of Man, subject to the following adaptations:—

Omit Paragraph 1.

In Paragraph 2 for "United Kingdom" read "Isle of Man."

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to repeal from the date hereof the said exemption contained in Paragraph (b) of Article 2 of the Order in Council aforesaid.

WHEREAS by Section 16 of the Pluralities Act, 1838, as amended by the Pluralities Act, 1850, it is, amongst other things, enacted, "That whenever it shall appear to the Archbishop of the Province, with respect to his own Diocese, and whenever it shall be represented to him by the Bishop of any Diocese, or by the Bishops of any two Dioceses, that two or more Benefices, or that one or more Benefice or Benefices, and one or more Spiritual Sinecure Rectory or Rectories, Vicarage or Vicarages, in his or their Diocese or Dioceses, being either in the same Parish or contiguous to each other, and of which the aggregate population shall not exceed 1,500 persons, may, with advantage to the interests of religion, be united into one Benefice, the said Archbishop of the Province shall inquire into the circumstances of the case; and if on such Inquiry it shall appear to him that such Union may be usefully made, and will not be of inconvenient extent, and that the Patron or Patrons of the said Benefices, Sinecure Rectory or Rectories, Vicarage or Vicarages respectively, is or are consenting thereto, such Consent being signified in writing under the hands of such Patron or Patrons, the said Archbishop shall, 6 weeks before certifying such Inquiry and Consent to His Majesty as hereinafter directed, cause, with respect to his own Diocese, a Statement in writing of the facts, and in other cases a Copy in writing of the aforesaid Representation, to be affixed on or near the Principal Outer Door of the Church, or in some public and conspicuous place in each of such Benefices, Sinecure Rectories, or Vicarages, with notice to any person or persons interested that he, she, or they may, within such 6 weeks, show cause in writing under his, her, or their hand or hands, to the said Archbishop against such Union; and if no sufficient cause be shown within such time, the said Archbishop shall certify the Inquiry and Consent aforesaid to His Majesty in Council, and thereupon it shall be lawful for His Majesty in Council to make and issue an Order or Orders for uniting such Benefices, Sinecure Rectory or Rectories, Vicarage or Vicarages, into one Benefice, with Cure of Souls, for ecclesiastical purposes only: "

And whereas the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Randall Thomas, Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, hath, pursuant to the provisions of the said Acts, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Certificate in writing, bearing date the 29th day of March, 1917, in the words following:—

"We, Randall Thomas, Archbishop of the Province of Canterbury, Primate of All England and Metropolitan, do hereby certify to Your Majesty in Council:—

"That The Right Reverend Archibald, Lord Bishop of Exeter, on the 21st day of January, 1914, as the then Bishop of the Diocese within which are situate the Rectory of Rewe, and the Vicarage of Netherexe, both in the County of Devon, having represented unto us that the said Benefices, being contiguous to each other,

and of which the aggregate population does not exceed 1,500 persons, might with advantage to the interests of religion be united into one Benefice, we inquired into the circumstances of the case:

"The Representation of the said Lord Bishop of Exeter, our Inquiry into the circumstances of the case, the Statement of Circumstances in reply thereto, the Consent in writing of the said Patron, and the Copies of the Representation and Notices before mentioned, are hereunto annexed:

"And we do hereby certify the Inquiry and Consent aforesaid to Your Majesty in Council, to the intent that Your Majesty in Council may, in case Your Majesty in Council shall think fit so to do, make and issue an Order for uniting the said Benefices into one Benefice, with Cure of Souls, for ecclesiastical purposes only.

"RANDALL, CANTUAR."

Now, therefore, His Majesty in Council, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the Rectory of Rewe, situate in the County of Devon, and Diocese of Exeter, and the Vicarage of Netherexe, situate in the same County and Diocese, shall be united into one Benefice, with Cure of Souls, for ecclesiastical purposes only.

STATUTE APPROVED BY THE CONVOCATION OF THE UNIVERSITY OF OXFORD, ON TUESDAY, JUNE 19, 1917.

Whereas it is expedient to amend certain Clauses of Sections I. and II. of Title IV., of Sections I., III., VI., XI., and XII. of Title V. and of Section II. of Title XIII. of the Statutes of the University of Oxford, so as to bring them into accordance with the Statute concerning the number of Terms in the Academic Year which was made by the University on May 8, 1917 :

Now the said University, in exercise of the powers conferred on it by the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877, and of any other power enabling it, hereby enacts, subject to the approval of His Majesty in Council, as follows :—

1. In *Statt. Tit. IV. Sect. I. § 3* (p. 65, ed. 1914), the words "In the construction of this Statute Easter and Trinity Terms are (except where either of them is expressly mentioned) to be counted together as one Term" shall be struck out.

2. In *Statt. Tit. IV. Sect. II. A. § 4. cl. 5* and *cl. 6* (p. 78), *F. § 3. cl. 6* (pp. 113, 114), and *H. § 9. cl. 4* (p. 132), in each case the

words "Easter and Trinity Terms being counted as one" shall be struck out.

3. In *Statt. Tit. V. Sect. I* (p. 137), clause 3 shall be struck out.

4. In *Statt. Tit. V. Sect. III. cl. I.* (p. 138), *Sect. VI. § 4. cl. I* (p. 142), *Sect. XI. § 5. cl. 2 (a)* (p. 149), and *Sect. XII. § 1. cl. 5* (p. 151), in each case the words "Easter or" shall be struck out.

5. In *Statt. Tit. XIII. Sect. II. cl. 8* (*Statt. Univ. Oxon.*, Addenda, 1914-15, p. 7), the words "in Easter or" shall be struck out.

WHEREAS by treaty, grant, usage, sufferance, and other lawful means His Majesty the King has jurisdiction in China :

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in this behalf by "The Foreign Jurisdiction Act, 1890," or otherwise, in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows :—

1. This Order may be cited as "The China (War Powers) Order in Council, 1917," and shall be read as one with the "China Order in Council, 1904" (hereinafter called the "Principal Order"), and with any Order amending the same.

2. Where in the opinion of the Minister there are reasonable grounds for believing that any British subject has acted, is acting, or is about to act in a manner prejudicial to the public safety, or to the defence, peace, or security of His Majesty's dominions or of any part of them, the Minister may by order in writing direct that such person—

(a) Shall not enter, reside, or remain in any area specified in the order ;

(b) Shall reside or remain in any area so specified ;

(c) Shall conduct himself in such manner, or abstain from such acts, or take such order with any property in his possession or under his control, as may be specified in such order ;

(d) Shall be detained in custody in such place as may be specified in the order ; and the person so detained shall be deemed for all purposes to be in legal custody.

3. If any person in respect of whom an order is made under paragraph (a), (b), or (c) of the preceding article fails to comply with any of the provisions of the order, he shall be guilty of an offence against this Order, and shall be liable on conviction by the Court to imprisonment with or without hard labour for a term not exceeding three years ; provided, however, that nothing in this article shall be deemed to

empower a Provincial Court to award any sentence greater than is authorised by Article 59 (2) of the Principal Order.

4. Where in the opinion of the Minister it is expedient that any person, in respect of whom the provisions of Article 2 of this Order apply, should be deported from China to some place in His Majesty's dominions, he shall send to the Supreme Court a certificate under his hand and seal to that effect, and the Supreme Court may thereupon order that such person shall be deported from China to the place specified in such certificate. The provisions of the Principal Order, and of any Order amending the same, relative to deportation shall, subject to the provisions of this Order, apply to any deportation effected under this article.

5. If any person deported under this Order returns to China without permission in writing of the Minister (which permission the Minister may give) he shall (without prejudice to any liability under Article 83 (11) of the Principal Order) be guilty of an offence against this Order, and shall be liable on conviction by the Court to imprisonment with or without hard labour for a term not exceeding three years; provided, however, that nothing in this article shall be deemed to empower a Provincial Court to award any sentence greater than is authorised by Article 59 (2) of the Principal Order.

6. This Order shall take effect on the day on which the text thereof is first exhibited in the public office of the Supreme Court at Shanghai, along with a certificate under the hand of the Minister stating that he has been informed by telegraph by the Secretary of State that the Order has been passed in the form annexed to the certificate, and shall remain in force only during the continuance of the present war.

And the Right Honourable Arthur James Balfour, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, is to give the necessary directions herein.

On the 28th November, 1916, Lance-Corporal Anderson was in a hut in France with eleven other men when, accidentally, the safety pin was withdrawn from a bomb. In the semi-darkness he shouted a warning to the men, rushed to the door, and endeavoured to open it so as to throw the bomb into a field. Failing to do this, when he judged that the five seconds during which the fuse was timed to burn had elapsed, he held the bomb as close to his body as possible with both hands in order to screen the other men in the hut. SALE OF WASTE (WORSTED AND HOSIERY) ORDER, 1917.

In pursuance of the powers conferred upon them by the Defence of the Realm Regulations, the Army Council do hereby order as follows:

1. No person shall sell at any time after the 31st day of July, 1917, to any manufacturer any Laps, or Waste or any Blends or material wholly or partly composed thereof without a permit issued by or on behalf of the Director of Army Contracts, or at prices exceeding those set out in Schedule "A" hereto annexed or exceeding such other prices as in any particular case may be allowed by or on behalf of the Director of Army Contracts.

2. The remuneration of dealers in Laps or Waste shall be determined at the rates and for the services set out in Schedule "B" hereto annexed, and no dealer shall after the 31st day of July, 1917, make any sale of Laps or Waste at a price exceeding the purchase price thereof by more than the amount to which he may be entitled under such scale of charges, having regard to the services performed by him.

3. All persons having in their custody or control any Laps or Waste shall furnish such

particulars as to their business as may be required by or on behalf of the Director of Army Contracts.

4. No person shall without a permit issued by or on behalf of the Director of Army Contracts deliver at any time after the 31st day of July, 1917, any Laps or Waste in pursuance of any contract entered into prior to the date hereof, provided that where such contract shall have been entered into at any time prior to the 1st day of April, 1917, no such permit shall be necessary, and the contracting parties may be and are hereby authorised to complete such contract by delivery before the 31st day of December, 1917.

5. The Order may be cited as the Sale of Waste (Worsted and Hosiery) Order, 1917.

For the purpose of this Order, the expression "Laps or Waste" shall mean Laps, Waste and other by-products indicated in Schedule "A" hereto annexed produced in the spinning or manufacture of worsted and hosiery materials.

ARMY COUNCIL ORDER.

SALE OF WOOL (GREAT BRITAIN), 1917.

In pursuance of the powers conferred upon them by the Defence of the Realm Regulations the Army Council hereby order as follows:—

1. No person shall sell raw Wool grown or to be grown on sheep in Great Britain and the Isle of Man during the season of 1917, including Fleece Wool and Skin Wool, but not including Daggings, Locks, Brokes, and Fallen Wool, otherwise than to persons authorised by or on behalf of the Director of Army Contracts, or at prices other than those set out in the schedules hereto annexed or at such other prices as in any particular case may be allowed by or on behalf of the Director of Army Contracts.

2. No person shall sell raw Wool (as herein-before defined) grown or to be grown on sheep in Ireland during the season of 1917 otherwise

than in accordance with the provisions of the Sale of Wool (Ireland) Order, 1917.

3. No person shall make or take delivery of or payment for any Wool of the description aforesaid otherwise than in accordance with the provisions of this Order, whether in pursuance of any contract entered into prior to the date hereof or otherwise.

4. All persons having in their custody or control any stocks of Wool of the description aforesaid are hereby required to sell such Wool to any persons authorised by or on behalf of the Director of Army Contracts as may be required by him or on his behalf, and to make deliveries to such persons in such quantities and at such times and places as may be specified by him or on his behalf.

5. No person shall mix or wind in any Fleeces of the description aforesaid any Brokes or dead Wool, Locks, Daggings or other matter whatsoever.

6. The Order made by the Army Council relating to raw Wool grown or to be grown on sheep during the season of 1917, and dated the 5th day of April, 1917, is hereby cancelled.

7. This Order may be cited as the Sale of Wool (Great Britain) Order, 1917.

The Minister of Labour, by virtue of section 2 of the Labour Exchanges Act, 1909, and all other powers conferred on him in this behalf, hereby makes the following regulations:—

1. (1) Advisory committees shall be appointed by the Minister of Labour in such areas of the United Kingdom as he may think fit, or for the United Kingdom as a whole, after consultation with such bodies and persons as he may think best qualified to advise him on the matter.

(2) The members of an advisory committee, including the chairman, shall remain in office for three years, except where the Minister otherwise directs in any particular case, and provided that any person appointed to fill a vacancy shall not hold office after the termination of the period during which the person in whose place he is appointed would have held office.

(3) Sub-committees of an advisory committee may be appointed, and a sub-committee for women's work shall be appointed in all cases, except where the Minister of Labour is satisfied that its appointment is unnecessary; the chairman and members of each sub-committee shall

be appointed by the Minister of Labour after consultation with the advisory committee.

(4) If any members present at a meeting of an advisory committee or sub-committee dissent from a resolution passed by a majority of the committee or sub-committee at that meeting, they shall have the right to have their views duly recorded, and it shall be the duty of the chairman to forward this record, with a copy of the resolution, to the Minister of Labour.

(5) Subject to these Regulations, the procedure of any advisory committee or sub-committee shall be determined from time to time by the Minister of Labour, or by the committee or sub-committee, with the approval of the Minister.

2. All applications for accommodation within the premises of an Exchange shall be made to the officer in charge of such Exchange, who shall consult the advisory committee for the district. Any such application shall only be granted for such purposes and on such terms and conditions as may be laid down in general rules made by the committee, with the approval of the Minister.

3. The Minister shall have power to termi-

nate, as he may think fit, the appointment of any advisory trade committee appointed under section VII. of the General Regulations 1910, whether or not the period of three years for which the committee was appointed or reappointed has expired.

4. Regulations VII. and VIII (1) of the General Regulations 1910 are hereby repealed, save in so far as they apply to advisory trade committees the period of appointment of which has not expired and has not been terminated.
