At the Council Chamber, *Whitehall*, the 3rd day of *January*, 1919.

By the Lords of His Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.—No. 72.

**W**HEREAS His Majesty has been pleased, in exercise of the power in that behalf conferred on Him by Section one, sub-section one, of the Trading with the Enemy (Extension of Powers) Act, 1915, by divers Proclamations, and in particular by a Proclamation dated the 23rd day of May, 1916, and amended on the 16th day of January, 1918, entitled "The Trading with the Enemy (Statutory List) Proclamation," to prohibit all persons or bodies of persons, incorporated or unincorporated, resident, carrying on business, or being in the United Kingdom from trading with any of the persons or bodies of persons mentioned in the List contained in the last-mentioned Proclamation, such List being therein referred to as the Statutory List:

And whereas by Section one, sub-section two, of the said Act, it is provided that any List of persons and bodies of persons, incorporated or unincorporated, with whom such trading is prohibited by a Proclamation under the said Act

may be varied or added to by an Order made by the Lords of the Council on the recommendation of a Secretary of State:

And whereas the Statutory List contained in the last-mentioned Proclamation has been varied and added to by subsequent Orders of Council:

And whereas there was this day read at the Board a recommendation from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs to the effect that the Statutory List should be further varied and added to as set forth in the Schedule hereto.

Now, therefore, Their Lordships, having taken the said recommendation into consideration, are pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered,

That the Statutory List be varied and added to as set forth in the Schedule hereto.

Whereof the Right Honourable Arthur James Balfour, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, the Controller of the Foreign Trade Department, and all other persons whom it may concern, are to take notice and govern themselves accordingly.

NOTE (1).—All persons or firms resident,  
carrying on business or being in the United  
Kingdom are prohibited from having, with any  
person or firm mentioned in this List, or in any  
List issued under the Trading with the Enemy  
(Statutory List) Proclamation, any dealings  
other than such as are expressly authorised  
by paragraph 5 of the Proclamation. A List  
(The Consolidated List No. 68A) consolidat-  
ing all previous Lists up to and including that  
of the 15th November, 1918, together with  
List No. 69 of 29th November, List No. 70  
of 13th December, List No. 71 of 20th Decem-  
ber, and the List herewith annexed, contain  
all the names which up to this date are in-  
cluded in the Statutory List.

Additions to and variations in these Lists  
will be published at intervals approximately  
of two weeks.

The Lists are published in the London  
Gazette and reproduced in the Board of Trade  
Journal, and separate copies of all Lists may  
be obtained at a small cost from the Superin-  
tendent of Publications, His Majesty's Sta-  
tionery Office, Imperial House, Kingsway,  
W.C.

NOTE (2).—Where a firm is mentioned in the  
List, every partner in the firm is also included  
in the List, and all dealings with any partner  
in the firm, as well as all dealings with the  
firm, are prohibited: and conversely, all deal-  
ings with a firm any partner in which is men-  
tioned in the List are also prohibited.

NOTE (3).—Where a person or firm men-  
tioned in the List has more than one address  
in the country or group of countries under  
which the name of the person or firm appears,  
all dealings in that country, or in any country  
in the group, with such person or firm are pro-  
hibited, even in cases where one only of the  
addresses or one only of the countries is spe-  
cially mentioned.

NOTE (4).—Trading is prohibited under the  
Trading with the Enemy Proclamations of  
25th June and 10th November, 1915, with  
any person or firm of enemy nationality resi-  
dent or carrying on business in China, Siam,  
Persia, Morocco, Liberia or Portuguese East  
Africa. Persons or firms in the United King-  
dom are therefore prohibited from trading with  
any person or firm of enemy nationality in  
any of those countries, even though such per-  
son or firm is not mentioned by name in the  
Statutory List.

NOTE (5).—In order to minimise as far as  
possible any inconvenience which may be caused

to British traders by the dislocation of export trade owing to the inclusion in the Statutory List of a former connection, the Foreign Trade Department is collecting and classifying the names of non-enemy firms who may be able to act as substitutes for firms mentioned in the Statutory List. A considerable amount of information is already available at the Foreign Trade Department, and it is in many cases possible to suggest the names of satisfactory substitutes for individual firms on the Lists, without the necessity of referring the matter abroad. The Department is, however, prepared on application to inquire of His Majesty's Representatives abroad for the names of suitable substitutes. When the applicant wishes this done by telegraph he is required to undertake to pay the cost of telegraphic correspondence. It would greatly facilitate the work of the Foreign Trade Department if applicants in making inquiries would specify the particular trade or trades for which substitutes are required. *General inquiries for new connections abroad should be addressed to The Comptroller-General, Department of Overseas Trade (Development and Intelligence), 73, Basinghall Street, London, E.C. 2.*

NOTE (6).—The Statutory List for each country is telegraphed, on the day of issue, to His Majesty's representative in that country, who is instructed to notify accordingly British Consular Officers, to whom persons abroad should apply for information as to names on the List. Persons and firms in the United Kingdom with agencies or branches abroad would, however, be well advised to furnish such agencies or branches with issues of the List as they appear. The names on the Lists for all countries in Central or South America are also notified to His Majesty's Ambassador at Washington, who transmits them to H.M. Consul-General at New York and to other centres in the United States likely to be interested.

NOTE (7).—It is not unusual for firms in Holland and the Netherland East Indies to be registered under names commencing with descriptive terms such as "Handel Maatschappij" (Trading Company) or "Naamlooze Venootschap" (Limited Liability Company). In such cases it has been found more convenient to publish the firm under its proper name, followed by the general descriptive term "Handel Maatschappij" or "Naamlooze Venootschap" (N.V.) as in the case of an English company. For instance, Handel Maatschappij van den Berg & Company and Naamlooze Venootschap de Komeet v/h Dumonceau Frères will be found under "Berg" and "Komeet" respectively, and not under "Handel" or "Naamlooze."

By the Lords of His Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

WHEREAS it is provided by Section 2 of the Customs (Exportation Prohibition) Act, 1914, that any Proclamation or Order in Council made under Section 8 of the Customs and Inland Revenue Act, 1879, as

amended by the Act now in recital, may, whilst a state of war exists, be varied or added to by an Order made by the Lords of the Council on the recommendation of the Board of Trade:

And whereas it is provided by Section 2 of the Customs (Exportation Restriction) Act, 1914, that any Proclamation made under Section 1 of the Exportation of Arms Act, 1900, may, whether the proclamation was made before or after the passing of the Act now in recital, be varied or added to, whilst a state of war exists, by an Order made by the Lords of the Council on the recommendation of the Board of Trade:

And whereas by a Proclamation, dated the 10th day of May, 1917, and made under Section 8 of the Customs and Inland Revenue Act, 1879, and Section 1 of the Exportation of Arms Act, 1900, and Section 1 of the Customs (Exportation Prohibition) Act, 1914, the exportation from the United Kingdom of certain articles to certain or all destinations was prohibited:

And whereas by subsequent Orders of Council, and by the Proclamation, dated the 18th day of December, 1918, the said Proclamation was amended and added to in certain particulars:

And whereas there was this day read at the Board a recommendation from the Board of Trade to the following effect:—

That the Proclamation, dated the 10th day of May, 1917, as amended and added to by subsequent Orders of Council, and by the Proclamation, dated the 18th day of December, 1918, should be further amended by making the following amendments in and additions to the Schedule to the same:—

(1) That the following headings should be deleted:—

Boots and shoes, materials and tools used in the manufacture of, the following:—

(A) Shoemakers' machines and their component parts, and sandpaper coils, sand cloth coils, emery paper coils and emery cloth coils used in connection therewith;

(A) Shoemakers' tools, hand and machine;

(A) Brushes, tooth;

(A) Card clothing;

(A) Copper stamps for stamping woven piece goods;

(A) Coppers and their component parts;

(A) Cotton waste and articles containing cotton waste;

(A) Grates and registers for heating purposes and their component parts;

(A) Guanos;

(A) Horn, buttons and combs manufactured of;

(B) Maps and plans of any place within the territory of any belligerent, or within the area of military operations, on a scale of four miles to one inch, or on any larger scale, and reproductions on any scale by photography or otherwise of such maps or plans;

(A) Matches;

(A) Motor cars of 30 horse power and over;

(A) Motor vehicles and motor cycles, component parts of and accessories to;

(A) Oilstones;

(B) Ramie stockings and ramie fabrics suitable for the manufacture of gas mantles;

(A) Ranges, cooking and their component parts;

(B) Rubber gloves, surgical;

(B) Rubber (raw, waste and reclaimed), solutions containing rubber, jellies containing rubber, and any other preparations containing rubber, and also balata, gutta-percha, and the following varieties of rubber, viz.:—Borneo, Guayule, Jelutong, Palembang, Pontianac, and all other substances containing caoutchouc;

(B) Sparking plugs;

(A) Stoves, heating, capable of consuming coal, coke or other solid fuel, and their component parts;

(A) Tobacco, unmanufactured and manufactured, except cigars and snuffs;

(B) Tyres for motor vehicles and for motor cycles (whether attached to a vehicle or cycle or not) together with articles and materials especially adapted for use in the manufacture or repair of tyres;

(A) Vices.

(2) That the following heading should be added:—

(A) Guanos, except whale guano.

Now, therefore, their Lordships, having taken the said recommendation into consideration, are pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the same be approved.

(5) Before any securities are sent abroad for registration and return, a form of permit for the re-import of such securities under the terms of the Prohibition of Import (No. 21) Proclamation, 1917, must be obtained from the American Dollar Securities Committee, 19, Old Jewry, E.C.

The KING has been pleased to award the Albert Medal in recognition of the gallant action of Mr. Arthur Hamilton Ambury, late of New Plymouth, in endeavouring, at the cost of his own life, to save the life of another when mountaineering in New Zealand in June last.

On the 3rd June, 1918, Mr. Ambury, with his wife and two friends, were climbing on Mount Egmont, Taranaki, New Zealand, and had reached an altitude of about 5,500 feet when a call for help was heard from above.

Two members of Mr. Ambury's party immediately commenced to climb to render assistance, and Mr. Ambury, after placing his wife in a safe place, went up after them. At a height of about 7,300 feet they found two climbers, one of whom had been hurt. They took charge of the injured man, and his companion, who had an ice axe, proceeded higher up the mountain to assist a third member of the party.

The injured man had been assisted down some 1,000 feet and Mr. Ambury had nearly reached the party who were descending a steep ice slope in which they had to cut steps, when one of the two men in the rear slipped and slid down the slope at a terrific pace.

Mr. Ambury, who was about 60 feet lower down, braced himself and endeavoured to stop the falling man by seizing his alpenstock which was trailing behind him, but the alpenstock was jerked out of his hand and he was precipitated down the slope of the mountain. He was an experienced mountaineer and must have realised how terrible a risk he was running in endeavouring to save the falling man.

The KING has been pleased to award the Albert Medal to Second Lieutenant Geoffrey Rackham, Royal Army Service Corps, M.T.,

attached 545th Siege Battery, Royal Garrison Artillery, in recognition of his gallantry in saving life in France in October last.

At Le Cateau on the 27th October, 1918, a lorry (one of a convoy of seven) laden with shells and cartridges caught fire. Lieutenant Rackham, who was awakened by the fire alarm, hurried to the scene of the fire in his pyjamas to find that flames three to four feet high were issuing from the petrol tank. He put the cap on the petrol tank, jumped into the driver's seat, started up the blazing lorry and drove it, while cartridges were exploding, to a place of safety, afterwards helping to extinguish the flames. By his prompt and courageous conduct, serious damage, and in all probability loss of life, was averted; for the other loaded lorries were close by, and some 130 men of the battery were only thirty yards distant.
