A PROCLAMATION

REVOKING A PROCLAMATION, DATED THE 17TH DAY OF JULY, 1917, PROHIBITING THE EXPORTATION FROM THE UNITED KINGDOM OF DESIGNS FOR AIRCRAFT.

GEORGE R.I.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation, dated the Seventeenth day of July, 1917, made in pursuance of Section 8 of the Customs and Inland Revenue Act, 1879, and Section one of the Customs (Exportation Prohibition) Act, 1914, We thought fit, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, to prohibit the exportation from the United Kingdom of the following articles, that is to say, drawings, designs, specifications, and other descriptions in writing of any kind of aeroplanes or other aircraft, or of engines, or other accessories of aircraft;

And whereas it appears to Us that the said Proclamation should be revoked:

Now, therefore, We, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, hereby proclaim, direct and ordain, that the said Proclamation of the

Seventeenth day of July, 1917, shall be, and the same is hereby, revoked.

Given at Our Court at *Buckingham Palace*, this Tenth day of *February*, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and nineteen, and in the Ninth year of Our Reign.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 5th day of February, 1919, in the words following, viz. :—

“Whereas by section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865; it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein,

shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions, and provisions, as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

“ And whereas we consider it desirable that any Naval Officer who may be placed on the Retired List whilst holding the appointment of Superintendent of Torpedo Experiments at the Torpedo Experimental Station at Stokes Bay, First Technical Assistant to the said Superintendent, or Representative of the said Superintendent at the Royal Naval Torpedo Factory, Greenock, or who being already on the Retired List is transferred to such an appointment from an appointment in which he is entitled to the benefits of the provisions of His late Majesty's Order in Council, dated the 12th day of August, 1907, relative to increase of Retired Pay to Naval Officers serving on the Staff of the Inspection or Experimental Departments, or in posts at the Admiralty connected with those Departments, should be granted, or, as the case may be, continue to be entitled to the benefits of the provisions of the Order in Council aforesaid:

“ We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction, as from the 1st November, 1918, the following regulations for increases of Retired Pay of Officers of Your Majesty's Navy who are placed on the Retired List whilst serving as Superintendent of Torpedo Experiments at the Torpedo Experimental Station at Stokes Bay, First Technical Assistant to the said Superintendent or Representative of the said Superintendent at the Royal Naval Torpedo Factory, Greenock, or who being already on the Retired List are transferred to such an appointment from an appointment in which they are entitled to the benefits of the provisions of the Order in Council aforesaid:—

(1) If an Officer is discharged to retired pay at his own request, or on completion of any period for which he may have been appointed, or as unfit for further employment from other cause than age, medical unfitness, or misconduct, his retired pay shall be increased by one-sixtieth of the pay and allowances of the appointment for each complete year of service subsequent to retirement from the Active List of Your Majesty's Navy.

(2) If discharged to retired pay on account of age, medical unfitness, abolition of office, or reduction, or reorganisation of establishment—

(a) With ten or more years' service after date of retirement from Your Majesty's Navy, his retired pay shall be increased by one-sixtieth of the pay and allowances of the appointment for each complete year of such service;

(b) With less than ten years' service after such date, the increase shall be at the rate of one-fiftieth of the pay and allowances of the appointment, provided that the total addition shall not exceed ten-sixtieths of such pay and allowances.

“ The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals.”

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

“ And whereas we have had under consideration Chapter LII. of the Regulations for the Government of Your Majesty's Naval Service, wherein are laid down the scales of pensions and gratuities which may be awarded in compensation for wounds and injuries received ‘ in action ’ or ‘ not in action ’:

“ And whereas the aforesaid scales for ‘ not in action ’ are not applicable to certain Officers on the Temporary Lists of Your Majesty's Fleet who should, in our opinion, be granted these advantages:

“ We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction the award of compensation to such Officers, when wounded or injured otherwise than in action, on the scales applicable to Officers of corresponding rank and service on the Permanent List, with retrospective effect to cover certain cases occurring since 24th March, 1915.

“ The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal.”

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS the Local Government Board, after giving to the Incumbent and the Churchwardens of the Parish of Milton Abbas, in the County of Dorset, 10 days' previous Notice of their intention in that behalf, have, under the provisions of the Burial Act,

1853, as amended by the Burial Act, 1900, made a Representation to His Majesty in Council that, for the protection of the public health, the opening of any new Burial Ground in the Civil Parish of Milton Abbas aforesaid, save with the previous approval of the Local Government Board, should be prohibited, and that Burials should be discontinued therein, as follows, viz. :—

MILTON ABBAS.—Forthwith and entirely in the Parish Church of Milton Abbas, in the County of Dorset, and in the Churchyard attached thereto; Provided that in a vault belonging to Elizabeth Marlow and now existing in the said Churchyard, burial may be allowed of the body of the said Elizabeth Marlow at her decease, subject to the condition that the coffin be separately enclosed by stone-work or brickwork properly cemented.

Now, therefore, His Majesty in Council is pleased hereby to give Notice of such Representation, and to order that the same be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Privy Council on the 25th day of March next.

And His Majesty is further pleased to direct that this Order be forthwith published in the London Gazette, and that copies thereof be affixed on the doors of the Churches or Chapels of, or on some conspicuous places within, the Parish affected by such Representation one month before the said 25th day of March.

The following Statute made by the Governing Body of Downing College, Cambridge, on the 25th day of January, 1919, and sealed on the same day, has been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of its having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions of "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877":—

A STATUTE to alter the Statutes of Downing College in the University of Cambridge, which amending Statute was duly made at a General Meeting of the Governing Body of the said College specially summoned for this purpose, and held on the 25th day of January, 1919, and having been passed at such Meeting by the votes of more than two-thirds of the number of persons present and voting is now submitted for the approval of His Majesty the King in Council.

We, the Master, Professors, and Fellows of the said College (being the Governing Body thereof) in the exercise of the powers given to us by the 54th section of the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877, do hereby alter the existing Statutes of our said College in the manner following:—

By repealing Statute XXIV., intituled "Of Stipends," made on the 22nd day of March, 1881, by the Commissioners appointed for the purposes of the said Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877, and by substituting therefor the following Statute, to form an amended Statute XXIV.:—

All stipends shall be payable on the first day of February and the first day of August in

each year. All stipends and official salaries shall be considered as accruing from day to day, and be apportionable in respect of time accordingly. But the vested interest of any Master, Professor, Fellow, or Scholar, who was elected before the 25th day of January, 1919, shall be regulated by the same Statute whereby it was theretofore regulated. Any stipend which falls due after the termination of the Mastership or of a Professorship or Fellowship, and before the vacancy thereof is filled up, shall be invested in the public funds in the name of the College; but in the case of a Scholarship any such stipend shall be assigned by the Governing Body to some deserving Student of the College.

The salaries of all Officers shall be determined from time to time as the Governing Body shall think fit.

And whereas it is provided by Section 2 of the Customs (Exportation Restriction) Act, 1914, that any Proclamation made under Section 1 of the Exportation of Arms Act, 1900, may, whether the Proclamation was made before or after the passing of the Act now in recital, be varied or added to, whilst a state of war exists, by an Order made by the Lords of the Council on the recommendation of the Board of Trade:

And whereas by a Proclamation, dated the 10th day of May, 1917, and made under Section 8 of the Customs and Inland Revenue Act, 1879, and Section 1 of the Exportation of Arms Act, 1900, and Section 1 of the Customs (Exportation Prohibition) Act, 1914, the exportation from the United Kingdom of certain articles to certain or all destinations was prohibited:

And whereas by subsequent Orders of Council, and by the Proclamation, dated the 18th day of December, 1918, the said Proclamation was amended and added to in certain particulars:

And whereas there was this day read at the Board a recommendation from the Board of Trade to the following effect:—

That the Proclamation, dated the 10th day of May, 1917, as amended and added to by subsequent Orders of Council, and by the Proclamation, dated the 18th day of December, 1918, should be further amended by making the following amendments in and additions to the Schedule to the same:—

(1) That the following headings should be deleted:—

(A) Aerated and mineral waters, except unsweetened mineral waters;

(A) Boots and shoes (children's) with soles or uppers of leather;

Chemicals, drugs, dyes, dye-stuffs and medicinal and pharmaceutical preparations, the following:—

(A) Cream of tartar;

(A) Phosgene (carbonyl chloride);

(B) Tin, compounds of (except chlorides and oxide of tin);

(A) Tin, oxide of;

(A) Hair, animal, and tops, noils, mixtures, waste and yarns thereof;

(B) Iridium and its alloys, and manufactures containing iridium;

(A) Jute yarns;

Provisions and victuals which may be used as food for man, the following:—

(A) Barley, barley meal and pearled and pot barley;

(A) Tea, including tea waste, sweepings, dust and fluff, whether de-natured or not;

(A) Spirits, potable, of a strength of less than 43 degrees above proof;

(A) Telegraphs (including wireless) and telephones, and instruments and material for, including valves for wireless telegraphic apparatus;

(A) Tin and alloys of tin;

(A) Tin ore.

(2) That the following headings should be added:—

Provisions and victuals which may be used as food for man, the following:—

(A) Barley and barley meal;

(A) Tea, other than green tea, including tea waste, sweepings, dust and fluff, whether de-natured or not;

(A) Spirits, potable, of a strength less than 43 degrees above proof, except gin;

(A) Telegraphs and telephones, wireless, and instruments and material for wireless telegraphic and telephonic apparatus, including valves.

Now, therefore, their Lordships, having taken the said recommendation into consideration, are pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the same be approved.

Whereof the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs and Excise, the Director of the War Trade Department, and all other persons whom it may concern, are to take notice and govern themselves accordingly.

GENERAL ORDER OF THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT BOARD.

THE PUBLIC HEALTH (PNEUMONIA, MALARIA, DYSENTERY, &c.) REGULATIONS, 1919.

To the Mayor, Aldermen, and Commons of the City of London, in Common Council assembled ;—

To the Councils of the several Metropolitan Boroughs, Municipal Boroughs, and other Urban Districts in England and Wales ;—

To the Councils of the several Rural Districts in England and Wales ;—

To all Port Sanitary Authorities ;—

To all Medical Practitioners ;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

Whereas We, the Local Government Board, are empowered by Section 130 of the Public Health Act, 1875, as extended to London by the Public Health (London) Act, 1891, and as amended by the Public Health Act, 1896, from time to time, to make, alter, and revoke Regulations with a view to the treatment of persons affected with any epidemic, endemic or infectious disease and for preventing the spread of the disease; and to provide for the enforcement and execution of the Regulations;

And whereas Malaria, Dysentery, Trench Fever, Acute Primary Pneumonia, Acute Influenzal Pneumonia, Enteric Fever, Relapsing Fever and Typhus Fever are epidemic and infectious diseases:

Now, therefore, We, by this Our Order and in the exercise of the powers conferred upon Us by the Public Health Act, 1875, the Public Health (London) Act, 1891, and the Public Health Act, 1896, and of every other power enabling Us in that behalf, do hereby make the following Regulations, that is to say :—

Definitions, &c.

ARTICLE 1.—(1) In these Regulations, unless the contrary intentions appears :—

(a) The expression "Local Authority" means, as the case may be, the Mayor, Aldermen, and Commons of the City of London in Common Council assembled, the Council of a Metropolitan Borough, the Council of a Municipal Borough or other Urban District, the Council of a Rural District, or a Port Sanitary Authority;

(b) The expression "District" means the District of a Local Authority;

(c) The expression "Medical Officer of Health" means Medical Officer of Health of a Local Authority;

(d) The expression "Medical Practitioner" means a person for the time being registered under the Medical Acts;

(e) The expression "occupier" includes a person having the charge, management, or control of a building, or of the part of a building in which the patient is, and in the case of a house the whole of which is let out in separate tenements, or in the case of a lodging-house the whole of which is let to lodgers, the person receiving the rent payable by the tenants or lodgers either on his own account or as the agent of another person, and in the case of a ship, vessel, or boat, the master or other person in charge thereof;

(f) The expression "Dysentery" includes amoebic and bacillary dysentery;

(g) The expression "Enteric Fever" includes typhoid and paratyphoid fevers.

(2) The provisions of these Regulations shall apply to every ship, vessel, boat, tent, van, shed, or similar structure used for human habitation, in like manner as nearly as may be as if it were a building. A ship, vessel, or boat lying in any river, harbour, or other water not within the District of any Local Authority shall be deemed for the purposes of these Regulations to be within the District of such Local Authority as may be fixed by Us, and where no Local Authority has been fixed, then of the Local Authority of the District which nearest adjoins the place where such ship, vessel, or boat is lying.

Commencement of Regulations.

ARTICLE II.—These Regulations shall come into operation on the First day of March, One thousand nine hundred and nineteen, and shall then and thereafter apply and have effect throughout England and Wales, and shall be enforced and executed by every Local Authority.

ARTICLE III.—The provisions as to notification contained in these Regulations shall have effect in place of any provisions contained in any Order made by any Local Authority under the Infectious Disease (Notification) Act, 1889, providing for the notification to the Medical Officer of Health of cases of Malaria or Pneumonia occurring in the District of the Local Authority.

Notice of Provisions of Regulations.

ARTICLE IV.—The Local Authority shall forthwith cause notice to be given to all Medical Practitioners resident or practising within the District of the Local Authority of the duties imposed upon them by these Regulations.

Notification of Malaria, Dysentery, and Trench Fever, and of Acute Primary Pneumonia and Acute Influenzal Pneumonia by Medical Practitioners.

ARTICLE V.—Subject to the provisions of these Regulations, and subject to the provisions of Section 5 of the Local Government (Emergency Provisions) Act, 1916, every Medical Practitioner, as soon as he becomes aware that a person upon whom he is in professional attendance is suffering from Malaria, or Dysentery, or Trench Fever, or Acute Primary Pneumonia, or Acute Influenzal Pneumonia, shall forthwith make and sign and send or deliver to the Medical Officer of Health a notification of the case in the form and containing the particulars set forth in Schedule A. or Schedule B. as the case may be, of the Public

Health (Notification of Infectious Disease) Regulations, 1918, and shall transmit the notification to the Medical Officer of Health for the District:

Provided that a Medical Practitioner shall not be required to notify a case of Malaria, or Dysentery, or Trench Fever, under this Article and shall not be paid a fee for so doing if the case has already to his knowledge been notified under these Regulations or under the Infectious Disease (Notification) Act, 1889, within the period of six months immediately preceding the date on which he first becomes aware of the disease in that case.

Duties of Medical Officers of Health.

ARTICLE VI.—A Medical Officer of Health on receipt of a notification under these Regulations in relation to a case occurring in a place which is not in his District shall forthwith notify the Medical Officer of Health of the District in which the place is situated.

ARTICLE VII.—Upon the receipt of a notification under these Regulations, or on becoming aware in any other way of a case or suspected case of Malaria, or Dysentery, or Trench Fever, or Acute Primary Pneumonia, or Acute Influenzal Pneumonia, in his District, the Medical Officer of Health, or an Officer of the Local Authority acting under the instructions of the Medical Officer of Health, shall make such inquiries and take such steps as are necessary or desirable for investigating the source of infection, for preventing the spread of infection, and for removing conditions favourable to infection, and if a Medical Practitioner is not in attendance on the patient, the Medical Officer of Health shall also take such steps as are necessary or desirable for ascertaining the nature of the case.

ARTICLE VIII.—The Medical Officer of Health, on becoming aware of the occurrence within his District of—

(a) a case of Trench Fever, or

(b) a case of Malaria in which he has reason to believe that the infection was contracted in the United Kingdom,

shall immediately send to Us the name and address of the patient.

On becoming aware of an outbreak of Dysentery in his District, he shall immediately send to Us the names and addresses of the persons affected, and thereafter such particulars as We may require with regard to cases occurring subsequently.

If the District is not a County Borough he shall send the like information to the Medical Officer of Health of the County in which his District is situated.

ARTICLE IX.—In every case of Malaria, Trench Fever, or Dysentery in his District of which he becomes aware, the Medical Officer of Health shall take such steps as appear to him to be necessary and practicable to secure the treatment of the case in a suitable hospital, unless he is satisfied that treatment elsewhere than in a hospital will be carried out with all such precautions as are necessary to prevent the spread of the disease.

Malaria.

ARTICLE X.—In every case of Malaria occurring in his District of which the Medical Officer of Health becomes aware, and in which he considers that action is necessary to prevent the spread of infection, he shall take all prac-

ticable steps to ensure that the person suffering from Malaria—

- (1) is supplied with efficient mosquito netting,
- (2) receives necessary quinine treatment,
- (3) receives proper advice as to the continuation of quinine treatment in order to prevent relapses; and
- (4) receives proper advice as to the precautions to be taken to prevent the spread of infection.

ARTICLE XI.—On the occurrence within a District of two or more cases of Malaria in which the infection has, in the opinion of the Medical Officer of Health, been contracted within the District, the Local Authority may and if required by Us shall appoint and pay a Medical Practitioner approved by Us who shall—

(1) make systematic visits to houses where Malaria has occurred or where risk of Malaria infection arises, and shall offer to examine persons therein who are suspected of being infected with Malaria, and shall endeavour to obtain material for microscopic examination in order to determine whether malarial infection is present, and

(2) secure that effective measures are taken to prevent the spread of infection by the administration of quinine, by the use of mosquito netting, and by the destruction of mosquitoes, and otherwise.

Dysentery.

ARTICLE XII.—(1) In any case of Dysentery occurring in his District of which the Medical Officer of Health becomes aware, and in connection with which he is of opinion after inquiry that such a course is necessary to prevent the spread of infection, he may by notice in writing require that, until a further notice in writing is given by the Medical Officer of Health revoking the first mentioned notice on the ground that the risk of infection is removed—

(a) the person specified in the notice shall discontinue any occupation connected with the preparation or handling of food or drink for human consumption,

(b) children in the care or charge of any person specified in the notice shall not be sent to school,

(c) suitable measures to be specified in the notice shall be taken with respect to cleansing, disinfection, disposal of excreta, destruction of flies, and prevention of contamination of articles of food or drink for human consumption.

(2) The notice may be addressed to the head of the family to which the patient belongs, or to any person in charge of or in attendance on the patient, or to any other person in the building or place of which the patient is an inmate, or to the occupier of the building or place.

(3) It shall be the duty of the person to whom any such notice is addressed to comply with the requirements of the notice.

ARTICLE XIII.—(1) If a Medical Officer of Health has grounds for suspecting that any person in the District who is employed in any trade or business concerned with the preparation or handling of food or drink for human consumption is a carrier of dysentery infection, he may give notice in writing to the responsible manager of the trade or business concerned

certifying that for the purpose of preventing the spread of the disease he considers it necessary to make a clinical examination of such suspected person, and the responsible manager and all other persons concerned shall give to the Medical Officer of Health all reasonable assistance in the matter.

(2) If from the result of any such examination, or from bacteriological or protozoological examination of material obtained at any such examination, or from any other evidence which he may deem sufficient for the purpose, the Medical Officer of Health is of opinion that the specified person is a carrier of dysentery infection, the Medical Officer of Health may give a notice in writing to that effect to the responsible manager and to the suspected person with a view to preventing, during a period to be specified in such notice, the employment of the person to whom the notice relates in the conduct of the trade or business, or in any other trade or business concerned with the preparation or handling of food or drink for human consumption.

(3) It shall be the duty of the person to whom any such notice is addressed to comply with the requirements of the notice.

Trench Fever.

ARTICLE XIV.—(1) In any case of Trench Fever occurring in his District of which the Medical Officer of Health becomes aware, and in which he is satisfied that it is necessary, he may, by notice in writing, require—

(a) that such measures as may be specified by him shall be immediately taken to his satisfaction to obtain the complete destruction of lice on the person and clothing of every occupant of the building, and to secure the destruction of lice or their products in the building;

(b) the temporary segregation, for a period to be specified in the notice, of other inmates of the building or of other persons recently in contact with the patient until their persons and clothing have been completely freed from lice.

(2) The notice may be addressed to the head of the family to which the patient belongs, or to any person in charge of or in attendance on the patient, or any other person in the building of which the patient is an inmate, or the occupier of the building, and also to a person with whom the patient has recently been in contact.

(3) It shall be the duty of the person to whom any such notice is addressed to comply with the requirements of the notice.

Enteric Fever.

ARTICLE XV.—The provisions of Articles XII. and XIII. of these Regulations shall apply and have effect with the necessary modifications in any case of Enteric Fever occurring in the District and to any person residing or employed in the District in regard to whom the Medical Officer of Health has grounds for suspecting that such person is a carrier of enteric fever infection in like manner and circumstances as those provisions respectively apply and have effect in any case of Dysentery and to any person suspected to be a carrier of dysentery infection.

Typhus Fever and Relapsing Fever.

ARTICLE XVI.—The provisions of Articles

VIII. and XIV. of these Regulations shall apply and have effect with the necessary modifications in any case of Typhus Fever or of Relapsing Fever occurring in the District in like manner as those provisions apply in any case of Trench Fever.

General.

ARTICLE XVII.—(1) The duties assigned to the Medical Officer of Health by the Sanitary Officers (London) Order, 1891, the Sanitary Officers (outside London) Order, 1910, or the Sanitary (Ports) Order, 1910, as the case may be, shall be deemed to extend to and to include all action by the Medical Officer of Health in the execution of these Regulations.

(2) Any expenses incurred by a Medical Officer of Health in carrying out the duties imposed upon him by these Regulations shall be defrayed by the Local Authority of the District for which he is Medical Officer of Health.

ARTICLE XVIII.—Nothing in these Regulations shall be deemed to authorise a Medical Officer of Health or other Officer to take any of the steps herein mentioned at any Institution other than one belonging to the Local Authority, except with the consent of the Managers of that Institution.

Duties of Local Authorities.

ARTICLE XIX.—(1) The Local Authority may provide or contract for the provision of medical assistance for any person in the District who is suffering from any of the diseases mentioned in these Regulations and is in need of such assistance.

(2) Where any suitable hospital or place for the reception of the sick is provided within the District of a Local Authority, or within a convenient distance of such District, any person who is suffering from Malaria or Dysentery or Trench Fever, and is without proper lodging or accommodation, or is lodged in a room occupied by more than one family, or is on board any ship, vessel, or boat, or is lodged in any common lodging house, or is in any place where such person cannot be effectively isolated so as to prevent the spread of the disease, may, on a certificate signed by the Medical Officer of Health, and with the consent of the superintending body of such hospital or place, be removed to such hospital or place at the cost of the Local Authority.

Determination of Differences.

ARTICLE XX.—If a difference arises in relation to any subject matter of, or to anything done under these Regulations, the difference may, on the application of all the parties affected, be referred to Us for determination.

Short Title.

ARTICLE XXI.—These Regulations may be cited as "The Public Health (Pneumonia, Malaria, Dysentery, &c.) Regulations, 1919."

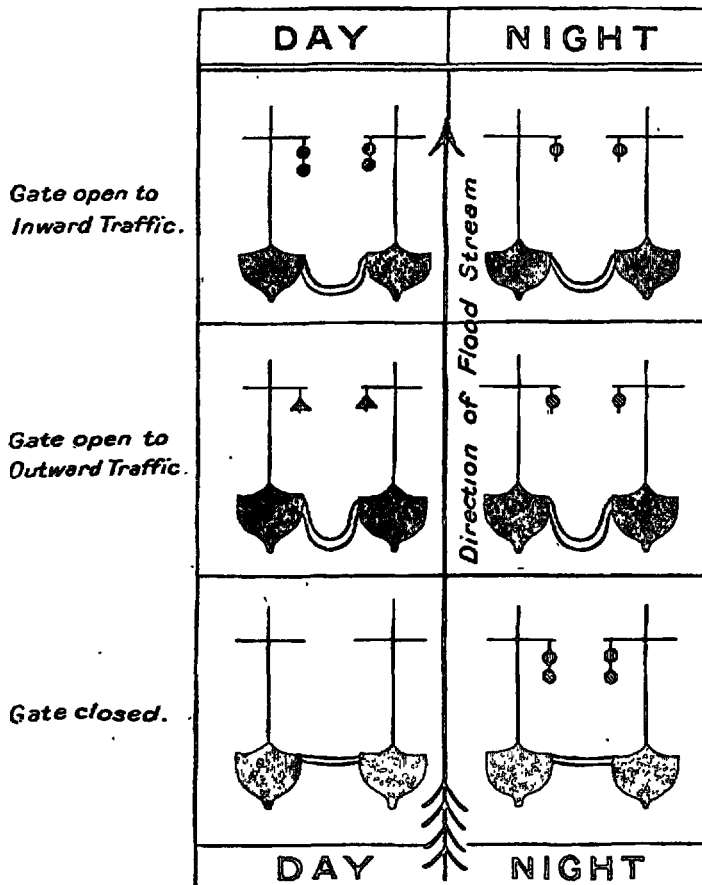

To empower the Company notwithstanding the 92nd or any other section of the Lands Clauses Consolidation Act, 1845, or any Act amending the same or any other statutory enactment to purchase and take by compulsion or agreement any part of or any lands, vaults, cellars, arches or other offices or constructions attached or belonging to or any easements or rights of using any subsoil under any house, building, manufactory or other premises without being required or compelled to purchase the whole or any other part of or any other easements or rights in or under such lands, house, building, manufactory or premises, and to provide that such easements, rights, lands, vaults, cellars, arches or other offices or constructions shall not be or be deemed to be a part of a house, building or manufactory within the meaning of the said Section 92, and to vary and extinguish all rights and privileges connected with any such lands, house, building, manufactory and premises and to empower the Company for the purposes of the intended Act to appropriate and use the subsoil under any street, road or public place without making any payment therefor.
