A PROCLAMATION

RELATING TO THE IMPORTATION OF CERTAIN ARTICLES INTO THE UNITED KINGDOM.

GEORGE R.I.

WHEREAS by Section forty-three of the Customs Consolidation Act, 1876, it is provided that the importation of arms, ammunition, gunpowder, or any other goods may be prohibited by Proclamation:

And whereas by certain Proclamations entitled Prohibition of Import Proclamations the importation of certain goods has been prohibited accordingly:

And whereas it is expedient that the importation into the United Kingdom of certain other goods should be prohibited:

Now, therefore, We, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, in pursuance of the said Act and of all other powers enabling Us in that behalf, do hereby proclaim, direct and ordain as follows:—

As from and after the date hereof, subject as hereinafter provided, the importation into the United Kingdom of the following articles is hereby prohibited, viz.:—

Potash Salts, namely, Potassium carbonate, bicarbonate, chlorate, perchlorate, chloride or muriate, chromate and bichromate, cyanide, ferrocyanide or yellow prussiate, hydrate or caustic, nitrate, permanganate, sulphate, including potash alums and potash manurial salts and mixtures containing any of these substances.

Saccharin and mixtures containing saccharin and other substances of like nature and use.

Provided always, and it is hereby declared, that this prohibition shall not apply to any such goods which are imported under licence given by or on behalf of the Board of Trade, and subject to the provisions and conditions of such licence.

This Proclamation may be cited as the Prohibition of Import (No. 31) Proclamation, 1919.

WHEREAS by the New Ministries and Secretaries Act, 1916, provision is made, amongst other things, for the transfer to the Minister of Labour of such powers and duties of any Government Department relating to labour or industry, whether conferred by statute or otherwise, as His Majesty may, by Order in Council, transfer to him:

And whereas it is further provided by the said Act that, where any powers and duties are transferred by virtue of the said Act, the transfer is to take effect as from a date to be fixed by Order of His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

(1) There shall be transferred to the Minister of Labour the powers and duties now vested in the Ministry of Pensions by Section 3 (1) (j) of the Naval and Military War Pensions Act, 1915, as amended by Section 1 of the Naval and Military War Pensions (Transfer of Powers) Act, 1917, to make provision for the training and employment of disabled officers and men after they have left the naval or military service of His Majesty, except so far as regards disabled officers and men in respect of whom, by reason of their special disability, it is deemed necessary to provide training or employment under medical supervision, or otherwise, than under ordinary industrial conditions; the cases coming within these exceptions to be determined by the Minister of Pensions in consultation with the Minister of Labour.

(2) The transfer to the Minister of Labour of these powers and duties shall take effect as from the 1st day of *May*, 1919.

(3) This Order may be cited as the Ministry of Labour (Transfer of Powers) Order, 1919.

WHEREAS by Section 83 of the Children Act, 1908, it is enacted as follows:—

“The provisions of this Part of this Act with respect to industrial schools shall, so far as applicable, apply to Certified Day Industrial Schools, subject to such modifications as are made therein by this Part of this Act: Provided that His Majesty may, by Order in Council, make such further modifications of those provisions as may appear to His Majesty to be necessary or proper for adapting those provisions to Day Industrial Schools:”

And whereas an Order in Council was made on the 2nd day of *April*, 1909, applying certain provisions of the Children Act to Certified Day Industrial Schools:

And whereas Section 130 of the said Act provides that:—

“An Order in Council under this Act may be revoked or varied by any subsequent Order in Council.”

And whereas it is desirable to vary Article IV. of the Order in Council dated the 2nd day of *April*, 1909, which reads as follows:—

“Section 65 of the Children Act shall in its application to Day Industrial Schools take effect with modifications as follows:—

“The detention order shall specify the time for which the child is to be detained in the school, being such time as to the court may seem proper for the teaching and training of the child, but not in any case extending beyond the time when the child will, in the opinion of the court attain the age of fourteen years:”

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to vary the Order of the 2nd day of *April*, 1909,

by substituting for the said Article IV. the following Article:—

“IV. Section 65 of the Children Act shall, in its application to Day Industrial Schools, take effect with modifications as follows:—

“The detention order shall specify the time for which the child is to be detained in the school, being such time as to the court may seem proper for the teaching and training of the child, but not in any case extending beyond the end of the school term in which the child will, in the opinion of the court, attain the age of fourteen years.”

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 16th day of April, 1919, in the words following, viz.:—

“Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being, or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions, and provisions, as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

“And whereas Your Majesty was graciously pleased by Your Orders in Council bearing date the 30th March, 1917, and 14th January, 1919, to authorize the Minister of Pensions to award pensions, allowances, and gratuities to Seamen and Marines disabled in consequence of service during the present war, on the scales and subject to the conditions prescribed in the Regulations annexed thereto:

“And whereas it is provided therein that the additions allowable under Naval Regulations in respect of Petty Officer or Non-Commissioned Officer time, Good Conduct Badges, Medal or character, shall be made to the minimum pension corresponding to the degree of disablement and that a further addition shall be made in respect of service in accordance with a special scale:

“And whereas by Your Royal Warrants bearing date the 29th day of March, 1917, and the 12th day of October, 1918, Your Majesty has been graciously pleased to sanction the grant of disablement pensions to soldiers disabled in the present war in addition to service pensions:

“And whereas we are of opinion that similar provision should be made for Seamen and Marines disabled during the present war while serving in the Royal Navy or Royal Marines:

“We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction the grant to discharged Seamen and Marines who have been awarded disablement pensions on the minimum scale corresponding to their degree of disablement under Your Orders in Council of 30th March, 1917, and 14th January, 1919,

without any additions for rank or service, good conduct badges, medal or character, of permanent pensions for service, in addition, under the following conditions:—

(1) If a Naval rating has 22 years or more of pensionable service, his pension shall be assessed in accordance with Articles 1934, 1935 and 1938 of the King's Regulations and Admiralty Instructions.

(2) If a Marine has 21 years or more of pensionable service, his pension shall be assessed in accordance with Articles 1197 and 1198, King's Regulations and Admiralty Instructions.

(3) If a Naval rating with 14 and less than 22 years of pensionable service has been granted a permanent disablement pension on the minimum scale without any additions for rank or service, good conduct badges, or medal (or is entitled by the nature of his injuries to a permanent pension on that scale the rate of which has not been finally assessed) he may be granted a permanent pension for service assessed in accordance with Article 1932, Clauses 1, 2 and 4, King's Regulations and Admiralty Instructions.

(4) Subject to the foregoing condition as to permanence of the disablement pension, a continuous service man who has completed 10 years on the Continuous Service system may be granted a permanent pension for service assessed under Article 1932, Clauses 3 and 4, King's Regulations and Admiralty Instructions.

(5) If a marine with 14 and less than 21 years of pensionable service has been granted a disablement pension on the minimum scale without any additions for rank or service, good conduct badges or medal, he may, subject to the aforesaid condition regarding the permanence of the award, be granted a permanent pension for service assessed in accordance with Article 1208, Clauses 1 and 3, King's Regulations and Admiralty Instructions.

(6) The pensions granted for service under the foregoing proposals shall be payable from the same date as the disablement pension granted under Your Orders in Council of 30th March, 1917, and 14th January, 1919.

“The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals.”

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

Commanders and Lieutenants promoted from those ranks, and in the scale of the ordinary pensions for the widows and of the compassionate allowances for the children of these Officers:

“We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to approve of the scales of Retired Pay Widows' Pensions, and Compassionate Allowances shown in the annexed schedules being substituted for those at present in force, with effect from the 1st February, 1919.

“The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals.”

WHEREAS by an Order of His late Majesty King Edward the Seventh in Council bearing date the Twenty-sixth day of September, 1901, and known as the Ashanti Order in Council, 1901, the territories therein described were annexed to, and became part of, His Majesty's Dominions under the name of Ashanti, and provision was made for the administration thereof:

And whereas by a further Order of His said late Majesty in Council, bearing date the Twenty-second day of October, 1906, known as the Ashanti Order in Council, 1906, the boundaries of Ashanti were further defined, and certain territories were annexed thereto, and included therein as part of His Majesty's Dominions:

And whereas by a further Order of His said late Majesty in Council, bearing date the Sixth day of July, 1907, and known as the Ashanti Order in Council, 1907, the Twelfth Article of the first hereinbefore recited Order has been amended:

And whereas by the Eleventh Article of the first hereinbefore recited Order provision was made with reference to the suspension from the exercise of his office of any person holding or exercising any office within Ashanti and it is expedient to revoke the said Article and make further and other provision in lieu thereof:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

I. The Eleventh Article of the Ashanti Order in Council, 1901, is hereby repealed and revoked without prejudice to anything lawfully done thereunder, and the said Order shall henceforth be construed and take effect as if instead of the said Eleventh Article the following Article had been inserted therein:—

“ XI. The Governor, or in the absence of the Governor from Ashanti the Chief Commis-

sioner, may, upon sufficient cause to him appearing, suspend from the exercise of his office any person holding or exercising any office within Ashanti whether appointed by the Governor or under or by virtue of any Commission or Warrant granted, or which may be granted, by His Majesty in His Majesty's name or under His Majesty's authority. Such suspension shall continue and have effect only until His Majesty's pleasure therein shall be signified to the Governor by a Secretary of State. If the suspension is confirmed by a Secretary of State, the Governor shall forthwith cause the officer to be so informed and thereupon his office shall become vacant. The Governor or Chief Commissioner as the case may be, in proceeding to any such suspension, shall observe the directions in that behalf given to him by any instructions from His Majesty or signified through a Secretary of State."

II. This Order shall be published in the Gold Coast Government Gazette, and shall thereupon come into operation, and the Governor of the Gold Coast Colony shall give directions for the publication of this Order at such places, and in such manner, and for such time or times as he thinks proper for giving due publicity thereto within Ashanti.

III. His Majesty may from time to time revoke, alter, add to, or amend this Order.

IV. This Order may be cited as the Ashanti Order in Council, 1919.

And whereas by a further Order of His said late Majesty in Council, bearing date the Twenty-second day of October, 1906, known as the Northern Territories Order in Council, 1906, the boundaries of the Northern Territories of the Gold Coast were further defined:

And whereas by a further Order of His said late Majesty in Council, bearing date the Sixth day of July, 1907, and known as the Northern Territories Order in Council, 1907, the Eleventh Article of the first hereinbefore recited Order has been amended:

And whereas by the Tenth Article of the first hereinbefore recited Order, provision was made with reference to the suspension from the exercise of his office of any person holding or exercising any office within the

Northern Territories, and it is expedient to revoke the said Article and make further and other provision in lieu thereof:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers by the Foreign Jurisdiction Act, 1890, or otherwise, in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

I. The Tenth Article of the Northern Territories Order in Council, 1901, is hereby repealed and revoked without prejudice to anything lawfully done thereunder, and the said Order shall henceforth be construed and take effect as if, instead of the said Tenth Article, the following Article has been inserted therein:—

"X. The Governor, or in the absence of the Governor from the Northern Territories the Chief Commissioner, may, upon sufficient cause to him appearing suspend from the exercise of his office any person holding or exercising any office within the Northern Territories whether appointed by the Governor or under or by virtue of any Commission or Warrant granted, or which may be granted, by His Majesty in His Majesty's name or under His Majesty's authority. Such suspension shall continue and have effect only until His Majesty's pleasure therein shall be signified to the Governor by a Secretary of State. If the suspension is confirmed by a Secretary of State, the Governor shall forthwith cause the officer to be so informed and thereupon his office shall become vacant. The Governor or Chief Commissioner, as the case may be, in proceeding to any such suspension, shall observe the directions in that behalf given to him by any instructions from His Majesty or signified through a Secretary of State."

II. This Order shall be published in the Gold Coast Government Gazette, and shall thereupon come into operation, and the Governor of the Gold Coast Colony shall give directions for the publication of this Order at such places, and in such manner, and for such time or times as he thinks proper for giving due publicity thereto within the Northern Territories.

III. His Majesty may from time to time revoke, alter, add to, or amend this Order.

IV. This Order may be cited as the Northern Territories Order in Council, 1919.

The Colonial Probates Act, 1892, shall apply to the British Possession hereunder mentioned:—

The Colony of the Bermudas or Somers Islands.

**W**HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say; the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme, bearing date the 27th day of March, 1919, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

EXPORTS TO THE OCCUPIED TERRITORIES ON THE RIGHT BANK OF THE RHINE.

Whereas by Royal Proclamation relating to Trading with the Enemy, dated the 9th day of September, 1914, it was, amongst other things, declared as follows:—

"The expression 'enemy country' in this Proclamation means the territories of the German Empire and of the Dual Monarchy of Austria-Hungary, together with all the Colonies and Dependencies thereof."

And whereas it was also declared by the said Proclamation that from and after the date of the said Proclamation the persons therein referred to were prohibited from having certain transactions with any person or body of persons of whatever nationality resident or carrying on business in an enemy country:

And whereas it was further declared by the said Proclamation as follows:—

"Nothing in this Proclamation shall be taken to prohibit anything which shall be expressly permitted by Our Licence, or by the licence given on Our behalf by a Secretary of State, or the Board of Trade, whether such licences be especially granted to individuals or be announced as applying to classes of persons":

And whereas by Proclamations dated the 8th day of October, 1914, the 7th day of January, 1915, and the 14th day of September, 1915, the said Proclamation dated the 9th day of September, 1914, was amended as in those Proclamations set forth:

And whereas the Board of Trade, on behalf of His Majesty, by Licence dated the 6th day of February, 1919, authorised all persons residing, carrying on business, or being in the United Kingdom, subject to the provisos set out in the Licence, to supply any goods, wares or merchandise to the territories on the left bank of the Rhine in the occupation of the Armies of the Associated Governments, and to perform certain other acts in connection with such supply as in the Licence set forth:

And whereas certain territories on the right bank of the Rhine are or may be in the occupation of the Armies of the Associated Governments:

Now, therefore, the Board of Trade, on behalf of His Majesty, and in pursuance of the powers reserved in the said Proclamations and all other powers thereunto them enabling, do hereby give and grant licence to all persons residing, carrying on business or being in the United Kingdom to negotiate for the supply of any goods, wares or merchandise to the territories on the right bank of the Rhine that are at the time in the occupation of the Armies of the Associated Governments, to supply any goods, wares or merchandise to such territories, to carry or arrange for the carriage of and to insure any goods, wares or merchandise destined for the said territories, and to take such action as may be necessary or convenient to secure payment for any goods, wares or merchandise so supplied or for any charges or expenses connected with such supply, carriage or insurance:

Provided always that any licence which may be necessary in respect of any such supply



under any prohibition of export for the time being in force in the United Kingdom is first obtained:

Provided also that nothing in this Licence shall be deemed to authorise the payment of money which at the date hereof is or but for the war would have been due to any person or body of persons resident or carrying on business in such territories, or the withdrawal or disposal of funds or property held or managed in this country for the account of or on behalf of any such person.

##### TRADE.

The Hair, Bass and Fibre Trade, that is to say, the drafting, dressing or mixing of bass, whisk or similar fibres or horse hair, other hairs and the curling or weaving of hair or fibre, or of mixed hair and fibre, and all preparatory, finishing, warehousing or packing operations incidental to or appertaining to all or any of the above processes, but excluding any of the above operations or processes where they are carried on in association with or in conjunction with the manufacture of Brushes or Brooms, and excluding also the dressing of animal skins.

#### DEFENCE OF THE REALM (LIQUOR CONTROL).

GENERAL ORDER (FURTHER AMENDMENT) OF THE CENTRAL CONTROL BOARD (LIQUOR TRAFFIC FOR ALL AREAS IN ENGLAND AND WALES.

We the Central Control Board (Liquor Traffic) in pursuance of the powers conferred upon us by the Acts and Regulations relating to the Defence of the Realm hereby make the following Order:—

##### *Areas to which the Order Applies.*

1. This Order shall apply to all Areas, or parts of Areas, situate in England and Wales to which the Defence of the Realm (Liquor Control) Regulations, 1915, have been applied.

##### *Extension of Hours during which Intoxicating Liquor may be sold.*

2. The hours between 6 p.m. and 10 p.m. shall be substituted for the hours between 6 p.m. and 9.30 p.m. and be the hours during which intoxicating liquor may be sold or supplied for consumption on the premises and be consumed in licensed premises and clubs in the evening on week-days; and the hours between 6 p.m. and 9 p.m. shall be substituted for the hours between 6 p.m. and 8.30 p.m., and be the hours during which intoxicating liquor may be sold or supplied in licensed premises and clubs for consumption off the premises and be despatched or taken therefrom in the evening on week-days.

And each of the Orders of the Board for the said Areas as amended by the General Order of the Board made on the tenth day of March, 1919, shall be further amended by substituting the hour of 10 p.m. for the hour of 9.30 p.m. and the hour of 9 p.m. for the hour of 8.30 p.m. wherever the said respective hours occur in the said Orders as amended aforesaid; and shall be read and have effect as if so further amended accordingly.

##### *Exhibition of Order.*

3. The secretary of every club to which this Order applies and every holder of a licence for

the sale of intoxicating liquor shall keep permanently affixed in some conspicuous place in the club or in the licensed premises a copy of this Order.

##### *Commencement of Order.*

4. This Order shall come into force on the twelfth day of May, 1919.

### EAST KENT (MUZZLING AND CONTROL OF DOGS) ORDER OF 1919.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, the Dogs Act, 1906, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

#### PART I.

##### *Prohibition of Movement of Dogs out of certain District.*

1.—(1.) No dog shall be moved out of the District described in the Schedule hereto, hereinafter referred to as "the Scheduled District," unless it is accompanied by a licence of the Board authorizing such movement signed by an Officer of the Board, and any such licence may be subject to such conditions as to the detention and isolation of the dog or otherwise as the Board may think necessary or desirable and shall be specified in the licence: Provided that this Article shall not apply to—

(a) the movement of a dog under a licence granted by the Board under the Importation of Dogs Order of 1914 and the Importation of Dogs (Amendment) Order of 1918 (No. 2) to a port in Great Britain for shipment, or to a place of detention for the purpose of detention and isolation; or

(b) the movement of a dog through the Scheduled District by railway from a place outside the District to another place outside the District without unnecessary delay and without being re-booked within the District.

(2.) If any farm (except any detached part) is partly within and partly without the Scheduled District, the whole shall be deemed to be within the Scheduled District.

##### *Seizure of Dogs in case of Default.*

2.—(1.) If a dog has been moved in contravention of this Order, or, having been moved with a licence under this Order, is not detained and isolated or otherwise dealt with as required by the conditions of the licence, an Inspector of the Board may seize the dog, and thereupon the Board shall detain and isolate it at the place of detention specified in the licence (if any) or any other place of detention selected by them for such time as the Board think necessary or expedient.

(2.) If the owner of the dog does not, within ten days after the expiration of the period of detention specified in the licence (if any), or such other period as the Board may think necessary or expedient and notify to the owner, claim the dog from the Board and pay to them their expenses of detaining and isolating the dog, the Board may destroy or otherwise dispose of the dog as they think expedient.

##### *Notice of Detention in case of Illegal Movement.*

3.—(1.) Where an Inspector or other Officer of the Board, or of a Local Authority, has reason to believe that a dog has been moved in contravention of this Order, he may give notice to the owner or person in charge of the dog requiring that the dog shall be detained and isolated in accordance with the provisions of such notice, and that within a time specified in such notice, the dog shall be moved to a place of detention for the purpose of such detention and isolation.

(2.) Such provisions may be inserted in the notice as the Board may think necessary or desirable for any of the following purposes, namely:—

(i) For prescribing and regulating the detention and isolation of the dog.

(ii) For prescribing the person by whom and the premises on which the dog shall be detained and isolated.

(iii) For regulating the movement of the dog to the place of detention.

(iv) For prescribing the confinement of the dog in a suitable hamper, crate, box, or other receptacle, or the muzzling of the dog, during its movement by railway, or along a highway or thoroughfare.

(v) For prescribing the mode of isolation of the dog.

(vi) For prescribing the notice to be given of the death or loss of the dog, or of any matter arising in connection with the movement, detention, or isolation of the dog and the persons by whom and to whom the notice is to be given; and

(vii) For prescribing the production of

the notice for inspection by an officer of the Board, or police constable, or officer of the Local Authority.

(3.) The operation of a notice under this Article may be terminated by notice to that effect given by an Inspector or other Officer of the Board or of the Local Authority to the owner or person in charge of the dog, on proof to the satisfaction of the Inspector or Officer that the dog was not moved in contravention of the said Order.

(4.) If the owner or person in charge of the dog, after receipt of such notice, fails to move the dog as required by the notice, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(5.) If the provisions inserted in any notice under this Article are not complied with, the owner of the dog and the person in charge of the dog, and any person who being required to comply with any such provision fails to do so, shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

## PART II.

### *Control of Dogs in Scheduled District.*

4.—(1.) A dog in the Scheduled District shall at all times:—

(a) whilst in or on any public place be efficiently muzzled with an effective wire cage muzzle;

(b) whilst in or on any other place, be kept under control by being—

(i) confined in a kennel or other enclosure from which the dog cannot escape; or

(ii) secured to some premises by a collar and chain; or

(iii) efficiently muzzled with an effective wire cage muzzle; or

(iv) accompanied by the owner or some person deputed by him and under effectual control.

(2.) The provisions of this Article shall not apply to—

(a) any pack of hounds while being exercised under the supervision of two or more competent attendants; or

(b) any dog in charge of a competent person while being used for sporting purposes, or for the capture or destruction of vermin, or for the driving or tending of cattle or sheep; or

(c) any dog confined in a suitable hamper, crate, box, or other receptacle, so constructed as to render it impossible for such dog while so confined to bite any person or animal.

### *Seizure, Detention, and Disposal of Uncontrolled Dogs.*

5.—(1.) Any dog in the Scheduled District which is not muzzled, or kept under control, as prescribed by this Order, may be seized by the Local Authority or by the police, and any dog so seized shall be dealt with by the Local Authority as follows:—

(i) If the dog is diseased or suspected, or has been bitten by a diseased or suspected dog, it shall be forthwith slaughtered.

(ii) If the dog has been exposed to the infection of rabies it shall be detained, slaughtered, or otherwise dealt with as the Local Authority think expedient, but so that the dog shall not, while detained by the Local Authority, be allowed to come in contact with any other animal.

(iii) In any other case the dog shall be treated as a stray dog seized under the powers conferred by section three of the Dogs Act, 1906.

(2.) No dog so seized shall be given or sold for the purposes of vivisection.

(3.) Every dog shall, for the purposes of this Article, be deemed to have been exposed to the infection of rabies which has been in the same shed, stable, building, kennel, field, or other place, or otherwise in contact with any diseased or suspected dog, or which has in any other way been exposed to the infection of rabies.

### *Prohibition of Holding of Exhibitions or Shows of Dogs in Scheduled District.*

6.—No exhibition or show of dogs, whether for sale or otherwise, shall be held in the Scheduled District except with a licence of the Board, and any such licence shall be subject to such conditions as the Board may think necessary or desirable, and shall specify in the licence.

## PART III.

### GENERAL.

#### *Offences.*

7.—(1.) If a dog is moved in contravention of this Order, the owner of the dog, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the dog, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the dog is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(2.) If any dog in the Scheduled District is not muzzled, or kept under control, as prescribed by this Order, the owner of the dog, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(3.) If a dog which is being moved or has been moved with a licence under this Order is not muzzled or confined, or is not detained and isolated or otherwise dealt with as required by the conditions of the licence, the owner of the dog, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(4.) If any person holds, or causes or permits to be held, any exhibition or show in contravention of this Order, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(5.) If a person with a view unlawfully to evade or defeat the operation of this Order or of the conditions of a licence under this Order,

allows a dog to stray, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(6.) If the owner or person in charge of a dog fails to give, produce, or do any notice, licence, or thing which by this Order, or by the conditions of a licence thereunder, he is required to give, produce, or do, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

*Interpretation.*

8.—In this Order—

“The Act of 1894” means the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

“Disease” means rabies, “diseased” means affected with rabies, and “suspected” means suspected of rabies.

“Public place” includes any street, highway, thoroughfare, public bridge, royal park, public park, garden or pleasure ground, common, unenclosed land, or other place to which the public have for the time being access.

Other terms have the same meaning as in the Rabies Order of 1919.

*Local Authority to Enforce Order.*

9.—The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

*Commencement.*

10.—This Order shall come into operation on the eighth day of May, nineteen hundred and nineteen: Provided that until the fifteenth day of that month, a dog in or on any public place in the Scheduled District need not be muzzled if it is led by a person with a collar and chain or other attachment.

*Short Title.*

11.—This Order may be cited as the East Kent (Muzzling and Control of Dogs) Order of 1919.
