**W**E, considering that it is desirable that Tuesday, the twentieth day of May instant, should be observed as a Bank Holiday in the City of Sheffield, and in pursuance of the provisions of "The Bank Holidays Act, 1871," do hereby, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by the Act aforesaid, appoint Tuesday, the twentieth day of May instant, as a special day to be observed as a Bank Holiday throughout the City of Sheffield, under and in accordance with the said Act, and We do, by this Our Royal Proclamation, command the said day to be so observed, and all Our loving subjects to order themselves accordingly.

Given at Our Court at *Buckingham Palace*, this Eighth day of *May*, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and nineteen, and in the Tenth year of Our Reign.

Given at Our Court at *Buckingham Palace*, this Eighth day of *May*, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and nineteen, and in the Tenth year of Our Reign.
