PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by Sub-section (3) of Section 12 of the Air Force (Constitution) Act, 1917, it is provided that where by any Enactment passed after the passing of that Act any amendments are made in the Army Act the corresponding amendments shall be made in the Air Force Act subject to such modifications and exceptions as His Majesty in Council may declare to be necessary for adapting the same to the Air Force:

And whereas by the Army (Annual) Act, 1919, certain amendments in the Army Act have been made:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to declare and order, and it is hereby declared and ordered, as follows:—

1. It is necessary that the amendments made in the Army Act by the Army (Annual) Act, 1919, should, in their application to the Air Force, have effect as set out in a modified form in Parts I. and II. of the Schedule to this Order, and accordingly the amendments set forth in Part I. of the said Schedule shall be

made in the Air Force Act; and the provisions in the Army (Annual) Act, 1919, mentioned in column one of Part II. of the said Schedule shall, in their application to the Air Force, have effect as set out in a modified form in column two thereof.

2. The said amendments to the Air Force Act shall take effect, and shall be deemed to have taken effect:—

(a) in the United Kingdom, Channel Islands and the Isle of Man as from the 30th day of April, 1919; and

(b) elsewhere whether within or without His Majesty's Dominions as from the 31st day of July, 1919.

Provided that the modification of Section 10 (1) of the Army (Annual) Act, 1919, and the amendment to Section 190 of the Air Force Act shall take effect, and shall be deemed to have taken effect, as from the 16th day of April, 1919, both within the British Islands and elsewhere.

3. This Order may be cited as the Air Force Act (Statutory Amendments) Order, 1919.

SCHEDULE.

PART I.

1. In Section 42, after the words "examine into such complaint, and" there shall be in-

inserted the words ("if so required by the officer").

2 In Sub-section (1) of Section 46, after the words "for bringing the offender to court-martial," there shall be inserted the words "or, in the case of an officer below the rank of field officer, may refer the case to be dealt with summarily by a general officer under the provisions of this Act."

3. After Section 46 the following Section shall be inserted:—

"46A.—(1) Any of the following authorities shall have power to deal summarily with a charge against an officer below the rank of field officer referred for that purpose, or for trial by court-martial, under the foregoing Section of this Act, that is to say, any general officer authorized to convene a general court-martial, and also, on active service, the General Officer Commanding-in-Chief in the Field, and any officer (not under the rank of Major-General) appointed for the purpose by him, or by the Air Council.

"(2) The authority having power to deal summarily with the case may, with or without hearing the evidence, dismiss the charge, if he in his discretion thinks that it ought not to be proceeded with, or, where he thinks the charge ought to be proceeded with, take steps for bringing the offender to a court-martial, or may, after hearing the evidence, deal with the case summarily by awarding one or more of the following punishments:—

(a) Forfeiture of seniority of rank either in the air force or in the corps or unit to which the offender belongs, or in both.

(b) Severe reprimand or reprimand.

"(3) Where the authority having power to deal summarily with the case considers that he may so deal with the case, he shall, unless he awards a severe reprimand, or a reprimand, in every case ask the officer charged whether he desires to be dealt with summarily or to be tried by a court-martial, and if the officer elects to be tried by a court-martial, take steps for bringing him to trial by a court-martial, but otherwise shall proceed to deal with the case summarily.

"(4) In every case where an authority has power to dispose of a case summarily, and decides so to do, the accused officer may demand that the evidence against him should be taken on oath, and the same oath or solemn declaration as that required to be taken by witnesses before a court-martial shall be administered to each witness in such case.

"(5) An offender shall not be liable to be tried by court-martial for any offence which has been dealt with summarily under this Section, and shall not be liable to be punished by a general officer under this Section for any offence of which he has been acquitted or convicted by a competent civil court or by a court-martial."

4. Section 114 shall be amended as follows:—

In Sub-section (1A) the second paragraph shall be omitted.

After Sub-section (1A) the following Sub-section shall be inserted:—

"(1B) With respect to horses, the following provisions shall have effect—

(i) It shall be the duty of the owner of any horse, and the occupier of any premises where horses are kept, to furnish, if

so required, to the authority hereinafter mentioned before such date in each year as may be prescribed a return specifying the number of horses belonging to him or kept on his premises, and giving with respect to every horse such details as may be so prescribed; he shall also afford all reasonable facilities for enabling any horse belonging to him or kept on his premises to be inspected and examined as and when required by the said authority; if any person fails to comply with any of the requirements of this paragraph, he shall be liable on summary conviction for each offence to a fine not exceeding fifty pounds;

(ii) the Air Council may, for the purposes of this Sub-section, make regulations prescribing anything which under this Sub-section is to be prescribed, and prescribing the forms to be used, and generally for the purpose of carrying this Sub-section into effect;

(iii) regulations made by the Air Council may provide for excepting from the provisions of this Sub-section horses of any class or description specified in the regulations."

After Sub-section (3) the following Sub-section shall be inserted:—

"(3A) If any officer is obstructed in the exercise of his powers under this Section, a justice of the peace may, if satisfied by information on oath that the officer has been so obstructed, issue a search warrant authorizing the constable named therein, accompanied by the officer, to enter the premises in respect of which the obstruction took place at any time between six o'clock in the morning and nine o'clock in the evening, and to inspect any carriages or animals that may be found therein."

For Sub-section (4) there shall be substituted the following Sub-section:—

"(4) The authority for the purposes of this Section shall be the Air Council or any authority or persons to whom the Air Council may delegate their powers under this Section."

5. At the end of Section 115 the following Sub-section shall be inserted:—

"(10) A requisition of emergency issued under this Section may prohibit, during such period as may be specified in the requisition, the sale and purchase of horses to or by any person other than a person appointed by the Air Council to purchase horses; and if any person sells or purchases or is concerned in the sale or purchase of a horse in contravention of such prohibition, he shall be liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding one hundred pounds or to imprisonment for a term not exceeding three months, or to both such imprisonment and fine."

6. The following provision shall be added at the end of Sub-section (2) of Section 131:—

"Notwithstanding anything in this Act, a Secretary of State may arrange with the Governor of a Colony that any person or class of persons enlisted in the Colony shall, if sentenced under this Act to penal servitude, be transferred to or kept in the Colony and there undergo his sentence in any prison or place in which persons sentenced to penal servitude by a civil court in the Colony can for the time being be confined or, if there be no such prison or place, in an authorized

prison as defined by Section 65 of this Act."

7. Section 153 shall be amended as follows:—

(a) For the words "any airman," "an airman," and "such airman," wherever those words occur, there shall be substituted respectively the words "any officer or airman," "an officer or airman," and "such officer or airman."

(b) After the word "desert," wherever that word occurs, there shall be inserted the words "or absent himself without leave," after the word "deserting" there shall be inserted the words "or absenting himself without leave," and after the word "deserter" there shall be inserted the words "or absentee without leave."

8. Sub-section (1) of Section 156 shall be amended as follows:—

(1) For the words "an officer or airman or any person acting on his behalf" in paragraph (a), and for the words "an officer or airman" in paragraphs (b) and (c) there shall be substituted the words "any person":

(2) After the words "or clothing" there shall be inserted the words "issued for the use of officers or airmen":

(3) For the words "or of the person with whom he dealt being or acting for an airman, or that the same was sold by order of the Air Council or some competent Air Force authority," there shall be substituted the words "or that the same was sold by order or with the consent of the Air Council, or some competent Air Force Authority, or that the same was the personal property of an officer who had retired or ceased to be an officer, or of an airman who had been discharged, or of the legal personal representatives of an officer or airman who had died."

In Sub-section (2) of Section 156, for the words "to a penalty not exceeding five pounds" there shall be substituted the words "to the same penalties as are prescribed in the case of a contravention of the last preceding Sub-section."

9. After Section 156 the following Section shall be inserted:—

"156A. If—

(a) any unauthorized person uses or wears any Air Force decoration or medal, or medal ribbon, or any badge, wound stripe, or emblem supplied or authorized by the Air Council, or any decoration, medal, or medal ribbon, badge, wound stripe or emblem so nearly resembling the same as to be calculated to deceive; or

(b) any person falsely represents himself to be a person who is or has been entitled to use or wear any such decoration, medal, or medal ribbon, badge, wound stripe, or emblem as aforesaid; or

(c) any person without lawful authority or excuse supplies or offers to supply any such decoration or medal as aforesaid to any person not authorized to use or wear the same;

such person shall be liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding twenty pounds or to imprisonment for a term not exceeding three months:

"Provided that nothing in this Section shall be deemed to prohibit the wearing or supply of ordinary regimental badges or any brooch or ornament representing the same."

10. In paragraph (j) of Sub-section (1) of Section 163 the words "or by whom the arrest" and the words "or arrest" shall be omitted.

11. The following paragraph shall be substituted for paragraph (3A) of Section 175:—

"(3A) Officers of the auxiliary Air Force, other than members of the permanent staff, if on the active list at all times, and if on the auxiliary air force reserve, at any time when they are doing duty with any body of the Air Force for the time being subject to air force law or are ordered on any duty or service for which as such reserve officers they are liable."

12. Section 179A shall be amended as follows:—

The following paragraph shall be substituted for paragraph (a) of Sub-section (2):—

"(a) a general court-martial for the trial of any such naval officer, petty officer, or seaman, shall not be convened except by the Admiralty or by an officer authorized by a warrant from the Admiralty in pursuance of this Section."

In paragraph (b) of Sub-section (2) the words "non-commissioned officer" and the words "or soldier" shall be omitted and the word "or" shall be inserted before the word "seaman."

The following paragraph shall be substituted for paragraph (d) of Sub-section (2):—

"(d) The findings and sentences of any general court-martial for the trial of any such officer, petty officer, non-commissioned officer, seaman, or soldier may be confirmed, in the case of an officer, petty officer or seaman of the naval forces, by the Admiralty or by any officer authorized by a warrant from the Admiralty in pursuance of this Section, and in the case of an officer, non-commissioned officer, or soldier of the military forces by His Majesty or by an officer authorized to confirm the findings and sentences of general courts-martial under the Army Act, and not otherwise, except that when such officer, petty officer, non-commissioned officer, seaman, or soldier while subject to this Act is serving beyond the seas with any body of the Air Force and in the opinion of the General or other officer commanding that body (such opinion to be stated in the confirmation and to be conclusive) there is not present any officer authorized to confirm the findings and sentences of general courts-martial under a warrant from the Admiralty issued in pursuance of this Section or under the Army Act, as the case may be, the findings and sentences may be confirmed by a general or other officer authorized to confirm the findings and sentences of general courts-martial under this Act."

After paragraph (g) the following paragraph shall be inserted:—

"(h) The power of a court-martial to inflict on an officer the punishment of forfeiture of seniority of rank shall include power to inflict a punishment of forfeiture of seniority of rank in the army or any corps thereof or both."

At the end of the Section the following new Section shall be inserted:—

"179B. In the application of this Act to officers of His Majesty's naval forces who are subject to Air Force law, the power of a court-martial to inflict the punishment of forfeiture of seniority of rank shall include

power to inflict the punishment of forfeiture of seniority of rank in the navy.”

13.—(1) In paragraph (4) of Section 190, after the words “ or part thereof,” where they occur for the third time, there shall be inserted the following words, “ it also includes any officer of His Majesty’s naval or military forces who is for the time being subject to Air Force law.”

1. The KING has been graciously pleased to approve of the award of the Albert Medal for gallantry in saving life at sea to—

Surgeon Lieutenant-Commander Edward Leicester Atkinson, D.S.O., R.N.

The account of the services, in respect of which this decoration has been conferred, is as follows:—

On the 16th September, 1918, a serious explosion occurred amidships on board H.M.S. "Glatton" whilst lying in Dover Harbour. This was followed immediately by an outbreak of fire, the oil fuel burning furiously and spreading fore and aft. Efforts were made to extinguish the fire by means of salvage tugs. The foremost magazines were flooded, but it was found impossible to get to the after magazine flooding positions. The explosion and fire cut off the after part of the ship, killing or seriously injuring all the Officers who were on board with one exception. The ship might have blown up at any moment.

At the time of the explosion Surgeon Lieut.-Commander Atkinson was at work in his cabin. The first explosion rendered him unconscious. Recovering shortly, he found the flat outside his cabin filled with dense smoke and fumes. He made his way to the quarter deck by means of the ladder in the Warrant Officers flat, the only one still intact. During this time he brought two unconscious men on to the upper deck, he himself being uninjured.

He returned to the flat, and was bringing a third man up, when a smaller explosion occurred whilst he was on the ladder. This explosion blinded him, and, at the same time, a piece of metal was driven into his left leg in such a manner that he was unable to move until he had himself extracted it. Placing the third man on the upper deck, he proceeded forward through the shelter deck. By feel, being totally unable to see, he here found two more unconscious men, both of whom he brought out.

He was found later on the upper deck in an almost unconscious condition, so wounded and burnt that his life was despaired of for some time.

The KING has been graciously pleased to approve of the award of the Albert Medal for gallantry in saving life at sea to—

Lieutenant David Wainwright, R.N.

The account of the services in respect of which this decoration has been conferred is as follows:—

On the 4th February, 1919, H.M.S. "Penarth" struck a mine and immediately began to sink. Lieutenant David Wainwright, taking command of the situation, at once superintended the manning and lowering of the starboard gig, and later the launching of the Carley floats. Hearing there was a stoker injured in one of the stokeholds, he called for

volunteers to show him the way, and at once made his way forward. There was by now a heavy list on the ship, and it was apparent she would not remain afloat much longer, the upper deck on the starboard side being already awash. Lieutenant Wainwright made his way below unaided, and while he was in the stokehold the ship struck a second mine abaft of him. The forepart was blown off and sank, and he was forced to wait till the stokehold had filled before he could float to the surface up the escape.

He displayed the greatest gallantry and disregard of his own personal safety in going below at a time when the ship was liable to sink at any moment.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, the Dogs Act, 1906, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

Power to make Regulations.

1.—(1.) The Local Authority of any District specified in the Schedule to this Order may, in accordance with the provisions of this Order, make Regulations, with a view to the prevention of worrying of cattle (including sheep), for requiring that dogs or any class of dogs shall, during all or any of the hours between sunset and sunrise be kept by the owners thereof under control in manner prescribed by the Regulations.

(2.) The Regulations may apply to the whole or any part of the District, and may exempt any class of dogs either generally or under prescribed conditions.

Confirmation of Regulations.

2.—(1) Regulations made under this Order shall not take effect unless and until they have been submitted to and confirmed by the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries.

(2) A copy of any Regulations made by a Local Authority under this Order, signed and certified by the Clerk of the Local Authority to be a true copy and to have been duly confirmed, shall be evidence, until the contrary is proved, in all legal proceedings, of the due making, confirmation, and existence of the Regulations without further or other proof.

Seizure of Dogs where Regulations are Contravened.

3. Any dog in respect of which an offence is being committed against a Regulation made under this Order may be seized and treated as a stray dog under the powers conferred by section three of the Dogs Act, 1906.

Extension of Definition in Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

4. Dogs shall be animals for the purposes of the following sections of the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894 (namely):—

Section forty-three (*police*);

Section forty-four (*General Administrative provisions*);

and also for the purposes of all other sections of the said Act containing provisions relative to or consequent on the provisions of those sections and this Order, including such sections as relate to offences and legal proceedings.

Local Authority to enforce Order.

5. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Short Title.

6. This Order may be cited as the CARMARTHENSHIRE (CONTROL OF DOGS) ORDER OF 1919.

ENGLAND AND WALES, SOUTH AND WEST COASTS.

Portland Bill to Bardsey Island—Traffic Regulations.

Former Notice.—No. 812 of 1919; hereby cancelled.

Notice is hereby given that under the Defence of the Realm (Consolidation) Regulations, 1914, the following regulations have been made by the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty and are now in force:—

Oil, motor spirit, petrol, or other goods may not be shipped on board craft of any description, whether coasting or foreign, either as stores for the equipment or navigation of the vessel, or as merchandise, except at places which are under the supervision of a Customs Officer. Such goods must be properly pre-entered before shipment, and a clearance must be obtained from the Customs Officials in accordance with the Customs War Powers Act, 1915. Sailing vessels may not have on board a quantity of petrol, motor spirit, benzine, paraffin, petroleum, or other similar substances, exceeding 4 gallons.

II.—REGULATIONS WITH REGARD TO FISHERMEN.

The following Regulations are to be complied with by all fishing vessels and boats on the coast of England and Wales from Portland Bill westwards to Bardsey island (hereinafter referred to as the South-Western Area).

2. By day and night trawling is prohibited in the areas formed by lines joining the following positions:—

(a) *On the North:* The parallel of lat. 50° 03' N.

On the South: The parallel of lat. 49° 59' N.

On the East: The meridian of long. 5° 25' W.

On the West: The meridian of long. 5° 35' W.

(b) *On the North:* The coast.

On the South: The parallel of lat. 49° 50' N.

On the East: The meridian of long. 5° 06' W.

On the West: The meridian of long. 5° 15' W.

(c) *On the North:* The parallel of lat. 50° 17' N.

On the South: The parallel of lat. 50° 12' N.

On the East: The meridian of long. 4° 00' W.

On the West: The meridian of long. 4° 09' W.

(d) *On the North:* The parallel of lat. 50° 13' 30" N.

On the South: The parallel of lat. 50° 07' 30" N.

On the East: The meridian of long. 3° 34' W.

On the West: The meridian of long. 3° 50' W.

3. With the above exception unrestricted fishing may now be resumed throughout the whole of the South-Western Area.

4. The shipment of oil, motor spirit, petrol, and other goods in fishing vessels is subject to the Customs Regulations for the time being.

5. Admiralty Orders for British fishing vessels are in all cases to be obeyed: See the current Notices to Fishermen (the "Green Book") issued free to fishermen at Mercantile Marine and Customs Offices.

Notes.

1. Reporting Wrecks.—Fishermen are notified that all wrecks found by them should be buoyed and reported to the local Naval Authorities in order that their positions may be recorded with a view to their being charted, and also that the wreck may, if practicable, be destroyed.

Fishermen will recognise the importance of this request.

2. Amateur fishermen and pleasure craft out fishing may not _____ fish in areas, _____, or in any manner forbidden to commercial fishermen.

3. Fishery Officer means an officer of the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, a Port Fishery Officer, or other person duly appointed _____.

4. Chart or prohibited areas and of areas affected by Port Fishery Orders can be seen by fishermen on application to Port Fishery Officers.

5. Complaints on the part of the fishing community, and questions of doubt, should be referred in the first instance to the local Fishery Officer, or direct to the Inspector of Fisheries attached to the area.

III.—PLYMOUTH.

PART I.—MOVEMENTS WITHIN THE PORT.

1. The movements of all merchant ships, fishing vessels, or boats of any kind, are subject to the direction of the King's Harbour Master, Plymouth, for the Sound, and the King's Harbour Master, Devonport, for the Hamoaze, whose orders are to be immediately obeyed.

Approach to Government Vessels and Establishments.

2. No merchant vessels (including fishing craft, barges, boats, yachts, or private vessels of any kind) will be allowed to approach any Government ship, vessel, lighter, or other Government craft, or any Government Dockyard or Establishment, without special permission.

Prohibited Areas.

3. When anchoring, care must be taken to be well clear of the fairway.

Mount Batten Breakwater.—All small craft are warned that they should not approach within 200 yards of Mount Batten Breakwater, it being necessary to keep this area clear for seaplanes going out and returning.

Fishing is now permitted by night in Whitsand bay, subject to the following regulations:—

(a) No fishing at night is to take place east of a line drawn in a 231° (*S. 67° W. Mag.*) direction from Rame head.

(b) Except on Sundays, no night fishing is to take place within three miles of the coast between Tregantle and Portwrinkle up to the hour of 12 midnight, or such later hour as may be ordered.

4. A limited number of moorings for yachts may be laid in the following places and nowhere else:—

On West Hoe—on application to King's Harbour Master, Plymouth; in the Cattewater above Turnchapel—on application to the Harbour Master of Cattewater.

PART II.—VESSELS LEAVING THE PORT.

Prohibition.

5. Merchant vessels (including those engaged in the coastal trade) must on no account leave the Dockyard ports of Devonport and Plymouth without permission.

Vessels in the Hamoaze must obtain such permission from the King's Harbour Master, Devonport, at his office in the Dockyard; those at berths in the waters of the Sound, Cawsand bay, Cattewater, Sutton pool, or Milbay docks, must obtain permission from the King's Harbour Master, Plymouth, at Longroom, Stonehouse.

It is also necessary for ships to obtain permission from the Collector of Customs, at the Barbican, Plymouth.

PART III.—BOOM DEFENCE AND NAVIGATION OF NARROW WATERS.

6. The boom defence has now been dismantled, and the two boom-defence vessels which were moored between Devil's point and Wilderness point have been removed. These vessels have been moored at swinging moorings

laid to the north-westward of the entrance to Millbrook lake. Position of mooring-buoy is 286° (*N. 58° W. Mag.*), 575 yards from Cremyll obelisk. The vessels being moored out of the fairway, no lights will be displayed on them by night, and all vessels and boats are cautioned to keep well clear of them.

7. Vessels are warned to pay strict attention to Clause 9, Order in Council, 4th September, 1918, Regulations for the Dockyard Ports of Plymouth and Devonport, and no merchant vessel, whether navigating with or against the tide, is to attempt to pass a man-of-war in the "Narrows" when she is flying the "Red Ensign" over "M" Commercial by day, or a red light by night, at the fore truck.

A vessel navigating against the tide should ease her engines and wait until any other vessel going with the tide has passed clear.

The following signals are hoisted at Mount Wise, Longroom, and South dockyard signal station:—

Signal and Signification.

Ball over Red Burgee.—Large ships coming from Sound to Hamoaze; all traffic outwards between Rubble bank and Melampus light-buoy is to cease while this signal is flying.

Red Burgee over Ball.—Large ships coming from Hamoaze to Sound; all traffic inwards between Melampus light-buoy and Rubble bank is to cease while this signal is flying.

It must be clearly understood that when either of the above signals is hoisted, no merchant vessel is allowed to be under way within the limits defined hereunder, unless permission has previously been obtained from the Naval authorities.

Limits.

The Northern limit is a line drawn 90° and 270° (*S. 74° E. Mag.*) and (*N. 74° W. Mag.*) through the north Rubble buoy, and the Southern limit is a line joining Dunstone point and Melampus light-buoy.

Ordinary Port Regulations.

8. The ordinary Regulations of the Port, except as affected by this Notice, are to be strictly adhered to.

Variation.— 16° W.

Note.—This Notice is a revision of the former Notice quoted above.

Caution.

This Admiralty Notice to Mariners is issued under the provisions of the Defence of the Realm (Consolidation) Regulations, 1914, and failure to comply strictly with the directions contained in it will constitute an offence against those Regulations.

Any person found guilty of such an offence is liable to severe penalties both of imprisonment and fine.

Any person aiding or abetting the commission of such an offence is himself guilty of an offence against the Regulations.
