The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by the Representation of the People Act, 1918 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act"), as amended by the Representation of the People (Amendment) Act, 1918, power is conferred on His Majesty to make provision for various matters by Order in Council:

And whereas by the Representation of the People Order His Majesty was pleased by Order in Council to make provision for various matters under the Act:

And whereas by section 40 (2) of the Act any Order in Council made thereunder may be revoked or varied as occasion requires by any subsequent Order in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, in pursuance of the powers conferred on Him by the Act, and of all other powers enabling Him in that behalf, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

The Representation of the People Order shall be amended as follows:—

The following rule shall be inserted after rule 1:—

" 1A.—The electors lists for a registration unit shall consist of—

List A.—A copy of the register in force for the unit.

List B.—A list of newly-qualified electors, *i.e.*, persons who are qualified for registration as parliamentary or as local government electors in respect of qualifying premises for which they are not registered in the register in force or for which they have become entitled to be registered in a different voting capacity.

List C.—A list of persons no longer qualified as electors, *i.e.*, persons who, being registered in respect of qualifying premises in the register in force, have ceased to be qualified for registration as parliamentary or as local government electors in respect of those premises or have become entitled to be registered in respect of those premises in a different voting capacity.

" Provided that where since the publication of the register the area of a registration unit

has been altered the register in force shall be deemed to be the register or registers for the unit or units any part of which is comprised in the new unit."

2. The following paragraph shall be inserted at the end of rule 2:—

"Where a person is qualified for registration as a parliamentary elector in respect of more than one qualification and any entry in respect of him has been removed as a duplicate, the registration officer shall not be required to include in subsequent electors lists any entry which has been so removed if the elector remains qualified for registration as a parliamentary elector in respect of the qualification for which he is so registered in the register in force."

3. The following rule shall be substituted for rule 43:—

"43. As respects constituencies in Great Britain the Spring Register for 1920 shall come into force on the 15th day of May, nineteen hundred and twenty, and shall remain in force, unless otherwise ordered, until the 15th day of October, nineteen hundred and twenty, and in connection with that register the registration dates shall be the dates specified in the third column of Part I. of Schedule X. to this Order."

4. The following rule shall be substituted for rule 45:—

"45. The documents mentioned in Part II. of Schedule X. to this Order shall, for the purposes of the Spring Register for 1920, be kept published until the dates specified in the second column of that Schedule."

5. The third register prepared under the Act shall remain in force until the 15th day of May, nineteen hundred and twenty, and accordingly in rule 43A the 15th day of May shall be substituted for the 15th day of April.

6. The following rules shall be inserted after rule 34:—

"34A. It shall be the duty of the registration officer to transmit to the Minister of Health, in addition to the copy of the register required to be transmitted by rule 27 in the First Schedule to the Act, a summary of the contents of the register, at such times and in such form and giving such particulars as the Minister of Health may require.

"This rule shall not apply to Scotland."

"34B. Where any provision of this Order is repugnant to or inconsistent with any of the rules set out in the First Schedule to the Act, such rules shall be deemed to be amended in such manner as to bring the same into conformity with this Order."

7. The following form shall be substituted for No. XI. in the "Forms for England and Wales" set out in Schedule I., being the form of register for England and Wales:—

The register contains the names in [alphabetical] [street] order of all persons entitled to vote as parliamentary and as local government electors.

The Index letters in columns 2 (a) headed "Parliamentary" or 2 (b) headed "Local Govt." of the register show the nature of the qualification of an elector, as follows:—

- R. = Residence qualification.
- B.P. = Business premises qualification.
- O. = Occupation qualification.
- H.O. = Qualification through husband's occupation.
- N.M. = Naval or military voter.

The entry of the appropriate index letter or letters against a name in the column 2 (a) headed "Parliamentary" indicates that the elector is a parliamentary elector, and the entry of the appropriate letter or letters against a name in the column 2 (b) headed "Local Govt." indicates that the elector is a local government elector. No. 2 ORDER, 1919.**

Whereas by the Flax (Irish Crop) Order, 1919, as amended by the Flax (Irish Crop) Amendment Order, 1919, the Minister of Munitions regulated upon certain terms the sale of all Flax of the 1919 crop grown in Ireland:

And whereas it is expedient that the said Order should be further amended:

Now therefore the Minister of Munitions, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon him by the Defence of the Realm Regulations and all other powers thereunto enabling him, hereby orders as follows:—

1. The Flax (Irish Crop) Order, 1919, as amended by the Flax (Irish Crop) Amendment Order, 1919, shall be amended by substituting for Clause 2 of the said Order as amended the following Clause:—

“(2) The Flax of which possession is hereby taken under Clause 1 hereof will be divided under the direction of the Board of Trade into six grades according to its quality, handling and cleaning, and no person shall sell any Flax of the description aforesaid at prices other than those hereinafter set out:—

First Grade, 45s. per stone, delivered at the appointed centre.

Second Grade, 43s. per stone, delivered at the appointed centre.

Third Grade, 41s. per stone, delivered at the appointed centre.

Fourth Grade, 39s. per stone, delivered at the appointed centre.

Fifth Grade, 37s. per stone, delivered at the appointed centre.

Sixth Grade, 35s. per stone, delivered at the appointed centre.

Flax which is inferior in quality to that of the sixth grade hereinbefore mentioned shall be paid for according to its relative value.”

2. This Order may be cited as the Flax (Irish Crop) Amendment No. 2 Order, 1919.

LYTHAM URBAN DISTRICT COUNCIL

(Acquisition by Lytham Urban District Council of Portion of Undertaking of Blackpool, St. Anne's and Lytham Tramways Company Limited; Running Powers and Working Agreements; Tramways in Lytham; Acquisition of Lands; Levying and Increase of Tolls, Rates and Charges; Motive Power, Erection of Equipment, Attachment of Brackets to Buildings, &c.; Provision as to Waiting Rooms, Lost Property, &c.; Lopping of Trees and Penalties; Generation and Supply of Electricity; Cost and Terms of Supply; Working Agreements; Compulsory Running Powers over Tramways of Blackpool Corporation and St. Anne's-on-Sea Urban District Council; Repeal of certain Provisions of Blackpool, St. Anne's and Lytham Tramways Act, 1900; Provision and Running of Omnibuses in the district and in Blackpool and St. Anne's; Borrowing of Money and other Financial Provisions; Incorporation, Amendment and Repeal, &c., of Acts and Orders and other Purposes.)

NOTICE is hereby given, that application is intended to be made to Parliament in the ensuing Session by the Urban District Council of Lytham (in this Notice called "the Council") for an Act for all or some of the purposes hereinafter mentioned:—

1. To empower the Council to acquire the portion of the undertaking within the district of the council of the Blackpool, St. Anne's and Lytham Tramways Company Limited (hereinafter called "the Company"), including their tramways, lands, buildings, works, plant, rolling stock and property, and the rights, powers, authorities and privileges exercisable by them in respect thereof, and the benefit of certain agreements dated the 4th October, 1898, and the 10th February, 1917, between the Company and the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the borough of Blackpool, and to provide for the transfer to and vesting in the Council of the portion of the said undertaking, rights, powers and properties, the application of the purchase money, and to confirm and authorize the carrying into effect of any agreement between the Company and the Council or the Company and the St. Anne's-on-Sea Urban District Council that may have been entered into before the passing of the Bill for or relating to the sale and purchase of the undertaking or otherwise, or to enact provisions giving effect to any such agreement or agreements, and to amend any such agreement so as to carry into effect the objects of the intended Act.

2. To empower the Council to carry on the undertaking acquired by the Council and to maintain, alter, improve, enlarge, renew or discontinue the tramways and works of the Company.

3. To confer on the Council all or some of the powers contained in the Blackpool, St. Anne's and Lytham Tramways Act, 1900 (hereinafter called "the Act of 1900"), and any other Acts relating to the Company's undertaking, or to repeal the said Acts, and, if thought fit, to re-enact with amendments and to make applicable to the Council certain of the enactments contained therein.

4. To empower the Council to make, lay

down, use and maintain the tramways herein-after described in the urban district of Lytham, with all necessary and proper rails, plates, junctions, turnouts, crossings, passing places, posts, poles, brackets, wires, works and conveniences, namely:—

Tramway No. 1.—3 furlongs 0.73 chains or thereabouts in length (being a double line in lieu of existing single line) commencing in Church-road by a junction with the existing tramway therein authorized by the Act of 1900 at a point 6.63 chains or thereabouts measured in an easterly direction from the intersection of Woodville-terrace and Church-road, passing along Church-road and Market-square into and terminating in Clifton-street by a junction with the existing tramway at a point 1.84 chains west of the intersection of Pleasant-street with Clifton-street.

Tramway No. 2.—A double line 2.50 chains or thereabouts in length commencing in Market-square by a junction with Tramway No. 1 hereinbefore described at a point 1.65 chains or thereabouts west of the point of intersection of Park-street and Clifton-square in a southerly direction, passing into and terminating in Clifton-square at a point 1.19 chains north of the intersection of Henry-street and Clifton-square.

5. The tramways will be laid along the several streets and roads hereinafter mentioned, so that for a distance of 30 feet or upwards a less space than 9 feet 6 inches will intervene between the outside of the footpath on the side or sides hereinafter mentioned of the streets or roads and the nearest rail of the tramway.

Tramway No. 1.—In Church-road and Market-square. On the north side thereof throughout its whole length.

The proposed tramways will be constructed on the gauge of 4 feet 8½ inches, and it is not intended to run thereon carriages or trucks adapted for use on railways.

6. To empower the Council to make from time to time such crossings, passing places, sidings, loops, junctions, and other works in addition to those specified herein as may be necessary or convenient to the efficient working of the intended tramways, and of any other tramways for the time being belonging to or worked or run over by the Council (all of which tramways are hereinafter included in the expression "the Council tramways") or any of them or for affording access to the stables, carriage houses, sheds and works of the Council or their lessees.

7. To empower the Council from time to time when by reason of the execution of any work in, or the alteration of, any street, road, highway or thoroughfare in which any of the Council tramways shall be laid, it is necessary or expedient so to do to alter, remove or discontinue all or any of such tramways, and to make and lay down in the same or any adjacent street, road, highway or thoroughfare a substituted or temporary tramway or substituted or temporary tramways.

8. To empower the Council from time to time to alter or reconstruct any of the Council tramways or any part or parts thereof, and to take up and remove any of such tramways or any part or parts thereof respectively, and to relay the same in such part of the street or road as the Council may think fit.

9. To empower the Council to lay down

double in lieu of single lines and single in lieu of double lines or interlacing lines in lieu of double or single lines.

10. To provide for the repair by the Council, their lessees or other persons, bodies or authorities of any streets, roads, highways or thoroughfares in which any tramway may for the time being be laid and for the use or disposal of any materials or things found in the construction, alteration, reconstruction or repair of any of the Council tramways.

11. To provide that so much of Section 34 of the Tramways Act, 1870, as limits the extent of any carriages used on any tramway beyond the outer edge of the whole of such carriages shall not apply to carriages used on the Council tramways.

12. To empower the Council for the purposes of the Council tramways and for other the purposes of the intended Act to purchase or acquire by agreement or to take on lease lands, houses, buildings and other property in the urban district of Lytham, and to take easements over or in connection with any such lands.

13. To empower the Council and their lessees to work the Council tramways by electricity or mechanical or other motive power or partly by one such power and partly by another such power, and to place and run carriages thereon.

14. To prescribe the price and terms upon which electrical power is to be supplied for working the Council tramways, and for lighting any public lamps in connection therewith.

15. To specify the nature of the traffic for which the Council tramways shall or may be used, and to reserve cars for special purposes; to authorize the Council and their lessees or other the person or persons working such tramways to levy tolls, rates and charges for the use thereof by carriages passing along the same, and the conveyance of passengers, goods, minerals, animals, merchandise and other traffic upon the same, and to increase existing tolls, rates and charges; and to confer exemptions from tolls, rates and charges.

16. To empower the Council to lay down, construct, erect and maintain on, in, under or over the surface of any street, road or place, and to attach to any house and building such posts, conductors, transformers, wires, tubes, mains, plates, cables, ropes and apparatus, and to make and maintain such openings and ways in, on or under any such surface, and to attach to any house, bridge or building such supports, brackets and fittings as may be necessary or convenient for the working of the Council tramways, or for providing access to or in connection with any engines, machinery or apparatus used for the purposes of such tramways.

17. To empower the Council to provide shelters and waiting rooms, cloak rooms and sheds for the accommodation and use of passengers and others using the Council tramways, and to use any parts of any public or private streets and roads, or any public park, gardens or recreation grounds for such purposes; to appoint and alter stages from time to time upon the said tramways and starting and stopping places for their tramcars, and to marshal and make bye-laws for marshalling and regulating the conduct of intending passengers by, on or in their tramcars, to attach to any buildings, lamp-posts, poles, standards, brackets or other similar erections

on or near to any of the Council tramways, signs or directions, indicating the positions of stopping places for cars running on such routes; to acquire, hold and use patent and other rights and licences relative to tramways and the manufacture, working or user thereof, and the user of electrical and other motive power; and to make provision with reference to property lost or found in the tramcars, owned or worked by the Council, or in the shelters, rooms or sheds provided by them in connection therewith.

18. To authorize and enable the Council to cut, lop and remove trees overhanging any public or private street or road or otherwise interfering with the proper and safe passage of the Council tramcars, and the erection, maintenance and user of their tramway equipment; to remove any snow or other matter interfering with the working of their tramcars, and to use the Council tramways for the carriage of refuse and materials in connection with the works of the Council and for sanitary purposes.

19. To make provision for and with reference to and to empower the Ministry of Transport and the Council to make regulations and bye-laws relating to the Council tramways worked by the Council and the working and user thereof and the regulation of traffic on the streets and roads forming part of or adjoining or intersecting the Council tramways; to provide for the enforcement of such regulations and bye-laws by penalties and otherwise, and to make provision for the protection of the Council tramways and tramcars from injury or damage, and for the punishment by penalties and otherwise of persons injuring or damaging or improperly using or interfering with the same; if thought fit to extend and apply to the intended Act, and to such injuries and damages, and to the obstruction of any tramcars of the Council any of the provisions of the Malicious Damages Act, 1861; and to impose penalties on persons interfering with the Council in the exercise of the powers to be conferred upon them by the intended Act.

20. To authorize and empower the Council to generate, store, transform, transmit and supply electrical energy for working and lighting the Council tramways and any stations, premises, and depôts used for or in connection therewith, and for traction purposes; and for telephonic communication or otherwise in connection with the Council tramways and any omnibuses of the Council.

21. To authorize the Council on the one hand and the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the borough of Blackpool, and also the St. Anne's-on-Sea Urban District Council, and any other company, local authority, body or person owning or working or who may hereafter own or work any tramway which can be worked with or in conjunction with any tramway owned or worked by, or leased to, or run over by the Council on the other hand, to enter into and carry into effect agreements for the working, running over, leasing, using, managing, alteration, construction, or equipment and maintenance by the contracting parties, or either, or any of them, of all or any of their respective tramways, the making of all necessary junctions and the supply of tramcars, plant, machinery and electrical energy necessary for the purposes of such agreements; the employment, appointment and removal of officers and servants and others; the payments to be made and conditions to be performed in respect of such working;

leasing, use, management and maintenance, and the interchange, accommodation and convenience, transmission and delivery of traffic coming from or destined for the respective undertakings of the contracting parties; the payment, collection, division and apportionment of the tolls, rates or other receipts arising from the respective undertakings, the giving and taking of guarantees, and to confer on the Council and any such local authority, company or person all such powers as may be necessary for giving effect to all or any of the aforesaid purposes.

22. To empower the Council or their lessees or any local authority, company or persons running over and using any tramways owned or worked by the Council, or any part thereof, to run over and use with their engines and carriages for the purpose of passengers, goods and other traffic, and with their officers and servants upon such terms and conditions and upon payment of such tolls, rates and charges or other consideration as may be agreed upon, or as, failing agreement, may be determined by arbitration or by the Ministry of Transport or other tribunal as defined by the intended Act, the tramways in the borough of Blackpool and the urban district of St. Anne's-on-Sea, or any parts or part of such tramways.

23. To enable the Council to provide and run omnibuses within the district, the borough of Blackpool and the urban district of St. Anne's-on-Sea and elsewhere with the consent of the local and road authority, to provide that such consent shall not be unreasonably withheld, and to make provision for the determination of differences between the Council and the local and road authorities aforesaid, to demand and recover tolls and charges for the use of such omnibuses, and to apply any of the provisions of the Bill with regard to tramways to omnibuses.

24. To confirm and give effect to any agreement or agreements entered into or which may be entered into by the Council with any company, body or person in relation to any of the matters aforesaid.

25. To vary or extinguish all or any rights and privileges inconsistent with or which would or might in any way interfere with the objects of the intended Act, and to confer other rights and privileges.

26. To empower the Council to borrow or

raise money for the purchase of the Company's undertaking and the payment of any sums to the Company and their officers, and the construction of the works, and for all other the purposes of the Bill, and to charge such moneys upon the district fund and the general district rate and upon the estates, undertakings, rates, rents, revenue and other property of the Council or on any of those securities, and to execute and grant mortgages, or to create and issue stock in respect thereof, and to apply some of the financial and other provisions of the existing Acts of the Council to and in respect of money borrowed under the Bill.

27. To incorporate, with or without amendment, or to render inapplicable all or some of the provisions of the following public Acts:— The Public Health Acts; the Lands Clauses Acts; the Tramways Act, 1870; and all Acts amending those Acts respectively, and to repeal, alter, amend or incorporate all or some of the provisions of the local Acts and Provisional Orders confirmed by Act of Parliament now in force within the district, including the following (that is to say):—

The Lytham Improvement Act, 1904, and any other Act or Order relating to the Council; the St. Anne's-on-Sea Improvement Act, 1914, and any other Act or Order relating to the St. Anne's-on-Sea Urban District Council, and the Blackpool, St. Anne's and Lytham Tramways Act, 1900, and any other Act or Order relating to the Company.

Plans and sections of the intended tramways, together with a book of reference to the plans and a copy of this Notice as published in the London Gazette, will forthwith be deposited for public inspection with the Clerk of the Peace for Lancashire at his office at Preston and with the Clerk to the Lytham Urban District Council at his office at Lytham.

Printed copies of the Bill will be deposited in the Private Bill Office of the House of Commons on or before the 17th day of December next.
