The KING'S Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by an Order made by the late King's Most Excellent Majesty in Council on the 19th March, 1908, His Majesty was pleased to order (amongst other things) that, where any property belonging to or held for the benefit of a unit of Volunteers or Yeomanry mentioned in the first column of the Schedule to that Order was vested in or held by any Trustees other than the Commanding Officer of such unit, those Trustees should, until otherwise directed by Order in Council under Section 29 of the Territorial and Reserve Forces Act, 1907, be appointed in regard to the property so vested in or held by them to be special Trustees, to the exclusion of the Association, and should continue to hold such property in trust for the corresponding unit of the Territorial Force in like manner in all respects as they previously held it for the audit of the Volunteers or Yeomanry, and that the corresponding unit should, notwithstanding any trust, limitation, or condition affecting any such property, continue entitled to the benefit

thereof in like manner as the unit was entitled thereto before it became a unit of the Territorial Force:

And whereas by virtue of the above-recited provisions of the said Order in Council the Trustees named in the first column of the Schedule to this Order hold the property described and set opposite to their names in the second column of that Schedule in trust for the unit of the Territorial Force mentioned in the third column of that Schedule for the purposes and subject to the limitations mentioned in the deed referred to in the fourth column of that Schedule, and it is expedient that such property should be transferred from those Trustees to the County Association mentioned in the fifth column of that Schedule:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, doth order, and it is hereby ordered, that as from the date of this Order the said property shall be by virtue of this Order transferred from the said Trustees to and vested in the said County Association subject to any charges thereon and to any liabilities in or towards the discharge of which the said property is properly applicable, and shall be held by the said Trustees for the benefit of the said unit of the Territorial Force or for such other purposes as the Association

with the consent of the said unit (to be ascertained in manner prescribed by regulations of the Army Council) shall direct, but so that the interest of any beneficiary other than the said

unit or the unit of the Volunteers or Yeomanry with which it corresponds shall not without the consent of such beneficiary be affected.

The KING'S Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by section 26 of the Pluralities Act, 1838, after reciting that "Whereas in some instances Tithings, Hamlets, Chapelries, and other Places or Districts may be separated from the Parishes or Mother Churches to which they belong, with great advantage, and Places altogether Extra-Parochial may, in some instances, with advantage be annexed to Parishes or Districts to which they are contiguous, or be constituted separate Parishes for ecclesiastical purposes," it is, amongst other things, enacted, "That when with respect to his own Diocese it shall appear to the Archbishop of the Province, or when the Bishop of any Diocese shall represent to the said Archbishop, that any such Tithing, Hamlet, Chapelry, Place or District within the Diocese of such Archbishop, or the Diocese of such Bishop, as the case may be, may be advantageously separated from any Parish or Mother Church, and either be constituted a Separate Benefice by itself or be united to any other Parish to which it may be more conveniently annexed, or to any other adjoining Tithing, Hamlet, Chapelry, Place, or District, Parochial or Extra-Parochial, so as to form a Separate Parish or Benefice, or that any Extra-Parochial Place may with advantage be annexed to any Parish to which it is contiguous, or be constituted a Separate Parish for ecclesiastical purposes; and the said Archbishop, or Bishop, shall draw up a scheme in writing (the scheme of such Bishop to be transmitted to the said Archbishop for his consideration) describing the mode in which it appears to him that the alteration may best be effected, and how the changes consequent on such alteration in respect to Ecclesiastical Jurisdiction, Glebe Lands, Tithes, Rent Charges, and other Eccle-

siastical Dues, Rates and Payments, and in respect to Patronage and rights to pews, may be made with justice to all parties interested; and if the Patron or Patrons of the Benefice or Benefices to be affected by such alteration shall consent in writing under his or their hands to such scheme, or to such modification thereof, as the said Archbishop may approve, and the said Archbishop shall, on full consideration and inquiry, be satisfied with any such scheme, or modification thereof, and shall certify the same and such consent as aforesaid, by his report to His Majesty in Council, it shall be lawful for His Majesty in Council to make an Order for carrying such scheme, or modification thereof, as the case may be, into effect."

And whereas the Right Reverend John Reginald, Lord Bishop of Rochester, hath made a Representation in writing, dated the 19th day of September, 1919, to the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Randall Thomas, Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, as follows:—

"I, John Reginald, by Divine Permission Bishop of Rochester, do, in pursuance of the 26th Section of the Act of Parliament of the 1st and 2nd years of the reign of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, c. 106, hereby represent to your Grace:

"1. There is in the County of Kent and my Diocese of Rochester, the Rectory of Crayford, the Parish whereof lies adjacent to the Parish of Bexley and contains, according to the census of 1911, a population of 5,167 persons, and the net annual value thereof is £600.

"2. In the same County and Diocese is the Vicarage of Bexley, the Parish whereof adjoins the District Chapelry of Christ Church, Dartford, and contains, according to the census of 1911, a population of 3,242 persons, and the net annual value thereof is £151.

"3. In the same County and Diocese is the said District Chapelry of Christ Church, Dartford, the Parish whereof adjoins the Parish of

Crayford aforesaid, and contains, according to the census of 1911, a population of 5,562 persons, and the net annual value thereof is £290.

" 4. In the same County and Diocese is the District Chapelry of Christ Church, Bexley Heath, the Parish whereof adjoins the Parish of St. Paul, Northumberland Heath, and contains, according to the census of 1911, a population of 9,504 persons, and the net annual value thereof is £270.

" 4A. In the same County and Diocese is the District Chapelry of St. Paul, Northumberland Heath, the Parish whereof adjoins the Parish of Christ Church, Erith, and contains, according to the census of 1911, a population of 4,029 persons, and the net annual value thereof is £220.

" 5. In the same County and Diocese is the District Chapelry of Christ Church, Erith, the Parish whereof adjoins the Parish of Erith, and contains, according to the census of 1911, a population of 4,752 persons, and the net annual value thereof is £300.

" 6. In the same County and Diocese is the said Parish of Erith, the Parish whereof adjoins the Parish of All Saints, Belvedere, and contains, according to the census of 1911, a population of 10,749 persons, and the net annual value thereof is £440.

" 7. In the same County and Diocese is the Particular District of All Saints, Belvedere aforesaid, the Parish whereof contains, according to the census of 1911, a population of 9,288 persons, and the net annual value thereof is £316.

" 8. In consequence of the increase of the population in the Parishes aforesaid, it appears to me that the following alterations may be made in the boundaries thereof with advantage to the interests of religion: (1) a certain district of the said Parish of Bexley being contiguous to the said Parish of Crayford may be advantageously separated from the said Parish of Bexley, and united to the said Parish of Crayford, (2) a certain district of the said Parish of Christ Church, Dartford, being contiguous to the said Parish of Bexley, may be united to the said Parish of Bexley, (3) a certain district of the said Parish of Crayford, being contiguous to the said Parish of Christ Church, Bexley Heath, may be united to the said Parish of Bexley Heath, (4) a certain district of the said Parish of Crayford, being contiguous to the said Parish of St. Paul, Northumberland Heath, may be united to the said Parish of St. Paul, Northumberland Heath, (5) a certain district of the said Parish of Christ Church, Erith, being contiguous to the said Parish of St. Paul, Northumberland Heath, may be united to the said Parish of St. Paul, Northumberland Heath, (6) a certain district of the said Parish of All Saints, Belvedere, being contiguous to the said Parish of St. Paul, Northumberland Heath, may be united to the said Parish of St. Paul, Northumberland Heath, (7) a certain district of the said Parish of Erith, being contiguous to the said Parish of Christ Church, Erith, may be united to the last-mentioned Parish.

" 9. Hugh Sidney Marsham Townshend, Esquire, of Bexley, in the County of Kent, is the Patron of the said Benefices of Bexley and Christ Church, Bexley Heath, the Reverend Leonard Savill, Vicar, of the Vicarage of Dartford, is, in right of his said Vicarage, Patron of the said Benefice of Christ Church, Dartford, Francis Augustus Bevan, of 54, Lombard

Street, in the City of London, Esquire, John Francis William Deacon, of 20, Birchin Lane, in the City of London aforesaid, Esquire, the Reverend David James Stather Hunt, Vicar, of the Vicarage of Holy Trinity, Tunbridge Wells, in the County of Kent, Honorary Canon of the Cathedral Church of Rochester, and the Reverend Walter Evelyn Gilliat, Vicar, of the Vicarage of Iver, in the County of Buckingham, are the Patrons of the said Benefice of St. Paul, Northumberland Heath, the Venerable Donald Tait, Archdeacon of Rochester, the Reverend Alfred William Boulden, Vicar, of the Vicarage of Christ Church, Erith aforesaid, Everard Hesketh, of Beachcroft, Eltham, in the County of Kent, Esquire, and James Simms, of Craighead, Woolwich Road, Abbey Wood, in the same County, Esquire, are the Patrons of the said Benefice of All Saints, Belvedere, the Right Honourable Philip George, Baron Wynford, is the Patron of the said Benefice of Erith, and I, the Bishop aforesaid, am Patron of the said Benefices of Crayford and Christ Church, Erith.

" 10. The Reverend John Henry Wicksteed is the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Bexley, the Reverend Canon Gustavus John Jones is the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Crayford, the Reverend Rowland Wormell is the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Christ Church, Dartford, the Reverend William Reed is the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Christ Church, Bexley Heath, the Reverend Henry Wilmot Watson is the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of St. Paul, Northumberland Heath, the Reverend Alfred William Boulden is the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Christ Church, Erith, the Reverend William Francis Cobb, is the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Erith, and the Reverend William Richard Hartwright is the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of All Saints, Belvedere.

" 11. Pursuant to the directions contained in the 26th Section of the said Act, I, the said Bishop, have drawn up a Scheme in writing, appended to this Representation, describing the several areas or districts of the Parishes of Bexley, Christ Church Dartford, Crayford, Christ Church Erith, All Saints Belvedere, and Erith, proposed to be annexed to the said Parishes of Crayford, Bexley, Christ Church Bexley Heath, St. Paul Northumberland Heath, and Christ Church Erith, respectively, and the mode in which it appears to me the alterations may be best effected, and how the changes consequent thereon in respect to Ecclesiastical jurisdiction, Glebe Lands, Tithes, Dues, Rates and payments, and in respect of Patronage and rights to pews may be made with justice to all parties interested. And I do hereby submit the same to your Grace, together with the consents, in writing, of the said Patrons and Incumbents, and in case you shall, on full consideration and inquiry, be satisfied therewith, I request that your Grace will be pleased to certify the same and the Consents of the Patrons thereto to His Majesty in Council."

And whereas the said Scheme drawn up by the said Bishop and the Consents referred to in the said Representation are as follows:—

" SCHEME.

" 1. It is proposed to separate the following District from the Parish of Bexley in the County of Kent and Diocese of Rochester and

unite the same for ecclesiastical purposes to the adjoining Parish of Crayford in the same County and Diocese:—

“Such District shall consist of that portion of the said Parish of Bexley which lies to the north-east of an imaginary line starting on the eastern boundary of the said Parish where the tram line from the sand and gravel pits crosses the said boundary and proceeding north-westward along the centre of the said tram line to its junction with the South Eastern and Chatham Railway between Bexley and Crayford Stations thence crossing the said Railway and along the western boundaries of the fields numbered 274 and 273 on the Ordnance map for the said Parish of Bexley to the River Cray thence crossing the said River it proceeds northward along the eastern boundaries of the fields numbered 292 and 300 on the said Ordnance map along the centre of the Farm road numbered 299 on the said Ordnance map until it reaches Bourne road and thence north-westward across Bourne Road in a straight line to the boundary stone of the said Parish on the Dover Road on the northern boundary of the said Parish and such District is coloured pink and indicated by the letter ‘A’ on the annexed plan. The inhabitants of the said District shall not in future be entitled to any accommodation in the Parish Church of Bexley (except nevertheless any person or persons possessing a legal right by faculty or otherwise to any pew or sitting within the said Church and who may not be willing to relinquish and give up the same) and shall be exonerated from all liability to repair the said Parish Church of Bexley but shall be entitled to accommodation in the Parish Church of Crayford and shall be liable subject to the provisions of the Compulsory Church Rates Abolition Act, 1868, to the repairs of the said Church. The Incumbent of the Parish of Crayford shall have the sole and exclusive Cure of Souls within the above-mentioned District.

“2. It is also proposed to separate the following District from the Parish of Christ Church Dartford in the same County and Diocese and to unite the same to the adjoining Parish of Bexley aforesaid:

“Such District shall consist of that portion of the said Parish of Christ Church Dartford which lies to the west of an imaginary line starting from the centre of Dartford Heath Road where the boundary of the said Parish of Crayford crosses that road and proceeds southward along the centre of that road and south-westward along the centre of the road leading from Heathside to Maypole until it meets the High Road known as Dartford Lane and thence westward along the centre of the last-mentioned road to the eastern boundary of the said Parish of Bexley and such District is coloured blue and indicated by the letter ‘B’ on the annexed plan. The inhabitants of the said District shall not in future be entitled to any accommodation in the Parish Church of Christ Church Dartford (except nevertheless any person or persons possessing a legal right by faculty or otherwise to any pew or sitting within the said Church and who may not be willing to relinquish and give up the same) and shall be exonerated from all liability to repair the said Parish Church of Christ Church Dartford but shall be entitled to accommodation in the Parish Church of Bexley and shall be liable

subject to the provisions of the Compulsory Church Rates Abolition Act, 1868, to the repairs of the said Church. The Incumbent of the Parish of Bexley shall have the sole and exclusive Cure of Souls within the above-mentioned District.

“3. It is also proposed to separate the following District from the Parish of Crayford aforesaid and to unite the same to the Parish of Christ Church Bexley Heath in the same County and Diocese:—

“Such District shall consist of that portion of the said Parish of Crayford which lies to the west of an imaginary line starting from the southern boundary of the said Parish of Crayford in the Dover Road at the point where it meets the estate known as Martens Grave and proceeds northward from the said boundary along the western boundary fence of the said property until it reaches May Place Road and proceeds thence eastward along the centre of the last-mentioned road to its junction with Hills and Holes Road, thence northward along the centre of the last-mentioned road until it meets the western boundary of the said Parish in the Bexley Road, and such District is coloured purple and indicated by the letter ‘C’ on the annexed plan. The inhabitants of the said District shall not in future be entitled to any accommodation in the Parish Church of Crayford (except nevertheless any person or persons possessing a legal right by faculty or otherwise to any pew or sitting within the said Church and who may not be willing to relinquish or give up the same) and shall be exonerated from all liability to repair the said Parish Church of Crayford but shall be entitled to accommodation in the Parish Church of Christ Church Bexley Heath and shall be liable subject to the provisions of the Compulsory Church Rates Abolition Act, 1868, to the repairs of the said Church. The Incumbent of the Parish of Christ Church Bexley Heath shall have the sole and exclusive Cure of Souls within the above-mentioned District.

“4. It is also proposed to separate the following District from the Parish of Crayford aforesaid and to unite the same to the Parish of St. Paul Northumberland Heath in the same County and Diocese:—

“Such District shall consist of that portion of the said Parish of Crayford which is bounded by an imaginary line starting at a point in Hills and Holes Road which is over the centre of the Railway from Bexley Heath to Barnehurst near the latter Station and proceeding north-westward along the centre of the said Road until it meets the western boundary of the said Parish in the Bexley Road thence following the boundary of the said Parish northward and eastward to the point where Collyer Lane leaves the said boundary for Myrtle Farm thence proceeding in a southerly direction along the eastern fence of the grounds of the property known as Northumberland House and thence in a direct line until it reaches the second culvert on the said Railway from Barnehurst Station thence westward along the centre of the said Railway to the point in the Hills and Holes Road whence the said imaginary line started and such district is coloured yellow and indicated by the letter ‘D’ on the annexed plan. The inhabitants of the said District shall not in future be entitled to any accommodation in the Parish Church of Crayford (except nevertheless any person or persons possessing a legal

right by faculty or otherwise to any pew or sitting within the said Church and who may not be willing to relinquish or give up the same) and shall be exonerated from all liability to repair the said Parish Church of Crayford but shall be entitled to accommodation in the Parish Church of St. Paul Northumberland Heath and shall be liable subject to the provisions of the Compulsory Church Rates Abolition Act, 1868, to the repairs of the said Church. The Incumbent of the Parish of St. Paul Northumberland Heath shall have the sole and exclusive Cure of Souls within the above-mentioned District.

" 5. It is also proposed to separate the following District from the Parish of Christ Church Erith aforesaid and to unite the same to the Parish of St. Paul Northumberland Heath aforesaid:—

" Such District shall consist of that portion of the said Parish of Christ Church Erith as is bounded on the north and east by an imaginary line starting from the western boundary of the said Parish at its junction with Park Crescent and proceeding thence along the centre of Park Crescent in an easterly direction to the western corner of the grounds of the house known as Riversfield and proceeding thence south-eastward along the western boundary of the said grounds and the western boundary of the garden and grounds belonging to Lesney House and the eastern boundary of the yard and enclosure adjoining Lesney Farm and continuing thence in a more southerly direction to the northern boundary of the Parish of Crayford where that boundary first meets the High Road from Myrtle Farm to Northumberland Heath and known as Colliers Lane on the south by the Parish of Crayford aforesaid and on the west by the said Parish of St. Paul Northumberland Heath and such district is coloured green and indicated by the letter ' E ' on the annexed plan. The inhabitants of the said District shall not in future be entitled to any accommodation in the Parish Church of Christ Church Erith (except nevertheless any person or persons possessing a legal right by faculty or otherwise to any pew or sitting within the said Church and who may not be willing to relinquish or give up the same) and shall be exonerated from all liability to repair the said Parish Church of Christ Church Erith but shall be entitled to accommodation in the Parish Church of St. Paul Northumberland Heath and shall be liable subject to the provisions of the Compulsory Church Rates Abolition Act, 1868, to the repairs of the said Church. The Incumbent of the Parish of St. Paul Northumberland Heath shall have the sole and exclusive Cure of Souls within the above-mentioned district.

" 6. It is also proposed to separate the following District from the Parish of All Saints Belvedere in the same County and Diocese and to unite the same to the Parish of St. Paul Northumberland Heath aforesaid:—

" Such District shall consist of that part of the said parish of All Saints Belvedere which lies to the east of Bedonwell Road and to the south of the Lane leading from Bedonwell Road aforesaid to Brook Street and such District is coloured brown and indicated by the letter ' F ' on the annexed plan. The inhabitants of the said District shall not in future be entitled to any accommodation in the Parish Church of All Saints, Belvedere (except nevertheless any

person or persons possessing a legal right by faculty or otherwise to any pew or sitting within the said Church and who may not be willing to relinquish or give up the same) and shall be exonerated from all liability to repair the said Parish Church of All Saints Belvedere but shall be entitled to accommodation in the Parish Church of St. Paul Northumberland Heath and shall be liable subject to the provisions of the Compulsory Church Rates Abolition Act, 1868, to the repairs of the said Church. The Incumbent of the Parish of St. Paul Northumberland Heath shall have the sole and exclusive Cure of Souls within the above-mentioned District.

" 7. It is also proposed to separate the following District from the Parish of Erith in the same County and Diocese, and to unite the same to the Parish of Christ Church Erith aforesaid:—

" Such District shall consist of that portion of the said Parish of Erith which is bounded on the east and south by the boundary between the Parishes of Erith and Christ Church Erith and on all other sides by an imaginary line starting from the centre of Pier Road at its junction with Queens Road and proceeding north-westerly along the approach to Erith Railway Station thence north-eastward along the centre of Station Road to its junction with High Street thence northward across High Street along the eastern boundary of the Railway Station Wharf and proceeding northward until it meets the northern boundary of the Parish of Erith in the centre of the River Thames, and such District is coloured red and indicated by the letter ' G ' on the annexed plan. The inhabitants of the said District shall not in future be entitled to any accommodation in the Parish Church of Erith (except nevertheless any person or persons possessing a legal right by faculty or otherwise to any pew or sitting within the said Church and who may not be willing to relinquish or give up the same) and shall be exonerated from all liability to repair the said Parish Church of Erith but shall be entitled to accommodation in the Parish Church of Christ Church Erith and shall be liable subject to the provisions of the Compulsory Church Rates Abolition Act, 1868, to the repairs of the said Church. The Incumbent of the Parish of Christ Church Erith shall have the sole and exclusive Cure of Souls within the above-mentioned district.

" No alteration shall be made in the Patronage or endowments of any of the said Benefices.

" That pursuant to the directions contained in the said Pluralities Act the said Lord Bishop has drawn up a Scheme in writing describing the mode in which it appears to him that the proposed alterations may best be effected and how the changes consequent upon such alterations in respect of Ecclesiastical Jurisdiction, Glebe Lands, Tithe Rent-Charges and other Ecclesiastical Dues, Rates and Payments, and in respect to Patronage and rights to pews may be made with justice to all parties interested which Scheme, together with the Consents in writing of the respective Patrons and Incumbents of all the aforesaid Benefices or Parishes affected, has been transmitted to us by the said Lord Bishop for our consideration.

" The Representation and Scheme of the said Lord Bishop and the Consents above referred to are hereunto annexed.

" And We, the said Archbishop, being on full consideration and inquiry satisfied with the said Scheme, do hereby, pursuant to the said Pluralities Act, certify the same and such Consents as aforesaid to Your Majesty in Council to the intent that Your Majesty in Council may, in case Your Majesty in Council shall think fit so to do, make and issue an Order for carrying the said Scheme into effect.

TRADE BOARDS.

THE TRADE BOARDS (GROCERY AND PROVISIONS) ORDER, 1920, SPECIAL ORDER, DATED 17TH JUNE, 1920, MADE BY THE MINISTER OF LABOUR UNDER SECTION 1 OF THE TRADE BOARDS ACT, 1918, APPLYING THE TRADE BOARDS ACTS, 1909 (9 EDW. 7, C. 22) AND 1918 (8 & 9 GEO. 5, C. 32), TO THE GROCERY AND PROVISIONS TRADE,

Whereas the Minister of Labour is empowered under and by virtue of Sub-section (2) of Section 1 of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, to make a Special Order applying the Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and 1918, to any specified trade to which they do not at the time apply if he is of opinion that no adequate machinery exists for the effective regulation of wages throughout the trade, and that accordingly, having regard to the rates of wages prevailing in the trade or in any part of the trade, it is expedient that the Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and 1918, should apply to that trade;

And whereas it is provided by Sub-section (5) of Section 1 of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, that any Act confirming a Provisional Order made in pursuance of Section 1 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, may be repealed or varied by a Special Order;

And whereas the Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and 1918, do not apply to the trade specified in the appendix to this Order, except as regards such processes or operations as may be covered by the Trade Boards (Sugar Confectionery and Food Preserving) Order, 1913;

And whereas the Minister of Labour is of opinion that it is expedient that the Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and 1918, should apply to the trade specified in the Appendix to this Order;

Now, therefore, the Minister of Labour, in pursuance of the powers in him vested, as before recited, does hereby make a Special

Order that from and after the eighteenth day of June, 1920, the following provisions shall have effect (that is to say):—

ARTICLE 1.—The Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and 1918, shall apply to the Trade specified in the Appendix to this Order.

ARTICLE 2.—The Trade Boards Provisional Orders Confirmation Act, 1913, confirming, among other Orders, the Trade Boards (Sugar Confectionery and Food Preserving) Order, 1913, is hereby varied by the exclusion therefrom of all processes or operations comprised therein, which are included in the Appendix to this Order.

ARTICLE 3.—This Order may be cited as the Trade Boards (Grocery and Provisions) Order, 1920.

APPENDIX.

TRADE.

The Grocery and Provisions Trade (that is to say):—

1. The retail sale of any of the articles specified in Schedule I in or in connection with any establishment or business or branch or department in which:—

(a) twelve or more of such articles are sold or exposed for sale, whether or not the sale of such articles is the main business in the establishment or business or branch or department; or

(b) the retail sale of any one or more of such articles is the main or principal business of that establishment or business or branch or department.

2. The wholesale sale (except when incidental to manufacture or production) of any of the articles specified in Schedule II in or in connection with any establishment or business or branch or department in which such sale is the main or principal business of that establishment, business, branch, or department.

3. The sale of other goods when any such sale is carried on in association with the sales specified in paragraph 1 or paragraph 2 above if such sale involves the employment of workers who are also employed in those sales; including the following or similar operations when incidental to or carried on in conjunction with the sales specified in 1, 2, or 3 above:—

- (i) checking, testing, grading;
- (ii) weighing, measuring;
- (iii) packeting, boxing, bundling, bagging, parcelling, packing, unpacking, labelling;
- (iv) collecting, despatching, delivering;
- (v) stock-keeping, warehousing, storing, cold storing, refrigerating;
- (vi) portering, loading, unloading, lift or hoist operating;
- (vii) timekeeping, cleaning premises;
- (viii) adjusting implements, cleaning implements, utensils or receptacles;
- (ix) cleaning goods;
- (x) window or show-case dressing;
- (xi) garaging, horse or motor keeping, cleaning vehicles;
- (xii) mixing, blending, crushing, grinding, mincing, shredding, cutting;

(xiii) sausage making, bacon processing, ham processing, ham boiling, ham or bacon curing;

(xiv) roasting coffee, blanching almonds;

(xv) cooking, preparing or serving food or drink for consumption by the public on or off the premises by workers principally engaged in the sales specified in 1, 2, or 3, above;

(xvi) clerical work, commercial travelling or canvassing;

but excluding

(a) operations performed at docks, wharves or warehouses by workers not directly employed by employers engaged in the business specified in 1, 2, or 3, above;

(b) the sale of goods for export and operations incidental thereto except when carried on in conjunction with the sale of goods for distribution within the United Kingdom;

(c) the transport of goods by common carriers;

(d) operations performed by workers engaged in any industry or trade concerned exclusively with carting and operations incidental thereto;

(e) Post Office business;

(f) operations in agriculture within the meaning of the Corn Production Act, 1917;

(g) operations performed by workers employed by wholesale brokers or merchants who do not employ warehouse workers or carters;

(h) sales and operations incidental thereto covered by the Trade Boards (Milk Distributive) Order, 1920.

TRADE BOARDS ACTS, 1909 AND 1918. ROPE, TWINE AND NET TRADE BOARD (GREAT BRITAIN.)

PROPOSAL TO VARY MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES FOR CERTAIN CLASSES OF FEMALE WORKERS.

In accordance with Regulations made under section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour, and dated 31st October, 1918, the Trade Board established in Great Britain under the Trade Boards Act, 1918, for those branches of the Trade specified in the Trade Boards (Rope, Twine and Net) Order, 1919, hereby give notice, as required by section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, that they propose to vary (the Minister of Labour having given his consent to such notice being given) the General Minimum Time-Rates, Piece-Work Basis Time-Rates and Overtime Rates at present Fixed and set out in the Schedule to their notice dated 1st April, 1920, and effective under the Order of the Minister of Labour, dated 31st March, 1920, in respect of those classes of Female Workers specified in Part I. of the Schedule set out below, the variation of the Minimum Rates of Wages which is set out below to be operative for a period of four months from the date on which the variation becomes effective.

SCHEDULE.

PART I.

Proposed Variation of General Minimum Time-Rates and Piece-Work Basis Time- Rates for Certain Classes of Female Workers.

Female Workers (other than Home-Workers) of 18 years of age and over employed in Rope Making or on processes preparatory thereto in a Factory or Workshop where Hemp or similar Rope is made, or where Hemp or similar Rope and Wire Rope are made.

Proposed Variation of General Minimum Time-Rate to operate for a period of four months from the date on which the Variation set out in this Notice takes effect, from 8½d. per hour to 10½d. per hour.

Proposed Variation of Piece-work Basis Time-Rate to operate for a period of four months from the date on which the Variation set out in this Notice takes effect, from 9d. per hour to 11½d. per hour.

PART II.

Proposed Variation of Overtime Rates for Cer- tain Classes of Female Workers.

Overtime Rates, calculated on the Minimum Rates set out above in the manner set out in the Schedule to the Notice Fixing Minimum Rates for Overtime issued by the Trade Board, and dated 1st April, 1920, shall apply, in substitution for the above Minimum Rates in respect of all hours worked by the above classes of workers in excess of the number of hours therein declared by the Trade Board to be the normal number of hours of work in the trade.

PART III.

The above Minimum Rates of Wages shall apply, subject to the Provisions of the Trade Boards Acts and of this Notice, to all Female Workers in Great Britain, who are employed during the whole or any part of their time in any branch of the trade specified in the Trade Boards (Rope, Twine and Net) Order, 1919; that is to say, the making or remaking of (a) rope (including driving rope and banding), (b) cord (including blind and window cord, but excluding silk, worsted and other fancy cords), (c) core for wire ropes, (d) lines, (e) twine (including binder and trawl twine), (f) lanyards, (g) net and similar articles; the bleaching, teasing, hackling, carding, preparing and spinning of the materials required for the making or remaking of any of the articles (a) to (g) above, when carried on in the same factory or workshop, as such making or remaking; the manufacture of packings, gaskins, and spun yarns, when carried on in the same factory or workshop as the making or remaking of any of the articles (a) to (g) above; the braiding or splicing of articles made from rope, cord, twine or net; the mending of nets and the winding, twisting, doubling, laying, polishing, dressing, tarring, tanning, dyeing, balling, reeling, finishing, packing, despatching, warehousing and storing of any of the above articles where these operations or any of them are carried on in a factory or workshop in which any of the articles (a) to (g) above are made or remade; but excluding the making of wire rope (unless made in the same factory or workshop as hemp

or similar rope or core for wire rope), and excluding the making of net in connection with the lace curtain trade and the weaving of cloth.

PART IV.

SECTION I.—The above Minimum Rates of Wages shall be paid clear of all deductions, other than deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments, or deductions authorised by any Act to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any Superannuation or other Provident Fund.

SECTION II.—The above Minimum Rates of Wages are without prejudice to workers who are earning Higher Rates of Wages.

The Trade Board will consider any Objections to the above Proposals which may be lodged with them within two months from 16th June, 1920. Such Objections should be in writing and signed by the person making the same (adding his or her full name and address), and should be sent to the Secretary of the Rope, Twine and Net Trade Board (Great Britain), 5, Chancery Lane, London, W.C. 2.

It is desirable that the Objections should state precisely, and so far as possible with reasons, what is objected to.

SECTION (i).—As respects Whole-Time Workers employed by the week or longer period the Proposed General Minimum Time-Rates set out in Parts I. and II. above are for a week not exceeding 48 hours, and no deduction from such rates shall be made where in any week the number of hours worked is less than 48, except where the worker is absent without the permission, given or obtained, of the employer or his agent. In such a case a proportionate deduction may be made according as the number of hours worked is less than 48.

SECTION (ii).—As respects other workers, the Proposed General Minimum Time-Rates set out in Parts I. and II. above are for a week of 48 hours, and shall be subject to a proportionate deduction according as the number of hours of employment in any week is less than 48.

PART IV.

Proposed Overtime Rates for Male and Female Workers (All Ages).

SECTION (i).—In accordance with Section 3 (1) (c) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, the Trade Board propose to declare the normal number of hours of work in the trade to be as follows:

In any week 48 hours.

On any Day other than Sundays and customary Public and Statutory Holidays ... 7 hours.
On Sundays and customary Public and Statutory Holidays 6 „

SECTION (ii).—The Overtime Rates in respect of hours worked by a worker in excess of the declared normal number of hours of work in the trade shall be as follows:—

(a) For the first two hours of Overtime on any day except the day which constitutes the usual weekly half-holiday, Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, the Overtime Rate shall be equivalent to time-and-a-quarter; that is to say, One and a quarter times the General Minimum Time-Rates otherwise applicable.

(b) For Overtime after the first two hours of Overtime on any day except Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, and for all Overtime on the day which constitutes the usual weekly half-holiday, the Overtime Rate shall be equivalent to Time-and-a-half; that is to say, One and a half times the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable.

(c) For all Overtime worked on Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, the Overtime Rates shall be equivalent to Double Time; that is to say, Twice the

General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable.

Provided, that where it is or may become the established practice of an employer only to require attendance on six days in the week:—

(1) The Overtime Rates shall be payable only where on any day (except Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays) the number of hours works exceeds eight; and in the case of Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, the Overtime Rates shall be payable only where on any of these days the number of hours worked exceeds six.

(2) All hours of work on the seventh day shall be paid for at Double Time, if the normal working week of 48 hours has been previously completed.

PART V.

For the purpose of this Notice the following definitions shall apply:—

SECTION (i).—A Foreman shall be deemed to be a person who is employed in any branch of the trade specified in the Trade Boards (Milk Distributive) Order, 1920, and to whom is deputed the duty of exercising supervising authority over workers exceeding five in number (exclusive of the foreman) working in any shop, department, or other branch of the trade.

SECTION (ii).—A Roundswoman shall be deemed to be a female person in charge of a round or rounds.

SECTION (iii).—A Shop Assistant shall be deemed to be a male or female person wholly or mainly employed in a shop in serving customers and/or in checking in and out.

PART VI.

The proposed Rates set out in the respective Scales A, B and C in Parts I. and II. of this Notice shall apply as follows:—

SECTION (i).—The Rates set out in Scale A shall apply to areas administered by Rural District Councils, but shall not apply to any town or village within any Rural District Council Area having a population exceeding 10,000.

SECTION (ii).—The Rates set out in Scale B shall apply to all areas other than those specified in Sections (i) and (iii) of this part of this Notice.

SECTION (iii).—The Rates set out in Scale C shall be applicable to London; that is to say, the City of London and the Metropolitan Police Districts, except such parts as are administered by a Rural District Council.

Provided that the Rate applicable to a roundsman or a roundswoman shall be determined by reference to the area in which the greater part of his or her round of distribution lies.

PART VII.

The above proposed Minimum Rates of Wages shall apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts and of this Notice, to all workers as specified in England and Wales, who are employed during the whole or any part of their time in any branch of the trade specified in the Trade Boards (Milk Distributive) Order, 1920; that is to say:—

1. (a) The wholesale or retail sale of fresh

milk, when carried on as a main or distinct business, or as a distinct branch or department of a business.

(b) The sale of food or drink for consumption on the premises, or of other goods when any such sale is carried on in association with and as a subsidiary part of such business, branch or department as aforesaid, if such sale involves the employment of workers who are principally employed in the sale specified in (a) above.

2. (a) The following operations, when incidental to the sales specified in 1 above:—

(i) Boxing, parcelling, labelling, weighing, measuring, checking, bottling, unpacking, packing.

(ii) Collecting, delivering, despatching, horse-keeping, cleaning vehicles.

(iii) Portering, lift or hoist operating, time-keeping, storing, stock-keeping, warehousing, cleaning premises.

(iv) Pasteurising, cooling, separating of milk.

(v) Cleaning utensils or receptacles.

(vi) Blending, testing, sampling.

(vii) Other incidental operations.

(b) Clerical work or canvassing when incidental to and carried on in conjunction with the work specified in 1 above.

But excluding any operations in:—

(a) The transport of goods by common carriers.

(b) Any industry or trade concerned exclusively with carting and operations incidental thereto.

(c) Post Office business.

(d) Agriculture within the meaning of the Corn Production Act, 1917.

PART VIII.

SECTION (i).—The above General Minimum Time-Rates and Overtime Rates shall be paid clear of all deductions other than deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments, or deductions authorised by any Act to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any Superannuation or other Provident Fund.

SECTION (ii).—The above proposed minimum rates of wages are without prejudice to workers who are earning higher rates of wages or to agreements made or that may be made between employers and workers for the payment of wages in excess of these minimum rates of wages.

The Trade Board will consider any objections to the above Proposals to Fix which may be lodged with them within two months from 15th June, 1920. Such Objections should be in writing and signed by the person making the same (adding his or her full name and address) and should be sent to the Secretary, the Milk Distributive Trade Board (England and Wales), 5, Chancery Lane, London, W.C. 2.

It is desirable that Objections should state precisely and, so far as possible, with reasons, what is objected to.

THE VICTORIA CROSS.

GEORGE R.I.

WHEREAS Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, by a Warrant under Her Royal Sign Manual dated 29th January, 1856, did create a Naval and Military Decoration to be styled and designated "The Victoria Cross," and did express Her desire that this decoration should be highly prized and eagerly sought after by the Officers and Men of Her Naval and Military Services.

AND WHEREAS by divers subsequent Warrants other Officers and Men were admitted to and made eligible for the decoration, and certain amendments were made to the Rules and Ordinances attaching thereto.

AND WHEREAS We deem it expedient that the said Warrant and subsequent Warrants before referred to, as also the Rules and Ordinances affecting the same, shall be consolidated, varied and extended.

NOW, THEREFORE, We do hereby declare that the said Warrants, and the Rules and Ordinances heretofore in force for the Government of the said Decoration, shall for that purpose be amended, varied, modified and extended; and in substitution thereof We by these presents, for Us, Our Heirs and Successors, are graciously pleased to make, ordain and establish the following Rules and Ordinances for the Government of the same which shall from henceforth be inviolably observed and kept:—

Firstly, it is ordained that the distinction shall as heretofore be styled and designated "The Victoria Cross," and shall consist of a Maltese Cross of bronze with our Royal Crest in the centre and underneath it an escroll bearing this inscription: "For Valour."

Secondly, it is ordained that the Cross shall be suspended from the left breast by a red riband, and on those occasions when only the riband is worn a replica of the Cross in miniature shall be affixed to the centre of the riband.

Thirdly, it is ordained that the Cross shall only be awarded for most conspicuous bravery or some daring or pre-eminent act of valour or self-sacrifice or extreme devotion to duty in the presence of the enemy.

Fourthly, it is ordained that the Cross may be awarded posthumously.

Fifthly, it is ordained that the names of all those persons upon or on account of whom We may be pleased to confer or present the decoration shall be published in the *London Gazette*, and a Registry thereof kept in the Office of Our Secretary of State for War.

Sixthly, it is ordained that:—

(1) Officers, Warrant Officers and subordinate Officers hereinafter referred to as Officers, Chief Petty Officers and Petty Officers hereinafter referred to as Petty Officers, men and boys hereinafter referred to as Seamen, serving in—(a) our Navy or in ships of any description for the time being under Naval Command; (b) our Indian Marine Service; (c) Navies or Marine Services of our Dominions, Colonies, Dependencies or Protectorates; and (d) our Mercantile Marine whilst serving under Naval or Military Authority, or who in the course of their duties may become subject to enemy action;

(2) Officers, Warrant Officers, Non-Commissioned Officers, men and boys hereinafter referred to as Marines, serving in our Marines;

(3) Officers, Warrant Officers (Classes I and II), Non-Commissioned Officers, men and boys hereinafter referred to as Privates, of all ranks serving in our Army, our Army Reserve, our Territorial or other forces, and the Forces of our Dominions, Colonies, Dependencies or Protectorates;

(4) Officers, Warrant Officers, Non-Commissioned Officers, and Airmen in the ranks of our Air Force, or the Air Forces of our Dominions, Colonies, Dependencies or Protectorates;

(5) British and Indian Officers and men of all ranks of our Indian Army, the Imperial Service Troops of Native States of India, or any other Forces there serving under the Command, guidance, or direction of any British or Indian Officer, or of a Political Officer attached to such Forces on Our behalf, and

(6) Matrons, sisters, nurses and the staff of the Nursing Services and other Services pertaining to Hospitals and Nursing, and Civilians of either sex serving regularly or temporarily under the Orders, direction or supervision of any of the above mentioned Forces

shall be eligible for the decoration of the Cross.

Seventhly, it is ordained that if any recipient of the Cross shall again perform such an act of bravery, as would have made him or her eligible to receive the Cross, such further act of bravery shall be recorded by a Bar to be attached to the Riband by which the Cross is suspended, and for every such additional act of bravery, an additional Bar shall be added, and any such Bar or Bars may be awarded posthumously. For every Bar awarded a replica of the Cross in miniature shall be added to the riband when worn alone.

Eighthly, it is ordained that every recommendation for the Award of the decoration of the Cross shall be made and reported through the usual channel to the Senior Naval, Military or Air Force Officer Commanding the Force, who shall call for such description, conclusive proof as far as the circumstances of the case will allow, and attestation of the act as he may think requisite, and if he approve he shall recommend the grant of the decoration to Our

Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, Our Secretary of State for War and the Royal Air Force as the case may be, who shall submit to Us the names of every one so recommended whom they shall consider worthy: in the case of there being no British or Indian Officer, then the Political Officer attached to the Force shall, after obtaining conclusive proof of the act of bravery as far as is possible, if he approve, submit the recommendation to Us through the proper channels.

Ninthly, it is ordained that in the event of any unit of our Naval, Military or Air Forces, consisting in the case of our Navy of a squadron, flotilla or ship's company, or of a detached body of seamen or marines; or in the case of our Army of a regiment, squadron, battery or company, or of a detached body of soldiers; or in the case of our Air Force of a Squadron or other body of airmen, having distinguished itself collectively by the performance of an act of heroic gallantry or daring in the presence of the enemy in such a way that the Admiral, General or other Officer in Command of the Force to which such an unit belongs, is unable to single out any individual as specially pre-eminent in gallantry or daring, then one or more of the officers, warrant officers, petty officers, non-commissioned officers, seamen, marines, private soldiers or airmen in the ranks comprising the unit shall be selected to be recommended to Us for the award of the Victoria Cross in the following manner:—

(a) When the total personnel of the unit does not exceed 100, then one officer shall be selected for the decoration by the officers engaged; and in like manner one warrant officer or petty officer or non-commissioned officer of the unit shall be selected by the warrant officers, petty officers or non-commissioned officers engaged, and one seaman, marine, private soldier or airman in the ranks shall be selected by the seamen, marines, private soldiers or airmen in the ranks engaged.

(b) When the total personnel of the unit exceeds 100 but does not exceed 200, then the number of seamen, marines, private soldiers or airmen in the ranks to be selected in the manner described in (a) shall be increased to two.

(c) When the total personnel of the unit exceeds 200 in number, the number of Crosses to be awarded in accordance with these provisions shall be the subject of special consideration by Our Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty or by one of Our Secretaries of State for submission to Us.

(d) The selection to be by a secret ballot in such manner as shall be determined in accordance with the foregoing provisions by the Officer directing the selection to be made.

(e) The death of any person engaged shall not be a bar to his selection.

(f) The names of the persons recommended in accordance with these provisions shall be submitted to Us in the manner laid down in Rule 8.

Tenthly, it is ordained that every recipient of the Cross, not being nor ranking as a Commissioned Officer nor in the case of Our Navy, being or ranking with a warrant officer, nor coming within Rule 11, shall from the date of the act by which the decoration has been

gained, be entitled to a special pension of Ten Pounds a year, and each additional Bar conferred under Rule 7 on such recipient shall carry with it an additional pension of Five Pounds per annum.

Eleventhly, every Indian Officer of Our Indian Army of rank junior to that of Second Lieutenant who shall have received the Cross shall, from the date of the act by which such decoration has been gained, be entitled to a special pension of Five hundred and twenty-five rupees a year, and each additional Bar conferred on such Indian Officer shall carry with it an additional pension of One hundred and fifty rupees a year. In the case of a Warrant or Non-Commissioned Officer or soldier of Our Indian Army aforesaid We ordain and award a special pension of One hundred and fifty rupees, with Seventy-five rupees additional for each additional Bar. On the death of these recipients of the Cross these pensions shall be continued to his widow until her death or remarriage.

Twelfthly, in order to make such additional provision as shall effectually maintain pure this most honourable distinction, it is ordained that if any person on whom such distinction shall be conferred be convicted of treason, cowardice, felony, or of any infamous crime, or if he or she be accused of any such offence and doth not after a reasonable time surrender himself or herself to be tried for the same, his or her name shall, by an especial Warrant under Our Royal Sign Manual, forthwith be erased from the registry of individuals upon whom the said decoration shall have been conferred and the pension conferred under Rules 10 and 11 shall cease and determine from the date of such Warrant. It is hereby further declared that We, Our Heirs and Successors, shall be the sole judges of the circumstance demanding such expulsion; moreover, We shall at all times have power to restore such persons as may at any time have been expelled, both to the enjoyment of the decoration and pension, and notice thereof of expulsion or restoration in every case shall be published in the London Gazette.

Given at Our Court at St. James's this 22nd day of May, in the eleventh year of Our reign, and in the year of Our Lord one thousand nine hundred and twenty.

Order) provided that he or she shall, if required, work on every weekday for the number of hours following, viz. :—

- (a) 12 hours while the crops are being carted;
- (b) 11 hours while other work is in progress.

3. Nothing in this Order shall affect the rate of wages payable to any worker under the Orders of the Board for the time being in force in respect of employment on a Sunday.
