The following Statute made by the Governing Body of Merton College, Oxford, on the 6th day of December, 1920, and sealed on the 11th day of December, 1920, has been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of its having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions of The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877:—

The Warden and Fellows of Merton College, Oxford, respectfully submit for the approval of His Majesty the King in Council the following amending Statute which was duly made in accordance with the provisions of the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877, Section 54, the same being passed by the votes of not less than two-thirds of the number of persons present and voting at a General Meeting of the Governing Body of the said College, specially summoned for the purpose, and held on the 6th day of December, 1920.

" 1. In Statute III 2, £300 shall be substituted for £200.

2. To Statute III 6, the following subsection shall be added—(l) The stipend of a Fellow elected under this section shall be £200 per annum, clear of income tax, pay-

able out of the corporate revenues of the College.'

3. To the Statute made by the College on January 16, 1920, and approved by the King in Council on August 13, 1920, the following section shall be added:—

' 6. The stipend of a Fellow elected under this Statute shall be £200 per annum, clear of income tax, payable out of the corporate revenues of the College.'

4. In Statute XIII 8, as amended on May 7, 1914, £400 shall be substituted for £300.

5. Before any statutory charge on the corporate revenues in force on December 1, 1920, is diminished under the provisions of Section 5 of Statute XI, the additional charges created by this Statute shall first be rateably diminished or, if need be, shall be suspended; and Section 5 aforesaid shall be read accordingly.

6. This Statute shall come into force on the 1st day of January, 1922.'

TRADE BOARDS ACTS, 1909 AND 1918.

GROCERY AND PROVISIONS TRADE BOARD (SCOTLAND).

PROPOSAL TO FIX MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES FOR MALE AND FEMALE WORKERS.

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour, and dated 31st October, 1918, the Trade Board established under the Trade Boards Act, 1918, in Scotland for the Grocery and Provisions Trade, as specified in the Trade Boards (Grocery and Provisions) Order, 1920, HEREBY GIVE NOTICE, as required by Section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, that they PROPOSE TO FIX General Minimum Time Rates and Overtime Rates for Male and Female Workers, as follows:—

PART I.

Proposed General Minimum Time-Rates for all Male and Female Workers.

SECTION II.—(a) As respects all classes of workers other than those specified in paragraph (b) of this Section, a "week" means a week of 48 hours.

- (b) In the case of those classes of Counting-House Clerks who are employed in the Wholesale Trade and whose customary working week consists of a number of hours less than 48, but not less than 38, a "week" means a week of the number of hours customarily worked by the classes in question.
- (c) For the purpose of calculating the hourly rate applicable in respect of each hour of employment the weekly rates set out in Section I. must be divided:
- (i.) In the case of the workers referred to in paragraph (a) of this Section by 48,
 - (ii.) In the case of the workers referred to in paragraph (b) of this Section by the number of hours per week customarily worked by the class of workers in question.
- (d) Payment at not less than the hourly rate applicable, calculated as described in paragraph (c) of this Section, must be made for ALL hours of employment (not merely for the number of hours constituting a "week" as described in paragraphs (a) and (b) of this Section), except in so far as higher rates are payable under the provisions of Part II. of this Notice.

PART II.

Proposed Overtime Rates for all Male and Female Workers (all Ages).

SECTION I.—In accordance with Section 3 (1) (c) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, the Trade Board propose to declare the Normal Number of Hours of Work per Week in the Trade to be 48.

Provided that all hours worked on Sundays, on Customary Local Holidays and on Statutory Holidays shall be regarded as Overtime to which the Overtime Rates shall apply.

SECTION II.—The Minimum Rates for Overtime in respect of all hours worked by a worker in excess of the declared normal number of hours of work in the trade shall be:—

(a) For all hours worked on Sundays, on Customary Local Holidays and on Statutory Holidays, Twice the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, Double Time.

(b) For all hours worked in any week in excess of 48, One-and-a-Half times the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, Time-and-a-Half, except in so far as Double Time is applicable under paragraph (a) of this Section.

PART III.

The above proposed Minimum Rates of Wages shall apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, to All Male and Female Workers in Scotland in respect of all time during which they are employed in any branch of the trade specified in the Trade Boards (Grocery and Provisions) Order, 1920, that is to say:—

1. The retail sale of any of the articles specified in Schedule I in or in connection with any establishment or business or branch or department in which—

(a) Twelve or more such articles are sold or exposed for sale whether or not the sale of such articles is the main business in the establishment or business or branch or department; or

(b) The retail sale of any one or more of such articles is the main or principal business of that establishment or business or branch or department.

2. The wholesale sale (except when incidental to manufacture or production) of any of the articles specified in Schedule II in or in connection with any establishment or business or branch or department in which such sale is the main or principal business of that establishment, business, branch, or department.

3. The sale of other goods when any such sale is carried on in association with the sales specified in paragraph 1 or paragraph 2 above, if such sale involves the employment of workers who are also employed in those sales—

Including the following or similar operations when incidental to or carried on in conjunction with the sales specified in 1, 2, or 3 above—

- (i) Checking, testing, grading,
- (ii) Weighing, measuring,
- (iii) Packeting, boxing, bundling, bagging, parcelling, packing, unpacking, labelling,
- (iv) Collecting, despatching, delivering,
- (v) Stock-keeping, warehousing, storing, cold-storing, refrigerating,
- (vi) Portering, loading, unloading, lift or hoist operating,

- (vii) Time-keeping, cleaning premises,
- (viii) Adjusting implements, cleaning implements, utensils or receptacles,
- (ix) Cleaning goods,
- (x) Window or show-case dressing,
- (xi) Garaging, horse or motor keeping, cleaning vehicles,
- (xii) Mixing, blending, crushing, grinding, mincing, shredding, cutting,
- (xiii) Sausage making, bacon processing, ham processing, ham boiling, ham or bacon curing.
- (xiv) Roasting coffee, blanching almonds,
- (xv) Cooking, preparing or serving food or drink for consumption by the public on or off the premises by workers principally engaged in the sales specified in 1, 2, or 3 above,
- (xvi) Clerical work, commercial travelling or canvassing;

But excluding:—

- (a) Operations performed at docks, wharves and warehouses by workers not directly employed by employers engaged in the business specified in 1, 2, or 3 above,
- (b) The sale of goods for export and operations incidental thereto except when carried on in conjunction with the sale of goods for distribution within the United Kingdom,
- (c) The transport of goods by common carriers,
- (d) Operations performed by workers engaged in any industry or trade concerned exclusively with carting and operations incidental thereto,
- (e) Post Office business,
- (f) Operations in agriculture within the meaning of the Corn Production Act, 1917,
- (g) Operations performed by workers employed by wholesale brokers or merchants who do not employ warehouse workers or carters,
- (h) Sales and operations incidental thereto covered by the Trade Boards (Milk Distributive) Order, 1920.

PART IV.

SECTION I.—The above proposed Minimum Rates of Wages shall be paid clear of all deductions other than deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments, or deductions authorised by any Act to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any superannuation or other provident fund.

SECTION II.—The above proposed Minimum Rates of Wages are without prejudice to Workers who are earning higher rates of wages or to agreements made or that may be made between employers and workers for the payment of wages in excess of these minimum rates of wages.

The Trade Board will consider any Objections to the above Proposals to Fix which may be lodged with them within two months from 16th December, 1920. Such Objections should be in writing and signed by the person making the same (adding his or her full name and address) and should be sent to The Secretary, the Grocery and Provisions Trade Board (Scotland), 5, Chancery Lane, London, W.C. 2.

It is desirable that Objections should state precisely and, so far as possible, with reasons, what is objected to.

TRADE BOARDS ACTS, 1909 AND 1918.

STAMPED OR PRESSED METAL WARES
 TRADE BOARD (GREAT BRITAIN).MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES (AS VARIED) FOR
 CERTAIN CLASSES OF MALE WORKERS.

Effective as from 31st December, 1920.*

In accordance with the Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour, and dated 31st October, 1918, the Trade Board established in Great Britain under the Trade Boards Act, 1918, for the Stamped or Pressed Metal Wares trade, as specified in the Trade Boards (Stamped or Pressed Metal Wares) Order, 1919, having given due Notice on the 18th September, 1920, of Proposal to Vary the General Minimum Time-Rates and Overtime Rates for Male Workers as set out in their Notice dated 9th September, 1920, hereby give notice that they have varied the General

Minimum Time-Rates and Overtime Rates for certain classes of Male Workers, the Minimum Rates as varied being as shown in the Schedule set out below.

The Trade Board further give notice that they have received notification from the Minister of Labour that he has made an Order, dated 14th December, 1920, under Section 4 (2) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, confirming the Minimum Rates as varied by the Trade Board and specifying 31st December, 1920,* as the date from which such Rates shall become effective.

* Should this date not correspond with the beginning of the period for which wages are paid by an employer who pays wages at intervals not exceeding seven days, the rates shall become effective as from the beginning of the next full-pay period, but not in any case later than 6th January, 1921.

SCHEDULE.

PART I.

*General Minimum Time-Rates (as Varied) for
 Certain Classes of Male Workers.*

SECTION I.—Male Workers of 21 years of age and upwards who are employed as Braziers, Burnishers, Drop-Stampers, Dippers, Dippers who are also Bronzers, Annealers or Brass Polishers:—

(a) Braziers, Burnishers or Drop-Stampers:
 Workers of Grade I, as hereinafter defined, 1s. 8½d. per hour.

Workers of Grade II, as hereinafter defined, 1s. 10½d. per hour.

Workers of Grade III, as hereinafter defined, 2s. per hour.

(b) Dippers:

During the first 12 months of employment after the age of 21 years, 1s. 5½d. per hour.

On and after completion of 12 months' employment after reaching the age of 21 years, 1s. 8½d. per hour.

(c) Dippers who are also Bronzers:

Workers of Grade I, as hereinafter defined, 1s. 8½d. per hour.

Workers of Grade II, as hereinafter defined, 1s. 10½d. per hour.

Workers of Grade III, as hereinafter defined, 2s. per hour.

(d) Annealers who can Take Charge of their Own Work:

1s. 8½d. per hour.

(e) Brass Polishers:

Workers of Grade I, as hereinafter defined, 1s. 8½d. per hour.

Workers of Grade II, as hereinafter defined, 1s. 11d. per hour.

Workers of Grade III, as hereinafter defined, 2s. 0½d. per hour.

SECTION II.—For the purpose of the above Rates the following definitions shall apply:—

Braziers:

A Brazier of Grade I is a Male Worker of 21 years of age or over employed on brazing and not fulfilling the conditions of Grade II or Grade III as hereinafter defined.

A Brazier of Grade II is a Male Worker of 21 years of age or over who has had not less than six years' experience as a Brazier and who is an expert in brazing in all classes of metal except aluminium.

A Brazier of Grade III is a Male Worker of 21 years of age or over who in addition to

fulfilling the conditions of Grade II, as above defined, is also an expert in brazing aluminium or is a charge hand with the duty of being responsible for all work and order in the shop.

Burnishers:

A Burnisher of Grade I is a Male Worker of 21 years of age or over employed on burnishing and not fulfilling the conditions of Grade II or Grade III as hereinafter defined.

A Burnisher of Grade II is a Male Worker of 21 years of age or over who has had not less than six years' experience as a Burnisher and who is an expert hook and straight Burnisher at the vice and satisfactorily burnishes deep thin shell work at the lathe.

A Burnisher of Grade III is a Male Worker of 21 years of age or over who in addition to fulfilling the conditions of Grade II, as above defined, is an expert in speed and quality in all classes of work, or is a charge hand with the duty of being responsible for all work and order in the shop.

Drop-Stampers:

A Drop-Stamper of Grade I is a Male Worker of 21 years of age or over employed on drop-stamping and not fulfilling the conditions of Grade II or Grade III as hereinafter defined.

A Drop-Stamper of Grade II is a Male Worker of 21 years of age or over who has had not less than six years' experience as a Drop-Stamper and who undertakes all classes of deep or shallow work in all strengths of the metal used.

A Drop-Stamper of Grade III is a Male Worker of 21 years of age or over who, in addition to fulfilling the conditions of Grade II, as above defined, is an expert in all classes of work or is a charge hand with the duty of being responsible for all work and order in the shop.

Dippers who are also Bronzers:

A Worker of Grade I is a Male Worker of 21 years of age or over employed on dipping and bronzing and not fulfilling the conditions of Grade II or Grade III as hereinafter defined.

A Worker of Grade II is a Male Worker of 21 years of age or over who has had not less than six years' experience as a Dipper and Bronzer and who is an all-round Dipper and Bronzer and also does art bronzing and colouring, or electro-plating or has a knowledge of electro-plating.

A Worker of Grade III is a Male Worker of 21 years of age or over who, in addition to fulfilling the conditions of Grade II, as above defined, also has an expert knowledge of art bronzing or metal colouring or electro depositing and solutions or is a charge hand with the duty of being responsible for all work and order in the shop.

Brass Polishers:

A Polisher of Grade I is a Male Worker of 21 years of age or over employed on polishing and not fulfilling the conditions of Grade II or Grade III as hereinafter defined.

A Polisher of Grade II is a Male Worker of 21 years of age or over who has had not less than six years' experience as a Polisher and is an expert in all processes of any class of common work and can emery-bob and mop best work.

A Polisher of Grade III is a Male Worker of 21 years of age or over who, in addition to fulfilling the conditions of Grade II, as above defined, is also an expert in all processes of both common and best work or is a charge hand with the duty of being responsible for all work and order in the shop.

SECTION III.—Male Workers under 21 years of age who are employed as Braziers, Burnishers, Drop-Stampers, Dippers, Dippers who are also Bronzers, or as Annealers who can take charge of their own work:—

Workers under 15 years of age, 5d. per hour.

Workers of 15 and under 16 years of age, 7d. per hour.

Workers of 16 and under 17 years of age, 8½d. per hour.

Workers of 17 and under 18 years of age, 10½d. per hour.

Workers of 18 and under 19 years of age:

(a) With less than two years' experience in the branch of trade in which they are engaged, 11d. per hour.

(b) With not less than two years' but less than three years' experience in the branch of trade in which they are engaged, 1s. per hour.

(c) With over three years' experience in the branch of trade in which they are engaged, 1s. 1d. per hour.

Workers of 19 and under 20 years of age:

(a) With less than three years' experience in the branch of trade in which they are engaged, 1s. per hour.

(b) With not less than three years' but less than four years' experience in the branch of trade in which they are engaged, 1s. 2d. per hour.

(c) With over four years' experience in the branch of trade in which they are engaged, 1s. 4d. per hour.

Workers of 20 and under 21 years of age:

(a) With less than three years' experience in the branch of trade in which they are engaged, 1s. 3d. per hour.

(b) With not less than three years' but less than five years' experience in the branch of trade in which they are engaged, 1s. 5d. per hour.

(c) With not less than five years' experience in the branch of trade in which they are engaged, 1s. 6d. per hour.

PART II.

Overtime Rates (as Varied) for Certain Classes of Male Workers.

Overtime Rates calculated on the Minimum Rates specified in Part I of this Notice, in the manner set out in Part III of the Notice issued by the Trade Board, dated 9th September, 1920, shall apply in substitution for the Minimum Rates otherwise applicable as set out in Part I of this Notice, in respect of all hours worked in excess of the number of hours declared by the Trade Board in the above-mentioned Notice, dated 9th September, 1920, to be the normal number of hours of work in the trade.

PART III.

The above Minimum Rates of Wages shall apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, to all workers of the Classes specified above in respect of all time during which they are employed in any branch of the

trade specified in the Trade Boards (Stamped or Pressed Metal Wares) Order, 1919, that is to say:—

The manufacture from metals (other than precious metals) by the processes of cold stamping or cold pressing (including cutting or piercing) of cabinet fittings, window fittings, curtain accessories, stationers' sundries, drapers' sundries, fittings for gas or electric light, fittings for suit-cases or handbags or purses, buckles, eyelets, ferrules, labels, collar studs, tie-clips, thimbles, photograph frames, stamped chains, bells, fancy nails (excluding the shanks), parts of safety razors (excluding the blades), parts of braces or suspenders, corset steels or busks, whistles, tin-openers, medals or any similar articles or metal parts of such articles:—

Including:—

(a) The operations of annealing, hardening, barrelling, polishing, bronzing, nickelling, lacquering, japanning, non-vitreous enamelling, tinning, or assembling where these operations are carried on in association with or in conjunction with the manufacture of such stamped or pressed metal articles;

(b) The operations of carding, boxing, packeting, labelling, weighing, packing, warehousing or despatching, where these operations are incidental to or appertaining to the manufacture of such stamped or pressed metal articles;

But excluding—

(a) The operations specified in the Trade Boards (Hollow-ware) Order, 1913;

(b) The making of buttons or any operations incidental thereto;

(c) The making of coffin furniture or any operations incidental thereto;

(d) The making of pins, hairpins, hooks and eyes, hair-curlers, snap-fasteners or safety pins or any operations incidental thereto;

(e) The making of steel pens and the making of stationers' metal sundries or other similar metal articles when carried on as a subsidiary branch of work in association with or in conjunction with the making of steel pens, so as to provide a common or interchangeable form of employment for the workers;

(f) The minting of coinage of the realm;

(g) The process of hand-embossing.

PART IV.

SECTION I.—The above Minimum Rates of Wages shall be paid clear of all deductions, other than deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments, or deductions authorised by any Act to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any superannuation or other provident fund.

SECTION II.—The above Minimum Rates of Wages are without prejudice to Workers who are earning Higher Rates of Wages, or to Agreements made or that may be made between Employers and Workers for the payment of Wages in excess of these Minimum Rates of Wages.
