The following Scheme for the adjustment of the property, rights, liabilities, &c., of the Urban District Council of Aldershot, in the Administrative County of Southampton, and for other purposes, as settled by a Committee of His Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, is published in accordance with the provisions of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1882":—

Whereas by the Municipal Corporation Acts, 1882 and 1885, it is enacted that where a Petition for a Charter of Incorporation is referred to the Committee of His Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, and it is proposed by the Charter to extend the Municipal Corporation Acts to the Municipal Borough to be created by the Charter, the said Committee of Council may settle a Scheme for the purposes in the said Acts named and containing such provisions as are in the said Acts particularized.

And whereas in the month of July, One Thousand Nine Hundred and Twenty, certain Inhabitant Householders of the Urban District of Aldershot, in the County of Southampton, petitioned His Majesty the King praying for the grant of a Charter of Incorporation.

And whereas the said Petition for a Charter was referred to the Committee of Council, and it was proposed by the Charter to create the Urban District of Aldershot, hereinafter

described a Municipal Borough, and to incorporate the Inhabitants thereof, and to extend the Municipal Corporation Acts to the Municipal Borough to be created by the Charter.

And whereas under and by virtue of the Public Health Act, 1848, as extended by the Public Health Supplemental Act for Aldershot, 1857, the Local Board for the Parish of Aldershot was constituted in the year 1857, and then became invested with various powers and duties and the Local Board was constituted the Urban Sanitary Authority for the Parish of Aldershot.

And whereas by an Order of the Southampton County Council made under Section 57 of the Local Government Act, 1888, and finally approved by the County Council on the 14th August, 1893, the number of elected members of the Local Board was increased from nine to twelve.

And whereas under and by virtue of the Local Government Act, 1894, the Local Board became the Urban District Council for the Urban District of Aldershot, hereinafter called "The District Council."

And whereas under and by virtue of the powers vested in him by the Public Health Supplemental Act for Aldershot, 1857, three of the members of the District Council are nominated by the Secretary of State for War.

And whereas by an Order of the Southampton County Council made under Section 57 of the Local Government Act, 1888, and finally

approved by the County Council on the 9th November, 1903, the number of elected members of the District Council was increased from twelve to fifteen.

And whereas the Local Government Board on the 4th day of February, 1898, made an Order conferring on the District Council the powers of Sections 6 (i) (c) (iii) and 8 (i) (d) of the Local Government Act, 1894, as to Recreation Grounds, and on the 31st day of October, 1916, made an Order under Section 33 of the Local Government Act, 1894, investing the District Council with the power to appoint Overseers of the Poor of the Parish of Aldershot, and the power to appoint and revoke the appointment of Assistant Overseers for such Parish.

And whereas the Education Act, 1902, has come into operation in the Urban District of Aldershot and the District Council are now the Local Education Authority within the said District for the purposes of Part III of the said Act, and a Scheme for the constitution of an Education Committee was made by the District Council on the 18th day of March, 1903, and approved by the Board of Education on the 27th day of May, 1903, and amended by a Scheme made by the District Council on the 23rd day of September, 1918, and approved by the Board of Education on the 4th day of October, 1918.

And whereas under the Education Act, 1902, an Agreement dated 7th May, 1909, for the erection of a County School at Aldershot was made between the District Council and the County Council of Southampton, and a Scheme for the Administration of such School affecting the District and the District Council was approved by the Board of Education in November, 1915.

And whereas the Aldershot Electric Lighting Order, 1898, confirmed by the Electric Lighting Orders Confirmation (No. 5) Act, 1898, is now in force within the District.

And whereas the following Acts have been adopted by the Local Board or by the District Council, and are now in force within the District of the Council, viz. :—

1. The Public Health Acts Amendment Act, 1890, adopted February, 1891.
2. The Infectious Diseases (Prevention) Act, 1890, adopted February, 1891.
3. The Private Street Works Act 1892, adopted September, 1907.

And whereas on the 11th day of March, 1912, and the 17th day of April, 1912, the Local Government Board approved the extension of the Infectious Disease (Notification) Act, 1889, to Polymyelitis and Cerebro-Spinal Fever respectively.

And whereas by virtue of Orders of the Local Government Board and the Secretary of State for the Home Department dated respectively 8th October, 1913, and 13th September, 1913, the following Parts and Sections of the Public Health Acts Amendment Act, 1907, (that is to say Parts II., III., IV., V., VI., and IX., Sections 79, 80, 81, 84, 86 included in Part VII., and Section 95 included in Part X. of the Act) are in force within the District of the Council.

And whereas by an Order made by the District Council (in pursuance of the powers conferred by Section 112 of the Public Health Act, 1875, as amended by Section 51 of the Public Health Acts Amendment Act, 1907) on the 21st day of April, 1915, and confirmed by

Order of the Local Government Board dated the 18th day of June, 1915, each of the trades of a Blood-Drier, a Tanner, a Leather Dresser, a Fat Melter or Fat Extractor, a Glue Maker, a Size Maker, a Gut Scraper, a Rag and Bone Dealer, and a Fish Frier was declared to be an offensive trade.

And whereas the Local Board under the provisions of the Public Health Act, 1875, on the 6th day of June, 1887, made Bye-laws with respect to the cleansing of footways, pavements, and cesspools, with respect to the management of a mortuary, with respect to nuisances, with respect to slaughterhouses, with respect to common lodging houses, and with respect to a pleasure ground, which were allowed by the Local Government Board upon the 26th day of August, 1887.

And whereas the District Council on the 1st day of August, 1900, made regulations under the Dairies, Cowsheds and Milkshops Order of 1885.

And whereas the District Council under the provisions of the Public Health Act, 1875, on the 2nd October, 1907, made Bye-Laws with respect to Tents, Vans, Sheds, and similar structures used for human habitation, which were allowed by the Local Government Board on the 13th day of December, 1907.

And whereas the District Council under the provisions of the Public Health Act, 1875, on the 4th day of December, 1907, made Bye-Laws with respect to Houses let in Lodgings or occupied by members of more than one family, which were allowed by the Local Government Board on the 4th day of February, 1908.

And whereas under the provisions of the Public Health Act, 1875, the District Council on the 6th day of November, 1895, made Bye-Laws with respect to New Buildings which were allowed by the Local Government Board on the 3rd day of January, 1896, and on the 19th day of March, 1914, made Bye-Laws with respect to New Streets and Buildings which were allowed by the Local Government Board on the 15th day of June, 1914.

And whereas the District Council on the 17th day of March, 1909, under Section 74 of the Elementary Education Act, 1870, as amended by the Education Acts, 1876 to 1907, made Bye-Laws with respect to School Attendance which were allowed by the Secretary of State on the 23rd day of June, 1909.

And whereas under the provisions of the Public Health Act, 1875, the District Council on the 7th day of July, 1915, made Bye-Laws with respect to Offensive Trades which Bye-Laws were allowed by the Local Government Board on the 30th day of July, 1915.

And whereas the District Council on the 1st day of September, 1920, under the Town Police Clauses Act, 1847, made Bye-Laws with respect to Hackney Carriages which were allowed by the Minister of Health on the 24th day of September, 1920.

And whereas the District Council on the 3rd day of November, 1920, under the Employment of Children Act, 1903, made Bye-Laws with respect to the Employment of Children which were allowed by the Secretary of State on the 28th day of February, 1921.

And whereas the County Council of Southampton have made certain Bye-Laws for the good rule and government of the Administrative County of Southampton and the same are now in force in the Urban District of Aldershot.

And whereas it is intended that arrangements shall be made for the consolidation of the Police Force of the Borough of Aldershot when constituted by Charter with the Police Force of the County of Southampton.

And whereas the District Council are a Local Authority within the meaning of the Municipal Corporation Acts, 1882 and 1885.

And whereas this Scheme before being settled by the Committee of Council was referred for consideration to His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the Home Department, to the Minister of Health, to the Board of Trade and to the Board of Education.

And whereas it is expedient that a Scheme should be made and settled containing the provisions hereinafter set forth.

Now, therefore, pursuant to the Municipal Corporation Acts, 1882 and 1885, and every other power enabling them in that behalf, the Committee of Council have settled a Scheme containing the provisions herein, and do hereby direct, order and declare as follows:—

1. This Scheme may be cited for all purposes as "The Borough of Aldershot Scheme, 1922."

2. The Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the Borough of Aldershot are in this Scheme referred to as "The Corporation."

3. This Scheme, when confirmed, shall come into operation on the day of the first meeting of the Council of the Municipal Borough created by the said Charter, and this Scheme shall be construed and applied as if it had been dated and confirmed by Parliament or Order in Council on the day before the day of the said first Meeting, and everything thereunder shall be done and had accordingly. This date is hereinafter referred to as "the commencement of this Scheme." So far as may be necessary this Scheme shall operate retrospectively.

4. From and after the commencement of this Scheme the Municipal Borough created by the said Charter shall be placed within the jurisdiction of the Corporation acting by the Council of the Borough as the Sanitary Authority of the said Borough.

5. The District Council, their powers, duties, rights, obligations and privileges, shall continue and be deemed to have continued to exist until the commencement of this Scheme, unaffected in any manner whatsoever by the grant of the said Charter or the creation of the said Borough. From and after the commencement of this Scheme the District Council shall be and the same are hereby abolished, and the powers, duties, rights, obligations and privileges thereof shall cease and determine.

6. All the jurisdiction, powers, trusts, duties and property vested in or possessed by the District Council, or by any person or body in trust for them or any of their members as such (and not otherwise dealt with or transferred by or under any part of this Scheme) shall vest in the Corporation, and shall be exercised, held and applied for the municipal and public purposes of the said Borough.

7. All duties and liabilities which immediately before the commencement of this Scheme attached to and were enforceable against the District Council or the property thereof, shall attach to and be enforceable against the Corporation or the property thereof.

8. Any investigation, legal proceeding or remedy in respect of any debt, liability, penalty, or forfeiture due to or incurred by or

on behalf of the District Council before the commencement of this Scheme may be continued, prosecuted or enforced by or against the Corporation.

9. The term "property" in this Scheme means and includes all property real and personal, and all things in action and all rights of common and commonable rights and rights to toll, and all franchises, privileges, and rights which have any pecuniary value, and all charters, records, deeds, books and documents, and all rights and all claims to relief and all rights to avoid contracts or otherwise, and includes any estate or interest legal or equitable in or in respect of any property so defined.

10. The District Fund and General District Rate of the Borough of Aldershot shall for all purposes whatsoever (subject to the provisions of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882, with respect to the Borough Fund and Borough Rate and Watch Rate respectively) take the place of and be substituted for the District Fund and General District Rate respectively of the District Council, and all sums of money respectively payable to, from, or out of, and all liabilities charged upon or attaching to the District Fund and General District Rate of the said Urban District shall (subject as aforesaid) be paid to, from, or out of, and shall be charged upon the said District Fund and General District Rate of the said Borough respectively.

11. All the rights, interests, powers, property, privileges, liabilities, or obligations vested in or attached to the District Council under "the Aldershot Electric Lighting Order, 1898" as confirmed by "the Electric Lighting Orders Confirmation (No. 5) Act, 1898," "The Public Health Acts Amendment Act, 1890," "the Infectious Diseases (Prevention) Act, 1890," "the Private Street Works Act, 1892," and "the Public Health Acts Amendment Act, 1907," or under any other Statute, Order, Bye-Law or Regulation, shall pass to, devolve upon, be exercisable by or against, vested in or attached to the Corporation acting by the Council as the Sanitary Authority of the Borough, and from and after the commencement of this Scheme, the Corporation shall be and continue the legal successors of the Urban District Council of Aldershot for all purposes. The Town Clerk of the Borough shall be substituted for and perform the duties of the Clerk to the District Council.

12. Any rules and regulations under the Public Health Act, 1875, and the Dairies, Cowsheds and Milkshops Order of 1885; the Orders made by the Local Government Board on the 4th day of February, 1898, and the 31st day of October, 1916, under Sections 6 (i) (c) (iii) 8 (i) (d) and 33 of the Local Government Act, 1894, the Order made by the District Council on the 21st day of April, 1915, and confirmed by the Local Government Board on the 18th day of June, 1915 (relating to certain trades, businesses or manufactures), and (subject as hereinafter provided) any Bye-Laws and any table of fees and charges in force within the Urban District of Aldershot at the commencement of this Scheme, shall, unless duly repealed, revoked or varied, continue in force and have operation in the Borough in like manner and with like effect as if the Corporation, acting by the Council and their Officers, and the Borough, were referred to therein instead of the Local Board or the Dis-

trict Council (as the case may be) and their Officers, and the District.

Provided that:

(i.) The Bye-Laws with respect to New Buildings which were made by the District Council on the 6th day of November, 1895, and allowed by the Local Government Board on the 3rd day of January, 1896, shall be repealed as from the commencement of this Scheme;

(ii.) The Bye-Laws with respect to slaughter-houses which were made by the District Council on the 6th day of June, 1887, and allowed by the Local Government Board on the 26th day of August, 1887, shall continue in force and be in force within the Borough until the expiration of one year from the commencement of this Scheme and no longer, unless prior to that date other bye-laws made by the Corporation with respect to slaughter-houses shall have come into force.

13. Any Order made under the Shops Act, 1912, and in force in the Urban District immediately before the commencement of this Scheme shall, subject to the provisions of that Act, continue in force in the Borough.

14. The Bye-Laws for the good rule and government of the Administrative County of Southampton, so far as they are in force in the Urban District of Aldershot, shall continue in force and be enforced within the Municipal Borough of Aldershot until the expiration of two years from the commencement of this Scheme, or until other Bye-Laws for good rule and government made by the Corporation shall have come into force, whichever shall first occur.

15. As soon as may be convenient after the commencement of this Scheme, the Council of the Borough shall prepare and submit to the Board of Education a Scheme for an Education Committee for the Borough, in accordance with the provisions of Section 17 of the Education Act, 1902.

16. Until such Scheme shall have been approved by the Board of Education, the members of the Education Committee of the District Council who are in office immediately before the commencement of this Scheme shall be deemed to have been appointed, and shall be the Education Committee for the Borough of Aldershot.

17. As soon as the Scheme of the Borough Council shall have been approved by the Board of Education, the Education Committee appointed by the District Council shall be dissolved and cease to exist.

18. The hereinbefore mentioned Scheme for the administration of the County School at Aldershot shall continue in operation as if in lieu of the District Council the Corporation acting by the Town Council had then existed and had been therein mentioned.

19. From and after the commencement of this Scheme any powers and duties of the District Council under any Order or Scheme made under the War Pensions Acts shall be transferred to the Council of the Borough, and the said Order or Scheme shall remain in force until the same is altered or revoked in pursuance of the said Acts and shall be read as if the Council of the Borough were therein referred to instead of the District Council and the District.

20. Notwithstanding the incorporation of the Borough and the provisions of this Scheme, all rates, assessments, compositions, charges, mortgages, contracts, leases, conveyances, deeds, documents, acts, matters, and things made, entered into, or done before the commencement of this Scheme, by, to, or with reference to the District Council, shall be as good, valid, and effectual to all intents and purposes whatsoever for, against and with reference to the Corporation as if the same had been done, entered into, or done by, to or with reference to the Corporation instead of the District Council, and may be proceeded on or enforced in the same manner in all respects as if the Corporation instead of the District Council had been party or privy to the same and had been named or referred to therein.

21. In case any Officer of the District Council who shall have been employed by the District Council shall not be employed by the Council of the said Borough, nor offered by the said Council a position in their employ of a similar character and of an equal value to that formerly held by him, he shall be entitled to be paid by way of compensation for the loss of his position out of the funds of or under the control of the Corporation acting by the Council as the Sanitary Authority for the said Borough, and the amount to be paid in each case shall be determined in accordance with the provisions of Section 120 of the Local Government Act, 1888, and Sub-Sections (1) to (7) inclusive of that Section, shall apply as if they formed part of this Scheme, with the substitution of the words "Borough Council" for "County Council," and "this Scheme" for "this Act," and with such other modifications as are necessary to make them applicable hereto.

22. Provided nevertheless, that if any such Officer be so employed by the said Corporation and discharged by them (otherwise than for misconduct) within four years of the commencement of this Scheme he shall be entitled to compensation in the same manner as if he had not been employed by the said Corporation. Provided that the term "Officer" shall include only persons employed by the said Council whose salaries or emoluments are payable at intervals of not less than one month and no other persons.

23. The Accounts of the District Council and their Officers shall be made up to the date of the commencement of this Scheme and shall (as soon as conveniently may be) be audited by the District Auditor in like manner, and subject to the like powers, duties, provisions and right of appeal as if the Charter had not been granted, and the provisions of Sections 247 and 250 of "The Public Health Act, 1875," as amended by "The District Auditors Act, 1879," and any regulations duly issued by the Local Government Board or the Minister of Health with respect to the Audit of Accounts of Local Boards or Urban District Councils, and of their Officers, shall apply to such audit; and the provisions of this Scheme with respect to the District Council shall be construed so as to admit of such exceptions as may be necessary to enable such audit to be duly made, but such exceptions shall be strictly limited in time, extent, character, and operation to the purposes of such audit; any money certified to be due from any person by the District Auditor at such audit shall be paid by such person to the Treasurer of the Borough.

The following Scheme for the adjustment of the property, rights, liabilities, &c., of the Urban District Councils of Saint Anne's-on-the-Sea and Lytham, both in the Administrative County of the County Palatine of Lancaster, and for other purposes, as settled by a Committee of His Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, is published in accordance with the provisions of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1882":—

Whereas by the Municipal Corporation Acts, 1882 and 1885, it is enacted that where a Petition for a Charter of Incorporation is referred to the Committee of His Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, and it is proposed by the Charter to extend the Municipal Corporation Acts to the Municipal Borough to be created by the Charter, the said Committee of Council may settle a Scheme for the purposes in the said Acts named and containing such provisions as are in the said Acts particularized:

And whereas in the month of May, One thousand nine hundred and twenty, certain Inhabitant Householdors of the Urban District of Saint Anne's-on-the-Sea, in the County Palatine of Lancaster, petitioned His Majesty the King praying for the grant of a Charter of Incorporation:

And whereas it was proposed that such Charter should extend to the Urban District of Lytham, situate in the same County and adjoining the said Urban District of Saint Anne's-on-the-Sea:

And whereas the said Petition for a Charter was referred to the Committee of Council and it is proposed by the Charter to create the Urban District of Lytham and the Urban District of Saint Anne's-on-the-Sea one Municipal Borough by the name of the "Borough of Lytham Saint Anne's" (hereinafter referred to as "the Borough") and to incorporate the Inhabitants of the said Districts and to extend the Municipal Corporation Acts to the Municipal Borough to be created by the Charter:

And whereas the Urban District Council of Lytham (hereinafter called "the Lytham Council") have and are exercising divers powers under the Acts and Orders mentioned in the First Schedule hereto and hereinafter referred to as "the Lytham Local Acts and Orders" and the Lytham Council are the successors in law of the Commissioners for the purposes of the Lytham Improvement Act, 1847, in that Schedule mentioned, and the Lytham Local Acts and Orders, except so far as the same have been amended or repealed, are in force within the Urban District of Lytham (hereinafter called "the Lytham District"):

And whereas the Urban District Council of Saint Anne's-on-the-Sea (hereinafter called "the Saint Anne's Council") have and are exercising divers powers under the Acts and Order mentioned in the Second Schedule hereto and hereinafter referred to as "the Saint Anne's Local Acts and Order" and the Saint Anne's Local Acts and Order except so far as the same have been amended or repealed are in force within the Urban District of Saint Anne's-on-the-Sea (hereinafter called "the Saint Anne's District"):

And whereas the Public Acts or parts of

Public Acts mentioned in the Third Schedule hereto have been adopted and are in force as to such of them as are mentioned in Part I. of that Schedule for and within the Lytham District and as to such of them as are mentioned in Part II. thereof for and within the Saint Anne's District:

And whereas by virtue of Orders made by the Local Government Board the Sections and Parts of the Public Health Acts Amendment Act, 1907, which are mentioned in the Fourth Schedule hereto are in force within the Saint Anne's District, and by virtue of a like Order Section 50 of the said Act (comprised in Part III. thereof) is in force within the Lytham District:

And whereas the Lytham Council and the Saint Anne's Council, under the powers conferred on them respectively by the Acts and Orders hereinbefore referred to and by the Public General Acts applying to the said Councils own divers undertakings and properties, and have contracted loans in respect of their said undertakings and properties or some of them, and otherwise for the purpose of providing for the further administration of their respective Districts balances of which loans remain outstanding:

And whereas the Local Government Board made the following Orders in pursuance of Section 33 of the Local Government Act, 1894, namely on the 30th day of September, 1897, and on the 5th day of June, 1896, conferring upon the Lytham Council the power of appointing overseers of the poor, and of appointing and revoking the appointment of any assistant overseer for the Township of Lytham and the powers of a parish council under Sub-Section (3) of Section 14 of that Act respectively, and on the 23rd day of March, 1895, the 26th day of November, 1895, and the 14th day of February, 1898, conferring upon the Saint Anne's Council the like power in respect of the Township of Saint Anne's:

And whereas by an Order made by the Saint Anne's Council (in pursuance of the powers conferred by Section 112 of the Public Health Act, 1875, as amended by Section 51 of the Public Health Acts Amendment Act, 1907) on the 5th day of April, 1911, and confirmed by Order of the Local Government Board dated the 14th day of June, 1911, each of the trades, businesses or manufactures of fish fryer and rag and bone dealer was declared to be an offensive trade:

And whereas under the powers of the Public Health Acts and other Acts them respectively thereunto enabling the Lytham Council or their predecessors have made Bye-laws with respect to the matters mentioned in Part I. of the Fifth Schedule hereto and the Saint Anne's Council or their predecessors have made Bye-laws with respect to the matters mentioned in Part II. of that Schedule, and the said respective Bye-laws are in force within the Lytham District and the Saint Anne's District respectively:

And whereas each of them, the Lytham Council and the Saint Anne's Council, have made regulations under the Dairies, Cowsheds and Milkshops Order of 1885, which regulations are now in force within the Lytham District and the Saint Anne's District respectively:

And whereas the County Council of the Administrative County of the County Palatine of Lancaster have made certain Bye-laws for the good rule and government of that County

and also Bye-laws under the Employment of Children Act, 1903, the Education Act, 1918, and the Locomotives Act, 1898, and an Order and Bye-laws under the Lights on Vehicles Act, 1907, and the same are now in force in the Lytham District and the Saint Anne's District respectively:

And whereas by virtue of the Orders made by the said County Council in pursuance of the Isolation Hospitals Act, 1893, the short titles and dates whereof are set forth in the Sixth Schedule hereto, the Lytham District and the Saint Anne's District are included within the area of the Fylde Preston and Garstang Joint Hospital District and the Lytham Council are entitled to appoint one member and the Saint Anne's Council are entitled to appoint one member of the Fylde, Preston and Garstang Hospital Committee constituted by those Orders:

And whereas by virtue of Orders made by the said County Council in pursuance of the Isolation Hospitals Act, 1903, the short titles and dates whereof are set forth in the Seventh Schedule hereto, the Lytham District and the Saint Anne's District are included within the area of the Fylde Joint Hospital District, and the Lytham Council are entitled to appoint three members and the Saint Anne's Council are entitled to appoint three members of the Fylde Hospital Committee constituted by those Orders:

And whereas by virtue of the Fylde Waterworks (Transfer) Act, 1897, the Lytham Council and the Saint Anne's Council are constituent authorities for the purposes of that Act and the other Acts and Orders relating to the Fylde Water Board, and the Lytham Council are entitled to appoint three members and the Saint Anne's Council are entitled to appoint two members of the Fylde Water Board constituted by the Fylde Waterworks (Transfer) Act, 1897:

And whereas it is intended that arrangements shall be made for the consolidation of the Police Force of the Borough when constituted by Charter with the Police Force of the County of Lancaster:

And whereas it is expedient that the Council of the Borough shall be the Local Education Authority for the purposes of Part III of the Education Act, 1902:

And whereas the Lytham Council and the Saint Anne's Council and the said County Council are Local Authorities within the meaning of the Municipal Corporation Acts, 1882 and 1885:

And whereas on the Second day of May, 1921, the Saint Anne's Council and the Lytham Council entered into an agreement with Thomas Bradley, the present Clerk of the Saint Anne's Council, in relation to his appointment as Town Clerk of the Borough if created, and to the salary to be paid to him as holder of that office and the compensation to be paid to him on retirement therefrom and otherwise, and it is expedient that the said agreement shall be confirmed and made binding on the Corporation of the Borough:

And whereas this Scheme before being settled by the Committee of Council was referred for consideration to His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the Home Department, to the Minister of Health, to the Board of Trade, and to the Board of Education:

And whereas it is expedient that a Scheme

should be made and settled containing the provisions hereinafter set forth:

Now therefore, pursuant to the Municipal Corporation Acts, 1882 and 1885, and every other power enabling them in that behalf, the Committee of Council have settled a Scheme containing the provisions herein, and do hereby direct, order and declare as follows:—

1. This Scheme may be cited for all purposes as "The Borough of Lytham Saint Anne's Scheme, 1922."

2. In this Scheme—

"The Lytham District" means the Urban District of Lytham;

"The Lytham Council" means the Urban District Council of the Lytham District;

"The Saint Anne's District" means the Urban District of Saint Anne's-on-the-Sea;

"The Saint Anne's Council" means the Urban District Council of the Saint Anne's District;

"The Borough" means the Municipal Borough of Lytham Saint Anne's created by the said Charter;

"The Corporation" means the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the Borough acting by the Council;

"The County Council" means the County Council of the Administrative County of the County Palatine of Lancaster;

"Property" means and includes all property, real and personal, and all things in action and all rights of common and commonable rights and rights to toll, and all franchises, privileges and rights which have any pecuniary value, and all charters, records, deeds, books and documents, and all rights and all claims to relief and all rights to avoid contracts or otherwise, and includes any estate or interest, legal or equitable, in or in respect of any property so defined.

3. This Scheme, when confirmed, shall come into operation on the day of the first meeting of the Council of the Borough, and this Scheme shall be construed and applied as if it had been dated and confirmed by Parliament or Order in Council on the day before the day of the said first meeting, and everything thereunder shall be done and had accordingly. This date is hereinafter referred to as "the commencement of this Scheme." So far as may be necessary this Scheme shall operate retrospectively.

4. From and after the commencement of this Scheme the Borough shall be placed within the jurisdiction of the Corporation acting by the Council of the Borough as the Sanitary Authority and as the Local Education Authority for the purposes of Part III. of the Education Act 1902 (as the case may be) of the Borough.

5. The Lytham Council and the Saint Anne's Council and their respective powers, duties, rights, obligations and privileges shall continue and be deemed to have continued to exist until the commencement of this Scheme unaffected in any manner whatsoever by the grant of the said Charter or the creation of the Borough. From and after the commencement of this Scheme the Lytham Council and the Saint Anne's Council shall be and the same are hereby abolished and their respective powers, duties, rights, obligations and privileges shall cease and determine.

6. All the jurisdiction, powers, rights, duties and property vested in or possessed by the Lytham Council or the Saint Anne's Council or in or by any person or body in trust for either of those Councils or any of their members as such (and not otherwise dealt with or transferred by or under any part of this Scheme) shall vest in the Corporation and shall be exercised, held and applied for the municipal and public purposes of the Borough.

7. All duties and liabilities which immediately before the commencement of this Scheme attached to and were enforceable against the Lytham Council or the Saint Anne's Council or the property of those Councils respectively shall attach to and be enforceable against the Corporation and the property of the Corporation.

8. Any investigation, legal proceedings, or remedy in respect of any debt, liability, penalty or forfeiture due to or incurred by or on behalf of the Lytham Council or the Saint Anne's Council before the commencement of this Scheme may be continued, prosecuted or enforced by or against the Corporation.

9. The District Fund and General District Rate of the Borough shall for all purposes whatsoever (subject to the provisions of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882, with respect to the Borough Fund and Borough Rate and Watch Rate respectively) take the place of and be substituted for the District Funds and General District Rates respectively of the Lytham District and of the Saint Anne's District and all sums of money respectively payable to, from, or out of, and all liabilities charged upon or attaching to the District Funds and General District Rates of the said Districts respectively shall (subject as aforesaid) be paid to, from, or out of and shall be charged upon the District Fund and General District Rate of the Borough respectively.

10. All the rights, interests, powers, property, privileges, liabilities or obligations vested in or attached to the Lytham Council under the Lytham Local Acts and Orders mentioned in the First Schedule hereto or in or to the Saint Anne's Council under the Saint Anne's Local Acts and Order mentioned in the Second Schedule hereto or in or to either of the said Councils under any other Statute, or Order, or any Bye-law or Regulation shall pass to, devolve upon, be exercisable by or against, vested in or attached to the Corporation acting by the Council as the Sanitary Authority of the Borough and from and after the commencement of this Scheme the Corporation shall be and continue the legal successors of the Lytham Council and the Saint Anne's Council for all purposes. Provided that the Lytham Local Acts and Orders mentioned in the First Schedule hereto and the Bye-laws mentioned in Part I. of the Fifth Schedule hereto and any other Bye-laws, Regulations or Orders made by the Lytham Council or their predecessors under the Lytham Local Acts and Orders or any Public General Act and in force within the Lytham District at the commencement of this Scheme shall, except in so far as repealed by this Scheme, be operative only within so much of the Borough as comprises the Lytham District, and that the Saint Anne's Local Acts and Order mentioned in the Second Schedule hereto and the Bye-laws mentioned in Part II. of the Fifth Schedule hereto

and any other Bye-laws, Regulations, or Orders made by the Saint Anne's Council or their predecessors under the Saint Anne's Local Acts and Order, or any Public General Act, and in force within the Saint Anne's District at the commencement of this Scheme, shall, except in so far as repealed by this Scheme, be operative only within so much of the Borough as comprises the Saint Anne's District. The Town Clerk and other officers of the Borough shall be substituted for and perform the duties of the Clerks and other officers of the Lytham Council and the Saint Anne's Council respectively.

11. The enactments mentioned in Part I. of the Third Schedule hereto which have been adopted by the Lytham Council shall from the commencement of this Scheme be in force throughout so much of the Borough as comprises the Lytham District and the enactments mentioned in Part II. of the said Schedule which have been adopted by the Saint Anne's Council shall from the commencement of this Scheme be in force throughout so much of the Borough as comprises the Saint Anne's District as if in each case the same had been duly adopted by the Corporation for the said portions of the Borough after the creation thereof.

12. The Orders of the Local Government Board declaring those provisions of the Public Health Acts Amendment Act, 1907, which are mentioned in the Fourth Schedule hereto to be in force within the Saint Anne's District, shall from the commencement of this Scheme have effect as if the said Orders had declared the said provisions to be in force throughout so much of the Borough as comprises the Saint Anne's District, and the hereinbefore recited Order of that Board declaring Section 50 of the said Act (comprised in Part III. thereof) to be in force within the Lytham District, shall from the commencement of this Scheme have effect as if such Order had declared the said Section to be in force throughout so much of the Borough as comprises the Lytham District.

13. The hereinbefore recited Orders of the Local Government Board made in pursuance of Section 33 of the Local Government Act, 1894, shall from the commencement of this Scheme continue in force and effect within the Borough and in favour of the Corporation as fully as they are now in force within the Lytham District and the Saint Anne's District respectively, and in favour of the Councils of those respective Districts.

14. The hereinbefore recited Order made by the Saint Anne's Council on the 5th day of April, 1911, and confirmed by the Local Government Board on the 14th day of June, 1911, relating to certain trades, businesses or manufactures, shall from the commencement of this Scheme be in force within and apply to so much of the Borough as comprises the Saint Anne's District.

15. Except as hereinafter provided, and subject to the provisions of Clause 10 of this Scheme, the Bye-laws mentioned in the Fifth Schedule hereto and any other Bye-laws, Regulations and Orders made by the Lytham Council and the Saint Anne's Council under the Public Health Act, 1875, the Dairies, Cowsheds and Milkshops Order of 1885, the Shop Hours Act, 1904, the Shops Act, 1912, or any other Public General Act and in force within the Lytham District and the Saint Anne's District at the

commencement of this Scheme, shall, from and after such commencement and until duly repealed, revoked or varied, continue in force and have operation in like manner and with the like effect as if the Corporation and their officers were referred to therein instead of the Lytham Council or their predecessors or the Saint Anne's Council or their predecessors (as the case may be) and their officers.

Provided that:

(a) The series of Bye-laws numbered (2), (3) and (13) in Part I. of that Schedule shall be repealed as from the commencement of this Scheme;

(b) The series of Bye-laws numbered (11), (17) and (18) in Part I. of that Schedule, and the series of Bye-laws numbered (1) and (5) in Part II. of that Schedule, shall not remain in force after one year from the commencement of this Scheme.

16. The Bye-laws for the good rule and government of the County of Lancaster, the Bye-laws made by the County Council (a) under the Employment of Children Act, 1903, and the Education Act, 1918, with respect to the employment of children, and (b) under the Locomotives Act, 1898, with respect to the use of locomotives on highways and the Order and Bye-laws made by the County Council under the Lights on Vehicles Act, 1907, so far as they are in force in the Lytham District or the Saint Anne's District, shall continue in force and be enforced within the Borough until the expiration of two years from the commencement of this Scheme, or until other Bye-laws or an Order dealing with the same matters, as the case may be, made by the Corporation shall have come into force, whichever shall first occur.

17.—(1) From and after the commencement of this Scheme, and subject to any Order which may thereafter be made by the County Council the Borough shall be a constituent district, and the Corporation shall be a constituent authority for all the purposes of the Orders mentioned in the Sixth and Seventh Schedules hereto respectively, and in substitution for the Lytham District and the Saint Anne's District and the Councils of those Districts respectively, and the Corporation shall be entitled to elect or appoint six members of the Fylde Hospital Committee and two members of the Fylde Preston and Garstang Hospital Committee constituted by the said Orders.

(2) From and after the commencement of this Scheme the Corporation shall be a constituent authority for all the purposes of the Fylde Waterworks (Transfer) Act, 1897, and the other Acts and Orders relating to the Fylde Water Board, and in substitution for the Lytham Council and the Saint Anne's Council, and shall be entitled to appoint five members of the Fylde Water Board constituted by the Fylde Waterworks (Transfer) Act, 1897.

(3) Provided that the persons who at the date of the commencement of this Scheme shall be holding office as members of either of the said Hospital Committees or of the said Water Board, elected or appointed by the Lytham Council or by the Saint Anne's Council, shall continue in office as if this Scheme had not been made, and shall be deemed to have been elected or appointed by the Corporation and to represent the Borough, but any casual vacancy (whether existing at or

arising after the commencement of this Scheme) amongst the members of the said Bodies respectively elected or appointed by the Lytham Council or by the Saint Anne's Council, shall be filled by the Corporation.

18.—(1) From and after the commencement of this Scheme the Council of the Borough shall be the Local Education Authority for the purposes of Part III. of the Education Act, 1902, and as soon as may be convenient after the commencement of this Scheme the Council of the Borough shall prepare and submit to the Board of Education a Scheme for an Education Committee for the Borough in accordance with the provisions of Section 17 of that Act.

(2) Until such Scheme comes into force the members of the Council of the Borough shall be the Education Committee under Section 17 of the Education Act, 1902.

(3) All public elementary schools provided by the County Council as local education authority and situate in the Borough, and all lands so situate and vested in the County Council for purposes of Part III. of the Education Act, 1902, with the furniture, fittings, books and apparatus belonging to the County Council of any public elementary school in the Borough shall, by virtue of this Scheme and from and after the commencement of this Scheme, be transferred to and vest in the Corporation as the Local Education Authority for all the estate and interest therein of the County Council as the Local Education Authority, and all contracts, debts and liabilities which at the commencement of this Scheme are existing or are owing by or attach to the County Council in respect exclusively of any public elementary school in the Borough or of the lands, furniture, fittings, books or apparatus or with respect to the officers, teachers and servants of any public elementary school in the Borough shall, by virtue of this Scheme and from and after the commencement of this Scheme, enure and attach to and be carried into effect by and be discharged and satisfied by the Corporation as the Local Education Authority.

(4) Subject to any adjustment which may hereafter be made, the liability for the repayment of so much of any loan raised exclusively in respect of any public elementary school or of any lands, furniture, fittings, books or apparatus transferred to and vested in the Corporation by virtue of this Scheme as will be owing at the commencement thereof and the liability for the payment of the interest on that part of any such loan shall by virtue of this Scheme be transferred and attach to the Corporation as the Local Education Authority, and so much of any such loan as will be owing on the said date shall be charged on the Fund or Rate out of which the expenses of the Corporation under the Education Act, 1902, are payable, and shall be repaid by the Corporation within the period (if any) for which that part of the loan was originally sanctioned, or within which the said part of the loan is otherwise required to be repaid or is made repayable.

(5) Any Bye-laws made under the Education Acts, 1870 to 1919, or any of them and in force in the area of the Borough immediately before the commencement of this Scheme shall, from and after such commencement, apply within the Borough until revoked or altered by the Council of the Borough.

(6) All managers of public elementary

schools within the Borough who were appointed by the County Council, the Lytham Council or the Saint Anne's Council shall at the commencement of this scheme vacate office.

(7) An equitable adjustment shall be made between the Corporation and the County Council in respect of the matters to which this clause relates, and Section 68 of the Local Government Act, 1894, shall apply to such adjustment as if the same were required for the purposes of the said Local Government Act, 1894, and with such modifications as may be necessary.

(8) The powers of the Lytham Council and the Saint Anne's Council to appoint Governors under the Scheme of the 15th day of June, 1903, made by the Board of Education in the matter of the Lytham School Charities, and to appoint School Managers under the provisions relating to School Managers referred to in Clause 1 of that Scheme, shall be transferred to and vested in the Corporation without prejudice to the tenure of office of any Governor or School Manager appointed by the Lytham Council or the Saint Anne's Council in office at the commencement of this Scheme.

19. All mortgages, stocks, charges, loans and debts of the Lytham Council and of the Saint Anne's Council shall be the mortgages, stocks, charges, loans and debts of the Corporation and all mortgages of and charges upon the undertakings, rates and property of the Lytham Council or of the Saint Anne's Council respectively, shall be mortgages of and charges upon the same undertakings, and of and upon the district fund, general district rate and property of the Corporation.

20. All arrears of any general district rates and other rates and payments which on the commencement of this Scheme are due or are owing to the Lytham Council or to the Saint Anne's Council, or either of them, in respect of hereditaments within the Borough may be collected, levied and recovered by the Corporation.

21. Notwithstanding the incorporation of the Borough and the provisions of this Scheme, all rates, assessments, compositions, charges, mortgages, contracts, leases, conveyances, deeds, documents, acts, matters and things, made, entered into, or done before the commencement of this Scheme, by, to, or with reference to the Lytham Council or the Saint Anne's Council (as the case may be) shall be as good, valid and effectual to all intents and purposes whatsoever for, against and with reference to the Corporation as if the same had been done, entered into, or done by, to or with reference to the Corporation instead of the Lytham Council or the Saint Anne's Council (as the case may be) and may be proceeded on or enforced in the same manner in all respects as if the Corporation instead of the Lytham Council or the Saint Anne's Council had been party or privy to the same and had been named or referred to therein.

22. Thomas Bradley, of Saint Anne's-on-the-Sea, the Clerk of the Saint Anne's Council, shall, if willing to act, be the first Town Clerk of the Borough, and shall hold office upon the terms as to salary, compensation upon retirement, and otherwise set forth in the hereinbefore recited agreement of the Second day of May, 1921, and the said agreement is hereby confirmed and made binding upon the Corporation in like manner as if the same had been made after the creation of the

Borough and the Corporation had been a party thereto in lieu of the Saint Anne's Council and the Lytham Council.

23.—(1) In case any officer of the Lytham Council or the Saint Anne's Council, or any officer of the County Council in respect of elementary education in either the Lytham District or the Saint Anne's District, who shall have been employed by such Council for a period of not less than five years, shall not be employed by the Council of the Borough nor offered by that Council a position in their employ of a similar character and of an equal value to that formerly held by him, he shall be entitled to be paid compensation for the loss of his position out of the funds of or under the control of the Corporation acting by the Council as the Sanitary Authority or Education Authority (as the case may be) for the Borough, and the amount to be paid in each case shall be determined in accordance with the provisions of Section 120 of the Local Government Act, 1888, and sub-sections (1) to (7) inclusive of that section shall apply as if they formed part of this Scheme with the substitution of the words "Borough Council" for "County Council" and "this Scheme" for "this Act," and with such other modifications as are necessary to make them applicable thereto.

(2) Provided nevertheless that if any such officer be so employed by the Corporation and discharged by them (otherwise than for misconduct) within four years after the commencement of this Scheme he shall be entitled to compensation in the same manner as if he had not been employed by the Corporation.

(3) Provided also that the term "officer" shall include only persons employed by the Lytham Council or the Saint Anne's Council or by the County Council as aforesaid whose salaries or emoluments are payable at intervals of not less than one month and no other persons.

(4) The foregoing provisions of this clause shall apply to a teacher employed in any public elementary school at the commencement of this Scheme within either of the aforesaid districts as if he were an officer employed by the County Council provided that in the case of a teacher employed in a non-provided school the said provisions shall only apply if such teacher be discharged by the Corporation or by the direction or with the consent of the Corporation (otherwise than for misconduct) within four years of the commencement of this Scheme.

24. The accounts of the Lytham Council and the Saint Anne's Council and their officers shall be made up to the commencement of this Scheme and shall (as soon as conveniently may be) be audited by the District Auditor in like manner and subject to the like powers, duties, provisions, and right of appeal as if the Charter had not been granted and the provisions of Sections 247 and 250 of the Public Health Act, 1875, as amended by the District Auditors Act, 1879, and any regulations issued by the Local Government Board or the Minister of Health with respect to the audit of accounts of Local Boards or Urban District Councils, and of their Officers shall apply to such audit; and the provisions of this Scheme with respect to the Lytham Council and the Saint Anne's Council shall be construed so as to admit of such exceptions as may be necessary to enable such audit to be duly made, but such exceptions

shall be strictly limited in time, extent, character, and operation to the purposes of such audit. Any money certified to be due from any person by the District Auditor at such audit shall be paid by such person to the Treasurer of the Borough.

WHEREAS by Section 43 of the Explosives Act, 1875, it is provided that His Majesty from time to time, by Order in Council, may prohibit, either absolutely or except in pursuance of a licence of the Secretary of

State under the Act, or may subject to conditions and restrictions the manufacture, keeping, importation, conveyance, and sale, or any of them, of any explosive which is of so dangerous a character that in the judgment of His Majesty it is expedient for the public safety to make such Order:

And whereas the explosives to which this Order applies are of so dangerous a character that in the judgment of His Majesty it is expedient for the public safety to make this Order:

And whereas the provisions of Section 1 of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, have been complied with:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order and prescribe as follows:—

1. This Order applies to all explosives other than gunpowder, small-arm nitro-compound, safety cartridges made with gunpowder, or with small-arm nitro-compound, cartridges or charges for cannon or blasting made with gunpowder and not containing within themselves their own means of ignition, percussion caps, safety fuze, or fire-works.

2. No person shall sell any explosive to which this Order applies unless he complies with the following conditions:—

(i) He shall satisfy himself that the person desiring to purchase the explosive is in possession of a police certificate as provided by the two Orders in Council of the date of 20th April, 1883, and the Order in Council of the date of the 26th October, 1896.

Provided that this shall not apply to the owner agent or manager of a mine or quarry in respect of the sale by him of explosives to his employees for immediate use in the said mine or quarry.

(ii) He shall keep a record of the nature and quantity of explosives sold, the date of each transaction, and the name and address of the purchaser, and shall show such record to any Government Inspector, police officer, or duly appointed officer of the Local Authority when called upon to do so.

3. This Order shall come into force from the date hereof.

1. Provided that in the case of workers of 14½ years of age and upwards and under 18 years of age the rate applicable to a worker of any particular age as set out in the foregoing Table shall only become payable on the first pay-day in January or July, as the case may be, corresponding with or next following the date on which the worker attains such age, the rate payable until such half-yearly pay-day being that applicable under the Table to a worker of the next lower age group.

2. Provided also that in the case of a worker who has had less than three months' experience in the operations of sorting or grading of Waste Paper or Paper Stock Materials, and who:—

(a) Is employed during the whole or a substantial part of her time in learning such operations by an employer who provides the learner with reasonable facilities for such learning; and

(b) Has received a certificate or has been registered in accordance with rules from time to time laid down by the Trade Board or has made application for such certificate or registration which has been duly acknowledged and is still under consideration, the minimum rate payable to her during the period re-

quired to complete such first three months of experience shall be 1d. per hour less than that otherwise applicable to her under the foregoing provisions.

Workers of 16 and under 16½ years of age, 22s. per week of 48 hours, *i.e.*, 5½d. per hour.

Workers of 16½ and under 17 years of age, 24s. per week of 48 hours, *i.e.*, 6d. per hour.

Workers of 17 and under 17½ years of age, 27s. per week of 48 hours, *i.e.*, 6¼d. per hour.

Workers of 17½ and under 18 years of age, 30s. per week of 48 hours, *i.e.*, 7½d. per hour.

Workers of 18 years of age or over, 33s. per week of 48 hours, *i.e.*, 8¼d. per hour.

1. Provided that in the case of workers of 14½ years of age and upwards and under 18 years of age the rate applicable to a worker of any particular age as set out in the foregoing Table shall only become payable on the first pay day in January or July as the case may be corresponding with or next following the date on which the worker attains such age, the rate payable until such half-yearly pay day being that applicable under the Table to a worker of the next lower age group.

2. Provided also that in the case of a worker who has had less than three months' experience in the operations of sorting or grading Woollen Rag or Woollen and Worsted Waste Materials, and who is employed during the whole or a substantial part of her time in learning such operations by an employer who provides the learner with reasonable facilities for such learning, the Minimum Rate payable to her during the period required to complete such first three months of experience shall be 1d. per hour less than that otherwise applicable to her under the foregoing provisions.

SECTION II.—PIECE-WORK BASIS TIME-RATE FOR FEMALE PIECE-WORKERS.

Workers of 16 and under 16½ years of age, 20s. per week of 48 hours, *i.e.*, 5d. per hour.

Workers of 16½ and under 17 years of age, 22s. per week of 48 hours, *i.e.*, 5½d. per hour.

Workers of 17 and under 17½ years of age, 24s. per week of 48 hours, *i.e.*, 6d. per hour.

Provided that in the case of workers of 14½ years of age and upwards, and under 18 years of age, the rate applicable to a worker of any particular age as set out in the foregoing Table shall only become payable on the first pay-day in January or July, as the case may be, corresponding with or next following the date on which the worker attains such age, the rate payable until such half-yearly pay-day being that applicable under the Table to a worker of the next lower age group.

SECTION II.—PIECE-WORK BASIS TIME-RATE FOR FEMALE PIECE-WORKERS.

FEMALE WORKERS OF ALL AGES, 8d. per hour.

The Overtime Rates for Male Workers of 21 years of age or over are set out in Part III of this Notice.

PART III.

OVERTIME RATES.

MALE WORKERS OF 21 YEARS OF AGE OR OVER AND FEMALE WORKERS.

SECTION I.—In accordance with Section 3 (1) (c) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, the Trade Board have declared the normal number of hours of work in the Trade to be as follows:—

IN ANY WEEK, 48 hours.

ON ANY DAY (OTHER THAN SATURDAY), 8½ hours.

ON SATURDAY, 4½ hours.

Provided that all hours worked by a worker on Sundays, on Customary Public Holidays, or on Statutory Holidays shall be regarded as Overtime to which the Overtime Rates shall apply.

SECTION II.—The Minimum Rates for Overtime in respect of hours worked by a Male Worker of 21 years of age or over, or by a Female Worker, whether engaged on Time-Work or on Piece-Work in excess of the declared normal number of hours, shall be as follows:—

(1) ON ANY DAY other than Sundays, Customary Public Holidays and Statutory Holidays:—

(a) For the first two hours' Overtime, One-and-a-Quarter Times the Minimum Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, TIME-AND-A-QUARTER.

(b) For Overtime after the first two hours of Overtime, One-and-a-Half Times the Minimum Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, TIME-AND-A-HALF.

(2) ON SUNDAYS, ON CUSTOMARY PUBLIC HOLIDAYS, AND ON STATUTORY HOLIDAYS:—

For all time worked, Twice the Minimum Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, DOUBLE TIME.

(3) IN ANY WEEK:—For all hours worked in any week in excess of 48, One-and-a-Quarter Times the Minimum Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, TIME-AND-A-QUARTER, except in so far as higher Overtime Rates are payable under the provisions of Sub-sections 1 (b) and 2 of this Section.

(4) The Overtime Rates set out in Sub-sections (1) and (2) of this Section are payable in respect of all hours of Overtime worked on any day, notwithstanding that the number of hours worked in the week does not exceed 48.

(NOTE.—The hours which Female Workers, young persons and children are allowed to work are subject to the provisions of the Factory and Workshop Acts and of the Employment of Women, Young Persons and Children Act, 1920.)

PART IV.

The above respective Minimum Rates of Wages shall, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, apply, as specified above, to all Male Workers of 21 years of age or over and to all Female Workers in Great Britain in respect of all time during which they are employed in the General Waste Branch of the Waste Materials Reclamation Trade, as defined in the Regulations made by the Minister of

Labour, dated 27th August, 1920, that is to say:—

(1) The collecting, sorting or grading of the following materials:—

Rags, waste paper, paper stock, woollen, worsted, cotton, jute, flax, hemp or other textile waste, textile clippings or cuttings, used bags, sacks or sacking, scrap rubber, scrap iron or other scrap metal, fur cuttings, rabbit skins, bones or fat, used tins, broken glass or earthenware.

(2) The collecting, sorting or grading of the following articles when collected, sorted or graded in association with or in conjunction with the collecting, sorting or grading of the waste materials specified above:—

Discarded clothing (including head-gear or foot-gear), discarded textile articles, old ropes, used bottles or used jars.

(3) The following operations when carried on in association with or in conjunction with the collecting, sorting or grading of any or all of the waste materials specified in 1 above:—

The ripping of worn cloths for rags, the picking of old ropes, the trimming of paper salvage, the washing of used bottles or used jars, the washing of used tins, the breaking of scrap metal, the drying of rabbit skins, the making or repairing of sacks or bags, the willowing, pulling, scouring, carbonising or putting down mixings of textile waste.

(4) The operations of receiving, packing, compressing, teagling, craning, despatching, or warehousing when carried on in association with or in conjunction with any of the above-mentioned operations.

But excluding—

(a) Any of the above-mentioned operations when carried on in the establishment in which waste materials are produced or in which they are used as raw materials for further manufacture.

(b) The making or repairing of sacks or bags when carried on in a factory or workshop engaged solely or mainly in the making or repairing of sacks or bags.

(c) The collecting, sorting, grading or drying of rabbit skins when carried on in an establishment in which such operations are the main or principal business, or when carried on in association with or in conjunction with any business establishment, branch or department engaged in the manufacture of hatters' furs.

(d) (i) The collecting, sorting or grading of cotton waste when carried on in an establishment in which such operations are the main or principal business.

(ii) Any of the operations included in paragraphs (1), (2), (3) and (4) above (other than the operations specified in paragraph (d)—(i) above) when carried on in or in association with or in conjunction with any establishment of the kind specified in subparagraph (1) above.

Provided that notwithstanding anything contained in this Notice the above Minimum Rates shall not apply to Male Workers who are engaged in the loading or discharging of waterborne craft in any Section of the Trade.

PART V.

GENERAL PROVISIONS.

SECTION I.—The Guaranteed Time-Rates for Piece-Workers set out in Part I above are for

the purpose of securing to workers employed on Piece-Work a Minimum Rate of remuneration on a Time-Work Basis, and such workers shall be entitled to be paid not less than the Guaranteed Time-Rate applicable to a worker of her age as set out in the before-mentioned Parts of the Schedule; in any case where her earnings on Piece-Work are less than such sum.

SECTION II.—(a) The Piece-Work Basis Time-Rates set out in Part I above are applicable to the workers specified therein as follows, that is to say, that where a worker is employed upon Piece-Work, each Piece-Rate paid must be such as would yield, in the circumstances of the case, to an ORDINARY worker not less than the Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate applicable. (b) In the case of Male Workers of 21 years of age or over employed on Piece-Work, each Piece-Rate paid must be such as would yield, in the circumstances of the case, to an ORDINARY worker not less than the General Minimum Time-Rate applicable. (c) In determining whether any Piece-Rate satisfies these conditions, regard must be had only to the earnings of ordinary workers, *i.e.*, workers of ordinary skill and experience in the class of work in question, and not to the earnings of workers of less than ordinary skill and experience, *e.g.*, learners and infirm workers.

SECTION III.—The Minimum Rates of Wage shall be paid clear of all deductions, other than deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments, or deductions authorised by any Act to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any superannuation or other provident fund.

SECTION IV.—The above Minimum Rates of Wages are without prejudice to workers who are earning higher rates of wages or to agreements made or that may be made for the payment of wages in excess of the Minimum Rates.

GOVERNMENT OF NORTHERN IRELAND.

(a) Mr. Walter Abbott to exercise and perform those powers and duties under the designation of Registrar of Business Names for Northern Ireland;

(b) Mr. James Stewart, of the Ministry of Commerce, to assist Mr. Abbott in such exercise and performance under the designation of Assistant Registrar of Business Names for Northern Ireland.
