The Air Member for Supply and Research. The Secretary of the Air Ministry.

(2) Of the members of the Air Council (other than the President) the Chief of the Air Staff shall be appointed by His Majesty, and the other members shall be appointed by the Secretary of State.

(3) There may be included in the Air Council such additional members (if any) not exceeding two, as may be appointed by the Secretary

of State.

(4) The Secretary of State is to be responsible to His Majesty and Parliament for all the business of the Air Council.

All business, other than business which the Secretary of State specially reserves to himself, is to be transacted in the following principal divisions:—

- (a) The Parliamentary Under Secretary of State for Air to be Vice-President of the Air Council and to be responsible to the Secretary of State for so much of the business of the Air Council, and in particular of that relating to Civil Aviation, as may be assigned to him from time to time by the Secretary of State.
- (b) The Chief of the Air Staff to be the first and Senior Air Member of Council, and principal adviser of the Secretary of State in the direction of the Air Force; and in particular to be responsible to the Secretary of State for the administration of so much of the business relating to the disposition, command, training, employment, communications and works services of the Air Force, as may be assigned to him from time to time by the Secretary of State.

(c) The Air Member for Personnel to be responsible to the Secretary of State for the administration of so much of the business relating to the personnel, discipline and organisation of the Air Force as may be assigned to him from time to time by the

Secretary of State.

(d) The Air Member for Supply and Research to be responsible to the Secretary of State for so much of the business relating to the equipment, armament and maintenance of the Air Force, and to aeronautical research and inspection both for the Air Force and for civil purposes, as may be assigned to him from time to time by the Secretary of State.

- (e) The Secretary of the Air Ministry to be responsible to the Secretary of State for such duties discharged by the Air Ministry as are not assigned to other members of the Council, for the control of expenditure, and for the co-ordination of Air Ministry business; and to be also designated Secretary of the Air Council and as such charged with the preparation of all official communications of the Council.
- (5) Subject to the foregoing provisions as to the transaction of business in separate divisions the powers and duties of the Air Council may be exercised and performed by any three of their number and notwithstanding that any office, the holder of which is a member of the Air Council, is temporarily vacant, provided, however, that documents may be signed on behalf of the Air Council by any two members of the Air Council.
- .(6) This Order in Council shall be substituted for the Order in Council dated the 13th day of October, 1920.
