EXPLOSIVE SUBSTANCE.

Order of the Secretary of State, No. 7 (B), dated the 7th November, 1922, modifying the General Rules as to Packing for Conveyance of Explosives other than Gunpowder.

Explosives Act, 1875 (38 Vict., c. 17).

In pursuance of Section 83 of the Explosives Act, 1875, I hereby amend the Order of the Secretary of State of the 10th June, 1904 (known as Order of Secretary of State No. 7), with respect to the packing of explosive for conveyance, as follows:-

So much of General Rule No. 5 of the Order as relates to the packing of explosive of Class III., Division I., other than propellants is hereby repealed, and the following provision substituted :--

Class.	Method of Packing.	Amount in any one outer package.	Amount in any one inner package.
Class III., Division I., other than propellants.	As for Class I., provided that either the outer or inner package shall be thoroughly waterproof, and that no metal shall be used in the construction of the packages, except that (1) nails of brass, zinc, or other soft metal, or coated with the same may be used for securing the outer package, and (2) wire stitching may be used for securing the inner package if the wire is effectively prevented from coming into contact with the explosive by means of a sheet of stout cardboard or otherwise.	50 lbs.	5 lbs.

This Notice sets out all the Minimum Rates of Wages which have been fixed or varied by the Trade Board for Female Home-Workers and are effective under the Trade Boards Acts and takes the place of the Notice V. (4) issued by the Trade Board and dated 11th August, 1920.

The Minimum Rates set out in the Schedule below are effective under Orders of the Minister of Labour dated 9th August, 1920, and 6th November, 1922, as follows:—

- The General Minimum Piece-Rates applicable to Workers who receive work through a Middlewoman or Middleman set out in Column II. of Part I of the Schedule below as from 13th November, 1922.*
- 2. All other rates as from 14th August, 1920.
- * Should this date not correspond with the beginning of the period for which wages are paid by an employer who pays wages at intervals not exceeding seven days, the rates shall become effective as from the beginning of the next full pay period, but in no case later than 19th November, 1922.

The General Minimum Piece-Rates set out above apply to the actual workers and not to the Middlewoman or Middleman. The cotton for sewing the buttons must be provided by the employer.

PART II.

PIECE-WORK BASIS TIME-RATE FOR CERTAIN CLASSES OF FEMALE HOME-WORKERS.

For all Female Home-Workers, other than those employed on carding linen buttons and metal trouser buttons 8½d. per hour.

In the case of all Female Home-Workers employed on Piece-Work, to whom the General Minimum Piece-Rates set out in Part I do not apply, each piece-rate paid must be such as would yield in the circumstances of the case not less than 8½d. per hour to an ordinary worker, i.e., a worker of ordinary skill and experience in the classes of work in question.

PART III.

For the purpose of this Notice the expression "Home-Worker" means a worker who works in her own home or in any other place not under the control or management of the employer.

PART IV.

SECTION I.

The Minimum Rates of Wages set out in this Schedule apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, to all Female Home-Workers in Great Britain, in respect of all time during which they are employed in any branch of the trade specified in the Trade Boards (Button-Making) Order, 1919, and as set out below.

Section II.

The Trade as specified in the above-mentioned Order is as follows:—

The manufacture of buttons, button-moulds, upholsterers' buttons or upholsterers' button-headed nails (excluding the shanks), from any material by the process of cutting, sawing, stamping, pressing, turning, drilling, fancying, grinding, barrelling, polishing, japanning, lacquering, dyeing, colouring, painting, varnishing, sewing, crotcheting or the covering of button moulds;

Including-

- (a) The manufacture of studs, links, or parts thereof, from any material other than metal, where such manufacture is carried on in association with or in conjunction with button-making, so as to provide a common or interchangeable form of employment for workers;
- (b) The manufacture of shanks for buttons where carried on in association with or in conjunction with button-making;
- (c) The carding of any of the above articles, wherever carried on;

SCHEDULE.—PART IV.—Continued.

(d) All despatching, packing, warehousing, or other operations incidental to or appertaining to the manufacture of any of the above articles;

But excluding :-

(e) The manufacture of wooden button moulds;

(f) The covering of button moulds where carried on in association with or in conjunction with the making of wearing apparel.

PART V.

SECTION I.

The Minimum Rates of Wages set out in this Schedule must be paid clear of all deductions other than deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments or deductions authorised by any Act to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any Superannuation or other Provident Fund.

SECTION II.

The Minimum Rates of Wages set out in this Schedule are without prejudice to workers earning higher rates of wages, or to agreements made, or that may be made, between employers and workers for the payment of wages in excess of these Minimum Rates of Wages.

 - (ii) A learner shall cease to be a learner and be entitled to the full General Minimum Time-Rate applicable to female workers other than learners upon completion of 4 years' employment in the trade.
 - (iii) If the conditions set out in Part IV, Section IV, of this Schedule are not complied with, the minimum rate applicable is that for female workers other than learners set out in Section II above.

In the case of all Workers employed on Piece-work, each Piece-Rate paid shall be such as would yield, in the circumstances of the case, to an ORDINARY WORKER of the class in question, not less than the Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate appropriate to the class.

In determining whether any Piece-Rate satisfies the above mentioned condition, regard must be had only to the earnings of ordinary workers, i.e., workers of ordinary skill and experience in the class of work in question and not to the earnings of workers of less than ordinary skill and experience, e.g., learners and infirm workers.

PART III.

OVERTIME RATES FOR MALE AND FEMALE WORKERS OF ALL AGES. SECTION I.

In accordance with Section 3 (1) (c) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, the Trade Board have declared the NORMAL NUMBER OF HOURS OF WORK in the Trade to be as follows:—

Provided that all hours worked by a worker on Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays and hours worked on Saturday (subject to the provisions set out below) shall be regarded as Overtime, to which the Overtime Rates shall apply.

SECTION II.

The Minimum Rates for Overtime in respect of hours worked by a worker of the classes specified in Parts I and II of this Schedule in excess of the declared normal number of hours shall be as follows:—

- A.—FOR WORKERS EMPLOYED ON TIME-WORK:
- (1) ON ANY DAY other than Saturday, Sunday and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays:—
 - (a) For the FIRST TWO HOURS OF OVERTIME, One-and-a-Quarter Times the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, i.e., TIME-AND-A-QUARTER.
 - (b) For OVERTIME, AFTER THE FIRST TWO HOURS OF OVERTIME, One-and a-Half Times the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, i.e, TIME-AND-A-HALF

Provided that where it is the established practice of an employer only to require attendance on five days a week, the Overtime Rates specified in paragraphs A (1) (a) and A (1) (b) of this Section shall not be payable on any day (other than Saturday, Sunday and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays) until the number of hours worked exceeds $9\frac{1}{2}$ and $11\frac{1}{2}$ respectively.

- (2) ON SATURDAY in respect of: -
 - (a) THAT CLASS OF WORKER WHO CUSTOMARILY ATTENDS ON SIX DAYS
 A WEEK:--

For all Overtime worked after the first five hours One-and-a-Half Times the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, i.e., TIME-AND-A-HALF.

NOTE.—During the first five hours worked on Saturday the Minimum Rate applicable for this class of worker is the appropriate General Minimum Time-Rate set out in Part I of the Schedule to this Notice.

SCHEDULE—PART III.—Continued.

- (b) THAT CLASS OF WORKER WHO CUSTOMARILY ATTENDS ON FIVE DAYS A WEEK:--
 - (i) For the first two hours of Overtime, that is to say, for the first two hours worked on Saturday, One and a Quarter Times the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, i.e., TIME-AND-A-QUARTER.
 - (ii) For Overtime after the first two hours of Overtime One-and-a-Half Times the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, i.e., TIME-AND-A-HALF.
- (3) ON SUNDAYS AND CUSTOMARY PUBLIC AND STATUTORY HOLIDAYS:—
 For all time worked, Twice the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, i.e.,
 DOUBLE-TIME.

NOTE.—The Overtime Rates set out in Sub-Sections (1) (2) and (3) of this Section are payable as provided above, in respect of all hours of Overtime worked on any day, notwithstanding that the number of hours worked in the week does not exceed 48.

- 4) Where it is, or may become, the established practice of an employer to require attendance on Sunday instead of Saturday, the Minimum Rates for Overtime as set out in this Section shall apply to workers in like manner as if in the provisions of this Schedule as to Overtime the word "Saturday" were substituted for "Sunday" and the word "Sunday" for "Saturday."
- (5) FOR ALL HOURS WORKED IN ANY WEEK IN EXCESS OF 48, One-and-a-Quarter Times the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, i.e., TIME-AND-A-QUARTER, except in so far as higher Overtime Rates are payable under the provisions of paragraphs (1) (b), (2) (a), (2) (b) (ii) and (3) of this Section.

Provided that where it is the established practice of an employer to require attendance only on alternate Saturdays, the Overtime Rate should not be payable in the week in which attendance on Saturday is required until 50 hours have been worked.

B.—FOR WORKERS EMPLOYED ON PIECE-WORK:—

All Workers employed on Piece-work shall receive in respect of each hour of Overtime worked, IN ADDITION TO PIECE-RATES, each of which would yield, in the circumstances of the case, to an Ordinary Worker not less than the Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate applicable:—

- (a) AN AMOUNT EQUAL TO ONE-QUARTER OF THE APPROPRIATE PIECE-WORK BASIS TIME-RATE.
- (b) AN AMOUNT EQUAL TO ONE-HALF OF THE APPROPRIATE PIECE-WORK BASIS TIME-RATE, or
- (c) AN AMOUNT EQUAL TO THE FULL AMOUNT OF THE APPROPRIATE PIECE-WORK BASIS TIME-RATE, according as the Overtime Rate which would have been payable under the provisions of paragraph (A) of this Section, if the worker had been employed on Time-Work, were:—
 - (a) TIME-AND-A-QUARTER,
 - (b) TIME-AND-A-HALF, or
 - (c) DOUBLE-TIME, respectively.

SECTION III.

In the application of the above Overtime Rates to Workers who customarily attend on six days a week, any other day, not being Sunday, may be substituted for Saturday as the weekly short day, and in such case the provisions of Sections I and II above shall apply in like manner as if in such provisions "Saturday" were substituted for such short day, and such short day were substituted for "Saturday," notwithstanding anything contained in Sections I and II of this Part of this Schedule.

Note.—The hours which Female Workers, Young Persons and Children are allowed to work are subject to the provisions of the Factory and Workshop Acts, and of the Employment of Women, Young Persons and Children Act, 1920.

PART IV.

DEFINITIONS.

For the purpose of the application of the minimum rates set out in this Notice the following definitions shall apply:—

SECTION I.

(a) A CUTTER is a Male person employed in marking-in and cutting, using electric machine, band knife, shears, or hand knife on any materials other than linings, inter-linings, peaks, bazils, or any other trimmings, and who has been so employed for not less than five years after the age of 19.

(b) A BLOCKER is a Male person employed in pulling-on and blocking hats and caps by hand iron or steam or by hydraulic machine and in making shapes by the French gas block, and who has been so employed for not less than five years after the age of 19.

SECTION II,

(a) A PRESS-CUTTER is a Male person employed on any process of Press-Cutting and who has been so employed for not less than three years after the age of 19.

(b) A LINING-CUTTER is a Male person employed in cutting linings and inter-linings, or in marking-out, laying-up or hooking-up, and who has been so employed for not less than three years after the age of 19.

SECTION III.

A HOMEWORKER is a worker who works in her own home or in any place not under the control or management of the employer.

SECTION IV.

A FEMALE LEARNER is a worker who:-

(a) is employed during the whole or a substantial part of her time in learning any branch or process of the trade specified in Part V of the Schedule to this Notice by an employer

who provides the learner with reasonable facilities for such learning, and

(b) has received a certificate or has been registered in accordance with rules from time to time laid down by the Trade Board, and held subject to compliance with conditions specified in this Section, or has made application for such certificate or registration which has been duly acknowledged and is still under consideration. Provided that the certification or registration of a learner may be cancelled if the other conditions of learnership are not complied with.

Provided that an employer may employ a female learner on her first employment without a certificate or registration for a probation period not exceeding four weeks, but in the event of such learner being continued thereafter at her employment the probation period shall be included in her

period of learnership.

PART V.

APPLICABILITY OF MINIMUM RATES.

The above Minimum Rates of Wages shall apply to all workers in England and Wales in respect of all time during which they are employed in any branch of the trade specified in the Trade Boards (Hat, Cap and Millinery) Order, 1919, that is to say:

The making from any material of men's, women's or children's headgear, or the trimming thereof:

Including:

Warehousing, packing, or other operations incidental to or appertaining to the making or trimming of men's, women's or children's headgear;

But excluding:—

(1) The casting and making of solid metal helmets;

(2) The making of rubberised or oilskin headgear where carried on in association with or in conjunction with the making of other rubberised or oilskin articles;

(3) The making of nurses' or servants' caps, chefs' caps, hospital ward caps, or similar

articles

(4) The making of field bonnets, sun-bonnets, boudoir caps, or infants' millinery where carried on in association with or in conjunction with the making of dresses, non-tailored skirts, wraps, blouses, blouse-robes, jumpers, sports coats, neckwear, tea-gowns, dressing gowns, dressing jackets, pyjamas, underclothing, under-skirts, aprons, overalls, nurses' and servants' caps, juvenile clothing, baby linen or similar articles;

(5) The making of fur hats, where made in association with or in conjunction with the

manufacture of fur, or furriers' skins into garments, rugs, or similar articles:

- (6) The making of knitted headgear and the making of headgear from knitted fabrics where carried on in association with or in conjunction with the manufacture of the knitted fabrics.
- (7) Warehousing and packing of men's, women's, and children's headgear and other similar operations carried on in shops mainly engaged in the retail distribution of articles of any description that are not made or trimmed on the premises.

PART VI.

The above Minimum Rates of Wages must be paid clear of all deductions other than deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments, or deductions authorised by any Act to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any Superannuation or other Provident Fund.

Signed by Order of the Trade Board and in pursuance of Orders of the Minister of Labour confirming the Minimum Rates of Wages set out above and specifying the dates shown in this Notice as the dates on which the respective rates become effective.

ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:

Application of Order and Meaning of Terms.

1. This Order applies to the Prohibited Areas and the Controlled Area described in the Schedule. If any farm (excluding any detached part) is partly within and partly outside any Prohibited Area, the whole shall be deemed to be within that area. Subject to this provision, if any farm (excluding any detached part) is partly within and partly outside the Controlled Area, the whole shall be deemed to be within the Controlled Area;

" Animals" means cattle, sheep, goats and

pigs,

"Slaughterhouse" means premises used habitually and solely for the purpose of slaughtering animals, but does not include a slaughterhouse which forms part of a farm.

Restrictions in Force in the Prohibited Areas.

- 2.—(a) No animals shall be moved into or out of any Prohibited Area except as provided in Article 3 of this Order.
- (b) No animals shall be moved along or across any road or other highway or by water within any Prohibited Area except as provided in Article 3 of this Order, or be permitted by the owner or person in charge thereof to stray upon any such road or highway;
- (c) No market, sale or exhibition of animals shall be held in any Prohibited Area;
- (d) No slaughterhouse manure or refuse shall be moved out of any Prohibited Area or be brought into contact with animals in any Prohibited Area.

Provision for Movement of Animals into Prohibited Areas for Immediate Slaughter.

- 3. Animals may be moved from premises outside the Prohibited Areas and the Controlled Area to a slaughterhouse in any borough or urban district in any Prohibited Area, subject to the following conditions:
 - (i) A licence authorising the movement must be obtained from the Local Authority of the destination before the movement This licence must accompany commences. the animals throughout the whole move-
 - (ii) The animals must be put on rail at a station outside the Prohibited and Controlled Areas, and be moved by railway without being untrucked within any Prohibited Area until arrival at the railway station nearest to the place of destination.

(iii) No animals shall be moved with such a licence on any road or other highway within two miles of any Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Place.

Restrictions in Force in the Controlled Area.

- 4.—(a) No animal shall be moved out of the Controlled Area;
- (b) No animals shall be moved without a licence under Article 5-
 - (i) into the Controlled Area; or
 - (ii) along or across any road or other highway or by water within the Controlled Area;
- (c) No animal shall be permitted by the owner or person in charge thereof to stray upon any road or other highway in the Controlled Area;
- (d) No market, sale or exhibition of animals shall be held in the Controlled Area, except a market or sale for fat animals intended for immediate slaughter. A licence must be obtained from the Local Authority to hold any such market or sale, and a Veterinary Inspector of the Local Authority shall attend and examine the animals exposed thereat;
- (e) No slaughterhouse manure or refuse shall be moved out of the Controlled Area or be brought into contact with animals in such

Movement of Animals by Licence into or within the Controlled Area.

- 5. Licences may be granted by an Inspector of a Local Authority for the following movements of animals only:-
 - (a) From premises outside the Prohibited Areas and Controlled Area to a slaughterhouse in the Controlled Area;
 - (b) From a farm in the Controlled Area to a licensed fat stock market or sale in such
 - (c) From a licensed fat stock market or sale in the Controlled Area or from a farm or other premises in the Controlled Area to a slaughterhouse in such Area;
 - (d) From one farm to another in the Controlled Area, or between different parts of the same farm in such Area, if the Inspector considers the movement to be necessary or (These licences may be made expedient. available for movement as often as required if the Inspector endorses the licence "Occupation Licence.")

Conditions of Licences.

- 6.—(a) Licences may be granted only by an Inspector of the Local Authority in whose District the movement commences, except in the case of movement from premises outside the Prohibited and Controlled Areas to a slaughterhouse, in which case the licence shall be granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the slaughterhouse is situate;
- (b) Licences shall not permit movement on any road in any Prohibited Area except as provided in Article 3, or movement out of the Controlled Area in order to reach a destination in the latter Area;
- (c) Occupation Licences may be withdrawn at any time by a notice served by an Inspector of the Local Authority on the person to whom such licence was granted.

- than Occupation (d) Licences, other Licences, must be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest Police Station, or to an officer of the Local Authority, immediately after completion of the movement;
- (e) Licences, other Occupation Licences, shall only be available for four days, including the day of issue, and shall accompany the animals throughout the movement;
- (f) Animals while being moved with a licence under this Order shall be moved as far as practicable by the nearest available route and without avoidable delay to the place of destination specified in the licence, and not elsewhere, and shall be kept separate as far as practicable from all other animals;
- (g) Copies of licences authorising movement into the District of another Local Authority shall be sent by the Inspector issuing such licences to such other Local Authority;
- h) Licences shall be produced by the person in charge of the animals moved therewith on demand to an Inspector or to a Constable, and such person shall if required by such Officer give his name and address.

Movement through Prohibited Areas or Controlled Area by Railway Permitted.

7. This Order shall not prevent the movement of animals direct by railway through any of the Prohibited Areas, or through the Controlled Area, or both, if the animals are not untrucked within any such Areas.

Animals for Slaughter to be Marked.

- 8.—(a) Animals moved to a slaughterhouse in accordance with a licence under this Order shall be detained at such slaughterhouse until they are slaughtered;
- (b) Before movement commences all such animals shall be marked as follows:-

Cattle.—A broad arrow six inches long clipped on the left hindquarter, and the hair clipped off the end of the tail.

Sheep.—A broad arrow clipped on the forehead and a letter M six inches long painted or stamped with red or blue adhesive composition on both sides of each sheep.

Pigs.—Letter M painted or stamped on both sides of the pig with red or blue adhesive composition.

Closing of Footpaths and Premises.

- -(1) An Inspector of the Ministry or of the Local Authority may (notwithstanding the existence of any footpath or right of way) prohibit the entry of any person into any field, shed or other place in any Prohibited Area by giving notice in writing to that effect to the occupier. In such cases the owner of the animals in such places or his agents or servants may enter for the sole purpose of feeding or tending the animals, but no other person shall enter any such place until such notice has been withdrawn by a further notice from an Inspector, unless he has obtained a licence to do so from an Inspector of the Ministry or of the Local Authority.
-) Copies of such notices shall be affixed or exhibited by the Inspector in such manner as he may think desirable for ensuring notification of the restrictions thereby imposed.
- (3) Copies of such notices when served shall be sent to the Ministry.

Control of Dogs and Poultry.

- 10.-(1) An Inspector of the Ministry or of the Local Authority may, by a written notice-served upon the occupier of any premises in the Prohibited Area on which dogs or poultry are kept, require such occupier to keep such dogs or poultry under such control as may be prescribed in the notice, or to confine them toany specified part of the premises.
- (2) Copies of such notices when served areto be sent to the Ministry.

Local Authority to Enforce Order.

11. This Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Offences.

12. Any contravention of this Order or of any notice served thereunder is an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Revocation of Previous Orders.

13. The Middlesex and District (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1922 (No. 3) and the Middlesex and District (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1922 (No. 6) are hereby revoked, but any notice served under those Orders shall continue in force unless and until such notice has been withdrawn.
