## TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS AND TREASURY BONDS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 29th May, 1925, at 1 o'clock, for

(a) Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919; and

(b) £4 per cent. Treasury Bonds, repayable at par on the 15th April, 1933.

2. The maximum amount of Treasury Bills and Treasury Bonds to be issued will be £40,000,000. The amount of Treasury Bonds issued will not exceed £4,000,000 but subject to that limit the total amount issued will be divided between Bills and Bonds in such proportions as Their Lordships may determine.

### TREASURY BILLS.

3. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Tuesday, the 2nd June, 1925, to Saturday, the 6th June, 1925, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

4. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

5. Each tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date

on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

### 4 PER CENT. TREASURY BONDS, 1933.

6. The Bonds will be in denominations of £50, £100, £200, £500, £1,000 and £5,000. They will be exempt from Corporation Profits Tax, and will, as indicated in the Notice of 31st March, 1925, rank *pari passu* with those issued under the Prospectus of the 23rd March, 1923. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Tuesday, the 2nd June, 1925, to Saturday, the 6th June, 1925, inclusive; the first dividend, payable on the 15th October, 1925, will represent in the case of each Bond interest to that date from the date of the Bond.

7. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bonds required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one shilling) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bonds of different dates.

8. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

9. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the

following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills or Bonds are to be dated.

10. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills and Bonds.

11. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

## PUBLIC HEALTH (IMPORTED FOOD) REGULATIONS, 1925.

The Minister of Health hereby gives notice in pursuance of the above-named Regulations that he will recognise from the date of commencement of the Regulations each of the Official Certificates of which particulars are given in the Schedules hereto as evidence that the meat to which it relates has been derived from an animal which was free from disease at the time of slaughter and has been dressed or prepared and packed with all necessary precautions for the prevention of danger to public health.

The recognition is subject to the conditions set out in the headings to the schedules, and where the certificate is in the form of a label the recognition will apply only if the label is securely affixed to the meat or to the package containing the meat, and if the label has not in any other circumstances or on any other occasion been used as an Official Certificate.

## FIRST SCHEDULE.

Certificates recognised for the purposes of items (a) and (c) of the Second Schedule to the Regulations, *i.e.* :—

(a) A severed part of the carcase of a pig (including the severed head and the whole carcase without the head) which has not been salted, cured, pickled, dried or smoked or otherwise prepared, in the manner in which bacon or ham is ordinarily prepared, and from which no submaxillary, pre-scapular, pre-crural, or popliteal gland has been taken out;

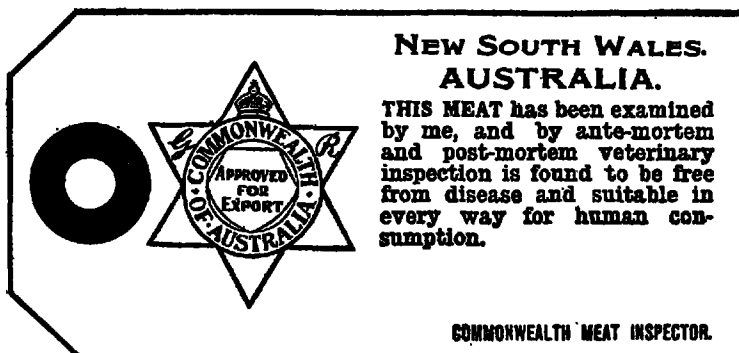
(c) All edible parts of a pig other than (i) the head or other severed parts of the carcase and (ii) the intestines prepared in the form of sausage casings.

FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (INFECTED  
AREAS) ORDER OF 1925 (No. 27).

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1922, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

*Declaration of Infected Areas.*

1. The Areas described in the First Schedule to this Order are hereby declared to be Infected Areas for the purposes of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Order of 1924 (No. 164) hereinafter referred to as the "Principal" Order.

*Revocation of Certain Orders.*

2. The Orders described in the Second Schedule hereto are hereby revoked.

*Commencement.*

3. This Order shall come into operation on the twenty-second day of May, nineteen hundred and twenty-five.

*Short Title.*
