**PROPOSAL TO VARY MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES
FOR CERTAIN CLASSES OF FEMALE WORKERS.**

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour and dated 31st October, 1918, and 1st August, 1922, the Trade Board established in Great Britain under the Trade Boards Acts for certain branches of work in the Rope, Twine and Net Trade as specified in the Trade Boards (Rope, Twine and Net) Order, 1919, as varied by the Trade Boards

(Made-up Textiles) Order, 1920, and by the Trade Boards (Rope, Twine and Net and Drift Nets) Order, 1925, **HEREBY GIVE NOTICE** that they **PROPOSE TO VARY** the General Minimum Time-Rates and Piece-Work Basis Time-Rates for all female workers and the Overtime Rates based thereon and the General Minimum Piece-Rates for female Home-workers for Hand Braiding, Hand Knotting or Hand Baiting Nets made from fibres other than hard fibres and the Overtime Rates for female workers (other than Home-workers) employed on Hand Machine Braiding to whom the General Minimum Piece-Rates fixed by the Trade Board for Hand Machine Braiding are applicable, at present effective and set out in the Schedule to the Trade Board's Notice B. (42) dated 19th November, 1925.

THE LONDON TRAFFIC (RESTRICTED STREETS) REGULATIONS, 1925, AND THE LONDON TRAFFIC (RESTRICTED STREETS) (No. 2) REGULATIONS, 1925.

Whereas by Notice dated the 31st day of October, 1925, published in the London Gazette dated the 3rd day of November, 1925, the Minister of Transport by virtue and in exercise of the powers given to him by Section 7 of the London Traffic Act, 1924, the London Traffic (Restricted Streets) Regulations, 1925, and the London Traffic (Restricted Streets) (No. 2) Regulations, 1925, after consulting the London and Home Counties Traffic Advisory Committee, relaxed the restrictions

and limitations imposed by Regulation 2 of each of the said Regulations upon the occasion of the dismantling of the Wembley Exhibition during the period from the 1st day of November, 1925, to the 1st day of December, 1925, both dates inclusive.

And whereas the Minister proposes further to relax the said restrictions and limitations upon the occasion of the dismantling of the Wembley Exhibition during the period from the 2nd day of December, 1925, to the 31st day of December, 1925, both dates inclusive.

Now therefore notice is hereby given that the Minister of Transport, by virtue and in exercise of the above-mentioned powers, has further relaxed the restrictions and limitations referred to in the above-mentioned Notice so that nothing in the said Regulations shall prevent any person who was maintaining at the date of this Notice a regular service in accordance with the London Traffic Act, 1924, upon Approved Route No. 6 from using on any weekday during the above-mentioned period in any of the streets or parts thereof declared to be "restricted streets" by the London Traffic (Restricted Streets) Order, 1925, and the London Traffic (Restricted Streets) (No. 2) Order, 1925, and forming part of that route, such number of omnibuses in excess of the number which he may use in those streets or parts thereof under the said Regulation 2 as may be necessary to maintain a regular service of omnibuses on that route at intervals of not less than 6 minutes if such excess is due solely to the use of omnibuses by him for the purpose of maintaining a regular service on that route: provided that nothing herein contained shall be deemed to affect or derogate from the powers of the Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis under the provisions of Section 52 of the Metropolitan Police Act, 1839, to give directions to constables for keeping order and for preventing any obstruction of the thoroughfares.
