A PROCLAMATION.

GEORGE R.I.

WHEREAS by the Emergency Powers Act, 1920, it is enacted that if it appears to Us that any action has been taken or is immediately threatened by any persons or body of persons of such a nature and on so extensive a scale as to be calculated, by interfering with the supply and distribution of food, water, fuel or light, or with the means of locomotion, to deprive the community, or any substantial portion of the community, of the essentials of life, We may, by proclamation, declare that a state of emergency exists:

And whereas on the twenty-eighth day of June last, We did, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, declare by proclamation, in pursuance of the said Act, that a state of emergency existed:

And whereas it is enacted by the said Act that no such proclamation shall be in force for more than one month, without prejudice to the issue of another proclamation at or before the end of that period:

And whereas the continued cessation of work in Coal Mines does, in Our opinion, constitute a state of emergency within the meaning of the said Act:

Now, therefore, in pursuance of the said Act, We do, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, hereby declare that a state of emergency exists.

Given at Our Court at *Buckingham Palace* this twenty-sixth day of July, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and twenty-six, and in the seventeenth year of Our Reign.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 24th day of June, 1926, (C.W. 5494/25), in the words following, viz.:—

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas under the provisions of Schedule V, Sections III and VII of Your Majesty's Order in Council bearing date the 22nd day of January, 1920, increments in the scale of full pay, unemployed pay and half pay for Lieutenants, Royal Marines, are granted after certain specified periods from date of entry, but no provision exists for the incremental date to be postponed in the event of

an Officer for any reason being deprived of seniority, and we consider that such provision should exist in the Regulations:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to provide that if a Probationary Second Lieutenant, Probationary Lieutenant or Lieutenant of Your Majesty's Royal Marine Force be for any reason deprived of seniority, the date upon which he is due for increment in full pay, unemployed pay or half pay under the aforesaid Regulations shall be deferred by the amount of time forfeited.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

Now, therefore, His Majesty, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Government of Ireland (Northern Ireland Bar) Order, 1926.

2. References in any enactment to the Bar or to the members of the Bar shall, if and so far as before the appointed day they applied to the Irish Bar and members of the Irish Bar, be construed as including references to the Bar of Northern Ireland and members of that Bar.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 20th day of May, 1926, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Stowmarket and part of the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Stowupland and for the union of the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Creeping Saint Peter with the remaining part of the said Benefice of Stowupland all of which Benefices are situate in the County of Suffolk and in the Diocese of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich:

“ Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Walter Godfrey, Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said Benefice of Stowmarket and part of the said Benefice of Stowupland and also upon the union of the said Benefice of Creeping Saint Peter and the remaining part of the said Benefice of Stowupland duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich and therein recommended the two unions aforesaid and the terms for effecting such unions, and the said Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

“ And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the said two unions based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

“ And whereas the said Benefices of Stowupland and Creeping Saint Peter are now full, the Reverend John Rowland Chapman being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of

Stowupland and the Reverend Claude Emmanuel De la Bere being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Creeping Saint Peter and the said Benefice of Stowmarket is at present vacant:

“ And whereas the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Stowupland now belongs to the Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice of Stowmarket:

“ Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Walter Godfrey, Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

“ 1. That a portion of the said Benefice of Stowupland that is to say the western portion (containing no Parish Church) of the said Benefice and Parish of Stowupland comprising an area of 450 acres or thereabouts and contiguous to the eastern boundary of the Parish of the said Benefice of Stowmarket (all which portion is more particularly set out and delineated upon the map or plan hereto annexed and thereon coloured pink) shall be severed from the said Benefice and Parish of Stowupland, and the portion so severed and the said Benefice of Stowmarket shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of ‘ The Benefice of Stowmarket ’ (hereinafter referred to as the United Benefice of Stowmarket) and one Parish for ecclesiastical purposes and for such other purposes as in the said Measure provided.

“ 2. That the said Benefice of Stowupland after the severance of such portion as aforesaid and the said Benefice of Creeping Saint Peter shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of ‘ The United Benefice of Creeping Saint Peter with Stowupland ’ but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

“ 3. That if upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette both of the said two Benefices of Stowupland and Creeping Saint Peter shall be vacant, the unions shall take effect forthwith; and if one only of the said two Benefices of Stowupland and Creeping Saint Peter shall be then vacant the said union shall also take effect forthwith if the Incumbent of the other of the said two Benefices of Stowupland and Creeping Saint Peter shall consent to become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice of Creeping Saint Peter with Stowupland and if the Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich shall signify in writing his consent thereto, but, if such Incumbent shall not so consent (or if the Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich shall not signify his consent as aforesaid) then the said Union shall take effect upon the next avoidance of his Benefice and the then Incumbent (if any) of the other of the said two Benefices of Stowupland and Creeping Saint Peter shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice of Creeping Saint Peter with Stowupland; and if neither of the said two Benefices of Stowupland and Creeping Saint Peter be then vacant then the said unions shall take effect on the next avoidance of either of the

said two Benefices of Stowupland and Creeting Saint Peter if the Incumbent at that time of the other of the said two Benefices of Stowupland and Creeting Saint Peter shall consent to become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice of Creeting Saint Peter with Stowupland (and if the Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich shall signify in writing his consent thereto) but if he shall not so consent (or if the Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich shall not signify his consent as aforesaid) then the said union shall take effect immediately upon the next vacancy of his Benefice and the then Incumbent (if any) of the other of the said two Benefices of Stowupland and Creeting Saint Peter shall become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice of Creeting Saint Peter with Stowupland. Provided always that the Incumbent (if any), for the time being of the said Benefice of Stowmarket upon the day that the said unions shall take effect shall become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice of Stowmarket.

" 4. That upon the said unions taking effect (a) the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Stowmarket shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice of Stowmarket (b) the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Stowupland shall (pending the provision of a Parsonage House more suitably situated) become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice of Creeting Saint Peter with Stowupland and (c) so soon as conveniently may be the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Creeting Saint Peter and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall be sold and disposed of by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient and that the net proceeds of such sale shall be applied according to the direction of the Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich either for augmenting the endowment of the two United Benefices of Stowmarket and Creeting Saint Peter with Stowupland in equal shares or wholly for the provision of a new Parsonage House for the United Benefice of Creeting Saint Peter with Stowupland.

" 5. That after the said unions have taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice of Creeting Saint Peter with Stowupland from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, the first turn of presentation or nomination to such United Benefice shall belong to and be exercisable by the Patron of the said Benefice of Creeting Saint Peter and that thereafter the right of presentation shall be exercised by the Patrons of the two said Benefices of Creeting Saint Peter and Stowupland alternately the Patron of the said Benefice of Creeting Saint Peter having the first of such alternate presentations to the United Benefice (in addition to the first presentation to the United Benefice hereinbefore recommended and proposed to be assigned to such Patron) and every alternate right of presentation thereafter and the Patron of the said Benefice of Stowupland having the second of such alternate presentations (that is to say the third

presentation to such United Benefice to be made after the union) and every alternate turn thereafter.

" 6. That a Curate at a stipend of £250 per annum be appointed to assist the Incumbent of the United Benefice of Stowmarket in performing the duties of such United Benefice this recommendation and proposal being made to the intent that the Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich shall have the power of requiring the appointment of a Curate in accordance with and subject to the conditions and provisions of Subsection (b) of Section 18 of the said Measure.

" 7. That upon the unions taking effect there shall be transferred and annexed to the United Benefice of Stowmarket a portion namely £80 per annum of the annual payment at present made by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners to the Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice of Stowupland and there shall be transferred and annexed to the United Benefice of Creeting Saint Peter with Stowupland all the other or remaining endowments of the said Benefice of Stowupland.

" Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the same Measure to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923:

And whereas certain objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the same Rules:

And whereas the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners after giving full consideration to such objections have deemed right to make no alterations in such draft Scheme:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas no appeal has been made to His Majesty in Council within the period of one month after the date of the said public notice in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure against the said Scheme or any part thereof by any person who has made objection as aforesaid to the said draft Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme.

and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 20th day of May, 1926, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of two neighbouring Benefices, that is to say the Benefice (being a Rectory) of East Shefford and the Benefice (being a Rectory) of West Shefford, both of which Benefices are situate in the County of Berks and in the Diocese of Oxford:

“ Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the late Right Reverend Hubert Murray, Bishop of Oxford, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of East Shefford and West Shefford duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Oxford and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of Oxford signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

“ And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

“ And whereas the said Benefice of West Shefford is now full, the Reverend Thomas Dewe being the present Incumbent thereof and the said Benefice of East Shefford is at present vacant:

“ Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the Right Reverend Thomas Banks, now Bishop of Oxford (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme) do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

“ 1. That the said Benefice of East Shefford and the said Benefice of West Shefford shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls under the style of ‘ The United Benefice of West with East Shefford ’ and that the Parishes of the said Benefices shall also be united into one Parish

for ecclesiastical purposes and for such other purposes as in the said Measure provided.

“ 2. That the Church of the Parish of West Shefford shall be the Parish Church of the United Parish and that the Table of Fees for the said Parish of West Shefford shall (until revised or altered by proper authority) be the Table of Fees for the United Parish.

“ 3. That if upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette both of the said two Benefices shall be vacant, the union of the same two Benefices shall take effect forthwith; and if one only of the said two Benefices shall be then vacant the said union shall also take effect forthwith if the Incumbent of the other of the said two Benefices shall consent to become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, but, if he shall not so consent then the said union shall take effect upon the next avoidance of his Benefice and the then Incumbent (if any) of the other of the said two Benefices shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice; and if neither of the said two Benefices be then vacant then the said union shall take effect on the next avoidance of either of the said two Benefices if the Incumbent at that time of the other of the said two Benefices shall consent to become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, but if he shall not so consent then the said union shall take effect immediately upon the next vacancy of his Benefice and the then Incumbent (if any) of the other of the said two Benefices shall become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

“ 4. That upon the union taking effect the marriage registers in duplicate current at the Church of East Shefford shall be sent by the Incumbent of the United Benefice to the Registrar General to be closed officially.

“ 5. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of West Shefford shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice and so soon as conveniently may be the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of East Shefford and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall be sold and disposed of by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient and that the net proceeds of such sale as to such a sum as may be agreed between the Bishop of Oxford and us the Ecclesiastical Commissioners shall be appropriated towards the cost of alterations and improvements to the Parsonage House of the United Benefice and any residue of such net proceeds shall constitute and form part of the expenses fund established pursuant to the 32nd Section of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923.

“ 6. That after the said union has taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, that in every series of three successive turns of presentation or nomination to the United Benefice to be made

after the union the Patron of the said Benefice of East Shefford shall have one turn and the Patrons of the said Benefice of West Shefford shall have two turns and if under any of the provisions of Clause 3 of this Scheme an Incumbent of the said Benefice of West Shefford shall become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice then the Patron of the said Benefice of East Shefford shall have the first turn in each series of three turns but if at the time when the union takes effect both of the said Benefices of East Shefford and West Shefford shall be vacant or if under any of the provisions of Clause 3 of this Scheme an Incumbent of the said Benefice of East Shefford shall become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice then the Patron of the said Benefice of East Shefford shall have the second turn in each series of three turns.

“ 7. That upon the union taking effect all the Tithe Rent Charges, Glebe lands and all other the endowments belonging to the United Benefice or which may hereafter belong thereto shall be charged and for ever after be chargeable in favour of the Incumbents for the time being of the three Benefices of Ascot Heath, All Saints; Sandhurst; and Earley, Saint Bartholomew; all in the said Diocese of Oxford with the three annual sums or yearly rentcharges hereinafter mentioned that is to say (a) in favour of the Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice of Ascot Heath, All Saints, a clear annual sum or yearly rent charge equivalent in amount to the gross yearly value of a sum of £109 17s. 10d. Tithe Rent Charge as determined in accordance with the statutory provisions for the time being and from time to time in force for ascertaining the sum payable in respect of Tithe Rent Charge (b) in favour of the Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice of Sandhurst, a clear annual sum or yearly rentcharge equivalent in amount to the gross yearly value of a sum of £109 17s. 10d. Tithe Rent Charge similarly determined and (c) in favour of the Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice of Earley, Saint Bartholomew, a clear annual sum or yearly rentcharge equivalent in amount to the gross yearly value of a sum of £91 11s. 6d. Tithe Rent Charge similarly determined; all the said three annual sums or yearly rentcharges to be paid half yearly as hereinafter provided and so that the amount of the said half yearly instalment of each of the said yearly rentcharges to be paid on each half yearly day hereunder shall be the same or the like amount as would in accordance with the aforesaid statutory provision have become payable in respect of the corresponding sum of Tithe Rent Charge on the last preceding half yearly day for payment of Tithe Rent Charge. The said yearly rentcharges to be as from the date of the union taking effect due and payable to the respective Incumbents in whose favour they are charged and to be apportionable between any outgoing Incumbent of any of the said three Benefices or his representatives on the one hand and his successor in the same Incumbency on the other hand and to be receivable by the Incumbents in whose favour they are charged as aforesaid by half-yearly instal-

ments on the first day of February and the first day of August in every year. And provided also that the whole of the First Fruits and Tenths now or hereafter payable to the Governors of Queen

Anne's Bounty in respect of the said United Benefice shall continue to be payable by the Incumbent of the said United Benefice.

“ Now, therefore, with the consent of the said William, Bishop of Manchester (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that all that part of the said Parish of Prestwich which is described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which part together with the boundaries thereof is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, shall, upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme as aforesaid become and be constituted a separate District for spiritual purposes, and that the same shall be named ‘ The District of Saint Gabriel, Prestwich.’

"And whereas the said Cyril Forster, Bishop of Southwark, acting on behalf of the subscribers of the above mentioned Fund has nominated himself and his successors, Bishops of the said Diocese of Southwark, as the persons to whom it is desired that the whole right of Patronage of the said proposed District or New Parish should be assigned:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Cyril Forster, Bishop of Southwark (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that all those portions of the said New Parish of Upper Tooting and of the said Parish of Tooting Graveney which are described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which portions together with the boundaries thereof are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, shall, upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme as aforesaid, become and be constituted a separate District for spiritual purposes, and that the same shall be named 'The District of Saint Augustine, Tooting.'

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Walter Godfrey, Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Kersey and Lindsey duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

"And whereas both of the said Benefices of Kersey and Lindsey are now full, the Reverend Daniel Kent Ambrose being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Kersey, and the Reverend Frederick Robert Stroud being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Lindsey:

"And whereas only one Parsonage House will be left standing or remaining within or belonging to the United Benefice when the

union which is hereinafter recommended and proposed shall take effect namely the Parsonage House belonging to the said Benefice of Kersey :

“ And whereas the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to each of the said two Benefices of Kersey and Lindsey now belongs to the same Patrons :

“ Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Walter Godfrey, Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme) do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say :—

That if upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette both of the said two Benefices shall be vacant the union of the same two Benefices shall take effect forthwith; and if the said Benefice of Lindsey only shall be then vacant the said union shall also take effect forthwith if the Incumbent of the other of the said two Benefices shall consent to become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, but if he shall not so consent then the said union shall take effect upon the then next avoidance of the said Benefice of Kersey and the then Incumbent of Lindsey shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice; and if the said Benefice of Kersey only shall be then vacant the said union shall take effect upon the next avoidance of the said Benefice of Lindsey; and if neither of the said two Benefices be then vacant, then the said union shall take effect on the next avoidance of the said Benefice of Lindsey if the Incumbent at that time of the said Benefice of Kersey shall have been instituted to Kersey subsequently to the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme or if instituted before that date shall consent to become the Incumbent of the United Benefice; but if he shall have been instituted to Kersey before that date and shall not so consent, then the said union shall take effect immediately upon the next vacancy of the Benefice of Kersey following such avoidance of the Benefice of Lindsey and the then Incumbent of Lindsey shall become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

And whereas no appeal has been made to His Majesty in Council within the period of one month after the date of the said public notice in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure against the said Scheme or any part thereof by any person who has made objection as aforesaid to the said draft Scheme :

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council :

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of his said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme, and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich.

Victoria, Chapter 70, of the Act of the 14th and 15th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 97, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Representation as to the assignment of a Consolidated Chapelry to the consecrated Church of All Saints, Squirrel's Heath, situate within the Parish of Romford, in the County of Essex and in the Diocese of Chelmsford:

"Whereas at certain extremities of the said Parish of Romford, of the Parish of Hornchurch, and of the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of Saint Andrew, Romford, both in the said County and Diocese, which said extremities lie contiguous one to another, and are described in the Schedule hereunder written, there is collected together a population which is situate at a distance from the several churches of such Parishes and New Parish:

"And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that certain contiguous portions (being the portions containing the population aforesaid) of the said Parish of Romford, of the said Parish of Hornchurch and of the said New Parish of Saint Andrew, Romford, should be formed into a Consolidated Chapelry for all Ecclesiastical purposes, and that the same should be assigned to the said Church of All Saints, Squirrel's Heath, situate as aforesaid:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Guy, Bishop of Chelmsford, as such Bishop (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Representation), and with the consent of the Warden and Fellows of Saint Mary College of Winchester in Oxford, commonly called New College in Oxford, as the Patrons of the Incumbency of the said Parish of Romford as well as of the Incumbency of the said Parish of Hornchurch and also as the Patrons of the Vicarage of the said New Parish of Saint Andrew, Romford (in testimony whereof they have affixed their Common or Corporate Seal to this Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly represent, that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all those contiguous portions of the said Parish of Romford, of the said Parish of Hornchurch, and of the said New Parish of Saint Andrew, Romford, which are described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which portions, together with the boundaries thereof, are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be united and formed into one Consolidated Chapelry for the said Church of All Saints, Squirrel's Heath, situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The Consolidated Chapelry of All Saints, Squirrel's Heath.'

"We, therefore, humbly pray that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into Your Royal consideration, and to make such Order in respect thereto as to Your Majesty in Your Royal Wisdom shall seem meet.

"THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The Consolidated Chapelry of All Saints, Squirrel's Heath, comprising:—

"All those contiguous portions of the Parish of Romford, of the Parish of Hornchurch, and

Whereas the Minister of Labour (hereinafter referred to as the Minister) by a Special Order called the Trade Board (Milk Distributive) Order, 1920(a), dated the ninth day of January, 1920, applied the Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and 1918 (b), to the trade specified in the Appendix to the said Special Order;

And whereas it is provided by Sub-section 1 of Section 2 of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, that every Special Order may be varied or revoked by a subsequent Special Order;

"3. For the purposes of this Appendix the expression 'fresh milk' shall include sterilized milk."

4. To incorporate in the Order such of the provisions contained in the Schedule to the Electric Lighting (Clauses) Act, 1899, as are applicable and to apply such provisions to the undertaking authorised by the said Order of 1921 or to be authorised by the Order with such variations and exceptions as may be contained therein.

5. To authorise the Corporation to open, break up, and interfere with all streets, roads and public places, ways, footpaths, bridges, culverts, sewers, drains and gas and water mains and pipes and telegraph and telephone and other wires within the area of supply, and to lay down, erect, maintain, renew, and remove either above or under ground or otherwise, electric lines, conductors, mains, pipes, tubes, wires, posts, street or distributing boxes, meters, apparatus or other works or things required for the purpose of enabling the Corporation to generate, supply, store, convey, transmit or distribute electricity within the added areas, and to confer all such other powers upon the Corporation as may be necessary for effecting the objects of the proposed undertaking.

6. To prescribe the maximum price or maximum prices that may be demanded and taken by the Corporation in respect of the supply of electrical energy within the added areas and to prescribe the minimum prices to be paid by persons supplied with electricity by the Corporation or connected to their electricity undertaking in those areas.

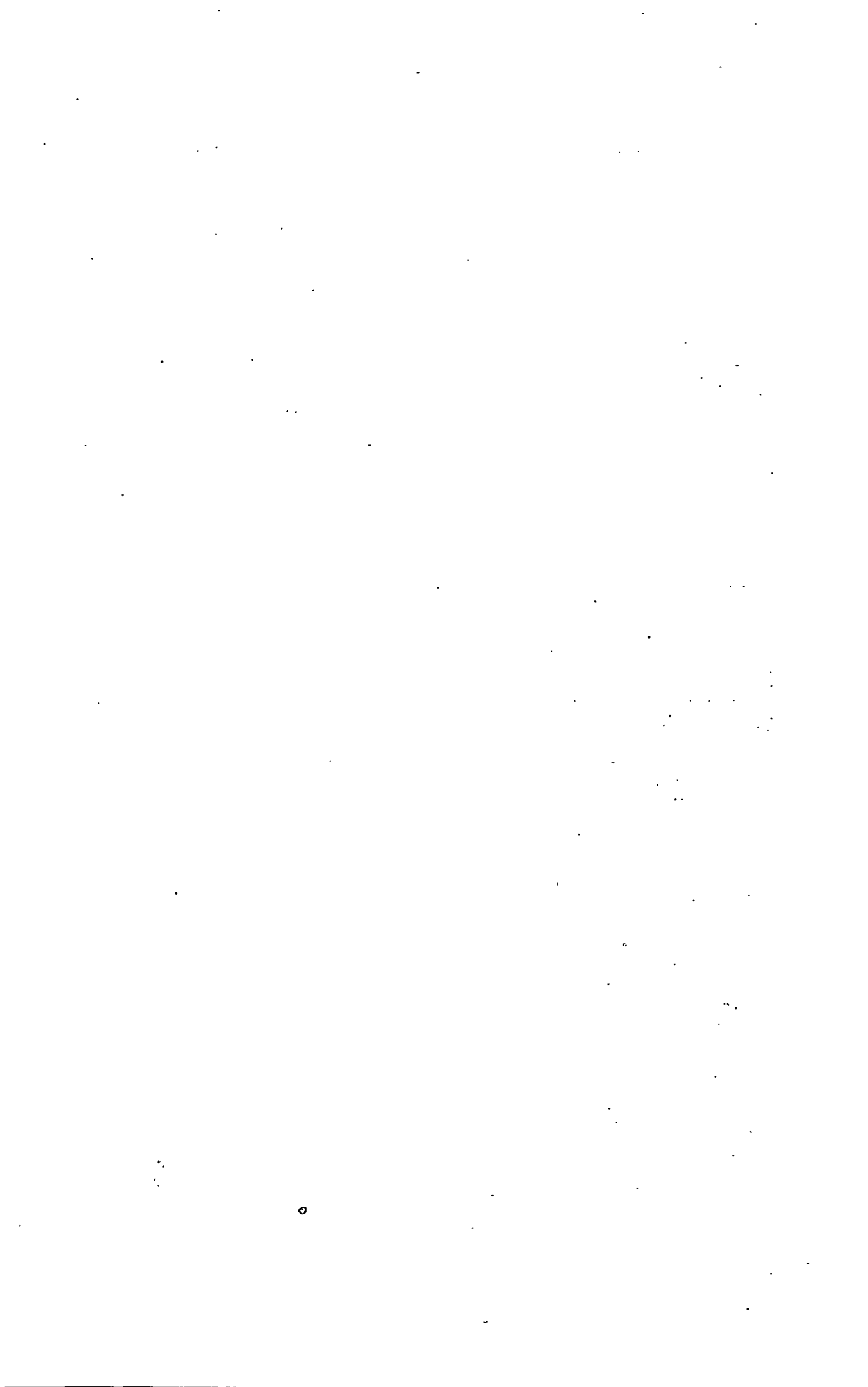
