WE, considering that it is desirable that Tuesday, the Twenty-seventh day of December next, should be observed as a Bank Holiday and as a Public Holiday in England and Wales and in Northern Ireland, and in pursuance of the provisions of The Bank Holidays Act, 1871, and The Holidays Extension Act, 1875, and The Customs Consolidation Act, 1876, Do hereby, by and with the

advice of Our Privy Council, and in exercise of the powers conferred by the Acts aforesaid, appoint Tuesday, the Twenty-seventh day of December next, as a special day to be observed as a Bank Holiday and as a Public Holiday in England and Wales and in Northern Ireland, under and in accordance with the said Acts, and We do, by this Our Royal Proclamation, command the said day to be so observed, and all Our loving subjects to order themselves accordingly.

A PROCLAMATION

DETERMINING NEW DESIGNS FOR CERTAIN SILVER COINS OF THE REALM.

GEORGE R.I.

WHEREAS under section eleven of the Coinage Act, 1870, We have power, with the advice of Our Privy Council, from time to time by proclamation to determine the design for any coin :

And whereas it appears to Us desirable to determine new designs for the silver coins hereinafter specified, being certain of the silver coins mentioned in the First Schedule to the Coinage Act, 1870:

We, therefore, in pursuance of the said enactment and of all other powers enabling Us in that behalf, do hereby, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, proclaim, direct, and ordain as follows:—

1. The designs for the said silver coins shall be as follows:—

(1) *Crown*—Every Crown shall have for the obverse impression Our Effigy with the inscription "GEORGIUS V DEI GRA: BRITT: OMN: REX" and for the reverse the Royal Crown with the date of the year encircled by a wreath composed of the national emblems of the rose, thistle and shamrock, with the inscription "FID. DEF. IND. IMP" together with the word "CROWN." The Coin shall have a graining upon the edge.

(2) *Half-Crown*—Every half-crown shall have the same obverse impression and inscription as the crown, and for the reverse the Ensigns Armorial of the United Kingdom contained in a shield having on each side the initial letter of Our Name in duplicate and interlaced surmounted by the Royal Crown with the inscription "FID. DEF. IND. IMP" together with the words "HALF-CROWN" and the date of the year interspersed with the national emblems of the rose, thistle and shamrock. The Coin shall have a graining upon the edge.

(3) *Florin*—Every florin shall have the same obverse impression and inscription as the crown and for the reverse the initial letter of Our Name in the centre interlaced by four crowned Sceptres in the form of a cross; in the angles the Ensigns Armorial of the United Kingdom contained in four shields, with the inscription "FID. DEF. IND. IMP" together with the words "ONE FLORIN" and the date of the year. The Coin shall have a graining upon the edge.

(4) *Shilling*—Every shilling shall have the same obverse impression and inscription as the crown and for the reverse Our Royal Crest with the inscription "FID. DEF. IND. IMP" together with the words "ONE SHILLING" and the date of the year. The Coin shall have a graining upon the edge.

(5) *Sixpence*—Every sixpence shall have the same obverse impression as the crown with the inscription "GEORGIUS V D.G. BRITT: OMN: REX F.D. IND: IMP:" and for the reverse six acorns growing from interlaced oak branches with the words "SIX PENCE" and the date of the year. The Coin shall have a graining upon the edge.

(6) *Threepence*—Every threepence, not being a coin of the King's Maundy monies, shall have the same obverse impression as the crown, with the inscription "GEORGIUS V D.G. BRITT: OMN: REX F.D. IND: IMP" and for the reverse three acorns growing from interlaced oak twigs, with the words "THREE PENCE" and the date of the year. The Coin shall have a plain edge.

2. The King's Maundy Monies—Every Maundy silver fourpence, threepence, twopence and penny shall have for the obverse impression Our aforesaid effigy, with the inscription "GEORGIUS V D.G. BRITT: OMN: REX F.D. IND: IMP:" and for the reverse the respective figures "4," "3," "2," "1", (according to the denomination or value of the piece) in the centre, with the date of the year placed across the figure, and encircled with an oak wreath surmounted by the Royal Crown. These Coins shall have a plain edge.

3. This Proclamation shall come into force and have effect as from the first day of December, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-seven.

“ And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

“ And whereas the said Benefice of Stanton Long is now full the Reverend Alfred Ernest Ball being the present Incumbent thereof and the said Benefice of Easthope is at present vacant:

“ And whereas the said Alfred Ernest Ball has consented to become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, if and when the union which is hereinafter recommended and proposed shall take effect:

“ Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Martin Linton, Bishop of Hereford (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

“ 1. That the said Benefice of Easthope and the said Benefice of Stanton Long shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls under the style of ‘ The United Benefice of Stanton Long with Easthope ’ but the parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

“ 2. That upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect and the said Alfred Ernest Ball if he is then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Stanton Long shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

“ 3. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Easthope shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice.

“ 4. That after the said union has taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, the right of presentation shall be exercised by the Patrons of the said two Benefices alternately, the Patrons of the said Benefice of Stanton Long having the right upon the first presentation to the United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate right of presentation and the Patron of the said Benefice of Easthope having the right of presentation upon the second presentation to the United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate turn thereafter.

“ Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament.”

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the same Measure to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923:

And whereas certain objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the same Rules:

And whereas the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners after giving full consideration to such objections have altered such draft Scheme:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Hereford has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas an Appeal against the said Scheme was made to His Majesty in Council by J. A. J. Philpott, Esquire, and others, Parishioners and Inhabitants of Stanton Long, and such Appeal was referred to the Judicial Committee of the Privy Council by Order of His Majesty in Council of the 26th day of July, 1926:

And whereas the Lords of the Committee, having taken the said Appeal into consideration, reported to His Majesty in Council as their opinion that the Appeal ought to be dismissed and the said Scheme affirmed:

And whereas His Majesty was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, by Order of the 10th day of August, 1927, to approve the said Report:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme, and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Hereford.

“ Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Bertram, Bishop of Norwich, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Binham and Cockthorpe, duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Norwich and therein recommended the severance from the said Benefice of Blakeney with Cockthorpe of the said Benefice of Cockthorpe and the union of the Benefice of Cockthorpe so severed with the said Benefice of Binham, and the said Bishop of Norwich signified in writing his approval of the said report:

“ And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices which Scheme is based upon the terms recommended in the said Report but with the assent of the said Bishop of Norwich embodies certain modifications thereof:

“ And whereas both of the said Benefices of Binham and Blakeney with Cockthorpe are now full the Reverend Frederic Andrew Hannam being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Binham and the Right Reverend Mowbray Stephen O'Rorke being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Blakeney with Cockthorpe:

“ And whereas only one Parsonage House will be left standing or remaining within or belonging to the United Benefice when the union which is hereinafter recommended and proposed shall take effect namely the Parsonage House belonging to the said Benefice of Binham:

“ Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Bertram, Bishop of Norwich (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

“ 1. That a portion of the said Benefice of Blakeney with Cockthorpe that is to say the Benefice of Cockthorpe shall be severed from the said Benefice of Blakeney with Cockthorpe and that the Benefice of Cockthorpe so severed and the said Benefice of Binham shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Binham and Cockthorpe' but the Parishes of the said Benefices of Binham and Cockthorpe shall continue distinct in all respects.

“ 2. That with the consent of the said Frederic Andrew Hannam (testified by his signing this Scheme) the union shall take effect upon the first vacation of the said Benefice of Blakeney with Cockthorpe which shall happen after the publication in the

London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme.

“ 3. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Binham shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice.

“ 4. That after the said union has taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice of Binham and Cockthorpe from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, the right of presentation shall be exercised by the Patrons of the said two Benefices alternately, the Patron of the said Benefice of Blakeney with Cockthorpe having the right upon the first presentation to the United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate right of presentation and the Patron of the said Benefice of Binham having the right of presentation upon the second presentation to the United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate turn thereafter.

“ 5. That upon the union taking effect there shall be transferred from the said Benefice of Blakeney with Cockthorpe and annexed to the United Benefice of Binham and Cockthorpe all the Tithe Rentcharges commuted at £152 3s. 4d. arising within the said Benefice of Cockthorpe together with all (if any) capital sums of money, stocks, annuities or other property being or representing the proceeds of the sale redemption or other conversion of such Tithe Rentcharges or any portion thereof but no other endowments of or belonging to the said Benefice of Blakeney with Cockthorpe shall be transferred and annexed to the United Benefice of Binham and Cockthorpe.

“ Provided nevertheless that the first fruits, five pounds, and tenths, ten shillings, formerly charged upon the said Benefice of Cockthorpe shall upon the union taking effect become charged upon the United Benefice of Binham and Cockthorpe.

“ Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament.”

And whereas certain objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the times prescribed in the same Rules:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Norwich has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas an Appeal against the said Scheme was made to His Majesty in Council by the Blakeney Parochial Church Council and the Right Reverend Bishop O'Rorke, Incumbent of the United Benefice of Blakeney with Cockthorpe, and such Appeal was referred to the Judicial Committee of the Privy Council by Order of His Majesty in Council of the 25th day of February, 1927:

And whereas the Lords of the Committee, having taken the said Appeal into consideration, reported to His Majesty in Council as their opinion that the Appeal ought to be dismissed and the said Scheme affirmed:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Norwich.

“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, of the Act of the 48th and 49th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, and of the Ecclesiastical Commissioners Measure, 1926, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for augmenting the income of the Archdeaconry of Doncaster, in the Diocese of Sheffield:

“ Whereas it appears to us to be desirable that the income of the said Archdeaconry of Doncaster should be augmented in the manner which is hereinafter recommended and proposed:

“ And whereas the grant hereinafter recommended and proposed, together with any existing grant or grants now payable by us in augmentation of the income of the said Archdeaconry, will not have the effect of raising the annual income provided for such Archdeaconry out of the Common Fund created by the said Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, beyond the sum of £300 and will not raise the whole income of that Archdeaconry, including the income derived from any ecclesiastical office or preferment annexed thereto, beyond the sum of £1000 per annum:

“ Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, with the consent of the Right Reverend Leonard Hedley, Bishop of Sheffield (testified by his having signed and sealed this Scheme), humbly recommend and propose that, subject as is hereinafter mentioned, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, be authorised to pay out of the said Common Fund by equal quarterly payments on the first day of January, the first day of April, the first day of July, and the first day of October, or on such other quarterly days as the payments now made by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, in respect of the income of the said Archdeaconry are usually made in every year, to the Archdeacon of the said Archdeaconry of Doncaster and to his successors in the same Archdeaconry a further yearly sum of £100, such yearly sum to take effect and be calculated as from the 1st day of January, 1927. Provided always that before any payment in respect of the said yearly sum of £100 shall be made by us we shall require to be satisfied that the Archdeacon who applies for the same has during the previous 12 calendar months complied with the conditions as to residence which for the time being are required by law.

“ And we further recommend and propose that procurations, synodals, visitation fees and induction fees or any of these fees or payments shall no longer be receivable by the Archdeacon of the said Archdeaconry, and all such fees or payments shall accordingly cease to be payable to the said Archdeacon.

“ And we further recommend and propose that whenever any Archdeacon who may be entitled to receive the said yearly sum of £100 hereinbefore recommended to be paid to the said Archdeacon of Doncaster shall resign or otherwise avoid his Archdeaconry, such yearly sum shall be apportionable between such Archdeacon or his representatives (as the case may be) and the Archdeacon who shall next be collated to the same Archdeaconry.

“ And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts and Measure, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.”

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Bishopric of Blackburn Measure, 1923, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 28th day of July, 1927, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Bishopric of Blackburn Measure, 1923, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme with respect to the constitution of the Bishopric of Blackburn:

"Whereas by the 9th section of the said Bishopric of Blackburn Measure, 1923, it is enacted that whenever the certificate referred to in the 3rd section of such Measure shall have been given to Your Majesty by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with respect to the Blackburn Bishopric Endowment Fund, we shall lay before Your Majesty in Council a Scheme for all or any of the matters in relation to such new Bishopric which in the said 9th section are mentioned:

"And whereas the said certificate was given by us with respect to the endowment fund of the said Bishopric of Blackburn on the 29th day of July, 1926, and thereupon by an Order of Your Majesty in Council of the 5th day of

November, 1926, made in pursuance of the said Measure and reciting that such certificate had been so given as aforesaid, which Order was published in the London Gazette on the 12th day of November, 1926, and came into operation on the day of the date of such publication, (1) the Bishopric of Blackburn was founded, (2) the Diocese of the said Bishopric was declared to consist (subject to the provisions contained in the 9th section of the said Measure as to the rearrangement of boundaries) of the Archdeaconries of Lancaster and Blackburn (except the Rural Deanery of Rossendale) then in the Diocese of Manchester, (3) the Parish Church of Blackburn in the County of Lancaster (subject to the rights of the Patron and the Incumbent thereof), was declared to be the Cathedral Church of the said Bishopric, and (4) the Bishop of Blackburn was constituted a Body Corporate and was invested with all such rights, privileges and jurisdictions as are possessed by any other Bishop in England and was subjected to the metropolitan jurisdiction of the Archbishop of York:

“ And whereas the Right Reverend Percy Mark, Bishop of Blackburn, the Right Reverend William, Bishop of Manchester, and the Right Reverend George Rodney, Bishop of Wakefield, do (so far as their respective consents are necessary) consent to this Scheme and the several recommendations hereinafter contained in testimony whereof they have respectively hereto set their hands and episcopal seals:

“ Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose as follows, namely:—

“ 1. The Diocese of Blackburn shall consist of the area assigned to it by the said Order in Council of the 5th day of November, 1926, without any alteration of the boundaries thereof.

“ 2. The boundaries of the Diocese of Manchester and of the Diocese of Wakefield shall be re-arranged as follows, that is to say, the Parish of Todmorden and the New Parish of Walsden, both in the Rural Deanery of Rochdale and the Archdeaconry of Rochdale, shall be severed from the Diocese of Manchester and shall be included in and form part of the Diocese of Wakefield.

“ 3. The Bishop of Blackburn for the time being shall, subject to the provisions hereinafter contained, have all such courts and officers and all such jurisdiction as were immediately before the said date of the publication in the London Gazette of the said Order of Your Majesty in Council of the 5th day of November, 1926, possessed by the Bishop of Manchester within the area of the Diocese of Blackburn which was then within the Diocese of Manchester.

“ 4. All parishes, ecclesiastical districts and other cures and places, churches and chapels and all the clergy and others Your Majesty's subjects within the territories which by virtue of the said Order of Your Majesty in Council of the 5th day of November, 1926, or of any Order of Your Majesty in Council confirming this Scheme have been or shall be severed from the Diocese of Manchester and do now constitute the Diocese of Blackburn or shall be included in the said Diocese of Wakefield shall be exempted and released from all

episcopal jurisdiction, authority and control of the Bishop of Manchester and shall be under and subject to the episcopal jurisdiction, authority and control of the Bishop of Blackburn or the Bishop of Wakefield, as the case may be, and of the successors of such Bishop.

“ 5. Until a dean and chapter of and for the cathedral church of the Bishopric of Blackburn shall have been created, the Bishop of Blackburn may as to any and every matter with respect to which the confirmation or other agency of a dean and chapter is by law required for rendering effectual the action of a Bishop, take action in such matter without such confirmation or agency, and his action so taken shall not for want of such confirmation or agency be ineffectual or invalid.

“ 6. During any and every vacancy in the See of Blackburn, whether such vacancy shall happen before or after the creation of a dean and chapter of and for the cathedral church of the Bishopric of Blackburn, the Archbishop of York for the time being shall have the custody and be guardian of the spiritualities of the See of Blackburn.

“ 7. The archidiaconal supervision of all the parishes, ecclesiastical districts and other cures and places comprised within the Diocese of Blackburn, as hereinbefore defined, shall remain vested in and be with and in and be exercised by the Archdeacon of the Archdeaconry of Lancaster and by the Archdeacon of the Archdeaconry of Blackburn respectively and the said archdeacons shall be officers of the Diocese of Blackburn and shall not be subject to the episcopal jurisdiction of the Bishop of Manchester but shall be exclusively subject to the episcopal jurisdiction of the Bishop of Blackburn and the archidiaconal dignities of the said archdeacons shall be transferred from the cathedral church of Manchester to the cathedral church of the Bishopric of Blackburn and all the endowments belonging to the said archdeaconries shall continue to belong to the same notwithstanding the transfer of the said archdeaconries from the Diocese of Manchester to the Diocese of Blackburn.

“ 8. The Rural Deanery of Rossendale, in the said Diocese of Manchester and in the said Archdeaconry of Blackburn, shall be severed from such archdeaconry, and shall be included in the Archdeaconry of Rochdale and shall be subject to the archidiaconal supervision of the Archdeacon of Rochdale, and the Parish of Todmorden and the New Parish of Walsden (hereinbefore recommended to be included in the Diocese of Wakefield) shall be severed from the Rural Deanery of Rochdale and Archdeaconry of Rochdale and shall be included in the Rural Deanery of Halifax and Archdeaconry of Halifax and shall be subject to the archidiaconal supervision of the Archdeacon of Halifax.

“ 9. The patronage of every ecclesiastical dignity or benefice being within the Diocese of Blackburn of which dignity or benefice the patronage or any estate or interest therein is now vested in or belongs to the Bishop of Manchester in right of his See shall, without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than this Scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council confirming the same, be forthwith, to the extent of the estate or interest therein now vested in or belonging to

the Bishop of Manchester as aforesaid, transferred from the said Bishop of Manchester to and shall become and be vested in and shall belong to the Bishop of Blackburn and his successors.

" 10. The patronage of the Benefice of Todmorden and also the alternate patronage of the Benefice of Walsden which are now vested in or exercisable by the Bishop of Manchester in right of his See shall, without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than this Scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council confirming the same, be forthwith, to the extent of the estate or interest therein now vested in or belonging to the Bishop of Manchester as aforesaid, transferred from the said Bishop of Manchester to and shall become and be vested in and exercisable by the Bishop of Wakefield and his successors.

" 11. Every officer (other than the Chancellor of the Diocese, Bishop's Secretary, Registrar of the Diocese and Registrar of the Archdeaconries, all of whom have been or will be appointed to similar offices in the Diocese of Blackburn) who by virtue of an appointment bearing date prior to the 14th day of July, 1924, now holds any office of emolument under the Bishop of Manchester or the dean and chapter of the cathedral church of Manchester or otherwise in and for the Diocese of Manchester and who derived or might have derived any portion of the emoluments of his office from sources arising within parishes or places which by the formation of the Diocese of Blackburn or by virtue of any Order of Your Majesty in Council confirming this Scheme have been or shall be transferred from the Diocese of Manchester to the Diocese of Blackburn or the Diocese of Wakefield shall for the term for which he was so appointed to his office as aforesaid or until his resignation or other avoidance thereof continue within such transferred parishes or places to perform such duties in the same manner (that is to say, either in person or by deputy as may be authorised by the terms of such his appointment) and to receive accordingly such emoluments (upon the scale which may be established or be in force in the Diocese of Blackburn or the Diocese of Wakefield as the case may be in relation to such his office) as an officer of or within the Diocese of Blackburn or the Diocese of Wakefield as the case may be as he has hitherto performed and received as an officer of or within the Diocese of Manchester and (if an officer of the Bishop or Diocese) shall as regards such transferred parishes or places during his tenure of such his office be an officer of the Bishop or Diocese of Blackburn or of the Bishop or Diocese of Wakefield as the case may be.

" 12. Eighteen honorary canonries shall be founded in the said cathedral church of the Bishopric of Blackburn and it shall be lawful for the Bishop of Blackburn to appoint to such honorary canonries spiritual persons to whom the provisions of the 23rd section of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, in relation to the holders of honorary canonries founded thereunder shall be applicable save that so long as there shall be no dean and chapter of the said cathedral church it shall be lawful for the Bishop of Blackburn of his own sole authority

and without the consent of any dean and chapter to make regulations respecting the honorary canons so appointed, provided always that any honorary canons in the cathedral church of Manchester who upon the foundation of the Bishopric of Blackburn were holding benefices in that part of the Diocese of Manchester which is now included in the Diocese of Blackburn and who by writing under their respective hands duly registered or recorded as the Bishop of Blackburn shall direct, shall consent to such transfer, shall (notwithstanding anything in the last mentioned Act and section contained) be transferred to and become honorary canons in the said cathedral church of the Bishopric of Blackburn and shall, thereupon, that is to say, as to each of them upon his appointment as such honorary canon in the cathedral church of the Bishopric of Blackburn, cease, ipso facto, to be an honorary canon in the cathedral church of Manchester.

" 13. All terriers, tithe apportionments, maps, plans and other documents relating exclusively to any parish or parishes, ecclesiastical districts, or other cures or places situate within the Diocese of Blackburn as hereinbefore defined or otherwise relating exclusively to the said Diocese or relating exclusively to the Parish of Todmorden and the New Parish of Walsden hereinbefore recommended to be included in the Diocese of Wakefield, shall subject to the provisions hereinbefore contained, be transferred from the custody of the registrar or other officer of the Diocese of Manchester or of the Bishop of such diocese, and shall become and be in the custody of the registrar or other officer or officers of the diocese or of the Bishop of the Diocese of Blackburn or of the Bishop of the Diocese of Wakefield as the case may be. And as to all documents which may remain in their present custody although relating to or affecting the Bishopric of Blackburn or any parish, ecclesiastical district, cure or place now situate in the Diocese of Blackburn as hereinbefore defined, or the said Parish of Todmorden and the said New Parish of Walsden, the registrar or other officer of the Diocese of Blackburn or of the Diocese of Wakefield shall be at liberty at all convenient times to inspect such documents and take copies therefrom as freely as the registrar or other officer in whose custody such documents may so remain.

" 14. Of the annual income which has been provided for the Bishopric of Blackburn under the said Bishopric of Blackburn Measure the sum of £1,500 shall be payable to and receivable by the Bishop of the said Bishopric as the personal stipend of the Bishop and the remainder shall be payable to and receivable by the Bishop by way of provision for or towards expenses falling upon the Bishop in connection with the episcopal administration of the Diocese."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the respective Registrars of the said Dioceses of Blackburn, Manchester and Wakefield.

“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for effecting the unions (1) of the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Garton in Holderness and the Benefice of Hilston (being part of the United Benefice of Tunstall in Holderness with Hilston) and (2) of the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Roos with the Benefice of Tunstall in Holderness (being part of the said United Benefice of Tunstall in Holderness with Hilston) all of which Benefices are situate in the County of York and in the Diocese of York:

“ Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Cosmo Gordon, Archbishop of York, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report (*inter alia*) upon the rearrangement by way of unions of the said Benefices of Garton in Holderness, Tunstall in Holderness, Hilston and Roos duly made their Report to the said Archbishop of York and therein recommended the unions (1) of the said two Benefices of Garton in Holderness and Hilston, and (2) of the said two Benefices of Roos and Tunstall in Holderness and the terms for effecting such unions, and the said Archbishop of York signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

“ And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the said unions based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

“ And whereas the said Benefice of Roos is now full the Reverend Harold Salisbury Glover being the present Incumbent thereof and the said Benefice of Garton in Holderness and the said United Benefice of Tunstall in Holderness with Hilston are at present vacant:

“ And whereas the said Harold Salisbury Glover has consented to become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice of Roos with Tunstall if and when the unions which are hereinafter recommended and proposed shall take effect:

“ Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Cosmo Gordon, Archbishop of York (in testimony whereof he has signed this

Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

“ 1. That the said Benefice of Garton in Holderness and a part of the said United Benefice of Tunstall in Holderness with Hilston that is to say the said Benefice of Hilston shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of ‘The United Benefice of Garton with Grimston and Hilston’ but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

“ 2. That the remaining portion of the said United Benefice of Tunstall in Holderness with Hilston, that is to say, the said Benefice of Tunstall in Holderness and the said Benefice of Roos, shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of ‘The United Benefice of Roos with Tunstall’ but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

“ 3. That upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette the unions shall forthwith take effect and the said Harold Salisbury Glover if he is then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Roos shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice of Roos with Tunstall.

“ 4. That upon the said unions taking effect (a) the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Garton in Holderness shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice of Garton with Grimston and Hilston; (b) the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Roos shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice of Roos with Tunstall; and (c) so soon as conveniently may be the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said United Benefice of Tunstall in Holderness with Hilston and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall be sold and disposed of by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient and that the net proceeds of such sale shall be held and invested by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, for the benefit of the United Benefice of Roos with Tunstall.

“ 5. That after the said unions have taken effect (a) the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice of Garton with Grimston and Hilston from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, the right of presentation shall be exercised by the Patron of the said Benefice of Garton in Holderness and by the Patrons of the said United Benefice of Tunstall in Holderness with Hilston alternately, the Patron of the said Benefice of Garton in Holderness having the right upon the first presentation to the United Benefice of Garton with Grimston and Hilston to be made after the union and every alternate right of presentation and the Patrons of the said United Benefice of Tunstall in Holderness with Hilston having the right of presentation upon the second presentation to the United Benefice of Garton with Grimston and Hilston to be made

after the union and every alternate turn thereafter in the same order of turns as between themselves as they are now entitled to present to the said United Benefice of Tunstall in Holderness with Hilston; and (b) the Patronage of the United Benefice of Roos with Tunstall shall belong wholly to the Patrons of the said Benefice of Roos.

"6. That upon the unions taking effect the permanent endowments of the said United Benefice of Tunstall in Holderness with Hilston shall be divided and annexed as follows, that is to say, a portion of the permanent endowments now belonging to the said United Benefice of Tunstall in Holderness with Hilston, namely, an annual sum of £60 being part of a larger annual sum now payable by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, to the Incumbent for the time being of the said United Benefice of Tunstall in Holderness with Hilston, shall be transferred and annexed to, and be and become payable by us to the Incumbent of, the United Benefice of Roos with Tunstall, and all other the permanent endowments now belonging to the said United Benefice of Tunstall in Holderness with Hilston shall be transferred and annexed to the United Benefice of Garton with Grimston and Hilston.

"Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the same Measure to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923:

And whereas certain objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the same Rules:

And whereas the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners after giving full consideration to such objections have deemed right to make no alteration in such draft Scheme:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Archbishop of York has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas no appeal has been made to His Majesty in Council within the period of one month after the date of the said public notice in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure against the said Scheme or any part thereof by any person who has made objection as aforesaid to the said draft Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased

hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme, and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of York.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Benefice of Church Minshull and the Benefice of Leighton with Minshull Vernon, both of which Benefices are situate in the County of Chester and in the Diocese of Chester:

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Henry Luke, Bishop of Chester, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Church Minshull and Leighton with Minshull Vernon duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Chester and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of Chester signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

"And whereas both of the said Benefices of Church Minshull and Leighton with Minshull Vernon are now full, the Reverend Herbert Henry Corsbie being the present Incumbent thereof:

"And whereas the said Herbert Henry Corsbie has consented to become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, if and when the union which is hereinafter recommended and proposed shall take effect:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Henry Luke, Bishop of Chester (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), do humbly recommend and pro-

pose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

“ 1. That the said Benefice of Church Minshull and the said Benefice of Leighton with Minshull Vernon shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of ‘ The United Benefice of Church Minshull with Leighton and Minshull Vernon ’ but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

“ 2. That upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect and the said Herbert Henry Corsbie if he is then Incumbent of the said Benefices of Church Minshull and Leighton with Minshull Vernon shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

“ 3. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Leighton with Minshull Vernon shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice and so soon as conveniently may be the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Church Minshull and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall be sold and disposed of by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient and that the net proceeds of such sale shall be held and invested by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, for the benefit of the United Benefice.

“ 4. That after the said union has taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, the right of presentation shall be exercised by the Patrons of the said two Benefices alternately, the Patron of the said Benefice of Leighton with Minshull Vernon having the right upon the first presentation to the United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate right of presentation and the Patron of the said Benefice of Church Minshull having the right of presentation upon the second presentation to the United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate turn thereafter.

“ Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measure relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament.”

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the same Measure to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923:

And whereas certain objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the same Rules:

And whereas the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners after giving full consideration to such objections have deemed right to alter such draft Scheme:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Chester has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas no appeal has been made to His Majesty in Council within the period of one month after the date of the said public notice in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure against the said Scheme or any part thereof by any person who has made objection as aforesaid to the said draft Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

“ Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Bertram, Bishop of Norwich, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Booton and Brandiston duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Norwich and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of Norwich signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

“ And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

“ And whereas the said Benefice of Booton is now full, the Reverend Frank Arthur Haylock being the present Incumbent thereof and the said Benefice of Brandiston is at present vacant:

“ And whereas the said Frank Arthur Haylock has consented to become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, if and when the union which is hereinafter recommended and proposed shall take effect:

“ And whereas only one Parsonage House will be left standing or remaining within or belonging to the United Benefice when the union which is hereinafter recommended and proposed shall take effect namely the Parsonage House belonging to the said Benefice of Booton:

“ Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Bertram, Bishop of Norwich (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

“ 1. That the said Benefice of Booton and the said Benefice of Brandiston shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of ‘ The United Benefice of Booton with Brandiston ’ and that such United Benefice shall be included in and form part of the Rural Deanery of Sparham, but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

“ 2. That upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect and the said Frank Arthur Haylock if he is then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Booton shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

“ 3. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Booton shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice.

“ 4. That after the said union has taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, the right of presentation shall be exercised by the Patrons of the said two Benefices alternately, the Patrons of the said Benefice of Brandiston having the right upon the first presentation to the United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate right of presentation and the Patron of the said Benefice of Booton having the right of presentation upon the second presentation to the United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate turn thereafter.

“ 5. That upon the union taking effect all the Tithe Rent Charge, Glebe lands and all other the endowments belonging to the said United Benefice of Booton with Brandiston or which may hereafter belong to the same United Benefice shall be charged and for ever after be chargeable with a clear annual sum or yearly rentcharge of £85 in favour of the Incumbent for the time being of the United Benefice of Felthorpe with Haveringland situate in the said County of Norfolk and in the said Diocese of Norwich, such annual sum or yearly rentcharge to be, as from the date of the said union taking effect, due and payable to the Incumbent in whose favour it is charged; and the annual sum or yearly rentcharge to be apportionable between any outgoing Incumbent of the said United Benefice of Felthorpe with Haveringland or his representatives on the one hand and his successor in the same Incumbency on the other hand, and to be receivable by the Incumbent in whose favour it is charged as aforesaid by equal half-yearly payments on the first day of June and the first day of December in every year and for the recovery of the said yearly rentcharge the Incumbent of the said United Benefice of Felthorpe with Haveringland shall have and be entitled to all the powers and remedies provided by Sections 121 and 122 of the Law of Property Act, 1925, in respect of rentcharges to which those Sections apply. Provided always that if at any time the Incumbent for the time being of the said United Benefice of Booton with Brandiston shall by any Deed duly executed by him under his hand and seal in accordance with the provisions of any Statute in that behalf enabling him, grant, convey and annex to the said United Benefice of Felthorpe with Haveringland any part or parts of the endowments belonging to the said United Benefice of Booton with Brandiston which shall in the opinion of the Bishop of Norwich for the time being be a just and fair equivalent or not less than an equivalent for the yearly rentcharge hereby created as aforesaid then such yearly rentcharge shall thereupon and thenceforth cease and be no longer payable.

“ Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament.”

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Norwich has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas no appeal has been proceeded with to His Majesty in Council in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure against the said Scheme or any part thereof by any person who has made objection as aforesaid to the said draft Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Norwich.

“ Whereas the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Randall Thomas, now Archbishop of Canterbury, is desirous that certain improvements should be made at the said Archbishop's Residence known as Lambeth Palace, and has submitted to us the particulars of such improvements and we have specified our general approval of the same:

“ And whereas the said Archbishop is also desirous and it appears to us to be expedient that towards the cost of effecting the aforesaid improvements a sum of £300 (being a sum which, together with the outstanding balance of the sum already borrowed upon the same security under the authority of the statutes hereinbefore mentioned, does not exceed two years' income of the See) should be provided by his borrowing the same by way of mortgage upon the security of all and every part of the lands tenements and hereditaments endowments or emoluments which now belong or may hereafter belong to the Archbishopric of Canterbury:

“ Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Randall Thomas, Archbishop of Canterbury (testified by his having affixed his signature and Archbishop's Seal to this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that the said Archbishop be authorised to borrow from the Governors of the Bounty of Queen Anne, and that the said Governors be empowered to lend under the provisions of the above mentioned Acts any sum not exceeding £300 and that as a security for the same the said Archbishop do mortgage all and every part of the lands tenements and hereditaments and endowments or emoluments which now belong or may hereafter belong to his said See to the said Governors by Deed for a term of fifteen years or until the said sum of £300 with interest for the same as hereinafter mentioned, and all costs and charges which may attend the recovery thereof, shall be fully paid and satisfied and that such principal sum shall be repaid with interest in the manner following, that is to say, during and in respect of the first period of 12 months of the said term computed from the day of the date of the mortgage, no part of the said principal sum shall be repayable but the said Archbishop or his successors shall yearly at the end of the second period of 12 months so computed and at the end of every such like period of 12 months thereafter, pay to the said Governors their successors or assigns, one twelfth part of the said principal sum of £300 until the whole thereof shall be repaid, and shall also at the end of the first and each succeeding period of 12 months, computed as aforesaid, pay interest at the rate of £4 per centum per annum on the said principal sum or on so much thereof as shall from time to time remain unpaid; and that if and when it shall happen that either the principal or the interest directed to be paid as hereinbefore mentioned shall be in arrear and unpaid for

the space of 40 days after the same shall have become due it shall and may be lawful for the said Governors their successors and assigns to recover the same and the costs and charges attending the recovery thereof by distress and sale in the like manner as rents may be recovered by landlords or lessors from their tenants by the laws in force at the time of such distress and sale; And that such mortgage deed shall be in the form and to the effect to be approved by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, and shall bind as well the said Randall Thomas, now Archbishop of Canterbury, as every succeeding Archbishop of Canterbury until the principal money and interest costs and charges shall have been paid off and discharged.

"And we further recommend and propose that the said sum of £300 so to be borrowed as aforesaid shall be paid to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, that the said Governors and their successors shall not be bound or required to see to the application thereof, and that upon the receipt of the said sum so to be borrowed as aforesaid the whole or any part or parts thereof shall be applied by us at such time or times and in such manner as shall appear to us to be expedient towards effecting the said proposed improvements at the Archbishop's Residence known as Lambeth Palace aforesaid.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in conformity with the provisions of the herein named Acts, or of either of them, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

His Majesty the KING has been graciously pleased to confer the Decoration of the Albert Medal upon Frank Hopkins of Newport, Monmouthshire.

The following is an account of the services in respect of which the Decoration has been conferred:—

On the night of the 18th August, 1927, the s.s. "Cambrian Baroness" was lying ready to

sail in South Lock at Newport, Mon., with a space of two or three feet between her side and the quay wall. At the last moment a fireman returning to the ship began to climb the pilot ladder but lost his hold and fell into the lock between the vessel and the wall of the lock. The ladder was lowered to the water and the man caught hold of it, but as the ladder was being hauled up his hold gave way and he fell back into the lock.

Among the bystanders on the quay was an unemployed seaman, Frank Hopkins. Seeing the accident Hopkins went down the ladder to the water level fifteen feet below. By the light of an electric torch from the ships' deck he caught hold of the fireman, who was now unconscious, and began to carry him up the ladder. The fireman was a dead weight and Hopkins progress was necessarily slow. As he was struggling up the ladder the vessel began to move towards the quay wall and someone shouted to Hopkins to let the man go and save himself. Hopkins replied "I have got him now and will bring him up." As soon as the fireman was within reach of men standing on the quay they hauled him into safety; Hopkins had barely managed himself to get up to the quay when the vessel closed with the wall. If he had been a few seconds later there is no doubt that he and the man he rescued would have been crushed to death.

Hopkins could have made sure of his own safety if he had given up his hold of the fireman. He knew quite well the risk he was running and knowing it saved the man.

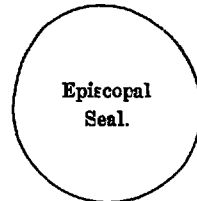
