WHEREAS by Section 48 of the Patents and Designs Acts, 1907 to 1928 (7 Edw. 7, c. 29; 4 & 5 Geo. 5, c. 18; 9 & 10 Geo. 5, c. 80; and 18 Geo. 5, c. 3), it is provided that His Majesty may by Order in Council apply the said Section to vessels, aircraft and land vehicles of a part of His Majesty's dominions outside the United Kingdom in like manner as to vessels, aircraft and land vehicles of a foreign state and that the said Section shall apply only to vessels, aircraft and land vehicles of a foreign state with respect to which His Majesty, by Order in Council, declares that the laws thereof confer corresponding rights with respect to the use of inventions in vessels, aircraft and land vehicles of the United Kingdom when coming into the foreign state or the territorial waters thereof:

And whereas by Section 91 of the said Acts, it is provided *inter alia* that where it is made to appear to His Majesty that the legislature of any British possession has made satis-

factory provision for the protection of inventions, designs or trade marks, patented or registered in this country, it shall be lawful for His Majesty, by Order in Council, to apply the provisions of the said Section to that Possession, with such variations or additions, if any, as may be stated in the Order:

And whereas the laws of Trinidad and Tobago confer rights with respect to the use of inventions in vessels, aircraft and land vehicles of the United Kingdom when coming into Trinidad and Tobago or the territorial waters thereof corresponding to those mentioned in Section 48 of the said Patents and Designs Acts, 1907 to 1928:

And whereas it is made to appear to His Majesty that the legislature of Trinidad and Tobago has made satisfactory provision for the protection of inventions, designs and trade marks, patented or registered in the United Kingdom:

And whereas by Order in Council dated the 12th day of August, 1907 (S.R. & O. 1907 (No. 652), p. 777), His late Majesty King Edward VII was pleased to declare that the provisions of Section 103 of the Patents, Designs and Trade Marks Act, 1883, should apply to Trinidad and Tobago, and it is expedient on the making of this Order that the said Order should be revoked:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, in exercise of the powers conferred upon Him in manner hereinbefore recited and of all others powers in that behalf, by and with the advice of His

Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. The provisions of Section 48 of the Patents and Designs Acts, 1907 to 1928, shall apply to vessels, aircraft and land vehicles of Trinidad and Tobago in like manner as they would apply to vessels, aircraft and land vehicles of a foreign state with respect to which an Order in Council had been made under sub-section (2) of that Section.

2. The provisions of Section 91 of the Patents and Designs Acts, 1907 to 1928, shall apply to Trinidad and Tobago.

3. The Order in Council dated the 12th August, 1907, relating to Trinidad and Tobago (S.R. & O. 1907 (No. 652), p. 777), is hereby revoked.

4. This Order may be cited as the Patents, Designs and Trade Marks (Trinidad and Tobago) Order, 1929.

And whereas at The Hague on the 6th November, 1925, His Majesty and the heads of certain foreign states having deemed it expedient to make certain modifications in and additions to the International Convention of the 20th March, 1883, for the creation of an International Union for the Protection of Industrial Property, as revised at Brussels on the 14th December, 1900, and at Washington on the 2nd June, 1911, agreed upon a Convention (Treaty Series, No. 16 (1928)) comprising the said International Convention as revised at Brussels and at Washington with the said modifications and additions, the ratification of which Convention was duly effected by Great Britain and certain other foreign states:

And whereas Brazil has acceded to the said Convention:

And whereas by reason of the accession to the said Convention of Brazil the laws thereof confer rights with respect to the use of inventions in vessels, aircraft and land vehicles of the United Kingdom when coming into Brazil or the territorial waters thereof, corresponding to those mentioned in the said Section 48:

And whereas the said Convention is an

arrangement of the nature contemplated by the said Section 91:

And whereas by Order in Council dated the 26th June, 1884 (S.R. & O. Rev. 1904, IX, Patents, &c. p. 5); Her late Majesty Queen Victoria was pleased to declare that the provisions of Section 103 of the Patents, Designs and Trade Marks Act, 1883 (46-7 V., c. 57), should apply to Brazil and certain other foreign countries, and it is expedient, on the making of this Order, that the said Order, in so far as it applies to Brazil, should be revoked:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, in exercise of the powers conferred upon Him in manner hereinbefore recited and of all other powers in that behalf, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to declare, and it is hereby declared, as follows:—

1. The laws of Brazil confer rights with respect to the use of inventions in vessels, aircraft and land vehicles of the United Kingdom when coming into Brazil or the territorial waters thereof, corresponding to those mentioned in Section 48 of the Patents and Designs Acts, 1907 to 1928.

2. The provisions of Section 91 of the Patents and Designs Acts, 1907 to 1928, shall be applicable to Brazil.

3. The Order in Council dated the 26th June, 1884, in so far as it relates to Brazil is hereby revoked.

4. This Order may be cited as The Industrial Property Convention (Brazil) Order, 1929.

that towards the cost of effecting the aforesaid improvements a sum of £300 (being a sum which together with the outstanding balance of the sum already borrowed upon the same security under the authority of the statutes hereinbefore mentioned, does not exceed two years' income of the See) should be provided by his borrowing the same by way of mortgage upon the security of all and every part of the lands, tenements and hereditaments, endowments or emoluments which now belong or may hereafter belong to the Bishopric of Truro:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Walter, Bishop of Truro (testified by his having affixed his signature and Episcopal Seal to this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that the said Bishop be authorised to borrow from the Governors of the Bounty of Queen Anne, and that the said Governors be empowered to lend under the provisions of the above mentioned Acts any sum not exceeding £300 and that as a security for the same the said Bishop do mortgage all and every part of the lands, tenements and hereditaments and endowments or emoluments which now belong or may hereafter belong to his said See to the said Governors by Deed for a term of 15 years or until the said sum of £300 with interest for the same as hereinafter mentioned, and all costs and charges which may attend the recovery thereof, shall be fully paid and satisfied and that such principal sum shall be repaid with interest in the manner following, that is to say, during and in respect of the first period of 12 months of the said term computed from the day of the date of the mortgage, no part of the said principal sum shall be repayable but the said Bishop or his successors shall yearly at the end of the second period of 12 months so computed and at the end of every such like period of 12 months thereafter, pay to the said Governors their successors or assigns one twelfth part of the said principal sum of £300 until the whole thereof shall be repaid, and shall also at the end of the first and each succeeding period of 12 months, computed as aforesaid, pay interest at the rate of £4 per centum per annum on the said principal sum or on so much thereof as shall from time to time remain unpaid. And that if and when it shall happen that either the principal or the interest directed to be paid as hereinbefore mentioned shall be in arrear and unpaid for the space of 40 days after the same shall have become due it shall and may be lawful for the said Governors their successors and assigns to recover the same and the costs and charges attending the recovery thereof by distress and sale in the like manner as rents may be recovered by landlords or lessors from their tenants by the laws in force at the time of such distress and sale. And that such mortgage deed shall be in the form and to the effect to be approved by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, and shall bind as well the said Walter, now Bishop of the said Diocese of Truro, as every succeeding Bishop of the same Diocese, until the principal money and interest costs and charges shall have been paid off and discharged.

"And we further recommend and propose that the said sum of £300 so to be borrowed as

aforesaid shall be paid to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, that the said Governors and their successors shall not be bound or required to see to the application thereof, and that upon the receipt of the said sum so to be borrowed as aforesaid the whole or any part or parts thereof shall be applied by us at such time or times and in such manner as shall appear to us to be expedient towards effecting the said proposed improvements at the Episcopal House of Residence aforesaid.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Osborne situate in the County of Dorset and in the Diocese of Salisbury, and the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Poyntington, situate in the said County of Dorset and in the Diocese of Bath and Wells:

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend St. Clair George Alfred, Bishop of Salisbury, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Osborne and Poyntington duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Salisbury and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of Salisbury signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas the Right Reverend St. John Basil Wynne, Bishop of Bath and Wells, has

also signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

"And whereas both of the said Benefices of Osborne and Poyntington are now full, the Reverend Arthur Heywood Tredennick being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Osborne and the Reverend Arthur Henry Bell being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Poyntington:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said St. Clair George Alfred, Bishop of Salisbury (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), and with the consent of the said St. John Basil Wynne, Bishop of Bath and Wells (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That the said Benefice of Osborne and the said Benefice of Poyntington shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Osborne with Poyntington' and that such United Benefice shall be included in and form part of the Diocese of Salisbury of the Archdeaconry of Sherborne and of the Rural Deanery of Sherborne but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

"2. That if upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette both of the said two Benefices shall be vacant, the union of the same two Benefices shall take effect forthwith, and if the said Benefice of Poyntington only shall be then vacant the said union shall also take effect forthwith if the Incumbent of the other of the said two Benefices shall consent to become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, but if he shall not so consent, then the said union shall take effect upon the then next avoidance of the said Benefice of Osborne and the then Incumbent of Poyntington shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, and if the said Benefice of Osborne only shall be then vacant the said union shall take effect upon the next avoidance of the said Benefice of Poyntington and if neither of the said two Benefices be then vacant, then the said union shall take effect on the next avoidance of the said Benefice of Poyntington if the Incumbent at that time of the said Benefice of Osborne shall have been instituted to Osborne subsequently to the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme or if instituted before that date shall consent to become the Incumbent of the United Benefice, but if he shall have been instituted to the said Benefice of Osborne before that date and shall not so consent, then the said union shall take effect immediately upon the next vacancy of the said Benefice of Osborne following such avoidance of the said Benefice of Poyntington and the then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Poyntington shall become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"3. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Osborne shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice and so soon as conveniently may be the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Poyntington and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall be sold and disposed of by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient and that the net proceeds of such sale shall be held and invested by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for the benefit of the United Benefice.

"4. That after the said union has taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, the right of presentation shall be exercised by the Patrons of the said two Benefices alternately, the Patrons of the said Benefice of Poyntington having the right upon the first presentation to the United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate right of presentation and the Patron of the said Benefice of Osborne having the right of presentation upon the second presentation to the United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate turn thereafter.

"Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the same Measure to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923:

And whereas the prescribed time has elapsed and no such objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishops of Salisbury and Bath and Wells has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after

the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the respective Registrars of the said Dioceses of Salisbury and Bath and Wells.

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend William Shuckburgh, Bishop of Lincoln, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Little Ponton and Stroxtun duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Lincoln and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of Lincoln signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

"And whereas both of the said Benefices of Little Ponton and Stroxtun are now full, the Reverend Robert John Anderson being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Little Ponton and the Reverend Sumner Colpoys Wood being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Stroxtun:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said William Shuckburgh, Bishop of Lincoln (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That the said Benefice of Little Ponton and the said Benefice of Stroxtun shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Little Ponton with Stroxtun' but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

“ Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Muriel Agnes, Countess De La Warr (in testimony whereof she has signed and sealed this Scheme), and with the consent of the said Arthur Foley, Bishop of London (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme and sealed the same with his Episcopal Seal), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England,

humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Little Stanmore (otherwise Whitchurch) now vested in her, the said Muriel Agnes, Countess De La Warr, as aforesaid, shall be transferred to the said Arthur Foley, Bishop of London, and his successors in the same Bishopric, and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Arthur Foley, Bishop of London, and by his successors in the same Bishopric for ever.

“ And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.”

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of London.

to the consecrated Church of Saint Ethelburga, Saint Leonards on Sea, situate in the Parish of Saint Leonards on Sea, in the County of Sussex and in the Diocese of Chichester:

"Whereas it appears to us to be expedient that a District Chapelry should be assigned to the said Church of Saint Ethelburga, Saint Leonards on Sea situate as aforesaid:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend George Kennedy Allen, Bishop of Chichester (testified by his having signed and sealed this Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all that part of the said Parish of Saint Leonards on Sea, together with the contiguous territory called or known as the Extra Parochial Place of Saint Mary Bulverhythe, in the said County and Diocese which is described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is with the said extra parochial territory delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be assigned as a District Chapelry to the said Church of Saint Ethelburga, Saint Leonards on Sea, situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The District Chapelry of Saint Ethelburga, Saint Leonards on Sea.'

"And with the like consent of the said George Kennedy Allen, Bishop of Chichester (testified as aforesaid), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, further represent, that it appears to us to be expedient that banns of matrimony should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials should be solemnized or performed at the said Church of Saint Ethelburga, Saint Leonards on Sea, situate as aforesaid, and that the fees or dues to be received in respect of the publication of banns and of the solemnization or performance of marriages, churchings and burials should be paid and belong to the minister of the same church for the time being.

"We, therefore, humbly pray that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into Your Royal consideration and to make such Order with respect thereto as to Your Majesty, in Your Royal wisdom, shall seem meet.

"THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The District Chapelry of Saint Ethelburga, Saint Leonards on Sea, comprising:—

"I. All that part of the Parish of Saint Leonards on Sea, in the County of Sussex, and in the Diocese of Chichester, which is bounded upon all sides as follows, that is to say, upon the south by the Sea, upon the west partly by the Extra Parochial Place called or known as Saint Mary Bulverhythe, and partly by the Parish of Hollington, both in the said County and Diocese, upon the north and upon the north east by the said Parish of Hollington, upon part of the east by the Parish of Upper Saint Leonards, in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining part of the east by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said Parish of Upper Saint Leonards, from the said Parish of Saint Leonards on Sea at a point in the road called West Hill opposite to the wall or fence which divides the house and premises

known as Eversfield Hospital from the house and premises known as Number 117 West Hill, and extending thence southward to and along the said wall or fence for a distance of 5 chains or thereabouts to the point where it meets the wall or fence forming the northern boundary of the houses and premises situate on the northern side of the road called Grosvenor Crescent and extending thence eastward along the last mentioned wall or fence for a distance of 10 yards or thereabouts to the point where it meets the wall or fence forming the eastern boundary of the house and premises known as Number 1 Grosvenor Crescent, and extending thence southward along such wall or fence for a distance of 1½ chains or thereabouts to its southern end on the northern side of Grosvenor Crescent, and extending thence in a straight line due south (thereby crossing Grosvenor Crescent and the West Marina Gardens) to the Sea.

The Governing Body of Shrewsbury School having, in virtue of the powers conferred upon them by the Public Schools Act, 1868, and of every other power enabling them in that behalf, made a Scheme which was sealed on the 21st day of December, 1929, in the terms appended hereto for further amending and

altering the original Scheme (approved by Order in Council of the 12th day of February, 1876), for the removal of the said School from its former site, the said Scheme is hereby published in the London Gazette in accordance with the provisions in that behalf contained in the said Act.

And notice is hereby given, that any person, body of persons, or body corporate, authorised in that behalf by the said Act, may, within two months after the publication of this notification, petition His Majesty in Council to withhold His approval from the whole or any part of the said Scheme.

SCHEME FOR FURTHER AMENDING AND ALTERING THE SCHEME APPROVED BY ORDER IN COUNCIL OF THE 12TH DAY OF FEBRUARY, 1876, FOR THE REMOVAL OF SHREWSBURY SCHOOL FROM ITS ACTUAL SITE.

Whereas by the Public Schools Act, 1868, 31 and 32 Vict., Cap. 118, it is (among other things) enacted as follows:—

Section 25. Any Scheme authorised to be made under this Act may contain all powers and provisions that may be thought expedient for carrying into effect its objects; and where any Scheme authorises the purchase or acquisition of any lands, there shall be deemed to be incorporated with such Scheme "The Lands Clauses Consolidation Act, 1845," with the exception of the provisions relating to the purchase of lands otherwise than by agreement, and of the provisions relating to entry upon land, to intersected lands, and to the recovery of forfeitures, penalties, and costs, and of the provisions relating to access to the special Act.

By Section 26 it is provided (among other things) that the new Governing Body of Shrewsbury School may, if they deem it expedient, at any time after the passing of the Act lay a Scheme before Her Majesty in Council for the removal of the School from its actual site to some other place, and may provide in such Scheme for the sale or mortgage of any property belonging to or held in trust for such School, and for its appropriation to building or other purposes, and for the purchase of other property, and for the erection of new buildings on the property so purchased, and generally for all matters required to effect such removal in a convenient manner to the same extent as if such Governing Body were the absolute owners of any property they might be dealing with under this section as purchasers, vendors, or otherwise:

And whereas divers other Acts of Parliament have since been passed continuing and enlarging the powers conferred by the above mentioned Act, and in particular it was by the 2nd Section of the Public Schools Act, 1869, enacted that "Any Governing Body established for any of the Schools to which the said Act (meaning the said Public Schools Act, 1868) applies shall, as in the case of Westminster School, be a Body Corporate with perpetual succession and a Common Seal and with power to hold lands for the purposes of the School for which it is established without licence of mortmain":

And whereas in pursuance of a Scheme proposed by the Governing Body of Shrewsbury School (hereinafter called "the Governing

Body") on the twenty-first day of August, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-five, for the removal of Shrewsbury School (hereinafter called "the Original Scheme"), which Scheme was duly approved and sanctioned by Her late Majesty Queen Victoria in Council on the twelfth day of February, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-six, the Governing Body acquired by purchase the messuages, buildings and land situate at Kingsland, near Shrewsbury, delineated upon the plan annexed hereto and therein coloured pink for the purposes of Shrewsbury School aforesaid (hereinafter called the School), which was removed to the new site accordingly:

And whereas in the years 1890 and 1891 the Governing Body acquired by purchase divers other lands (which are adjacent to the said lands coloured pink on the said plan and are thereon coloured pale green) for the purposes of the School, and such purchase and the purchase of other land subsequently acquired which is coloured pale blue on the said plan, were sanctioned by an Amending Scheme proposed by the Governing Body on the twenty-fifth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-two, which Scheme was duly approved and sanctioned by an Order of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria in Council dated the twenty-eighth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-two:

And whereas in the year one thousand nine hundred and twelve the Governing Body acquired the freehold land delineated and coloured yellow on the said plan and the leasehold land delineated and coloured dark blue thereon for the purposes of the School, and such purchases were sanctioned by another Amending Scheme proposed by the Governing Body on the eighteenth day of January, one thousand nine hundred and twelve, which Scheme was duly approved and sanctioned by an Order of His Majesty King George V in Council dated the fourteenth day of May, one thousand nine hundred and twelve:

And whereas in the year one thousand nine hundred and twenty the Governing Body acquired by purchase the freehold messuage land and hereditaments delineated on the said plan and therein coloured orange for the purposes of the School, and in the year one thousand nine hundred and seventeen the Governing Body acquired the leasehold land delineated on the said plan and therein coloured brown for the purposes of the School, and the said purchases were sanctioned by a further Amending Scheme proposed by the Governing Body on the twenty-first day of April, one thousand nine hundred and twenty, which Amending Scheme was duly approved and sanctioned by an Order of His Majesty King George V in Council dated the twenty-second day of July, one thousand nine hundred and twenty:

And whereas in the year one thousand nine hundred and twenty-one the Governing Body acquired by purchase the freehold messuages land and hereditaments delineated and coloured mauve on the said plan for the purposes of the School in consideration of an annual rentcharge of three hundred pounds for twenty years, and at or about the same time the Governing Body acquired the leasehold hereditaments delineated on the said plan and

therein coloured magenta for the purposes of the School, and the said purchases were sanctioned by a further Amending Scheme proposed by the Governing Body on the eighth day of August, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-one, which Amending Scheme was duly approved and sanctioned by an Order of His Majesty King George V in Council dated the thirty-first day of October, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-one:

And whereas in the year one thousand nine hundred and twenty-four the Governing Body acquired by purchase the freehold messuages lands and hereditaments delineated on the said plan and therein coloured dark green for the purposes of the School, and the said purchase was sanctioned by a further Amending Scheme proposed by the Governing Body on the eleventh day of April, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-four, which Scheme was duly approved and sanctioned by an Order of His Majesty King George V in Council dated the twenty-fifth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-four:

And whereas all of the said purchases were greatly for the benefit of the School, and were rendered necessary chiefly by the increase of the number of boys attending the School:

And whereas it has now become very desirable to provide further Playing Fields for the boys attending the School, and further accommodation for boarders attending the same, under the following circumstances:—

(1) For some years past owing to the increasing number of Boarders attending the School it has been necessary for the Governing Body to license for the reception of Boarders what are called "Waiting Houses," that is, houses occupied by Assistant Masters at the School who are authorised to take for a time Boarders for whom room cannot immediately be found in one of the ordinary Boarding Houses. If another ordinary Boarding House to accommodate forty-five boys were provided, the need for "Waiting Houses" would be greatly decreased, and it might even be possible to dispense with them altogether. "Kingsland House" (hereinafter mentioned) is most conveniently situated for such a Boarding House, and owing to improvements recently made by the Vendor thereof (hereinafter mentioned) could be converted into a full sized Boarding House for forty-five boys at a cost of not more than three thousand pounds or thereabouts;

(2) "Kingsland Grove" (hereinafter mentioned) is a smaller house than "Kingsland House," and if the Headmaster should ever while he continues to be Headmaster give up taking Boarders, Kingsland Grove would be a very convenient residence for him in lieu of the School House, which is a double-sized Boarding House. Further, "Kingsland Grove" is so situated that it would probably be to the advantage of the School to retain it;

(3) For the purpose of Playing Fields further accommodation is needed in view of the increased number of boys attending the School;

(4) Further, the property comprised in the Agreement hereinafter recited (which includes "Kingsland House" and "Kingsland Grove" and is hereinafter called "the

Kingsland House Property") is required to round off the existing property of the School and the opportunity of purchasing it should not be lost, lest it should be developed as a building estate, which would be almost certain to happen in the course of the next few years if it were not purchased for the purposes of the School as for some time past Shrewsbury has been spreading on the northern and western sides of the School, and the County Council of Shropshire are considering the advisability of constructing a by-pass road along the outskirts of Shrewsbury which would, if the proposed route is adopted, pass along the Roman Road which skirts the Kingsland House Property:

And whereas under the circumstances aforesaid by an Agreement dated the fourteenth day of August One thousand nine hundred and twenty-nine the Governing Body have agreed with Marion Wallace Cock of Kingsland House aforesaid Widow (conditionally on the sanction of His Majesty in Council being obtained to the Scheme) to purchase, and the said Marion Wallace Cock has agreed to sell, the Kingsland House Property (being the property described in the Schedule hereto and delineated on the plan hereto annexed and therein coloured sienna) for the sum of Sixteen thousand pounds, the said purchase to be completed on the Twenty-fourth day of June one thousand nine hundred and thirty-one:

And whereas the purchase of the Kingsland House Property from the said Marion Wallace Cock is very desirable in the interests of the School for the reasons hereinbefore appearing, and also because, unless such property is acquired now, it may not be possible to acquire it or any part of it at a later date:

And whereas it is apprehended that the Governing Body have not power under the Original Scheme or the said Amending Schemes to acquire the Kingsland House Property described in the said Schedule hereto:

The Governing Body of Shrewsbury School do hereby propose by virtue of and in pursuance of the powers hereinbefore mentioned to alter the Original Scheme as follows (that is to say):—

That the Original Scheme shall throughout be read and construed as though the messuages buildings land and hereditaments described in the said Schedule hereto and delineated on the plan annexed hereto and therein coloured sienna had been described in the Schedule to the Original Scheme and delineated on the plan thereto annexed and therein coloured as last aforesaid, And that the said Agreement of the fourteenth day of August One thousand nine hundred and twenty-nine and the carrying into effect thereof may be deemed to have been authorised by the Original Scheme.

THE SCHEDULE hereinbefore referred to.

All that messuage or dwellinghouse situate at Kingsland in the Parish of Meole Brace near the Town of Shrewsbury aforesaid together with the Courtyard gardens pleasure grounds stables Coach-houses outbuildings and offices thereunto belonging and together with the several pieces or parcels of land adjoining thereto and usually occupied therewith all which premises are commonly called by the

REGULATIONS RESPECTING COMPETITIVE EXAMINATIONS FOR APPOINTMENTS IN THE FOREIGN OFFICE AND DIPLOMATIC SERVICE.

1. Candidates will be required to appear before a Board of Selection which will meet

at the Office of the Civil Service Commission on the first Tuesday in May, and will decide which Candidates possess suitable qualifications for entry into the Foreign Office or Diplomatic Service in order to enable them to compete at the examination prescribed below. Candidates may appear before this Board of Selection at any time after they have attained the age of nineteen; but a Candidate who is not recommended for acceptance by the Board of Selection may not appear before that Board for interview a second time unless he is specifically notified after his first appearance that the Board will be prepared to see him again.

2. Candidates must have attained the age of 22 and must not have attained the age of 25 on the first day of August in the year in which the Examination is held.

3. Candidates must be natural-born British subjects and born within the United Kingdom or in one of the self-governing Dominions of parents also born within those territories, except when the circumstances are such as to justify a departure from the general rule, in which case they can be allowed to compete by special permission of the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, provided they fulfil the conditions of the rule in respect of nationality prescribed for Candidates for admission to His Majesty's Civil Service as a whole, viz.:—

“Candidates must be natural-born British subjects and the sons of fathers also natural-born British subjects; provided that exception may be made:—

(a) In the case of Candidates serving in a civil situation to which they were admitted with the certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners.

(b) In the case of natural-born British subjects who served in His Majesty's Armed Forces in the Great War between 4th August, 1914, and 11th November, 1918.

(c) In the case of natural-born British subjects who have satisfactorily completed a period of not less than five years' service on full pay in His Majesty's Regular Forces.

Provided also that if the Civil Service Commissioners are satisfied, in the case of any Candidate who is a British subject but does not fulfil all the requirements of the rule as to nationality and descent, that the Candidate is so closely connected by ancestry and upbringing with His Majesty's dominions that an exception may properly be made to that rule, they may accept such Candidate as eligible provided that this discretion shall not be exercisable unless (a) the father or the paternal grandfather of the Candidate was a natural-born British subject, and (b) neither the father nor the paternal grandfather had acquired any other nationality by naturalization or by any other voluntary and formal act.”

4. No person actually serving in the Army, Navy or Air Force will be eligible for admission to the Examination unless he produces to the Civil Service Commissioners, when called upon to do so, the permission of his Commanding Officer to attend the Examination, dated before the commencement of the competition, and given in accordance with such orders as may from time to time be issued.

Persons holding situations in the Civil Service must obtain the permission of the authorities of their Department to attend the Examination before the commencement of the competition.

Persons upon whose training for the occupation of teacher public money has been spent cannot be appointed until the consent of the appropriate education authority has been notified to the Civil Service Commissioners.

5. Candidates must satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners as to their health and character.
