The Home Secretary gives notice that in pursuance of Section 2 (1) of the Employment of Women, Young Persons and Children Act, 1920, he has made an Order authorising the employment on two day-shifts, of women of 18 years of age and over in the Knitting and Winding Departments at the Junior Street Factory of Messrs. Toone and Wells, Church Gate, Leicester, subject to the conditions that a worker shall not be employed in the afternoon shift in consecutive weeks and that suitable accommodation for clothing put off during working hours and messroom accommodation shall be provided.
