At the Court at *Buckingham Palace*, the 27th day of *November*, 1930.

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 22nd day of November, 1930 (C.W. 6600/30), in the words following, viz. :—

“Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, inter alia, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council :

“And whereas Your Majesty was graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council bearing date the 25th day of June, 1925, to approve regulations for the grant of pensions and gratuities to the widows, and of allowances to the children and other dependent relatives of Officers of Your Majesty's Naval and Marine Forces and Coastguard Service :

“And whereas under Clause 5 (g) of the Schedule to Your Majesty's aforesaid Order in

Council, the widows and children of Officers of Your Majesty's Marine Force who withdraw or retire with a gratuity only, on or after the 25th day of June, 1925, are not eligible for pension or allowances at the ordinary rates, and we consider that this restriction should apply also to the widows and children of such Officers who retired or withdrew with gratuities only before that date and are not in receipt of retired pay at the date of death :

“We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to provide that the widows and children of Officers of Your Majesty's Marine Force who retired with gratuities only before the 25th day of June, 1925, and are not in receipt of retired pay at the date of death, shall not be eligible for pensions and allowances at the ordinary rates.

“The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal.”

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS it is, among other things, provided by subsection (1) of section eighteen of the Finance Act, 1923, as extended by section thirty-one of the Finance Act, 1924, that if His Majesty in Council is pleased to declare—

(a) that any profits or gains arising from the business of shipping which are chargeable to British Income Tax are also chargeable to Income Tax payable under the law in force in any British Dominion; and

(b) that arrangements, as specified in the declaration, have been made with the Government of that British Dominion with a view to the granting of relief in cases where such profits and gains are chargeable both to British Income Tax and to the Income Tax payable in the British Dominion;

then, unless and until the declaration is revoked by His Majesty in Council, the arrangements specified therein shall, so far as they relate to the relief to be granted from British Income Tax, have effect as if enacted in the Finance Act, 1923, but only if and so long as the arrangements, so far as they relate to the relief to be granted from the Income Tax payable in the British Dominion, have the effect of law in the British Dominion:

And whereas the Agreement set out in the Schedule to this Declaration has been made between His Majesty's Government in the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and His Majesty's Government in Canada:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to declare, and it is hereby declared—

(a) that certain profits or gains arising from the business of shipping which are chargeable to British Income Tax are also chargeable to the Income Tax payable under the law in force in the Dominion of Canada; and

(b) that the arrangements contained in the said Agreement have been made with a view to the granting of relief in cases where profits or gains arising from the business of shipping are chargeable both to British Income Tax and to the Income Tax payable in the Dominion of Canada.

And His Majesty is further pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that this Declaration may be cited as "The Relief from Double Income Tax on Shipping Profits (Canada) Declaration, 1930."

SCHEDULE.

AGREEMENT BETWEEN HIS MAJESTY'S GOVERNMENT IN THE UNITED KINGDOM OF GREAT BRITAIN AND NORTHERN IRELAND AND HIS MAJESTY'S GOVERNMENT IN CANADA.

His Majesty's Government in the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and His Majesty's Government in Canada, being desirous of concluding an agree-

ment for the reciprocal exemption from Income Tax in certain cases of profits accruing from the business of shipping, have agreed as follows:—

Article 1.

His Majesty's Government in the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland agree to take the necessary steps under Section 18 of the Act of Parliament of the United Kingdom known as the Finance Act, 1923, and Section 31 of the Act of Parliament of the United Kingdom known as the Finance Act, 1924, for exempting from Income Tax chargeable in the United Kingdom for the year of assessment 1929-30, commencing on the 6th day of April, 1929, and for every subsequent year of assessment, any profits which accrue from the business of shipping carried on by an individual resident in Canada and not resident in the United Kingdom or by a company managing and controlling such business in Canada.

Article 2.

His Majesty's Government in Canada agree to take the necessary steps under paragraph (m) of Section 4 of the Income War Tax Act (Revised Statutes, 1927, Chapter 97), of the Parliament of Canada for exempting from Income Tax chargeable in the Dominion in respect of the income of the year 1929, or of fiscal periods ending in that year, and of each year thereafter, any profits which accrue from the business of shipping carried on by an individual resident in the United Kingdom and not resident in Canada, or by a company managing and controlling such business in the United Kingdom.

Article 3.

The expression "the business of shipping" means the business carried on by an owner of ships, and for the purpose of this definition the expression "owner" includes any charterer.

Article 4.

This Agreement shall cease to have effect if and so soon as either the relief to be granted under Article 1 hereof in respect of income tax in the United Kingdom, or the relief to be granted under Article 2 hereof in respect of income tax in Canada ceases to have legal operation or upon the expiration of twelve months after either His Majesty's Government in the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland or His Majesty's Government in Canada shall have given to the other notice of its intention to rescind this Agreement.

MERCHANDISE MARKS ACT, 1926.

In accordance with the provisions of Section 2, Sub-section (4) of the Merchandise Marks Act, 1926, the Board of Trade give notice that in pursuance of applications received by them for the making of Orders in Council to require imported goods of certain classes and descriptions to bear an indication of origin, they have made a reference to the Standing Committee appointed by them under the Act in respect of the following classes and descriptions of imported goods:—

(1) Polishing wheels, discs and bobs made wholly or mainly of felt;

(2) Slider fasteners of the type commonly known as Zip or Lightning Fasteners, i.e., consisting of two flexible stringers comprising a series of metal members which are progressively locked or unlocked by the action of a slider.

Attention is called to the fact that, while, under the provisions of the above Act, the Committee must in every case referred to them

consider whether the goods should bear an indication of origin at the time of sale or exposure for sale, they may also at their discretion consider and report upon the question whether such goods should bear an indication of origin at the time of importation.

ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 5TH DECEMBER, 1930.)

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1927, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Authorisation of Landing of a Pedigree Bull from Canada.

1. The landing of the animal described in the First Schedule hereto is hereby allowed under the Importation of Pedigree Animals Act, 1925, and subject to the provisions of Part II (Quarantine) of the Third Schedule to the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894, and Part VI (Animals intended to be landed at an Imported Animals Quarantine Station) of the Animals (Importation) Order of 1930 herein-after referred to as the "Principal" Order, and of this Order.

Definition of Quarantine Station.

2. The premises described in the Second Schedule hereto are hereby defined as an Imported Animals Quarantine Station for the purpose of the landing and detention of the animal under this Order.

Regulations Applicable to the Animal before and on Landing.

3.—(1) The animal shall not be landed in Great Britain unless and until there are delivered to a proper officer of Customs and Excise the certificates and declarations prescribed by this Article, namely:—

(a) a certificate signed by a duly authorised officer of the Dominion of Canada to the effect that at the time of the shipment of the animal both the bull and also the whole of the Dominion were free from foot-and-mouth disease, contagious pleuro-pneumonia and cattle-plague;

(b) a certificate signed by a duly qualified veterinary officer of the Dominion of Canada to the effect that the animal was, within one month prior to the date of shipment, tested with tuberculin, and did not react. This certificate shall be accompanied by the temperature chart in respect of the animal;

(c) a certificate signed by the Secretary of the Canadian Guernsey Breeders' Association or by some person authorised to act on his behalf, to the effect that the said animal was at the time of shipment from the Dominion duly registered as a pedigree bull in the Canadian Guernsey Herd Book; particulars of the number, name and identification marks of the animal as registered in the Canadian Guernsey Herd Book shall be inserted in the certificate;

(d) a statutory declaration from the shipper that the fodder and litter accompanying the animal are products of the Dominion of Canada;

(e) a statutory declaration from the Master of the Vessel in which the animal is carried to Great Britain that during the whole of the voyage from Canada no other cattle, sheep, goats, other ruminating animals or swine have been carried on the vessel; that no other fodder or litter for the use of the animal on the vessel has been shipped during the voyage to Great Britain at any port or place outside the Dominion of Canada, and that whilst the said animal was on board, the vessel did not enter a port in a prohibited country for the purposes of the Principal Order.

(2) The animal, before being landed, shall be examined by a Veterinary Inspector of the Ministry, and if found by him to be free from symptoms of disease, shall forthwith be landed and moved in a float, cart, van, or other available vehicle under the supervision of the Inspector from the place of landing to the Imported Animals Quarantine Station described in the Second Schedule hereto; the said vehicle shall be cleansed and disinfected before and after such use in the manner prescribed by the Inspector.

(3) The animal shall be detained and isolated in the said Quarantine station in accordance with the provisions of the Principal Order for a period of at least ten hours after landing and when moved therefrom the animal shall be accompanied by the certificate and licence required by Article 40 (8) of the Principal Order.

(4) The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries may, if he thinks fit, cause the tuberculin or any other test to be applied to the animal landed under this Order.
