WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 10th day of March, 1931 (G.H.), in the words following, viz:—

"Whereas by Section 20 of the Greenwich Hospital Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that the Admiralty shall from time to time continue or appoint such officers, clerks and servants for the purposes of the Hospital and Schools as seem fit, and may (subject to the approval of Your Majesty in Council) fix the salaries of such officers and clerks:

"And whereas by Section 8 of the Greenwich Hospital Act, 1872, it is enacted that the provisions of Section 20 of the Greenwich Hospital Act, 1865, so far as the same relate to salaries, shall extend to pensions and pecuniary benefits of any kind:

"And whereas Mr. H. E. Sharpe, a former Assistant Master in the Royal Hospital School, Greenwich, is eligible for the award of a superannuation allowance from the funds of Greenwich Hospital in respect of his service at Greenwich from 1st March, 1887, to 27th April, 1889:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by

Your Order in Council to sanction the payment from the funds of Greenwich Hospital to Mr. H. E. Sharpe of a Superannuation Allowance (Lump sum) of twenty-seven pounds and four shillings (£27 4s.)."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

eighth day of July, nineteen hundred and twenty-four—

(a) in pursuance of an agreement for arbitration to which the protocol set out in the Schedule to the Arbitration Clauses (Protocol) Act, 1924, applies; and

(b) between persons of whom one is subject to the jurisdiction of some one of such Powers as His Majesty, being satisfied that reciprocal provisions have been made, may by Order in Council declare to be parties to the said Convention, and of whom the other is subject to the jurisdiction of some other of the Powers aforesaid; and

(c) in one of such territories as His Majesty, being satisfied that reciprocal provisions have been made, may by Order in Council declare to be territories to which the said Convention applies:

And whereas His Majesty is satisfied that reciprocal provisions have been made as afore-

said by the Foreign Powers set out in the first column of the Schedule to this Order and as respects the territories belonging to such Powers set out in the second column of that Schedule:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon Him by the said Act and of all other powers enabling Him in that behalf, is pleased to declare, and it is hereby declared, as follows:—

1. The Powers set out in the first column of the Schedule to this Order are parties to the said Convention.

2. The territories set out in the second column of the said Schedule are territories to which the said Convention applies.

3. This Order may be cited as the Arbitration (Foreign Awards) No. 1 Order, 1931, and shall come into force on the 7th day of April, 1931.

And whereas it was further declared that the expression "Native Reserves" should mean the lands set apart by the said Order (and described in the Schedule thereto) for the sole and exclusive use of the Natives of Northern Rhodesia and any lands which might thereafter be constituted Native Reserves by any Order in Council amending or adding to the said Order:

And whereas by an Order in Council bearing date the 29th day of January, 1929, and known as the Northern Rhodesia (Native Reserves) Supplemental Order in Council, 1929, the Schedule to the said Northern Rhodesia (Crown Lands and Native Reserves) Order in Council 1928, was amended by the

addition thereto of the several Native Reserves set out in the Schedule to the said Northern Rhodesia (Native Reserves) Supplemental Order in Council, 1929:

And whereas by an Order in Council bearing date the 15th day of August, 1929, and known as the Northern Rhodesia (Native Reserves) Amendment Order in Council, 1929, the said Northern Rhodesia (Native Reserves) Supplemental Order in Council, 1929, and the Schedule thereto were amended:

And whereas it is expedient further to amend the said Schedule to the said Northern Rhodesia (Native Reserves) Supplemental Order in Council, 1929:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers by the Foreign Jurisdiction Act, 1890, or otherwise in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Northern Rhodesia (Native Reserves) Amendment Order in Council, 1931.

2. The Schedule to the Northern Rhodesia (Native Reserves) Supplemental Order in Council, 1929, as amended by the Northern Rhodesia (Native Reserves) Amendment Order in Council, 1929, is hereby further amended as follows:—

(a) The description of the Tonga (Magoye) Reserve (Reserve XI) is cancelled

and the following description substituted therefor:—

XI.—TONGA: (MAGOYE) RESERVE.

Boundaries:—

Commencing at the most easterly beacon of Farm No. 108a, the boundary passes in a south-easterly direction till it reaches the Lusito River, thence down the Lusito River to its nearest point to the North Kariba Coal Syndicate area, thence a straight line to the north-east corner beacon of that Syndicate's area, thence along the northern border of that area to the north-west corner thereof, thence a straight line in a westerly direction to Chilala Hill, thence a straight line in a south-westerly direction to Mabwituba Hill, thence a straight line due south to Nakasonsa Hill, thence a straight line south-east to the Zambezi River at a point where the Inyubwe Stream flows into it, thence in a south-westerly direction up the Zambezi River to the junction with the Cheziya Stream, thence up the Cheziya Stream for about 12 miles to a point where the stream turns westwards, thence a straight line north-west to Chisingwe Hill, thence a straight line in a westerly direction to the north-east corner beacon of Hay and Tarr's farm No. 500, thence along the east and north-west boundaries of that farm to the north-east corner beacon of Farm No. 501, thence along the northern boundary of that farm to its north-west corner beacon, thence a straight line in a north-westerly direction to the north-east corner beacon of the Railway Farm on the Magoye River, thence down the Magoye River to a point due west of the north-west corner beacon of Farm No. 273a, thence in a straight line to that beacon, thence along the southern boundaries of this farm, to the most southern beacon of Farm No. 9a, thence along the eastern boundaries of that farm back to the Magoye River, thence down the Magoye River to the north-east corner beacon of Farm No. 268a, thence along the northern boundary of that farm to the railway strip, thence northwards along the railway strip to the south-west corner beacon of Farm No. 628, thence along the southern boundaries of that farm and Farm No. 627 to the south-west corner beacon of Farm No. 511, thence along the southern boundary of that farm to the Magoye River, thence down the Magoye River to the north-east corner beacon of Farm No. 533, thence in a south-easterly direction for a distance of $5\frac{1}{2}$ miles, thence due east for a distance of 2 miles, thence due north for a distance of 3 miles, thence in a north-westerly direction to the junction of Mambwe-a-weneni stream with the Nawachindo stream, thence down the Nawachindo stream to the Magoye River, thence down the Magoye River to the south-west corner beacon of Farm No. 581, thence along the south-east boundary of that farm to its most easterly beacon, thence a straight line to the south-west corner

beacon of Farm No. 214a and along the south-east boundary of that farm to the Ngwezi River, thence up the Ngwezi River to the south-east corner beacon of Farm No. 655, thence along the eastern boundary of that farm to Farm No. 172a, thence along the southern and eastern boundaries of that farm to the north-east corner beacon thereof, thence a straight line to the south-east corner beacon of Farm No. 542, thence along the eastern boundaries of Farms Nos. 542, 253a, and 493a to the Lusito River, thence down the Lusito River in an easterly direction to the south-east corner beacon of Farm No. 108a, thence along the eastern boundary of that farm to the point of starting.

(b) The description of the Ila-Tonga Reserve (Reserve XIII) is cancelled and the following description substituted therefor:—

XIII.—ILA-TONGA RESERVE.

Boundaries:—

Commencing at the confluence of the Musa River with the Kafue River the boundary follows the western boundary of the Northern Copper Company's mineral grant to the south-west corner beacon thereof, thence a line in a southerly direction to the north-west beacon of Nanzela Mission Farm No. 207a, including 2,000 acres on the western side of that line surrounding the village of Shezongo, thence along the northern and eastern boundaries of Nanzela Mission Farm to its south-eastern beacon on the Nanzela River, thence a straight line in a southerly direction to Dundumwense Hill, thence a straight line in an easterly direction to Siakaunda Hill, thence in a south-easterly direction to the junction of the Simakoya Stream with the Chechekwenkwe Stream, then up the Chechekwenkwe Stream to its source, thence a straight line in a north-easterly direction to the source of the Mbabala Stream, thence down that stream to the south-west corner beacon of Farm No. 35a, thence along the west and north-west boundaries of that farm to the most westerly beacon of Farm No. 36a, thence along the north-west boundary of that farm to the most southerly beacon of Farm No. 598, thence along the western boundary of that farm to its most northerly beacon, thence along the south-west, north-west, and northern boundaries of Farm No. 64a, to its most easterly beacon, thence along the eastern boundary of Farm No. 37a to the north-west corner beacon of Farm No. 56a, thence along the northern boundary of that farm to the north-east corner beacon thereof, on the Mahumba River, thence a straight line in a north-easterly direction to the most westerly beacon of Farm No. 8a, thence along the north-west boundary of that farm to the most westerly beacon of Farm No. 256a, thence along the northern boundary of that farm to the most northerly beacon of Farm No. 258a, thence along the north-eastern boundary of that farm to the

most northerly beacon of Farm No. 260a, thence along the eastern boundary of that farm to the most northerly beacon of Farm No. 262a, thence along the north-eastern boundary of that farm to the most northerly beacon of Farm No. 7a, thence along the northern boundary of Farm No. 6a to the north-western beacon of Farm No. 267a, thence along the northern boundary of that farm to the railway strip, thence northwards along the railway strip to the south-east corner beacon of Farm No. 513 at Monze Siding, thence along the southern boundary of that farm to the south-west corner beacon thereof, thence along the southern boundary of Farm No. 276a to the north-east corner beacon of Farm No. 512, thence along the eastern and western boundaries of that farm to its most westerly beacon, thence west along the southern boundary of Farm No. 276a to its most westerly beacon, thence along its western boundary to the most westerly beacon of Farm No. 588, thence along the western boundaries of Farms Nos. 588 and 587 to the north-west corner beacon of Farm No. 587, thence in a straight line in a north-easterly direction to the most westerly beacon of Farm No. 543, thence along the north-west boundary of that farm to the Magoye River, thence down the Magoye River in a northerly direction till it loses itself in the Kafue Flats, thence a straight line in a north-westerly direction to the Kafue River at a point 15 miles east of Lochinvar Ranch, then in a westerly direction up the Kafue River to Lochinvar Ranch, thence along the eastern, southern, and western boundaries of Lochinvar Ranch to the north-west corner beacon thereof, thence eastwards down the Kafue River to the north-east corner beacon of Lochinvar Ranch, thence a straight line in a north-easterly direction to the junction of the Nangoma River with the Namwagu Lagoon, thence in an easterly direction along the Namwagu Lagoon to the south-west corner beacon of the Blue Lagoon Ranch Farm No. 570, thence along the western boundary of that ranch to its north-west corner beacon, thence in a straight line in a north-westerly direction to Cholobeti Hill, thence in a straight line westwards to a point on the Nansenga River due east of Mwako Hill, thence in a northerly direction up the Nansenga River to its junction with the Kachereka Stream, thence up the Kachereka Stream to its source, thence a straight line in a westerly direction to the junction of the Nangoma Stream with the Kafue River, thence down the Kafue River in a southerly direction to the point of starting.

Included within the boundaries defined above but excluded from the Reserve are:—

Farm No. 445, Macha Mission, 3,003 acres in extent, situated on the Macha Stream.

Farm No. 184a, Mapanza Mission, 97 acres in extent, situated on the Munyeka River.

Farm No. 185a, Shakashina Mission, 22 acres in extent, situated on the Munyeka River.

Farm No. 557, Namantombwa Mission, 784 acres in extent, situated on the Nangoma River.

Farm No. 192a, Kasenga Mission, 1,436 acres in extent, situated on the Kafue River.

Farm No. 191a, Ibamba Ranch, 6,003 acres in extent, situated on the Kafue River, and Farm No. 712, Ibamba Ranch Extension, 1,998 acres in extent, situated on the Kafue River.

Namwala Township, 2,000 acres in extent, situated on the Kafue River.

3. His Majesty, His Heirs and Successors, in Council, may at any time revoke, alter, add to, or amend this Order.

4. This Order shall come into operation forthwith and shall be published in the Northern Rhodesia Gazette and the Governor or other Officer for the time being Administering the Government of the Territory of Northern Rhodesia shall give directions for the publication of this Order at such places and in such manner and for such times as he thinks proper for giving due publicity thereto.

And the Right Honourable Lord Passfield, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, is to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

" We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, and of the Act of the 17th and 18th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 84, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for apportioning the income of the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Standish in the County of Lancaster and in the Diocese of Blackburn, between that Benefice and a certain other Benefice namely the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Little Marsden, which said last named Benefice is situate in the said County of Lancaster and in the said Diocese of Blackburn:

" Whereas the Bishop of the said Diocese of Blackburn is the Patron in right of his See of the said Benefice of Standish and also of the said Benefice of Little Marsden:

" And whereas it has been made to appear to us that the said Benefice of Little Marsden is at present insufficiently endowed; and that the said Benefice of Standish has endowments of such an amount as that after the charge hereinafter recommended and proposed to be made shall have been placed upon the same endowments, the said Benefice of Standish will still be sufficiently endowed:

" And whereas the Right Reverend Percy Mark, Bishop of the said Diocese of Blackburn, has represented to us, and we are of opinion, that it is desirable that additional provision should be made for the cure of souls within the New Parish of Little Marsden aforesaid, by means of that apportionment of the income of the said Benefice of Standish which is hereinafter recommended and proposed:

" And whereas the said Benefice of Standish is now full, the Reverend Charles William Newton Hutton being the present Rector or Incumbent thereof:

" Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Honourable and Most Reverend William, Archbishop of York, acting as Archbishop of the Province within which each of the said two Benefices is situate, and with the consent of the said Percy Mark, Bishop of the said Diocese of Blackburn, acting as such Bishop and also as the Patron in right of his See of each of the said two Benefices as aforesaid (in testimony whereof they the said consenting parties have respectively signed this Scheme and sealed the same with their several Episcopal Seals), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than this Scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same and as from the day of the date at which the said Benefice of Standish shall from whatsoever cause be next voided, all the Tithe rent charges Glebe lands and all (if any) other the endowments which shall at the date of the next avoidance of the said Benefice of Standish or which may thereafter belong to the same Benefice shall be charged and for ever thereafter chargeable in favour of the Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice of Little Marsden with the annual sum or yearly charge hereinafter mentioned that is to say a clear annual sum or yearly charge of £70 the same annual sum or yearly

charge of £70 to be as from the day aforesaid due and payable to the Incumbent of the said Benefice of Little Marsden and the same annual sum or yearly charge to be apportionable between any outgoing Incumbent of the Benefice of Little Marsden or his representatives on the one hand and his successors in the same incumbency on the other hand, and to be receivable by the Incumbent in whose favour it is charged as aforesaid by equal quarterly payments on the first day of January, the first day of April, the first day of July, and the first day of October in every year; and for the recovery of the said yearly charge of £70 the Incumbent of the said Benefice of Little Marsden and his successors shall have and be entitled to all the powers and remedies provided by Sections 121 and 122 of the Law of Property Act, 1925, in respect of rent-charges to which those Sections apply.

"Provided always that if at any time the Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice of Standish shall by any deed duly executed by him under his hand and seal in accordance with the provisions of any Statute in that behalf enabling him, grant convey and annex to the said Benefice of Little Marsden any part or parts of the Rectorial endowments belonging to the said Benefice of Standish which shall in the opinion of the Bishop of Blackburn for the time being be a just and fair equivalent or not less than an equivalent for the said yearly charge of £70 hereby proposed to be created as aforesaid then the same annual sum or yearly charge of £70 shall thereupon and thenceforth cease and determine; and be no longer payable as hereinbefore recommended and proposed.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of either of them, or of any other Act of Parliament."

REGULATIONS AMENDING THE REGULATIONS MADE BY THE TREASURY UNDER S. 4 OF THE PENSIONS (INCREASE) ACT, 1920, ON THE 22ND DECEMBER, 1930.

In pursuance of section four of the Pensions (Increase) Act, 1920, the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby make the following Regulations:—

1. For regulating the travelling upon and using and working of and for maintaining order in and upon the Company's Railways (hereinafter referred to as "the Railway"), which expression means and includes all and each of the Railways, Railway Stations and approaches thereto, and all and each of the works and premises belonging to or leased to the Company, and with respect to which the Company has power to make regulations by Bye-laws, and also all and each of the works by the Company's Special Acts authorised to be constructed.

1. Any person offending against any of the following Bye-laws numbered 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, 12, 13, 14, 15, 16, 18, 20, 21, 22, 23 and 24 respectively, shall be liable for every such offence to a penalty not exceeding forty shillings for a first offence, and not exceeding five pounds for any subsequent offence; and any person offending against either of the following Bye-laws numbered 17 and 19 respectively shall be liable for every such offence to a penalty not exceeding five pounds. Any

person offending against any of the following Bye-laws numbered 2, 7, 8, 9, 10, 14, 15, 18, 20, 23 and 24, and failing to desist or quit, as the case may be, when requested so to do by a servant or agent of the Company, may be removed from the Railway or any part thereof by any servant or agent of the Company, without prejudice where any penalty is prescribed as aforesaid for the infraction of any such Bye-law to such penalty.

2. No person shall pass any ticket barrier or enter any lift, escalator (which in these Bye-laws shall, unless the context otherwise requires, be deemed to include a moving platform), carriage or vehicle upon the Railway, for the purpose of travelling, unless and until he or she or someone on his or her behalf shall have obtained from the Company, or from some other Company or person duly authorised in that behalf by the Company, a ticket entitling him or her to travel on the Railway.

3. At all stations fares will be received and tickets issued conditionally on such issue not being in respect of any particular train, and on there being on the day of issue room in a train stopping at the station for which such tickets are issued.

4. When the fare to an intermediate station exceeds the fare to a more distant station, no person shall, for the purpose of travelling to such intermediate station, take or use or attempt to use a ticket for the more distant station with intent to avoid payment of the additional fare to such intermediate station. The liability to or infliction of any penalty incurred by the infraction of this Bye-law shall not prejudice any right of the Company to treat such ticket as forfeited and to recover the full fare for the distance actually travelled by the offender.

5. No person shall alter, deface, mutilate or destroy any ticket issued for the conveyance of any passenger, animal, or article on the Railway, with intent to enable the Company to be defrauded or prejudiced; or knowingly and wilfully use or attempt to use any such ticket which shall have been in any respect materially altered, defaced or mutilated.

6. No person shall sell or buy or attempt to sell or buy any ticket or transfer or receive any partly used ticket or any season ticket to or from any other person with intent that any person shall use the same for the purpose of travelling or conveyance upon the Railway, unless the ticket shall at the time of issuing thereof purport to be transferable and no person shall knowingly and wilfully use or attempt to use any ticket which has been sold, bought, transferred or received in contravention of this Bye-law. Provided that the sale or attempted sale by or the purchase or attempted purchase from a duly authorised servant or agent of the Company is excepted from the provisions of this Bye-law.

7. The Company may establish queues upon any part of any station and at such station every person desirous of travelling shall, upon request or notice by the Company or its officials, take up a position in the rear of one of such queues and approach the booking office, lift, escalator, carriage or vehicle in an orderly and regular manner, and obey the instructions of any of the Company's officials regulating such queues.

8. No person shall enter, or attempt to enter, any lift, or any carriage or compartment of a

carriage upon the Railway, through any door thereof, until all persons who are leaving or are on the way to leave such lift, carriage or compartment through such door shall have passed out of such door.

9. When a lift or carriage or compartment of a carriage upon the Railway contains the full number of passengers which it is constructed to carry, no additional person shall enter or remain therein if requested by a guard of the train or any servant or agent of the Company not to do so.

10. No person, except a servant or agent of the Company in the performance of his duty, shall mount or attempt to mount on any locomotive, motor cab, carriage or other vehicle, lift, or escalator except on such part or parts as are provided for the carriage of passengers.

11. No person, except a servant or agent of the Company in the performance of his duty, shall open or attempt to open any gate or door of any lift-shaft, or any lift, or unfasten or tamper with any fastening or fitting on any such gate or door, or enter or leave, or attempt to enter or leave, any lift whilst it is in motion or otherwise than at the side appointed for passengers to enter or leave the same, or ascend or descend, or attempt to ascend or descend, by means of any escalator except by the stairway thereof provided for ascending or descending passengers, as the case may be, or sit upon the stairway of any escalator, or tamper with any switch, lever, or other device operating or controlling any lift, escalator, or other mechanical appliance upon the Railway except (in cases of emergency) any switch or appliance upon or near which is displayed a notice that it is intended to be operated in cases of emergency.

12. No person, except a servant or agent of the Company in the performance of his duty, shall open the door, or stand or attempt to stand on the step or footboard of any carriage or vehicle upon the Railway whilst it is in motion or (except in case of accident or other emergency) between stations; or enter or leave or attempt to enter or leave any such carriage or vehicle whilst it is in motion or (except as aforesaid) between stations or otherwise than at the side of the carriage or vehicle adjoining the platform or place appointed for passengers to enter or leave the train; and where in any such carriage or vehicle one door is indicated by notice for entrance thereto and another door for exit therefrom no person shall (except in case of accident or other emergency) enter or leave or attempt to enter or leave such carriage or vehicle except by the door indicated for entrance or exit respectively.

13. Except by permission in writing of a station master or other officer of the Company duly authorised in that behalf, no person suffering from any infectious or contagious disease or disorder shall enter or remain and no person having the custody, charge, or care of any such person shall cause or permit such person to enter or remain in or upon the Railway or in any carriage upon the Railway, and the Company may refuse to receive or carry any such person, or to permit any such person to enter, remain, or be in or upon the Railway, or in any such carriage, or to travel on the Railway. Any person suffering as aforesaid, and any person having the custody, charge, or care of any such person may be removed

from any such carriage or from the Railway, by or under the direction of any servant or agent of the Company, and shall be liable to the Company for the cost of disinfecting the Company's premises and any carriage in which such person shall have been, and to make good any other damage to the property of the Company through the infraction of this Bye-law, without prejudice to any penalty incurred by such infraction.

14. No person in a state of intoxication shall enter or remain in or upon the Railway, or any lift, escalator, or carriage on the Railway, and no person who is in an unfit or improper condition to travel by passenger train or whose dress or clothing is in a condition liable to soil or injure the linings or cushions of any carriage, or the dress or clothing of any passenger, shall enter or remain in any lift, escalator or carriage upon the Railway. Provided that no person shall be prevented from entering or remaining in or on any lift, escalator, or carriage under the provisions of this Bye-law on the ground of the condition of his dress or clothing, when he so enters or remains in or on any lift, escalator, or carriage with the permission of the guard of the train, or of any servant or agent of the Company.

15. No person shall at any time while in or upon the Railway or in any lift, escalator, carriage, or vehicle upon the Railway, use any threatening, abusive, indecent, obscene, profane, or offensive language to the annoyance or hindrance of any other person, or behave in a riotous, disorderly, indecent, or offensive manner to the annoyance or hindrance of any other person, or write, draw, or affix any abusive, indecent, obscene, profane, or offensive word, representation, or character, or commit any nuisance in, upon, or against any part of the Railway or of such lift, escalator, carriage, or vehicle, or molest or wilfully interfere with the comfort or convenience of any passenger or person on the Railway.

16. No person shall take or cause to be taken into, or cause or allow to remain in any lift, escalator, or carriage upon the Railway, if requested not to do so by a guard of the train or any servant or agent of the Company, any animal, article, or thing which by reason of its nature is in the opinion of such guard, servant, or agent calculated to cause, or, in fact, does cause annoyance or damage to any passenger or damage to any property, and no person in charge of any animal shall permit such animal to stand, sit or walk on any escalator whilst such escalator is in motion in breach of a warning exhibited upon such escalator. If any person in charge of such animal, article, or thing fails, when requested by such guard, servant or agent, immediately to remove the same from the lift, escalator, or carriage, then the same may be removed therefrom by or under the direction of such guard, servant, or agent, without prejudice to any penalty incurred by the infraction of this Bye-law.

17. No person shall take into, or place in or upon, or cause to be taken into or placed in or upon, the Railway, or any lift, escalator, carriage, or vehicle upon the Railway, any loaded weapon of any kind, or any cinemato-

graph film whatsoever, or any inflammable, explosive, or corrosive gas, spirit, liquid, substance, or matter, or any article or thing which is or may become dangerous to any passenger or property. But nothing in this Bye-law shall apply to small quantities of spirit or liquid carried for the personal use of such person and not for the purpose of trade or business, provided that all due precautions are taken for the prevention of accident or injury therefrom. If any person offending against this Bye-law fails to remove from the Railway, or any such lift, escalator, carriage, or vehicle immediately upon request by any servant or agent of the Company, any article or thing to which this Bye-law relates, the same may be removed therefrom by or under the direction of such servant or agent without prejudice to any penalty incurred by the infraction of this Bye-law.

18. No person shall smoke in any carriage or compartment of a carriage upon the Railway or in or upon any part of the Railway, where smoking is expressly prohibited by the Company: and no person shall smoke in any train in which a smoking carriage or compartment is specially provided, except in such smoking carriage or compartment.

19. No person shall wilfully, wantonly, or maliciously move or set in motion, or stop or attempt to stop, any lift, escalator, carriage, or vehicle upon the Railway, except in cases of emergency by means of a switch or appliance upon or near which is displayed a notice that it is intended to be operated in cases of emergency, or break, cut, scratch, tear, soil, deface, or damage such lift, escalator, carriage, or vehicle or any of the fittings, furniture, decorations, or equipment thereof, or any notice, advertisement, number-plate, number, figure, or letter therein or thereupon, or remove any such article or thing therefrom, or deface or damage any property (whether real or personal), belonging to the Company, or upon the Railway. Any person offending against this Bye-law shall be liable to the Company for the amount of the damage done, without prejudice to any penalty incurred by the infraction of this Bye-law.

20. Except by permission of an officer of the Company, duly authorised in that behalf, no person while in or upon the Railway, or in any carriage or vehicle thereon, shall hawk, sell, or expose to offer for sale any article or goods whatsoever, or sing or perform on any musical instrument, or tout, ply for, or solicit alms, reward, or custom, or employment of any description.

21. (a) No person shall enter or remain in or upon or use the Railway or any carriage or vehicle thereon for the purpose of playing cards or gambling or book-making or betting or wagering or agreeing to bet or wager or paying or receiving or settling bets with any other person. (b) No person shall loiter or remain in or upon the Railway, or any lift, escalator, carriage, or vehicle thereon after having been requested by a servant or agent of the Company to depart unless such person is lawfully entitled so to remain.

22. No person shall throw or drop on or from any lift, escalator, carriage, or vehicle on

the Railway any article or thing whatsoever capable of injuring, damaging, or endangering any person or property.

23. No driver, conductor, or person in charge of any omnibus, motor-car, cab, carriage, wagon, bicycle, or other vehicle, or of any animal in or upon the Railway shall:

(a) Leave or place any such vehicle or animal in or upon the railway—

(i) Unattended; or

(ii) For a period longer than necessary for such person to transact any lawful business upon the Railway; or

(iii) In any manner or place so as to cause an obstruction or hindrance to the Company or to persons using the Railway; or

(iv) Otherwise than in accordance with any reasonable direction of any servant or agent of the Company; or

(b) Conduct himself or herself in a disorderly manner.

Any vehicle or animal so left or placed in breach of this Bye-law may be removed from the Railway by or under the direction of any servant or agent of the Company.

24. No person shall (a) spit upon the permanent way, or upon the floor or upon any part of any lift, escalator, carriage, or vehicle upon the Railway, or upon the platform at any Station of the Company, or upon the floor, side, or wall of any hall, office, waiting-room, refreshment-room, public room, or public passage at any Station of the Company; or (b) place or throw any litter upon the Railway except in receptacles expressly provided for that purpose.
