WHEREAS by the Copyright Act, 1911, 1 & 2 Geo. 5, c. 46, authority is conferred upon His Majesty to extend by Order in Council the protection of the said Act to certain classes of foreign works within any part of His Majesty's dominions, other than self-governing dominions, to which the said Act extends:

And whereas His Majesty by virtue of the authority conferred upon Him by the Copyright Act, 1911, was pleased to make an Order in Council dated the 12th day of February, 1931, and entitled "The Copyright (Federated Malay States) Order, 1931," S.R. & O., 1931, No. 105, extending the protection of such Act to works first published or made in the Federated Malay States, but such Order does not apply to Southern Rhodesia:

And whereas His Majesty is satisfied that the Rulers of the Federated Malay States have made, or have undertaken to make, such provisions as it appears to His Majesty expedient to require for the protection of works entitled to copyright under the provisions of Part I of the said Act in Southern Rhodesia:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, and by virtue of the authority conferred upon Him by the Copyright Act, 1911, is pleased to order and it is hereby ordered as follows:—

1. The Copyright (Federated Malay States) Order, 1931, shall apply to Southern Rhodesia.

2. Where any person has, before the date of this Order, taken any action whereby he has incurred any expenditure or liability in connection with the reproduction or performance of any work in a manner which at the time was lawful, or for the purpose of or with a view to the reproduction or performance of a work at a time when such reproduction or performance would, but for the making of this Order, have been lawful, nothing in this Order shall diminish or prejudice any rights or interest arising from or in connection with such action which are subsisting and valuable at the said date unless the person who, by virtue

of this Order, becomes entitled to restrain such reproduction or performance agrees to pay such compensation as failing agreement may be determined in accordance with the provisions of the Copyright Act, 1911.

3. This Order may be cited as the Copyright (Federated Malay States) (Amendment) Order, 1932.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 28th day of January, 1932, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Parish of Coggeshall and the Parish of Markshall, being the Parishes of the United Benefice of Coggeshall with Markshall, situate in the County of Essex and in the Diocese of Chelmsford:

“Whereas by an Order of Your Majesty in Council dated the 1st day of April, 1922, and published in the London Gazette on the 4th day of the same month, it was ordered and directed that the Benefice of Coggeshall and the Benefice of Markshall should be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of ‘The United Benefice of Coggeshall with Markshall,’ but that the Parishes of the said Benefices should continue distinct:

“And whereas since the date of the said Order of Your Majesty in Council the union of the said Benefices of Coggeshall and Markshall has become effective:

“And whereas since the date upon which the union of the said Benefices of Coggeshall and Markshall became effective Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Henry, Bishop of Chelmsford, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said Parishes of Coggeshall and Markshall have duly made a Report to the said Bishop of Chelmsford recommending the union of the said Parishes of Coggeshall and Markshall and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of Chelmsford signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

“And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the said union of Parishes based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

“And whereas the said United Benefice of Coggeshall with Markshall is now full, the Reverend Frank Pickford being the present Incumbent thereof:

“Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Henry, Bishop of Chelmsford (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), and with the consent of the said Frank Pickford (testified by his signing this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

“1. That upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette the said Parish of Coggeshall and the said Parish of Markshall shall be united into one Parish for ecclesiastical purposes and for such other purposes as in the said Measure provided.

“2. That the Parish Church of the said Parish of Coggeshall shall be the Parish Church of the United Parish and that the Table of Fees for the said Parish of Coggeshall shall (until revised or altered by proper authority) be the Table of Fees for the United Parish.

“3. That upon the union taking effect the Register Books of Baptisms, Marriages and Burials and other the Records and Muniments deposited in the Church of Markshall shall be transferred to the Church of Coggeshall but the marriage registers in duplicate current at the Church of Markshall shall first be sent by the Incumbent of the said United Benefice of Coggeshall with Markshall to the Registrar General to be closed officially.

“4.—(a) That so soon as conveniently may be after the union has taken effect the Church at Markshall shall be taken down and the materials and site thereof, together with any ground annexed thereto and necessary for the use and enjoyment thereof shall be sold and disposed of by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient subject to the conditions and restrictions imposed by the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923.

“(b) That the net proceeds (if any) to arise from such sale or sales after payment of the expenses attendant upon the sale or sales, the taking down of the Church, the removal of monuments (if any) and all other expenses incidental to these matters, shall be appropriated to the Expenses Fund of the Diocese of Chelmsford.

“(c) That the font, communion table, sacramental plate, bells, organ and other furniture and fittings of the said Church of Markshall or such of them as the Bishop of Chelmsford shall select shall be transferred to the Parish Church of the United Parish and any articles not so transferred shall be transferred to any other Church or Chapel or Churches or Chapels within the Diocese of Chelmsford which the Bishop may select; provided always that any articles that shall not be so transferred or appropriated except the font, communion table and sacramental plate, may be sold and the proceeds shall be added to the fund arising from the sale of the site and materials of the said Church of Markshall as aforesaid.

“Provided always that the provisions herein contained relating to the sale and disposal of the Church of Markshall shall not take effect until the consents and approval which by the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, are made requisite to the sale under the powers conferred by that Measure of the site of any

Church shall be obtained to the sale and disposal hereby proposed of the said Church of Markshall and of the site thereof together with any ground annexed or belonging thereto.

"And provided also that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the same Measure to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923:

And whereas the prescribed time has elapsed and no such objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Chelmsford has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas the said Scheme has been laid before both Houses of Parliament for the space of two calendar months:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Parishes therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme, and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Chelmsford.
