(2) To extend to the Council the powers of a local Authority under Section 54 of the Public Health Act, 1875, with regard to the carrying of water mains within and without their district;

(3) To make further provision in regard to the Council's water undertaking and in particular:

(i) to empower the Council to provide dwelling houses for persons employed by them for the purposes of the undertaking;

(ii) to provide that the Council shall not be bound to supply with water otherwise than by measure.

(a) any premises partly used for trade or manufacturing purposes

(b) certain other buildings institutions and premises;

(iii) to make special provision with regard to supplies of water to caravans and huts;

(iv) to authorise additional charges for water used in connection with apparatus requiring continuously running water;

(v) to prescribe the basis on which two or more houses or buildings in one occupation shall be assessed for water rates;

(vi) to provide for the recovery of water rates from persons removing;

(vii) to empower the Council to demand water rates half-yearly and to collect such rates with the general rate;

(viii) to extend the powers of the Council relating to the payment of water rates by owners of small houses and to authorise the Council to make allowances by way of discount for prompt payment of water rates;

(ix) to make provision in regard to the period of error in defective meters;

(x) to prescribe a penalty for opening valves and other apparatus;

(xi) to extend the powers of the Council to inspect premises for the purpose of ascertaining whether there is any waste or misuse of water;

(xii) to provide for the recovery of the cost of separate communication pipes;

(xiii) to vary the existing statutory requirements regarding the giving of guarantees by persons desiring to be furnished with a supply of water by the Council.

(4) To extend to powers of the Council to borrow money for the purposes of the water undertaking with the consent of the Minister of Health.

(5) To make provision as to the application of the revenues and the payment of the expenses of the water undertaking; to provide that such revenues shall be paid into and such expenses shall be paid out of the general rate fund; to provide for the keeping of separate accounts and to empower the Council to maintain a reserve fund.

(6) For the several purposes of the Application or for purposes connected with, incidental to, or consequent on those purposes to make any such alteration or amendment of the said Local Acts and Orders or of any other Local Act or of any Act confirming a Provisional Order made in pursuance of any of the Sanitary Acts or of the Public Health Act, 1875, and in force in the said District as may be necessary or desirable:

And whereas it is proposed that a Provisional Order should be issued in compliance with the said Application:

And whereas it is further proposed that such Provisional Order should provide, inter alia, that the construction of the waterworks which the Council were authorised by the local Act of 1925 to construct shall not be commenced except with the sanction of the Minister of Health.

PLANNING SCHEME.

4.—(a) Every steam vessel navigating against the tidal stream shall if necessary in order to avoid risk of collision ease her speed or stop on approaching or when rounding a point or sharp bend so as to allow any vessel navigating with the tidal stream to pass clear of her.

Steam vessels navigating against the tidal stream approaching a bridge.

(b) Every steam vessel navigating against the tidal stream shall if necessary on approaching a bridge ease her speed or stop in order to avoid risk of collision with another vessel or another vessel and her tow navigating with the tidal stream approaching or passing under the same bridge.

Penalty for breach of Bye-laws.

5. Any person acting in contravention of Bye-law 4 of these Bye-laws shall for every such act be liable to the penalty prescribed by Bye-law 82 of the Port of London River Bye-laws, 1914.

Any person desirous of making any objection to or representation respecting such proposed Bye-laws may do so in writing or otherwise, on or before the 21st day of March, 1934, to the undersigned.
