No applications can be received from gentlemen in the foregoing categories wishing to be presented. Their names must be forwarded by the gentleman making the presentation.

2. All gentlemen referred to in the following Regulations, wishing to attend or be presented at a Levée, should make a written application as directed below.

3. All Officers, whether on the active or retired lists of the Royal Navy, Royal Marines, Royal Naval Reserve and Royal Naval Volunteer Reserve, will communicate with and obtain their cards, whether for attendance or presentation, from the Private Secretary to the First Lord of the Admiralty.

4. All Officers on the active, retired, and reserve lists of the Regular Army and Territorial Army, except Officers of the Household Cavalry and the Brigade of Guards, and except Officers of the Indian Services and Indian Army and Colonial Service and Colonial Forces, will communicate with and obtain their cards, whether for attendance or presentation, from the Under-Secretary of State, War Office.

All Officers on the active, retired and reserve lists of the Household Cavalry and the Brigade of Guards will communicate, through their Regimental Headquarters, with the Comptroller, Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, to obtain their cards for attendance or presentation.

5. All Officers on the active list of the Royal Air Force and Officers of the Special Reserve and Auxiliary Air Force will obtain their

cards, for attendance or presentation, through the usual channels. Officers of the Reserve of Air Force Officers and Officers on the retired list of the Royal Air Force will communicate with and obtain their cards, whether for attendance or presentation, from the Secretary, Air Ministry, Kingsway, W.C.2.

6. All Officers of His Majesty's Civil Service will communicate with and obtain their cards for attendance or presentation from the Department under which they serve.

7. All Officers of the Indian Services and of the Indian Army, whether on the active or retired lists, will communicate with and obtain their cards, for attendance or for presentation, from the Political A.D.C. to the Secretary of State at the India Office, Whitehall.

8. All Officers of the Colonial Service and Colonial Forces, whether on the active or retired lists, will communicate with and obtain their cards, whether for attendance or presentation, from the Ceremonial and Reception Secretary, Colonial Office, Whitehall, with the exception of Officers of the local Forces of the self-governing Dominions, who will apply to the Under-Secretary of State, the War Office, for their cards for attendance or for presentation, supporting their application in all cases by a credential from the Governor-General, Governor, Officer commanding the local Forces, or the representative in London of the Dominion concerned.

Secondly All that strip of land (being part of a close of land called "The Middle Ing") situate between the last described piece of land and the yard of the dwelling-house next hereinafter described and containing fifty-eight square yards or thereabouts and bounded on or towards the north-east by the last described piece of land, on or towards the south-east by property of John Thomas Johnson and John William Booth, on or towards the south-west by the next hereinafter described piece of land and on or towards the north-west by property of Jonas Ackroyd.

And thirdly All that cottage or dwelling-house fronting to Moss Road, Wilsden aforesaid, with the yard thereto belonging (except the kitchen built in front of and adjoining the said cottage) being the topmost cottage in a row of eleven cottages erected upon two parcels of land staked out from a certain close of land called or commonly known by the name of "The Four Days' Work" and the site of which said cottage and yard contains two hundred and thirty-five superficial square yards or thereabouts, and is now in the occupation of Frederick Slater and is bounded on or towards the north-east partly by property of John Thomas Johnson and John William Booth and partly by the plot of land secondly before described, on or towards the south-east partly by Moss Road aforesaid and partly by the before-mentioned kitchen and on or towards the south-west and north-west by property of Jonas Ackroyd.

5. To provide that the lands described in paragraph 4 of this notice shall be excluded from the quantity of land which the Council are authorised to purchase by agreement for gasworks purposes under the Bingley Urban District Council Act 1901.

6. To empower the Council to give by agreement within their limits for the supply of gas a separate supply of gas for industrial purposes only, and to prescribe the conditions and regulations under which such a supply may be given and the restrictions to be placed on such a supply.

7. To authorise the Council to purchase or take on lease houses, cottages and other buildings for persons employed by them, and offices, showrooms and other buildings for the purposes of their gas undertaking, and to erect, fit up, maintain and let any such buildings.

8. To confer further powers upon the Council in regard to their gas undertaking and, amongst other things, to empower the Council to lay pipes in private streets and pipes for ancillary purposes; to extend the power of the Council to enter premises, to which a supply of gas is laid on, for the inspection of gas apparatus and for the purpose of ascertaining the quantity of gas consumed or supplied; to provide for the removal of fittings where a gas supply is discontinued; to require the provision of valves and appliances where high pressure air or other gas is used in connection with the consumption of gas; to compel gas consumers to repair gas apparatus in cases of danger; to make provision as to charges for a stand-by supply of gas where the consumer has a separate supply; to relieve the Council from obligation to supply gas in such circumstances as may be defined in the Order; to empower the Council to prevent the improper use of gas; to empower the Council to cut off supplies where charges for gas &c. are not wholly paid; to enable the Council to refuse to supply gas to persons in debt for other premises; to require gas consumers to give notice to the Council before removing and to prescribe the manner in which notices of discontinuance of a supply of gas shall be given; to make provision as to the mode of cutting off supplies of gas; to provide for the payment of expenses in relation to the reconnection of a discontinued supply; to enable the Council to levy and recover charges for special readings of meters; to make provision as to the inspection and testing of meters; to require anti-fluctuators to be used with gas engines; to prescribe the period of error in defective meters; to empower the Council to contract for the supply and purchase of gas in bulk; to authorise the Council to take licences for use of patents; and to make provision as to the exemption of fittings let for hire by the Council from distress or landlord's remedy for rent etc.

9. To authorise the Council to borrow money for the payment of any sums payable to the Bradford Corporation in respect of the sale and transfer referred to in paragraph 1 hereof and for the general purposes of the Council's gas undertaking, and for the payment of the costs and expenses of and connected with the Order and to enact other financial provisions.

10. To enable the Council to exercise all such powers as may be necessary or convenient for

giving effect to the purposes of the Order, and to confer upon them all such other powers as are now usually conferred upon local authorities in connection with the supply of gas.

11. To vary or extinguish all rights and privileges which would or might interfere with the objects of the Order and to confer other rights, powers and privileges.

12. To provide for the application of the provisions of section 265 of the Public Health Act 1875 to the Council in regard to their gas undertaking.

13. To incorporate with the Order with or without amendment or modification all or any of the provisions of the Lands Clauses Acts, the Gasworks Clauses Acts, 1847 and 1871, the Public Health Act 1875 and the Acts amending those Acts respectively; and to alter, amend, repeal or re-enact, and extend to the Order (with or without modification) all or some of the provisions of the Bingley Extension and Improvement Act 1867; the Bingley Water and Improvement Act 1881; the Bingley Urban District Council Act 1901 and the Bingley Gas (Charges) Order 1929, which relate to the Council's gas undertaking and of any other Act or Order relating to the Council or their gas undertaking.

Any local or other public authority, company, or person desiring to bring before the Board of Trade any objection to the draft Order may do so by registered letter addressed to the Director of Gas Administration, Board of Trade, Great George Street, London, S.W.1, and despatched on or before the 22nd day of March, 1934.

Any such objection shall state:—

- (a) the specific grounds of objection; and
- (b) the omissions, additions or modifications asked for.
