“And whereas by Order in Council bearing date of 1st February, 1926, the conditions of service were laid down for officers of the Royal Naval Shore Wireless Service:

“And whereas we consider it desirable in the interests of the Shore Wireless Service that certain of the conditions of service of Chief Officers of the Force should be amended:

“We beg leave humbly to request that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to authorise revised conditions of service as set forth in the annexed Schedule.

“The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 16th day of April, 1936 (L. 5199/35), in the words following, viz. :—

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions, and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas by Order, in Council of His late Majesty bearing date the 17th day of March, 1932, the appointment of a Chief Constable, Royal Marine Police, was sanctioned under the conditions set forth in the Schedule annexed thereto:

"And whereas Article I of the said Schedule limits appointment to the post to Officers of the rank of Lieutenant Colonel or Major, Royal Marines, on the Retired List:

"And whereas Order in Council of His late Majesty bearing date the 19th day of April, 1933, sanctioned *inter alia*, certain changes in the establishment of Officers of the Royal Marine Police:

"And whereas we consider that the field of selection for appointment to the post of Chief Constable, Royal Marine Police, should be extended:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to extend the grades of Officers eligible for selection for appointment as Chief Constable, Royal Marine Police, to include Officers serving in the Royal Marine Police Force, Officers on the Active or Retired Lists of the Royal Marines of the rank of Major or above; and Officers on the Active or Retired Lists of the Royal Navy of the rank of Lieutenant Commander or above, subject to an Officer of the Royal Navy or Royal Marines, if on the Active List, being placed on the Retired List on appointment to the Royal Marine Police:

"Provided that (a) any Officer who may be promoted whilst serving in the Royal Marine Police, shall, on appointment as Chief Constable, continue to be subject to the conditions, in so far as they are applicable, governing his periods of service in a lower rank, and such conditions shall not be deemed to have been cancelled by the provisions of Order in Council bearing date the 17th day of March, 1932; and (b) in the event of an Officer being appointed as Chief Constable from the Retired List of the Royal Navy and Royal Marines who received a gratuity on retirement, a deduction shall be made from the pay of the post equal to the annual value of the gratuity awarded on retirement, except that no deductions shall be made for officers retired with gratuities under the special retirement schemes mentioned in Order in Council bearing date the 13th day of May, 1927.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in the foregoing proposals."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And whereas there was this day read at the Board a representation from the said Judicial Committee in the words following, viz. :—

"The Lords of the Judicial Committee having taken into consideration the provision contained in Part I of Schedule C to the Judicial Committee Rules, 1925, as amended by Order in Council of the 8th day of August, 1932, and being of opinion that the amount so

last added ought to be increased Their Lordships do hereby agree humbly to recommend to Your Majesty that the said provision ought to be amended as follows, that is to say, by the substitution of the figures and words "33½ per cent." for the figures and words "25 per cent." and that the said amendment ought to take effect as from the 23rd day of April, 1936."

His Majesty, having taken the said representation into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve thereof, and to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the Judicial Committee Rules, 1925, as amended by Order in Council of the 8th day of August, 1932, be further amended accordingly.

WHEREAS by the Colonial Naval Defence Act, 1931 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act"), it is enacted that the legislature of any Colony may, with the approval of His Majesty in Council, make provision for maintaining and using vessels of war; and that where the legislature of any Colony has made provision for raising a force for the naval defence of the Colony within its territorial waters, that legislature may, with the approval of His Majesty in Council, further make such provision regarding the discipline and service of officers and men of that force as is set out in the Act:

And whereas by the Act it is further provided that His Majesty in Council may, on such conditions as He thinks fit, authorise the Admiralty to accept any offer made by the Government of a Colony to place at His Majesty's disposal for general service in the Royal Navy, vessels of war maintained, or officers or men of such force as aforesaid raised by the Colony:

And whereas by the Naval Volunteer Ordinance, 1935, of the Legislature of the Colony of the Gambia (hereinafter referred to as "the Legislature") provision has been made for raising a force for the Naval Defence of the Gambia called the Gambia Naval Volunteer Force (hereinafter referred to as "the Force"):

Now, therefore, His Majesty, in exercise of the powers vested in Him by the above recited provisions, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as "The Gambia Naval Defence Order, 1936."

2. Approval is hereby given to the exercise by the Legislature of the power contained in Section 1 of the Act, to make provision at the expense of the Colony for maintaining and using vessels of war.

3. The Admiralty is hereby authorised to accept any offer made by the Government of the Gambia to place at His Majesty's disposal for general service in the Royal Navy any vessel of war so maintained, provided that, as regards any such vessel maintained by the Colony of the Gambia in conjunction with any other Colony, a like offer is made by such last mentioned Colony.

4. Approval is hereby given to the exercise by the Legislature of the powers contained in Subsection (1) of Section 2 of the Act namely, to provide that officers and men of the Force—

(a) shall, whether serving ashore or afloat or within or without the limits of the Gambia, be subject to all the enactments and regulations for the time being in force for the enforcement of discipline in the Royal Navy, with such modifications and adaptations as may be made by the Legislature to adapt those enactments and regulations to the circumstances of the Gambia;

(b) shall be liable to service and training in any ship, establishment or other place without the limits of the Gambia, whether belonging to the Gambia or not;

(c) shall, in the case of officers or men entered on the express terms of accepting general service in the Royal Navy in emergency, form part of the Royal Naval Reserve or of the Royal Naval Volunteer Reserve, or that some shall form part of the Royal Naval Reserve and others of the Royal Naval Volunteer Reserve.

5. The Admiralty is hereby authorised to accept any offer made by the Government of the Gambia to place at His Majesty's disposal for general service in the Royal Navy any officers and men of the Force.

WHEREAS by the Extradition Acts, 1870 to 1935 (33 & 34 Vict. c. 52; 22 & 23 Geo. 5. c. 39; 25 & 26 Geo. 5. c. 25), it was, amongst other things, enacted that, where an arrangement has been made with any foreign State with respect to the surrender to such State of any fugitive criminals, His Majesty may, by Order in Council, direct that the said Acts shall apply in the case of such foreign State; and that His Majesty may, by the same or any subsequent Order, limit the operation of the Order and restrict the same to fugitive criminals who are in, or suspected of being in, the part of His Majesty's dominions specified in the Order and render the operation thereof subject to such conditions, exceptions and qualifications as may be deemed expedient:

And whereas a Treaty was signed on the 31st day of March, 1873, between Her late Majesty Queen Victoria and His late Majesty the King of Denmark for the mutual extradition of fugitive criminals:

And whereas the said Treaty was duly ratified (See S.R. & O. Revise 1904. V.):

And whereas a supplementary Convention was signed on the 15th day of October, 1935, between His late Majesty King George V and

His Majesty the King of Denmark and Iceland, which Convention is in the terms following:—

His Majesty the King of Great Britain, Ireland and the British Dominions beyond the Seas, Emperor of India (hereinafter referred to as His Majesty the King and Emperor), and His Majesty the King of Denmark and Iceland,

Desiring to make further provision for the reciprocal extradition of fugitive criminals, have resolved to conclude a Supplementary Convention to this end, and for this purpose have appointed as their plenipotentiaries:

His Majesty the King of Great Britain, Ireland and the British Dominions beyond the Seas, Emperor of India:

For Great Britain and Northern Ireland:

Commander Henry Fitzhardinge Berkeley Maxse, His Chargé d'Affaires *ad interim* in Copenhagen;

His Majesty the King of Denmark and Iceland:

For Denmark:

His Prime Minister Thorvald August Marinus Stauning, Acting Minister for Foreign Affairs;

Who, having communicated to each other their full powers found in good and due form, have agreed as follows:—

ARTICLE 1.

From the date of the coming into force of the present Convention Article 1 of the Extradition Treaty signed at Copenhagen on the 31st March, 1873, shall be amended by the addition of the following clause:—

“Extradition may also be granted at the discretion of the High Contracting Party applied to in respect of any other crime or offence for which, according to the laws of both of the High Contracting Parties for the time being in force, the grant may be made.”

ARTICLE 2.

The foregoing amendment shall apply to extradition proceedings between the territory of His Majesty the King of Denmark and Iceland on the one hand, that is to say, Denmark and Danish colonies, and, on the other hand, the following territories of His Majesty the King and Emperor, that is to say, the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, the Channel Islands, the Isle of Man, Newfoundland, British Colonies, British Protectorates to which the Extradition Treaty of the 31st March, 1873, applies, and mandated territories to which the said Treaty has been or may be extended, and in respect of which the mandate is exercised by His Majesty's Government in the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland.

ARTICLE 3.

The High Contracting Parties agree that His Majesty the King and Emperor may accede to the present Convention in respect of any other Member of the British Commonwealth of Nations, whose Government may desire that such accession be effected, by a notice given to that effect by the appropriate diplomatic representative of His Majesty the King and Emperor at Copenhagen. From the date that such notice comes into force the amendment

set forth in Article 1 shall apply to extradition proceedings between the territory of His Majesty the King of Denmark and Iceland, on the one hand, and on the other the territory of the Member of the Commonwealth concerned.

Any notice given under the first paragraph of this Article in respect of any Member of the British Commonwealth of Nations may include any territory in respect of which a mandate on behalf of the League of Nations has been accepted by His Majesty the King and Emperor and is exercised by the Government of the Member concerned.

ARTICLE 4.

The present Convention shall be ratified. The ratifications shall be exchanged in London as soon as possible.

ARTICLE 5.

The present Convention shall enter into force three months after the exchange of ratifications, and shall have the same duration as the Extradition Treaty of the 31st March, 1873.

In faith whereof the above-named plenipotentiaries have signed the present Convention and have affixed thereto their seals.

Done in duplicate in English and Danish at Copenhagen the 15th day of October, 1935.

And whereas His Majesty has ratified the said supplementary Convention in respect of, and the said Convention thereby extends to, the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, the Channel Islands, the Isle of Man, Newfoundland, and British Colonies:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, and in virtue of the authority committed to Him by the said recited Acts, doth order, and it is hereby ordered, that from and after the 30th day of June, 1936, the said Acts shall apply in respect of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, the Channel Islands, the Isle of Man, Newfoundland and British Colonies in the case of Denmark under and in accordance with the said Treaty of the 31st March, 1873, as modified by the supplementary Convention of the 15th October, 1935.

This Order may be cited as the Denmark (Extradition) Order in Council, 1936.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 5th day of March, 1936, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of

Benefices Measure, 1923, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the unions (1) of the Chapelry of Adlestrop (now part of the Benefice of Broadwell with Adlestrop) and the Benefice of Oddington and (2) of the Benefice of Broadwell and the Benefice of Stow on the Wold, all of which Benefices are situate in the County of Gloucester and in the Diocese of Gloucester:

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Arthur Cayley, Bishop of Gloucester, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the unions (1) of the said Chapelry of Adlestrop with the said Benefice of Oddington and (2) of the said Benefice of Broadwell with the said Benefice of Stow on the Wold duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Gloucester and therein recommended such unions and the terms for effecting the same including certain alterations of the boundaries of the Parish of the said Benefice of Stow on the Wold and of the Parishes of Upper Swell and Nether Swell being the Parishes of the United Benefice of Upper with Nether Swell, in the said County and Diocese of Gloucester, and the said Bishop of Gloucester signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the said unions and alterations of boundaries which Scheme is based upon the terms recommended in the said Report, but with the assent of the said Bishop of Gloucester embodies certain modifications thereof:

"And whereas all of the three said Benefices of Broadwell with Adlestrop, Oddington and Stow on the Wold are now full the Reverend Francis Grenville Cholmondeley being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Broadwell with Adlestrop, the Reverend Reginald Arthur Bentley being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Oddington, and the Reverend Frederick Macduff Christian Hare being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Stow on the Wold:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Arthur Cayley, Bishop of Gloucester, and with the consents of the said Reginald Arthur Bentley and Frederick Macduff Christian Hare (testified by their respectively signing this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That the said Chapelry of Adlestrop comprising all that part of the Parish of the said Benefice of Broadwell with Adlestrop which is included within the area of the Civil Parish of Adlestrop shall be severed from the said Benefice of Broadwell and the said Chapelry of Adlestrop so severed and the said Benefice of Oddington shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls and one Parish for all ecclesiastical purposes under the style of 'The United Benefice of Oddington with Adlestrop.'

"2. That the Church of the Parish of Oddington shall be the Parish Church of the United Benefice of Oddington with Adlestrop and that the Table of Fees for the said Parish

of Oddington shall (until revised or altered by proper authority) be the Table of Fees for the same United Parish.

"3. That the said Benefice of Broadwell and the said Benefice of Stow on the Wold shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Stow on the Wold with Broadwell' but the Parishes of the said Benefices of Broadwell and Stow on the Wold shall continue distinct in all respects.

"4. That if upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette the said Benefice of Broadwell with Adlestrop shall be vacant, the unions shall forthwith take effect, but if upon that day the said Benefice of Broadwell with Adlestrop shall be full the unions shall take effect immediately upon the first vacation thereafter of the said Benefice of Broadwell with Adlestrop, and in either case the said Reginald Arthur Bentley if he is then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Oddington shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice of Oddington with Adlestrop, and the said Frederick Macduff Christian Hare if he is then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Stow on the Wold shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice of Stow on the Wold with Broadwell.

"5. That upon the said unions taking effect (1) the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Oddington shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice of Oddington with Adlestrop (2) the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Stow on the Wold shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice of Stow on the Wold with Broadwell and (3) so soon as conveniently may be the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Broadwell with Adlestrop and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall be sold and disposed of by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient and that the net proceeds of such sale shall be held and applied by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, for and towards the cost of the provision of a Curate's Residence at Broadwell and any balance of the said net proceeds which shall not be required for that purpose shall be held and invested by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, as to one moiety of such balance for the benefit of the United Benefice of Oddington with Adlestrop, and as to the other moiety thereof for the benefit of the United Benefice of Stow on the Wold with Broadwell.

"6. That upon the unions taking effect a portion of the endowment and property now belonging to the said Benefice of Broadwell with Adlestrop that is to say a sum of £2,648 9s. 0d. £3½ per centum per annum Conversion Stock (1961) now held by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, for the benefit of the said Benefice of Broadwell with Adlestrop together with a sum of £245 Local Loans £3 per centum per annum Stock (being part of a larger sum of such Stock now held by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, for the benefit of the said Benefice of Broadwell with

Adlestrop) shall be annexed to the United Benefice of Oddington with Adlestrop, and all other the endowment and property (excepting the Parsonage House) now belonging to the said Benefice of Broadwell with Adlestrop shall be annexed to the United Benefice of Stow on the Wold with Broadwell.

"7. That upon the unions taking effect provision shall be made by the Incumbent of the United Benefice of Stow on the Wold with Broadwell for obtaining the services of a Curate to reside at Broadwell and the endowments and property of the same United Benefice other than the Parsonage House and Glebe shall be charged with a sum of £230 per annum as a fund to meet the expenses of providing for the services of such Curate as aforesaid which said fund of £230 per annum shall be held and administered by the Incumbent of the said United Benefice but shall be applicable only to the purpose aforesaid, provided that it shall be lawful for the Bishop of the Diocese if he thinks proper at any time and from time to time to direct that the said charge of £230 per annum shall be paid by the Incumbent of the said United Benefice to the Diocesan Board of Finance of the Diocese as trustees to apply the same for the purpose of paying the stipend of the said Curate as aforesaid.

"8. That after the said unions have taken effect (a) the patronage of the United Benefice of Stow on the Wold with Broadwell shall belong wholly to the Patrons of the said Benefice of Stow on the Wold and (b) the course and succession in which the respective Patrons of the said Benefices of Broadwell with Adlestrop and Oddington shall present or nominate to the United Benefice of Oddington with Adlestrop from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, such right of presentation shall be exercised by the Patrons of the said two Benefices alternately, the Patron of the said Benefice of Broadwell with Adlestrop having the right upon the first presentation to the United Benefice of Oddington with Adlestrop to be made after the unions and every alternate right of presentation and the Patron of the said Benefice of Oddington having the right of presentation upon the second presentation to the same United Benefice to be made after the unions and every alternate turn thereafter.

"9. That with the consents of the Patrons of the said United Benefice of Upper with Nether Swell, namely the Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of Christ in Oxford and Mark Fenwick, Esquire, J.P., of Abbotswold, Stow on the Wold (the consent of the said Dean and Chapter being testified by their causing their Common or Capitular Seal to be affixed to this Scheme and the consent of the said Mark Fenwick being testified by his signing this Scheme) and with the consents also of the said Frederick Macduff Christian Hare (testified as aforesaid) and of the Reverend John Harris MacCleary being the present Incumbent of the said United Benefice of Upper with Nether Swell (testified by his signing this Scheme) upon the unions taking effect all those parts of the said respective Parishes of Upper Swell and Nether Swell which are now included within the area of the Civil Parish of Stow on the Wold shall be

transferred and annexed for all ecclesiastical purposes to the Parish of the said Benefice of Stow on the Wold.

"Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

“We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Bethnal Green, Saint Simon Zelotes, and the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Stepney, Saint Anthony, both of which Benefices are situate in the County of Middlesex and in the Diocese of London:

“Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Honourable and Right Reverend Arthur Foley, Bishop of London, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Bethnal Green, Saint Simon Zelotes, and Stepney, Saint Anthony, duly made their Report to the said Bishop of London and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of London signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

“And whereas the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Stepney, Saint Anthony, is vested for an estate in fee simple without incumbrances in The Wardens and Commonalty of the Mystery of Grocers of the City of London, hereinafter referred to as the Grocers' Company:

“And whereas the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Bethnal Green, Saint Simon Zelotes, is vested in the said Arthur Foley, Bishop of London, and his successors in the same Bishopric:

“And whereas the said Grocers' Company are desirous that the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Stepney, Saint Anthony, now vested in them as aforesaid, should be transferred to and be vested in the Bishop of London for the time being to the intent that the Patronage of the United Benefice hereinafter recommended and proposed to be constituted shall be vested wholly in the See of London:

“And whereas the said Arthur Foley, Bishop of London, is willing to accept such transfer, and in token of such his willingness and also in token that the same transfer has that consent of the Bishop of the Diocese which by the hereinbefore mentioned Acts or by some

or one of them is made necessary he, the said Arthur Foley, Bishop of London, has executed this Scheme as hereinafter mentioned:

“And whereas the transfer of the Patronage of the said Benefice of Stepney, Saint Anthony, which is hereinbefore mentioned and hereinafter recommended and proposed will in our opinion tend to make better provision for the cure of souls in the Parish or District in or in respect of which the right of Patronage or Advowson so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid arises or exists, that is to say, in the Parish of the said Benefice of Stepney, Saint Anthony, hereinafter recommended and proposed to be united with the Parish of the said Benefice of Bethnal Green, Saint Simon Zelotes:

“And whereas both of the said Benefices of Bethnal Green, Saint Simon Zelotes, and Stepney, Saint Anthony, are now full, the Reverend Herbert Read Peerless being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Bethnal Green, Saint Simon Zelotes, and the Reverend George Dunraven Osborn being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Stepney, Saint Anthony:

“And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices of Bethnal Green, Saint Simon Zelotes, and Stepney, Saint Anthony, based upon the terms of the hereinbefore mentioned Report to the Bishop of London, and further, for effecting such transfer of patronage as is hereinbefore mentioned:

“Now, therefore, with the consent, so far as the transfer of Patronage hereinafter recommended and proposed is concerned, of the said Grocers' Company (in testimony whereof they have caused their Corporate or Common Seal to be affixed to this Scheme) and with the consent of the said Arthur Foley, Bishop of London (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme and sealed the same with his Episcopal Seal), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

“1. That upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Stepney, Saint Anthony, shall be transferred to the said Arthur Foley, Bishop of London, and his successors in the same Bishopric, and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Arthur Foley, Bishop of London, and by his successors in the same Bishopric for ever.

“2. That the said Benefice of Bethnal Green, Saint Simon Zelotes, and the said Benefice of Stepney, Saint Anthony, shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of ‘The United Benefice of Bethnal Green, Saint Simon Zelotes with Saint Anthony,’ and that such United Benefice shall be included in and form part of the Rural Deanery of Bethnal Green and that the Parishes of the said Benefices

shall also be united into one Parish for ecclesiastical purposes and for such other purposes as in the said Measure provided.

" 3. That the Church of the Parish of Bethnal Green, Saint Simon Zelotes, shall be the Parish Church of the United Parish and that the Table of Fees for the said Parish of Bethnal Green, Saint Simon Zelotes, shall (until revised or altered by proper authority) be the Table of Fees for the United Parish.

" 4. That if upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette both of the said two Benefices shall be vacant, the union of the same two Benefices shall take effect forthwith; and if one only of the said two Benefices shall be then vacant the said union shall also take effect forthwith if the Incumbent of the other of the said two Benefices shall with the approval of the Bishop consent to become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, but, if he shall not so consent or if the Bishop shall not approve then the said union shall take effect upon the next avoidance of his Benefice and the then Incumbent (if any) of the other of the said two Benefices shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice; and if neither of the said two Benefices be then vacant then the said union shall take effect on the next avoidance of either of the said two Benefices if the Incumbent at that time of the other of the said two Benefices shall with the approval of the Bishop consent to become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, but if he shall not so consent or if the Bishop shall not approve then the said union shall take effect immediately upon the next vacancy of his Benefice and the then Incumbent (if any) of the other of the said two Benefices shall become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

" 5. That upon the union taking effect the register books of baptisms, marriages and burials and other the records and muniments deposited in the Church of Saint Anthony, Stepney, shall be transferred to the Parish Church of the United Benefice but the marriage registers in duplicate current at the Church of Saint Anthony, Stepney, shall first be sent by the Incumbent of the United Benefice to the Registrar General to be closed officially.

" 6. That upon the union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Bethnal Green, Saint Simon Zelotes shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice.

" 7. That upon the union taking effect a Curate shall be employed to assist the Incumbent in the performance of the duties of the United Benefice and that a part of the endowment of the United Benefice, that is to say a sum of £250 per annum, being part of a stipend of £302 10s. 0d. per annum at present paid by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, to the Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice of Bethnal Green, Saint Simon Zelotes, shall be appropriated and paid by us to the Incumbent of the United Benefice conditionally upon the employment of such Curate as aforesaid.

" 8.—(a) That so soon as conveniently may be after the union has taken effect the Church of Saint Anthony, Stepney, shall be taken down and the materials and site thereof, together

with any ground annexed thereto and necessary for the use and enjoyment thereof shall be sold and disposed of by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient subject to the conditions and restrictions imposed by the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923.

(ii) The average of the mean prices for the two kinds of cheese has been ascertained for each of the said periods, exceptional quotations being disregarded. The average of the periodic averages so ascertained has then been calculated to two places of decimals and expressed in pence per pound.

(iii) From the figure thus obtained one penny three farthings has been subtracted and the balance gives the figure certified above.
