The following Address was presented to The King on Monday the 24th instant on the arrival of Their Majesties at St. Paul's Cathedral to attend the Empire Day Service in the Cathedral:—

To The KING's Most Excellent Majesty.

May it please Your Majesty:—

It has been a gracious privilege extended by Your Majesty's Royal Predecessors to the Children of the Religious, Royal and Ancient Foundation of Christ's Hospital to offer their humble and loyal greetings on the occasion of their Sovereign's visit to His capital City.

Immediately after the foundation of the Hospital in 1552 by King Edward the Sixth of Blessed Memory, the Children were permitted to address Queen Mary Tudor, and the custom has continued through the centuries.

We remember with gratitude that Your Majesty honoured our House last year by becoming our President and that Your Majesty expressed Your interest in our great Schools, which You hoped in due course to visit. We rejoice at the thought that Your Majesty has become our Patron, and that we also enjoy the Royal Favour by virtue of the Presidency of His Royal Highness the Duke of Gloucester.

That Your Majesty and Queen Elizabeth may have a long, happy, and prosperous Reign is the earnest prayer of the Sons and Daughters of this ancient House, who share the hope of all Your Majesty's subjects that peace and happiness, truth and justice, religion and piety, may be established among us for all generations.

The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that, at a Trial of the Pyx begun at Goldsmiths' Hall in the City of London on the 12th day of March and concluded on the 5th day of May, 1937, the following Verdict of the Pyx Jury was delivered to the King's Remembrancer, viz.:—

**TRIAL OF THE PYX OF THE LONDON MINT.**

**VERDICT.**

WE, whose names are hereunder written, having been sworn on the Twelfth day of March, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-seven, before the King's Remembrancer, at Goldsmiths' Hall in the City of London, have made the assays and trials of His Majesty's silver coins in the Pyx of the Royal Mint in London, which, according to accounts produced by the Officers of the Mint, were coined in the said Mint from the 1st day of January, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-six, to the 31st day of December, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-six, both days inclusive. We found that there were no gold coins in the said Pyx. We ascertained the number of coins in each packet produced to us, and that such number corresponded with the number which the Officers of the Mint represented it to contain, and we took one coin from each of such packets of silver coins with four additional coins from one of such packets making altogether one crown, thirty-eight half-crowns, forty-three florins, thirty-five shillings, sixty-one sixpences, one fourpence, thirteen threepences, two twopences and one penny. We then weighed each one pound troy weight (at its standard weight) of the coins so taken out and ascertained that the said coins so bulked were within the remedy as to weight prescribed by the Coinage Acts, 1870 to 1920. We then took for assay one pound troy (at its standard weight) of the coins so weighed comprising one crown, nine half-crowns, ten florins, nine shillings, sixteen sixpences, one fourpence, three threepences, two twopences and one penny, and we ascertained that the amount of variation from the standard weight allowed under the Coinage Acts, 1870 to 1920, was, for such pound so

taken for assay plus three thousandths (+ .003) of an ounce on the whole, and that, therefore, such pound troy of silver coins weighed and assayed as aforesaid was on the whole within the variation from standard weight so allowed. We then assayed separately the coins in the pound troy so taken for assay, comparing them with the standard Trial Plate made of pure silver (as prescribed by the Coinage Act, 1920) produced by the Board of Trade, so as to ascertain whether the metal of the said coins was on the whole within the remedy as to fineness prescribed by the Coinage Acts, 1870 to 1920, and we found that the amount of variation from the standard fineness so prescribed was plus thirty-four hundred-thousandths (+ .00034) on the whole of the coins in such pound, and that, therefore, the said pound troy of silver coins weighed and assayed as aforesaid was, on the whole, within the variation from fineness allowed under the Coinage Acts, 1870 to 1920. We weighed in bulk the residue of the coins remaining in the said packets of silver coins and we ascertained that they were on the whole within the remedy as to weight allowed under the Coinage Acts, 1870 to 1920, being three hundred and twenty-four thousandths of an ounce (- .324) below the standard weight prescribed by the said Acts.

REGULATIONS FOR THE APPOINTMENT BY COMPETITIVE SELECTION OF FISHERY OFFICERS (MALE) IN THE FISHERIES DEPARTMENT OF THE MINISTRY OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

*These Regulations are liable to alteration from time to time.*

1. Application for appointment shall be made in the first instance to the Secretary, Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries, at such time and in such manner as may be fixed by the Ministry. When a vacancy occurs, the Ministry will cause notice to be given by an advertisement in the Press, which will include a statement of the last day fixed for the receipt of applications.

2. A candidate must have attained the age of 25 and must not have attained the age of 40 on the last day fixed for the receipt of applications.

3. Every candidate must be a natural-born British subject, the son of a person who is or was at the time of death a British subject; provided that exception may be made:—

(a) In the case of candidates serving in a civil situation to which they were admitted with the certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners.

(b) In the case of natural-born British subjects who served in His Majesty's Armed Forces in the Great War between 4th August, 1914, and 11th November, 1918.

(c) In the case of natural-born British subjects who have satisfactorily completed a period of not less than five years' service on full pay in His Majesty's Regular Forces.

Provided also that if the Civil Service Commissioners are satisfied, in the case of any candidate who is a British subject but does not fulfil all the requirements of the rule as to nationality and descent, that the candidate is

*River Nene Catchment Area.*

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries hereby gives notice that the River Nene Catchment Board have made application under subsection (3) of Section 5 of the Land Drainage Act, 1930, that the statutory map of the Catchment Area be varied so far as relates to the extent of the "main river," by adding to the "main river" as shown on the said map the following watercourses:—

1. Part of the main outfall drain of the North Level Commissioners from its junction with the existing main river to a point approximately  $1\frac{3}{4}$  miles upstream.

2. A total length of approximately 5,460 yards of the Counter Drain and the New Wryde Drain (near Cross Guns) as follows:—

(a) A length of approximately 2,750 yards of the New Wryde Drain from the junction of this drain with the Counter Drain to the bridge crossing the Peterborough-Wisbech main road.

(b) A length of approximately 1,570 yards of the Counter Drain from its junction with the New Wryde Drain to a point in a westerly direction opposite Bassenhalby Moor Farm No. 1.

(c) A length of approximately 1,140 yards of the Counter Drain from its junction with the New Wryde Drain to a point in an easterly direction opposite Bank House Farm.

3. A total length of approximately 1,400 yards of the Counter Drain and the Thorney River, near Dog-in-a-Doublet, as follows:—

(a) A length of approximately 135 yards of the Thorney River measured in a northerly direction from its junction with the River Nene to a point immediately north of the point at which the Thorney River crosses the Counter Drain.

(b) A length of approximately 825 yards of the Counter Drain, measured in a westerly direction, from the point where the Thorney River crosses the Counter Drain to a point opposite Bank Farm.

(c) A length of approximately 440 yards of the Counter Drain, measured in an easterly direction, from the point where the Thorney River crosses the Counter Drain.
