The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by Section I of the Whaling Industry (Regulation) Act, 1934, (hereinafter referred to as "the Act"), it is enacted that if for the purpose of enabling effect to be given to any Convention relating to whales other than whalebone whales or baleen whales which is signed on behalf of His Majesty after the commencement of the Act it appears to His Majesty to be necessary so to do, His Majesty may by Order in Council direct that subject to such exceptions, adaptations or modifications (if any) as may be specified in the Order the provisions of the Act shall apply in relation to those other whales or to such descriptions thereof as may be so specified:

And whereas a Convention for the Regulation of Whaling was signed in London on the 8th day of June, 1937, some of the provisions of

which apply to Sperm Whales:

And whereas for the purpose of enabling effect to be given to the said Convention it appears to His Majesty to be necessary that the provisions of the Act should apply with modifications to Sperm Whales as defined in Section 2 of this Order:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to direct, and it is hereby directed, as follows:—

I. The provisions of the Act shall apply to Sperm Whales as defined in Section 2 of this Order: Provided that nothing in Section 3 of the Act shall be deemed to prohibit the killing or taking, or attempting to kill or to take, a Sperm Whale, which is neither an immature whale nor a female whale which is accompanied by a calf.

2. In this Order the expression Sperm Whales means whales known by the name of Sperm Whales, Spermacet Whales, Cachalot or Pot Whales

3. This Order may be cited as the Whaling Industry (Sperm Whales) Order, 1937.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 59th year of His late Majesty King George the Third, Chapter 134, of the Act of the 2nd and 3rd years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 49, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Representation as to the assignment of a District Chapelry to the consecrated Church of Saint James, situate at Clifton in the Parish of Rotherham, in the County of York and in the Diocese of Sheffield:

"Whereas it appears to us to be expedient that a District Chapelry should be assigned to the said Church of Saint James, situate at Clifton as aforesaid: "Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Leonard Hedley, Bishop of Sheffield (testified by his having signed and sealed this Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all that part of the said Parish of Rotherham which is described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be assigned as a District Chapelry to the said Church of Saint James, situate at Clifton as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The District Chapelry of Saint James, Clifton'.

"And with the like consent of the said Leonard Hedley, Bishop of Sheffield (testified as aforesaid), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, further represent, that it appears to us to be expedient that banns of matrimony should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials should be solemnized or performed at the said Church of Saint James, situate at Clifton as aforesaid, and that the fees or dues to be received in respect of the publication of banns and of the solemnization or performance of marriages, churchings and burials should be paid and belong to the minister of the same church for the time being: Provided always that so long as the Reverend Harold Dunbar Morgan, the present Vicar or Incumbent of the Vicarage of the said Parish of Rotherham, shall continue

to be such Vicar or Incumbent, all the fees or dues which may be received in respect of such publication, solemnization or performance at the said Church of Saint James, situate at Clifton as aforesaid, shall be paid over by the Minister thereof to the said Harold Dunbar Morgan.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for

ording in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Brampton Bryan situate partly in the County of Hereford and partly in the County of Radnor and the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Lingen situate in the said County of Hereford and both situate in the Diocese of Hereford:

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Lisle, Bishop of Hereford, pursuant to the provisions of the said Measures, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Brampton Bryan and Lingen duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Hereford and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of Hereford signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices which Scheme is based upon the terms recommended in the said Report, but with the assent of the said Bishop of Hereford embodies certain modifications thereof:

"And whereas the said Benefice of Brampton Bryan is now full the Reverend Leslie Noel Hodges being the present Incumbent thereof and the said Benefice of Lingen is at present vacant:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consents of the said Lisle, Bishop of Hereford, and Leslie Noel Hodges (testified by their respectively signing this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:-

" r. That the said Benefice of Brampton Bryan and the said Benefice of Lingen shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Brampton Bryan with Lingen' but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

"2. That upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect and the said Leslie Noel Hodges if he is then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Brampton Bryan shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

3. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Brampton Bryan shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice and so soon as conveniently may be the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Lingen and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall be sold and disposed of by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient and that the net proceeds of such sale shall constitute and form part of the Expenses Fund established pursuant to the said Measures.

4. That after the said union has taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, that in every series of three successive turns of presentation or nomination to be made to the United Benefice after the union the Patron of the said Benefice of Brampton Bryan shall have the first and the third turns and the Patron of the said Benefice of Lingen shall have the second turn.

"Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from making any other recommendations and proposals relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures.

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measures.

"Whereas the investments and property which are particularly described in the Schedule hereunder written are now held by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners as the Endowment Fund of the said Bishopric of Truro:

"And whereas no part of the said investments and property is specifically allotted to the provision or maintenance of an episcopal

residence for the Diocese of Truro:

"And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that the said investments and property should be transferred to us and that in exchange for such transfer we should pay out of the Common Fund created by the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, a fixed annual income for the said Bishopric as a re-endowment thereof:

"And whereas the Right Honourable Neville Chamberlain, First Lord of Your Majesty's Treasury, acting on behalf of Your Majesty, and the Right Reverend Joseph Wellington, Bishop of Truro, have respectively signified their consents to the exercise in relation to the said Bishopric of Truro of the power conferred upon us by Section 2 of the said Measure;

"And whereas the Truro Diocesan Board of Finance, the Cathedral Commissioners for England and the General Chapter of the Cathedral Church of Truro, being the consenting body as defined by Section 3 of the Cathedrals Measure, 1931, of the said Cathedral Church of Truro have respectively signified their approval of the submission of the said Scheme to Your Majesty in Council:

The method by which the cheese-milk price for the month as certified above has been computed is as follows:—

(i) The price quotations in respect of sales by wholesale of "New Zealand Finest White" cheese and of "Canadian Finest White" cheese published in the Official Market Report of the London Provision Exchange, Ltd., for each of the weekly periods ended at 11.30 a.m. on each of the Fridays in the preceding month have been examined.

(ii) For each of the said periods and for each description of "Canadian Finest White" cheese quoted in the Official Market Report

a mean price has been calculated by taking the mean value of the highest and lowest prices quoted, quotations described in the Report as being exceptional being disregarded.

(iii) An average price for "Canadian Finest White" cheese for each of the said periods has been calculated by taking the average of the aforesaid mean prices.

(iv) An average price for "New Zealand Finest White" cheese for each of the said periods has been ascertained in a similar fashion.

(v) A mean of the average prices for "Canadian Finest White" cheese and "New Zealand Finest White" cheese so ascertained has been calculated for each of the said periods. The average of such mean prices so ascertained has then been expressed in pence per pound, calculated to two places of decimals.

(vi) From the figure thus obtained one penny three farthings has been subtracted and the balance gives the figure certified above.
