WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 17th day of February, 1938, in the words and figures following, that is say:—

“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for constituting a separate District for spiritual purposes to be taken partly out of the Parish of Fernhurst and partly out of the Parish of Linchmere both in the County of Sussex and in the Diocese of Chichester:

“ Whereas we are satisfied that the said Parish of Fernhurst and the said Parish of Linchmere are Cures wherein or in parts whereof the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof and it has been made to appear to us that it

would promote the interests of religion that the particular portions of the said Parish of Fernhurst and of the said Parish of Linchmere which are hereinafter mentioned and described, should be constituted a separate District in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

“ And whereas there is not at present within the limits of the said proposed separate District any consecrated Church or Chapel in use for the purposes of Divine Worship:

“ And whereas by Instruments published in the London Gazette on the 29th day of October, 1935, and the 30th day of October, 1936, respectively, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, in consideration of benefactions of two capital sums of £500 each did, in pursuance of the Act of the 29th and 30th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 111, grant out of the Common Fund created by the firstly herein mentioned Act to the Incumbent of the Vicarage of the said Parish of Fernhurst yearly sums or stipends amounting to £32 10s., such yearly sums or stipends to be paid only upon the production of a certificate that an Assistant Curate had been employed to serve the Conventional District of Saint Paul, Camelsdale, and to continue payable so long only as might appear to us to be expedient:

“ And whereas it has been made to appear to us to be expedient that such yearly sums or stipends amounting to £32 10s. payable by us as aforesaid should cease to be so payable and that in lieu thereof we should grant a yearly sum of £32 10s. to the Minister of the said proposed separate District when duly licensed in accordance with the provisions of the secondly herein mentioned Act and to his successors:

" And whereas the said grant of the said yearly sum of £32 10s. will, after the publication in the London Gazette of an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme, be made and secured by an Instrument to be executed by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, under our Common Seal in accordance with the provisions of the said Act of the 29th and 30th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 111:

" And whereas the said benefactions of the said two capital sums of £500 each now held by us, are available for the further endowment of the said proposed separate District and we have agreed to pay to the Minister of the said proposed District, when duly licensed as hereinbefore mentioned, and to his successors Ministers or Incumbents of the said proposed District, a further yearly sum of £32 10s. by equal quarterly instalments on the 1st day of February, the 1st day of May, the 1st day of August and the 1st day of November in each and every year, so long as the said capital sums shall remain in our hands:

" And whereas by virtue of an Order of the Board of Charity Commissioners for England and Wales bearing date the 24th day of September, 1937, the Trustees of the Charity of the late Frank Pratt-Barlow at Camelsdale in the Parish of Fernhurst are authorised to transfer to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, a sum of £3,575 £4 per centum per annum Funding Stock 1960/90 as an augmentation of the endowment of the said proposed separate District when duly constituted:

" Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend George, Bishop of Chichester (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that all those portions of the said Parish of Fernhurst and of the said Parish of Linchmere, which are described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which portions together with the boundaries thereof are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, shall, upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme as aforesaid, become and be constituted a separate District for spiritual purposes and that the same shall be named 'The District of Saint Paul, Camelsdale.'

" And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

" THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

" The District of Saint Paul, Camelsdale, comprising:—

" All those contiguous portions of the Parish of Fernhurst and of the Parish of Linchmere, both in the County of Sussex and in the Diocese of Chichester, which taken together are bounded upon part of the east by the Parish of Lurgashall, in the said County and Diocese, upon the north partly by the Parish of Haslemere and partly by the New Parish of Saint Stephen, Shottermill, both in the County of Surrey and in the Diocese of Guildford, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon

the west, upon the south, and upon the remaining part of the east, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Stephen, Shottermill, from the said Parish of Linchmere at the point where the road leading from Shottermill to Springhead crosses the middle of the River Wey, and extending thence first south-westward and then southward along the middle of the said road for a distance of 11 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Camelsdale Road and the western arm of Marley Lane, and extending thence southward along the western arm of Marley Lane for a distance of 5½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Brinksway Lane and extending thence south-westward along the middle of Brinksway Lane for a distance of 41½ chains or thereabouts to the point where it is crossed by the boundary which divides the said Parish of Linchmere from the said Parish of Fernhurst, and extending thence first eastward and then in various directions along the last-mentioned boundary for a distance of 21½ chains or thereabouts to the point where it crosses the middle of Marley Lane, and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of Marley Lane for a distance of 1¼ chains or thereabouts to its junction with a roadway or footpath leading across Marley Common into the road from London to Chichester near Kingsley Green, and extending thence first south-eastward and then north-eastward along the middle of such roadway or footpath (thereby twice crossing the boundary which divides the said Parish of Fernhurst from the said Parish of Linchmere) for a distance of 1 mile or thereabouts to its junction with the said road from London to Chichester, and extending thence southward along the middle of the last-mentioned road for a distance of 22 chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the middle of the footpath and bridle road which leads to Shalford Hill, and extending thence first eastward to and then first southward and then eastward along the middle of the said footpath and bridle road for a distance of 37 chains or thereabouts to the point where it is crossed by the boundary which divides the Civil Parish of Fernhurst from the Civil Parish of North Ambersham, and extending thence north-westward along such civil parish boundary for a distance of 1 mile and 8 chains or thereabouts to the point where it crosses the road leading from Shottermill past the western side of Valewood Park, and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of the last-mentioned road for a distance of 47 chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the western end of the fence forming the boundary between North Side Copse and Vale Wood, and extending thence north-eastward to and along such fence for a distance of 14½ chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said Parish of Fernhurst from the said Parish of Lurgashall."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the secondly hereinbefore mentioned Act, been transmitted to the Patrons and to the Incumbents of the Cures out of which it is intended that the District recommended in such Scheme to be constituted shall be taken, and such Patrons and Incumbents have respectively signified their assent to such Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Chichester.

“ And whereas the said grant of the said yearly sum of £200 will, after the publication in the London Gazette of an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme, be made and secured by an Instrument to be executed by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, under our Common Seal in accordance with the provisions of the Act of the 29th and 30th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 111.

“ And whereas there has been contributed and paid to the credit of our account at the Bank of England a capital sum of £2,000 towards the cost of erecting a permanent Church within and for the said proposed separate District:

“ And whereas the said capital sum of £2,000 has been contributed and paid as aforesaid upon the understanding and condition that (such arrangement appearing to us to be expedient) the whole right of Patronage of the said proposed District, and, when such District shall have become a New Parish, then of the said New Parish, and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof should be assigned in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

“ And whereas the contributors of the said capital sum of £2,000 towards the cost of erecting such permanent Church have nominated to us the Archbishop of York for the time being as the person to whom they desire that the whole right of Patronage of the said proposed District or New Parish should be assigned:

“ Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Honourable and Most Reverend William, Archbishop of York (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that all those portions of the said New Parish of the Transfiguration, Newington, of the said Parish of Anlaby, and of the said New Parish of Saint Nicholas, Kingston-upon-Hull, which are described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which portions together with the boundaries thereof are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, shall, upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme as aforesaid, become and be constituted a separate District for spiritual purposes and that the same shall be named ‘ The District of Saint Martin, Hull ’.

“ And we further recommend and propose that the whole right of Patronage of the said District so recommended to be constituted and, when such District shall have become a New Parish as aforesaid, then of such New Parish and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof shall without any assurance in the law other than this Scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same and upon and from the day of the date of the publication of such Order in

the London Gazette as aforesaid, be assigned to and be absolutely vested in the said William, Archbishop of York, and his successors for ever.

“ And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

“ THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

“ The District of Saint Martin, Hull, comprising:—

“ (I) All that portion of the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of the Transfiguration, Newington, in the County of York and in the Diocese of York, which is bounded upon the north by the District of the Ascension, Derringham Bank, upon the west partly by the Parish of Anlaby and partly by the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of Saint Nicholas, Kingston-upon-Hull, upon the south partly by the last-mentioned New Parish and partly by the New Parish of Saint Mary and Saint Peter, Dairycoates, all in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining side, that is to say, upon the east, by an imaginary line commencing at the point opposite to the western end of Ringrose Street where the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Mary and Saint Peter, Dairycoates, from the said New Parish of the Transfiguration, Newington, crosses the middle of the Hessle Road and Cottingham Branch Line of the London and North Eastern Railway, and extending thence northward along the middle of the said line of railway for a distance of 56½ chains or thereabouts to the point where it crosses the middle of the road called Springbank West upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of the Transfiguration, Newington, from the said District of the Ascension, Derringham Bank.

“ (II) And also all that contiguous portion of the said New Parish of Saint Nicholas, Kingston-upon-Hull, which is bounded upon part of the east and upon the north-west by the above-described portion of the said New Parish of the Transfiguration, Newington, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the south-west, upon the south-east, and upon the remaining part of the east by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of the Transfiguration, Newington, from the said New Parish of St. Nicholas, Kingston-upon-Hull, at the junction of Boothferry Road with Askew Avenue, and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of Askew Avenue for a distance of 10 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Norton Grove, and extending thence first north-eastward and then eastward along the middle of Norton Grove for a distance of 25 chains or thereabouts to its junction with North Road, and extending thence northward along the middle of North Road for a distance of 1½ chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said New Parish of St. Nicholas, Kingston-upon-Hull, from the said New Parish of the Transfiguration, Newington.

“ (III) And also all that contiguous portion of the said Parish of Anlaby which is bounded upon the north by the said District of the

Ascension, Derringham Bank, upon the east by the above-described portion of the said New Parish of the Transfiguration, Newington, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the south and upon the west, by an imaginary line commencing at the point where the boundary which divides the said New Parish of the Transfiguration, Newington, from the said Parish of Anlaby diverges northward from following the middle of Anlaby Road, and extending thence westward along the middle of Anlaby Road for a distance of 6 chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the middle of the roadway leading along the backs of the houses and premises situate on the western side of Eastella Drive, and extending thence northward to and along the middle of such roadway and in a straight line in continuation thereof for a distance in all of 31 chains or thereabouts to a point in the middle of the road called Springbank West upon the boundary which divides the said Parish of Anlaby from the said District of the Ascension, Derringham Bank.”

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the secondly hereinbefore mentioned Act, been transmitted to the Patrons and to the Incumbents of the Cures out of which it is intended that the District recommended in such Scheme to be constituted shall be taken, and such Patrons and Incumbents have, with the exception hereinafter mentioned, respectively signified their assent to such Scheme:

And whereas one of the Patrons of the Vicarage of the said Parish of Anlaby has offered certain objections to the Scheme:

And whereas notwithstanding the said objections the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of York.

AMENDMENT OF STATUTE.

AMENDMENT of the College Statutes duly enacted at a Stated General Meeting holden on the 1st day of December 1937 and passed by the votes of not less than two-thirds of the number of persons present and voting, and ordered for sealing after the consent of the University has been given on the 25th day of January 1938 (*Oxford University Gazette*, No. 2201, Vol. LXVIII, page 38) and now submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council: Now therefore we the Principal and Fellows of the said College in virtue of all and every the powers enabling us contained in Statute XVIII in our Statutes and Section 7 of the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act 1923 do order and amend the Statutes of the College by the following addition and alteration:

STATUTE IX. 2

Clause 2 of Statute IX (Disposal of Revenue) of the Statutes of the College shall be deleted and there shall be substituted therefor the following clause:—

"2. (1) Income to which this clause applies may be applied in or towards the payment of any charges for University purposes imposed on the College by any Statute or Statutes made for the University from time to time under the powers of the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act 1877 and the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act 1923 to the extent to which any such charges are so imposed in respect of such income.

(2) This clause applies to income arising from any endowment, benefaction, or trust, and applicable to the maintenance of any fellowship, scholarship, or exhibition within the College, or to any other purpose for the benefit of the College or of the Principal or any other member of the College, including any fund for the purchase of advowsons, in every case where the endowment, benefaction, or trust

(a) was created by an instrument which came into operation not less than 60 years before the 1st day of December 1937, or

(b) is included among the endowments, benefactions or trusts specified in the Schedule appended to this clause, the trustees or governing bodies whereof have consented to the provisions of this clause."

6. HERRING INDUSTRY ACT, 1935.

The following Report has been made by the Herring Industry Board pursuant to Section 1 (6) of the Act as to the practicability of making provision for electing members of the Board by persons engaged in the herring industry.

1. Under the provision of the above subsection it is the duty of the Board as soon as may be after 15th March, 1937, to consider "whether it is practicable to make provision for the election by persons engaged in the Herring Industry of the members of the Board having special knowledge of the industry" and thereafter to report or submit a scheme as the case may be.

2. The Board have reconsidered this question on the basis of the legal opinion communicated to them that the words "whether it is practicable to make provision for the election by persons engaged in the herring industry of the members of the Board who are required to have special knowledge of the industry" should be interpreted as meaning whether it is possible

to devise workable machinery for the election of such members by persons engaged in the industry on a fair basis of representation of such persons and that the matter should be considered without regard to the probable suitability or otherwise of the persons likely to be elected for the performance of the statutory duties entrusted to the Board.

3. There would be no great difficulty in devising a workable scheme of election by the Board's licensees only and so following the practice of the various marketing Boards whereby the election of the members of those Boards is confined to registered persons, but it may be doubted whether such a scheme, which would vest the voting power in a comparatively small proportion of the persons engaged in the herring industry, can be regarded as an adequate compliance with the terms of the Statute.

4. If it is essential in order to comply with the terms of the Statute to extend the basis of election beyond the Board's licensees the difficulties in the way of devising a scheme which would give a fair and equitable basis of representation of persons engaged in the industry seem to be almost insuperable.

5. On the catching side of the industry alone certainly ten to twelve thousand, and possibly as much as fifteen thousand, persons find employment to a greater or lesser degree. These people are so employed for periods varying from one or two days to ten or eleven months of the year; their vessels range from small boats to steam drifters and steam trawlers, and the amounts they catch vary from a few stone to many tons per man.

The fishermen in all classes of vessels may be owners of ships and nets, persons remunerated by share of the catch or mere paid servants, and a great many of them are employed for longer periods in other industries, such as the mercantile marine, trawling for white fish, agriculture and public works, than in herring fishing. There are at least 160 ports and places of all sizes and importance where herring are landed.

6. It would clearly be inequitable to place all these persons in an equal position as regards voting strength and so give to a man whose property and livelihood depend entirely upon herring fishing no more voting strength than another to whom herring fishing is a mere casual side-line, but it seems impossible to find a fair basis of discrimination or, if one could be found, to apply it.

7. The Board know the names and owners of such vessels as are licensed by them, but otherwise have no knowledge or means of obtaining knowledge of the names of the other vessels used in herring catching, the periods for which they are so used, the identity and status of their crews or the amounts of their catches, and any attempt to obtain this information would be exceedingly costly and would probably involve the Board in a recurrent expenditure outside all proportion to their financial resources.

8. The matter is further complicated by the question whether a person who has for the time being left the herring industry and joined another trade can be regarded as being a person engaged in the herring industry and so qualified to vote. If the word "engaged" means engaged for the time being, probably three-quarters of the persons who catch herring

would be disqualified from voting in an election taking place in the first four months of the year.

9. In view of the above considerations, and on the assumption that election by licensees would not satisfy the requirements of the section, the Board are of opinion that it is not practicable to make provision for the election by persons engaged in the herring industry of the members of the Board who are required to be persons having special knowledge of the industry.
