“Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

“And whereas by Order in Council bearing date the 22nd day of January, 1920, sanction was given to the payment of Establishment Allowance of 10s. a day to Flag Officers and Commodores 1st Class, when in charge of an Establishment or Service and not in receipt of Table Money:

“And whereas we consider that this allowance should be extended to Flag Officers and Commodores 1st Class when appointed as Chief of Staff:

“And whereas we consider that Establishment Allowance of 10s. a day should also be paid to Commodores 2nd Class when appointed, in future, as Chief of Staff, instead of Command Money of 7s. a day and Entertaining Allowance of 5s. a day as at present authorised: .

“We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by your Order in Council to sanction such revised allowances.

“The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals.”

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

"Whereas the Right Reverend Douglas Henry, now Bishop of Chester, is desirous that a garage should be provided at the said Episcopal Residence and has submitted to us plans and the particulars of the garage and we have specified our general approval of the same:

"And whereas the said Bishop is also desirous and it appears to us to be expedient that towards the cost of providing the aforesaid garage a sum of £220 (being a sum which together with the outstanding balance of the sum already borrowed under the authority of the statutes hereinbefore mentioned for effecting improvements at the said Episcopal Residence does not exceed two years' income of the See) should be provided by way of advance from us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, to be repaid out of the emoluments of the Bishopric of Chester:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Douglas Henry, Bishop of Chester (testified by his having affixed his signature and Episcopal Seal to this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that the said Bishop be authorised to borrow and that we be authorised to advance and pay to him a sum of £220, and that the whole or any part or parts of the said sum of £220 so to be advanced shall be applied by us at such time or times, and in such manner as shall appear to us to be expedient towards effecting the said proposed improvement at the Episcopal Residence aforesaid, and that such sum of £220 shall be repaid with interest thereon in the manner following, that is to say, during the period of seven years from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme, the said Bishop or his successors shall at the end of each year pay to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, one-seventh part of the said principal sum of £220 and shall also at the end of each year pay interest at the rate of 4 per centum per annum on the said principal sum or on so much thereof as shall from time to time remain unpaid or alternatively it shall be permissible for us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, to provide for the repayment of the said sum of £220 and interest thereon or on outstanding balances as aforesaid by way of a yearly deduction during the said period of seven years from the annual sum payable by us to the said Bishop of Chester and his successors.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in conformity with the provisions of the herein named Acts or of either of them or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order

and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Chester.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Butterton, Saint Thomas, and the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Newcastle-under-Lyme, both of which Benefices are situate in the County of Stafford and in the Diocese of Lichfield:

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Edward Sydney, Bishop of Lichfield, pursuant to the provisions of the said Measures to inquire into and report upon, *inter alia*, the union of the said two Benefices of Butterton, Saint Thomas, and Newcastle-under-Lyme duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Lichfield and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of Lichfield signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices which Scheme is based upon the terms recommended in the said Report, but with the assent of the said Bishop of Lichfield, embodies certain modifications thereof:

"And whereas the said Benefice of Newcastle-under-Lyme is now full, the Reverend Cuthbert John Watkins being the present Incumbent thereof, and the said Benefice of Butterton, Saint Thomas, is at present vacant:

"And whereas the Governors of Queen Anne's Bounty now hold in trust for the said Benefice of Butterton, Saint Thomas, a sum of £2,934 14s. 6d. which sum, together with accrued interest thereon, represents the net proceeds of the sale of the Parsonage House formerly belonging to the said Benefice, and is hereinafter called 'the Parsonage House Fund':

"And whereas there is at present a charge of £130 per annum upon the revenues of the said Benefice of Butterton, Saint Thomas, in

respect of a pension payable to the Reverend James Heber George, a former Incumbent thereof:

" And whereas the patronage of the said Benefice of Butterton, Saint Thomas, now belongs to Captain Arthur William Milborne-Swinnerton-Pilkington, M.C., of Little Belvoir, Melton Mowbray in the County of Leicester:

" Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Edward Sydney, Bishop of Lichfield, and with the consent of the said Cuthbert John Watkins (testified by their signing this Scheme) do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

" 1. That the said Benefice of Butterton, Saint Thomas, and the said Benefice of Newcastle-under-Lyme shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Newcastle-under-Lyme with Butterton, Saint Thomas' and that such United Benefice shall be included in and form part of the Rural Deanery of Newcastle and that the Parishes of the said Benefices shall also be united into one Parish for ecclesiastical purposes and for such other purposes as in the said Measures provided.

" 2. That the Church of the Parish of Newcastle-under-Lyme shall be the Parish Church of the United Parish and that the Table of Fees for the said Parish of Newcastle-under-Lyme shall (until revised or altered by proper authority) be the Table of Fees for the United Parish.

" 3. That upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect and the said Cuthbert John Watkins, if he is then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Newcastle-under-Lyme, shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

" 4. That upon the union taking effect the marriage registers in duplicate current at the Church of Saint Thomas, Butterton, shall be sent by the Incumbent of the United Benefice to the Registrar General to be closed officially.

" 5. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Newcastle-under-Lyme shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice.

" 6. That upon the union taking effect provision shall be made by the Incumbent of the United Benefice for obtaining the services of a Curate or occasional clerical assistance and a portion of the endowment of the United Benefice, namely, the sum of £905 15s. 8d. Parliamentary grant £3 per cent. money, the sum of £1,753 17s. 2d. Royal Bounty Fund £3 per cent. money, the sum of £961 3s. 11d. Endowment Trust £3 per cent. money, the sum of 8s. 3d. Endowment Trust £4½ per cent. money and the sum of £3,045 5s. 6d. London Midland and Scottish Railway £4 per cent. Debenture Stock, all of which sums of money and Stock are at present held by the said Governors of Queen Anne's Bounty in trust for the said Benefice of Butterton, Saint Thomas, shall be appropriated by the said Governors as a fund to meet the expenses of providing for the services of a Curate or for occasional clerical assistance as aforesaid and the income in respect of such fund shall be

paid by the said Governors to the Diocesan Board of Finance of the Diocese as trustees to apply the same to the purpose aforesaid.

" 7. That (a) upon the said union taking effect a part, namely, the sum of £750, of the said Parsonage House Fund shall be transferred by the said Governors to and shall constitute and form part of the Expenses Fund established pursuant to the 32nd Section of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, and (b) with the consent of the said Arthur William Milborne-Swinnerton-Pilkington (testified by his signing this Scheme) upon the said union taking effect or upon the cessation if later of the pension now payable to the said James Heber George as aforesaid the balance of the said Parsonage House Fund shall be appropriated by the said Governors towards the cost of providing a house of residence for the Incumbent of a new District eventually to be formed out of the United Benefice; Provided that, pending the formation of such new District, the income arising in respect of such balance shall be paid by the said Governors to the Incumbent of the United Benefice.

" 8. That, with the consent of the said Arthur William Milborne-Swinnerton-Pilkington (testified as aforesaid) upon the day of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme the patronage of the said Benefice of Butterton, Saint Thomas, shall be surrendered in favour of the Patrons of the said Benefice of Newcastle-under-Lyme and upon the union taking effect the patronage of the United Benefice shall belong wholly to and shall be exercisable by the Patrons of the said Benefice of Newcastle-under-Lyme.

" Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from making any other recommendations and proposals relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the said Measures to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Measures:

And whereas the prescribed time has elapsed and no such objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Lichfield has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme

and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measures.

And His Majesty by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Lichfield.

That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Bishopstone shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice and so soon as conveniently may be the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Hinton Parva and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall be sold and disposed of by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient and that such proportion of the net proceeds of such sale as to us and the Bishop of the Diocese shall seem expedient shall be appropriated and held by us or be paid to the Diocesan Board of Finance of the Diocese as a Repair Fund for the said Church of Hinton Parva and the balance of such net proceeds shall constitute and form part of the Expenses

India £3½ per cent. Stock now held by us in trust for the said Benefice of Hinton Parva and (b) the following sums of stock now held by us in trust for the said Benefice of Bishopstone, that is to say, the sum of £2,000 Local Loans £3 per cent. Stock, the sum of £1,537 2s. 8d. £3½ per cent. Conversion Stock, the sum of £1,736 1s. 6d. £3 per cent. Redemption Stock and the sum of £38 17s. 9d. London County £3 per cent. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Horsley shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice and so soon as conveniently may be the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Byrness and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall be sold and disposed of by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient and that out of the net proceeds of such sale there shall first be appropriated such an amount as to us and to the Bishop of Newcastle shall appear expedient for improving the heating system at Byrness Church and the balance of such net proceeds shall constitute and form part of the Expenses Fund established pursuant to the 32nd Section of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923.

" 6. That upon the said union taking effect a part of the total endowments of the Benefices so constituted an United Benefice that is to say (a) the whole of the income arising from the sum of money appropriated or to be appropriated by Queen Anne's Bounty to the said Benefice of Byrness pursuant to the provisions of Part II paragraph 2 of the Third Schedule to the Tithe Act, 1936, and paragraph 1 of the Eighth Schedule to the same Act (b) two capital sums of money amounting to £239 11s. 6d. and £650 respectively at present held by Queen Anne's Bounty on behalf of the said Benefice of Byrness and (c) a sum of £755 Local Loans £3 per cent. Provided always that pending the formation of such two Districts the income in respect of the endowments hereby appropriated shall be paid by Queen Anne's Bounty and by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, respectively to the Diocesan Board of Finance of the Diocese as Trustees to apply the same towards the stipends of the Curates serving within the area or part of the area intended to be comprised within such Districts respectively.

(b) In any earthen grave now existing in the said Churchyard the burial may be allowed of the body of any member of the family of the person or persons heretofore buried in such grave, subject to the condition that no part of the coffin containing the body shall be at a depth less than three feet below the level of the surface of the ground adjoining the grave.

Now, therefore, His Majesty in Council is pleased hereby to give Notice of such Representation and to order that the same be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Privy Council on the 4th day of April next.

And His Majesty is further pleased to direct that this Order be forthwith published in the London Gazette, and that copies thereof be affixed on the doors of the Churches and Chapels of, or on some conspicuous places within, the Parish affected by such Representation one month before the said 4th day of April.
