TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 13th September, 1940, at 1 p.m., for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the National Loans Act, 1939 and 1940, to the amount of £65,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000, £10,000, £50,000 or £100,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 16th September, 1940, to Saturday, the 21st September, 1940, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 1.30 p.m. (Saturday 12 noon) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

9. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

The KING has been pleased to issue a Warrant under His Majesty's Royal Sign Manual to the following effect:—

GEORGE R.I.

GEORGE THE SIXTH, by the Grace of God, of Great Britain, Ireland and the British Dominions beyond the Seas King, Defender of the Faith, Emperor of India, to all to whom these Presents shall come,

Greeting!

Whereas His late Majesty King Edward the Seventh in consideration of the good services rendered by officers of the Constabulary Forces and by persons serving in Fire Brigades within His Dominions and in Territories under His Protection or Jurisdiction and the heroic acts of courage and instances of conspicuous devotion to duty of such persons, and being desirous of distinguishing such meritorious conduct by some mark of His Royal Favour did by Warrant under His Royal Sign Manual

dated the 7th July, 1909, institute a new Medal to be awarded for such services as aforesaid:

And whereas We are desirous of further amending the aforesaid Warrant which was amended by subsequent Warrants under the Royal Sign Manual bearing date respectively the 3rd October, 1916, the 1st October, 1930, the 12th December, 1933, the 25th May, 1936 and the 15th December, 1936, We are graciously pleased to make, ordain and establish the following Statutes for the governance of the said Decoration:

“ Firstly.—It is ordained that the Medal shall be designated and styled ‘ The King's Police and Fire Services Medal.’

Secondly.—It is ordained that the King's Police and Fire Services Medal shall consist of a circular Medal of Silver with the effigy of the Sovereign on the obverse, and shall bear on the reverse a design emblematic of Protection from danger and the words ‘ For Gallantry ’ or ‘ For Distinguished Service ’ as the case may be and on the rim the name of the person to whom the Medal has been awarded.

Thirdly.—It is ordained that the Medal shall only be awarded to those of Our Faithful Subjects and Others who have either performed acts of exceptional courage and skill or exhibited conspicuous devotion to duty as members of a recognized Police or Fire Service within Our United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland our Indian Empire Burma or any of Our Colonies or any territory under Our protection or jurisdiction not being administered by Us in Our Government in any other part of Our Dominions; or within any other part of Our Dominions Our Government whereof has signified its desire that the Medal should be awarded under the provisions of this Our Warrant to members of any such Service within such part, or within any territory under Our protection or jurisdiction being administered by Us in such Government; and that such award shall be made only on a recommendation to Us by Our Principal Secretary of State for the Home Department.

Fourthly.—It is ordained that the names of those upon whom We may be pleased to confer this Decoration shall be published in the London Gazette, and that a Register thereof shall be kept in the Office of Our Principal Secretary of State for the Home Department. Such Register shall show the name and rank of the person holding the Medal, the Police or Fire Service of which he is or was a member, and particulars of the action for which the Medal has been awarded.

Fifthly.—It is ordained that each Medal shall be suspended from the left breast, and the riband, of an inch and three-eighths in width, shall be dark blue with a narrow silver stripe on either side and a similar silver stripe in the middle; and in the case of awards for acts of exceptional courage each silver stripe of the riband shall contain a thin red line down the middle.

Sixthly.—It is ordained that any act of gallantry which is worthy of recognition by the award of the King's Police and Fire Services Medal, but is performed by one upon whom the Decoration has already been conferred, may, on a recommendation to Us by

Our Principal Secretary of State for the Home Department, be recorded by a Bar attached to the riband by which the Medal is suspended. For every such additional act an additional Bar may be added and for each Bar awarded a small silver rose shall be added to the riband when worn alone.

Seventhly.—It is ordained that it shall be competent for Us, Our Heirs and Successors by an Order under Our Sign Manual and on a recommendation to that effect by or through one of Our Principal Secretaries of State to cancel and annul the award to any person, of the above Decoration and that thereupon his name in the Register shall be erased. Provided that it shall be competent for Us, Our Heirs and Successors to restore any Decoration which may have been so forfeited when such recommendation has been withdrawn. And every person to whom the said Decoration is awarded shall, before receiving the same, enter into an agreement to return the Medal if his name shall be erased as aforesaid.

Eighthly.—It is ordained that Our Secretary of State for the Home Department may make regulations for the carrying into effect of this Our Royal Warrant."

All previous Warrants issued in this behalf are hereby revoked except in so far as they are already revoked.

ROYAL AIR FORCE.

The KING has been graciously pleased to approve the undermentioned awards in recognition of gallantry displayed in flying operations against the enemy:—

Awarded a Bar to the Distinguished Flying Cross.

Acting Squadron Leader Peter Wooldridge TOWNSEND, D.F.C. (33178).

In July, 1940, whilst leading a section of the squadron to protect a convoy, this officer intercepted about twenty or thirty enemy aircraft, destroying one and severely damaging two others. The enemy formation was forced to withdraw. Under his command, the squadron has destroyed eight enemy aircraft while protecting convoys against sporadic enemy attacks. In August, 1940, his squadron attacked some 250 enemy aircraft in the Thames Estuary. He himself shot down three enemy aircraft, the squadron as a whole destroying at least ten and damaging many others. The success which has been achieved has been due to Squadron Leader Townsend's unflagging zeal and leadership.

Acting Flight Lieutenant Stanley Dudley Pearce CONNORS, D.F.C. (40349), since killed in action.

This officer has led his flight in all its operations against the enemy with great skill and courage. In a week of almost continuous action he shot down at least four enemy aircraft bringing his total successes to twelve.

Acting Flight Lieutenant Alan Christopher DEERE, D.F.C. (40370).

Since the outbreak of war this officer has personally destroyed eleven and probably one other enemy aircraft and assisted in the destruction of two more. In addition to the skill and gallantry he has shown in leading his flight, and in many instances his

squadron, Flight Lieutenant Deere has displayed conspicuous bravery and determination in pressing home his attacks against superior numbers of enemy aircraft, often pursuing them across the Channel in order to shoot them down. As a leader he shows outstanding dash and determination.

Awarded the Distinguished Flying Cross.

Squadron Leader John Vincent Clarence BADGER (33046).

This officer assumed command of a squadron in July, 1940, and it is through his personal leadership that the squadron has achieved so many successes since the intensive air operations began. He has been instrumental in destroying six enemy aircraft. In spite of the fact that on three occasions he has returned with his aircraft very badly damaged through enemy cannon fire, he has immediately taken off in another aircraft to lead his squadron on patrol. Squadron Leader Badger has displayed great courage and resolution.

Squadron Leader Aeneas Ranald Donald MACDONELL (33120).

This officer has shot down nine enemy aircraft and damaged four others. He has been particularly successful as a leader and has displayed the highest courage, setting a splendid example to his squadron.

Squadron Leader John Marlow THOMPSON (34185).

This officer has commanded a squadron since January, 1940, and has operated over various areas in Northern France. He has taken part in nearly every patrol and, under his leadership, eighty-one enemy aircraft have been destroyed, twelve probably destroyed and at least forty-four damaged. He has, himself, shot down eight and damaged at least six enemy aircraft.

Flight Lieutenant Thomas Frederick Dalton MORGAN (37414).

This officer has shown great resolution as a fighter pilot and has led his flight, and at times his squadron, with conspicuous success. He has displayed great courage and determination in the face of heavy enemy odds, and has destroyed seven enemy aircraft. His behaviour in action has been an inspiration to the pilots in his flight.

Pilot Officer James Arthur WALKER (40768).

This officer has shown himself to be a keen and steady pilot and has displayed magnificent courage in the face of superior numbers of enemy aircraft. Since the middle of May he has shot down at least six enemy aircraft.

Pilot Officer Charles Anthony WOODS-SCAWEN (40770).

This officer has taken part in all engagements carried out by his squadron since the commencement of hostilities. He has destroyed a total of six enemy aircraft, and severely damaged several others. In June, 1940, Pilot Officer Woods-Scawen was shot down, landing some 25 miles within French territory, but succeeded in making his way back to his squadron. In spite of the fact that this pilot has been shot down six times, he has continued to fight with unabated

courage and enthusiasm, and has shown outstanding qualities as a resourceful and determined leader.

Awarded a Bar to the Distinguished Flying Medal.

563179 Sergeant Herbert James Lempriere HALLOWES, D.F.M.

Since the commencement of hostilities this airman has personally destroyed twenty-one enemy aircraft. He has set a fine example of bravery and resolute bearing on many occasions.

Awarded the Distinguished Flying Medal.

564573 Sergeant John Teasdale CRAIG.

Sergeant Craig has been in action with his squadron almost continuously since May, 1940. During this period he has personally destroyed at least eight enemy aircraft. His magnificent spirit has been of a high order, and he has ably upheld the fine work of his squadron.

580059 Sergeant William Lawrence DYMOND.

Since May, 1940, this airman pilot has accompanied his squadron on nearly all offensive patrols over France, and its engagements over this country. During this period he has shot down eight enemy aircraft, and probably destroyed a further three. Sergeant Dymond has displayed a fine fighting spirit.

563179 Sergeant Herbert James Lempriere HALLOWES.

In June, 1940, Sergeant Hallowes was attacking an enemy aircraft over Northern France, when he was himself attacked. His engine being disabled, he proceeded to glide back to friendly territory but was again attacked when about to abandon his aircraft by parachute. He dropped back into his seat and as the enemy aircraft passed he delivered such an effective burst of fire as to destroy his opponent. He then made a successful parachute landing.
