The KING has been graciously pleased to give orders for the following Appointment to the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire:—

To be an Additional Member of the Military Division of the said Most Excellent Order:—

Pilot Officer Charles Alfred Patten (82205), Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve.

One night in April, 1941, Pilot Officer Patten was the rear gunner of an aircraft which crashed and burst into flames during an operational mission. On extricating himself from his turret, he went to the front of the aircraft, where the front gunner was alive but trapped. Although this part of the aircraft was ablaze, and ammunition and flares were exploding, Pilot Officer Patten immediately endeavoured to rescue his trapped comrade. By almost superhuman efforts, and with the assistance of two members of the crew, he was able to wrench the turret from the aircraft and drag the front gunner to safety. By his promptness and courage, Pilot Officer Patten undoubtedly saved the life of this member of the crew.

The KING has been graciously pleased to approve the award of the George Medal to the undermentioned:—

Group Captain John Astley Gray, D.F.C.
Acting Squadron Leader Joseph Aidan MacCarthy, M.B., Ch.B., B.A.O. (23425).

One night in May, 1941, the pilot of an aircraft attempted to land with the undercarriage retracted. The aircraft crashed into the main bomb dump and then burst into

flames. Group Captain Gray and Squadron Leader MacCarthy immediately went to the scene of the accident. Although there was some delay in getting the fire tender to the spot, owing to wire entanglements at the bomb dump, Group Captain Gray and Squadron Leader MacCarthy entered the burning aircraft and between them succeeded in extricating two members of the crew who were trapped. By the time the first man had been extricated the fire had spread from the starboard tanks to the cabin and on to the port tanks. Ammunition, incendiaries and flares were burning in the wreckage, whilst numerous explosions erupted from the tanks. In spite of this, an attempt was made to rescue the pilot who was still trapped at the bottom of the fuselage. He was dragged clear but his harness still held him to the burning aircraft. Before he could be released another petrol tank burst and flames spread to such an extent that any further attempts to rescue him became impossible. Group Captain Gray and Squadron Leader MacCarthy were assisted by two other officers who both displayed great courage in their efforts. Group Captain Gray received severe burns on the head and his uniform was destroyed but he continued his efforts until overcome by the fumes. Squadron Leader MacCarthy suffered minor facial injuries caused by burns but, despite this and the strain to which he had been exposed, he would not retire to his quarters until he was satisfied that everything possible had been done for the comfort of the injured. Both Group Captain Gray and Squadron Leader MacCarthy displayed great bravery in the most appalling circumstances.

Acting Flight Lieutenant Harold Charles Morris (44773).

910986 Leading Aircraftman John Lewis Goldsmith.

One night in February, 1941, an aircraft, with instructor and pupil as occupants,

crashed on an aerodrome and immediately caught fire. Flight Lieutenant Morris, who was in an aircraft about to take off, taxied to the scene, whilst Leading Aircraftman Goldsmith, the aerodrome ambulance driver, immediately took his vehicle to within 50 yards of the crash. The fire tender was already there and foam was being sprayed at the base of the fire to subdue the flames sufficiently for the rescuers to approach the occupants who were still in the cockpit. The instructor was able to release himself but the pupil was pinned by his legs. Foam was sprayed on him and Flight Lieutenant Morris attempted to extricate him but without success. Leading Aircraftman Goldsmith succeeded in getting his head and arms into the cockpit and cutting away the pupil's harness straps but his legs remained trapped and, by this time, were being burned. The supply of foam suddenly ceased, whereupon Flight Lieutenant Morris and Leading Aircraftman Goldsmith, incurring the grave risk of the petrol tanks exploding, managed with some assistance, to lift the fuselage and to extricate the pupil. Throughout this incident Flight Lieutenant Morris and Leading Aircraftman Goldsmith displayed conspicuous gallantry and disregard of personal safety. Unfortunately the pupil succumbed to his injuries.

The KING has been graciously pleased to approve the following awards of the British Empire Medal (Military Division) to:—

535643 Sergeant Arthur Gwynne Francis.

In June, 1941, Sergeant Francis in company with another airman, observed an aircraft flying in from the sea with black smoke coming from the starboard engine. The aircraft crashed on the sand dunes about 100 yards away. Sergeant Francis ordered his companion to bring men and crash kit from a nearby unit and himself ran towards the aircraft. As he approached, the defective engine burst into flames and a dazed member of the crew, who was outside the aircraft, could give no information concerning the rest of the crew. Sergeant Francis looked in the door and the rear gun turret for possible survivors, afterwards climbing over the port mainplane on to the nose of the aircraft. Flames were entering the cockpit and he seized a fire extinguisher but could not put out the fire. He then jumped into the wrecked nose of the aircraft where he found an airman on the floor apparently dead and the pilot unconscious in his seat with his feet trapped. Sergeant Francis managed to extricate the pilot and lifted him out to others who had now arrived on the scene. The first airman then seemed to show signs of life and was dragged to a position where others could pull him from the aircraft with a salvage hook. Sergeant Francis then satisfied himself that no other person was in the wreckage before returning to a safe distance. In spite of an injured

hand, he continued to assist in salvage operations for some time. He displayed courage and resource of a high order throughout.

644978 Corporal William John Balls.

In May, 1941, this airman was a member of a party completing the loading of a tender with parts from a disabled aircraft at a Royal Air Force Station, when a parachute flare exploded inside the tender and burst into flames. Although fully aware that the lorry contained ammunition in addition to valuable equipment, Corporal Balls, in spite of the blaze and fumes from extinguishers which were being used, sprang into the lorry and commenced to throw out drums of ammunition. When forced back by fumes he jumped out of the tender and put on his respirator, and then succeeded in removing the ammunition from the tender. By his courageous act, this airman undoubtedly saved the vehicle and contents from becoming a total loss and it may well be that his promptitude prevented residents in houses in the immediate vicinity of the aerodrome from becoming casualties.

1018111 Aircraftman 1st Class David Idris Howells.

One night in May, 1941, an aircraft, in which were an instructor and pupil, turned over on the flare path and burst into flames. Aircraftman Howells, who was on duty with the fire piquet, with complete disregard for his own safety, immediately dashed into the flames and succeeded in extricating both the occupants of the aircraft. In doing so, Aircraftman Howells received severe burns to his hands. Nevertheless, by his promptness and gallant devotion to duty, he saved the lives of both the instructor and his pupil.

ROYAL AIR FORCE.

The KING has been graciously pleased to approve the following awards in recognition of gallantry displayed in flying operations against the enemy:—

Bar to the Distinguished Flying Cross.

Wing Commander John Woodburn GILLAN, D.F.C., A.F.C. (26010) (missing).

This officer has led the wing on nineteen occasions since July, 1941, and his fine leadership and cool courage have been an inspiration to his fellow pilots throughout all operations. On three recent escort missions Wing Commander Gillan has displayed especial skill and determination. He has destroyed one and damaged another enemy aircraft.

Acting Wing Commander Douglas Robert Stewart BADER, D.S.O., D.F.C. (26151).

This fearless pilot has recently added a further four enemy aircraft to his previous successes; in addition he has probably destroyed another four and damaged five hostile aircraft. By his fine leadership and high courage Wing Commander Bader has inspired the wing on every occasion.

Acting Squadron Leader Peter William Olber MOULD, D.F.C. (33414), No. 185 Squadron.

This officer has led the squadron on 62 daylight sorties since May, 1941; in addition, he has carried out 7 night sorties. Under his leadership the unit has destroyed eight, probably destroyed fourteen and damaged seven

hostile aircraft; Squadron Leader Mould has destroyed one and damaged two. By his magnificent example and courage, Squadron Leader Mould has contributed largely to the high standard of operational efficiency and morale of the squadron.

Acting Flight Lieutenant Brendan FINUCANE, D.F.C. (41276), No. 452 (R.A.A.F.) Squadron.

This officer has led his flight with great dash, determination and courage in the face of the enemy. Since July, 1941, he has destroyed three enemy aircraft and assisted in the destruction of a further two. Flight Lieutenant Finucane has been largely responsible for the fine fighting spirit of the unit.

Flying Officer Adrian WARBURTON, D.F.C. (41635), No. 69 Squadron.

This officer is a most determined and skilful pilot and has carried out 125 operational missions. Flying Officer Warburton has never failed to complete the missions he has undertaken and, in the actions fought, he has destroyed at least three hostile aircraft in combat and another three on the ground.

Distinguished Flying Cross.

Acting Flight Lieutenant William Pelham HOPKIN (42606), No. 602 Squadron.

Flight Lieutenant Hopkin has constantly been in action since July, 1940, and has at all times shown great keenness and determination to engage the enemy. During recent operations, he has proved a capable flight leader and has destroyed at least five enemy aircraft.

Acting Flight Lieutenant Eric RICHARDSON (45464), No. 258 Squadron.

This officer has been engaged in operations against the enemy for over a year and has destroyed two and damaged two hostile aircraft. He participated in evacuation patrols in France in June, 1940, and, later on, fought in the battle of Britain. Since February, 1941, Flight Lieutenant Richardson has taken part in eleven bomber escorts and four channel sweeps. He has displayed devotion to duty and has set an excellent example throughout.

Flying Officer Roger Rennels DREW (42819), No. 69 Squadron.

In July, 1941, this officer carried out an attack on the aerodrome at Zuara. Aircraft on the ground were machine gunned, one being destroyed and others damaged. Flying Officer Drew has also been responsible for the destruction of three Italian flying boats. He has completed 120 operational flights, including a number of reconnaissances, and, throughout he has displayed skill and enthusiasm.

Pilot Officer Jack BUCKLEY (89082), Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve, No. 105 Squadron.

In August, 1941, this officer attacked a 9,000-ton merchant ship off Lampedusa. Destroyers, torpedo boats and a large number of lighters were removing a cargo of motor transport at the time but Pilot Officer Buckley attacked through a curtain of fire and, although wounded during the run-in, scored hits setting the ship on fire. Subsequent reconnaissance revealed that a 700-ton sloop was also sunk as a result of the attack.

Pilot Officer Douglas Park Fox (61479), Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve, No. 149 Squadron.

One night in August, 1941, this officer was detailed to attack a target at Hanover. After flying through two electrical storms, his aircraft was hit by anti-aircraft fire but Pilot Officer Fox flew on. He was, however, unable to locate his target although he spent an hour in a determined effort to do so. Pilot Officer Fox, therefore, bombed an alternative target in the town of Minden from a height of 6,000 feet, afterwards flying over the town at roof top height using his machine guns. On the return journey, his aircraft was attacked by an enemy fighter and severely damaged. Pilot Officer Fox shook off the fighter but, later on, was attacked by another which was probably destroyed. Pilot Officer Fox flew his aircraft back to this country but, when some six miles from his base, the fuel was exhausted and he was forced to land hurriedly from a low height. As a result, the aircraft crashed and Pilot Officer Fox was trapped in the wreckage for two and a half hours. This officer displayed great determination and courage throughout. On a previous occasion, Pilot Officer Fox displayed similar fearlessness when attacking Hamburg.

Distinguished Flying Medal.

748525 Sergeant Arthur Charles LEIGH, Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve, No. 611 Squadron.

This airman pilot has displayed great skill and courage in operations, including fifty sweeps over enemy territory. Sergeant Leigh has destroyed two Messerschmitt 109's, probably destroyed another four and assisted in the destruction of a Dornier 17. His judgment and determination, especially in low flying attacks over Northern France, have set an excellent example.
