At the Court at Buckingham Palace, the 21st day of December, 1949.

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

Whereas the Church Commissioners for England have duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 3rd day of November, 1949, in words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Church Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 5th and 6th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter 108, and of the Act of the 21st and 22nd years of Her said late Majesty, chapter 57, which Acts are known as 'The Ecclesiastical Leasing Acts,' and of the Ecclesiastical Commissioners (Powers) Measure, 1936, and of the Coal Act, 1938, and of the Church Commissioners Measure, 1947, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for an appropriation to our General Fund of certain endowments of the benefice of Thurnscoe in the County of York and the Diocese of Sheffield:

"Whereas the annual value of the said benefice of Thurnscoe has been improved by means of certain leases of coal belonging to the benefice (which leases were effected under the authority of the said Ecclesiastical Leasing Acts) and of the compensation received by us the said Church Commissioners under the Coal Act, 1938, in respect of coal belonging to the benefice:

"And whereas the improvement in the annual value of the said benefice arising from the said leases and compensation monies exceeds the annual sum of £284 14s. 0d. and after the appropriation hereinafter recommended for the benefit of our General Fund the benefice will be left with an average annual income of not less than £650 0s. 0d.:

"And whereas among the endowments of the said benefice held by us subject to the provisions of the said Ecclesiastical Leasing Acts and the said Measures are included the sums of stock more particularly described in the 1st column of the Schedule hereto and producing the annual income of £284 14s. 0d. as set out in the 2nd column of the said Schedule:

"And whereas the benefice of Thurnscoe is now vacant:

"Now therefore we the said Church Commissioners humbly recommend and propose that as from the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme is published in the London Gazette the sums of stock set out in the 1st column of the Schedule hereto shall cease to be held by us for the benefit of the incumbent of the said benefice of Thurnscoe and shall be held by us for the benefit of our General Fund to be applied as in the said Act and Measures mentioned.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from making any other recommendations and proposals relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts and Measures or of any of them or of any other Act

of Parliament or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England.

"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, Chapter 77, of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, and of the Act of the 37th and 38th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 63, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme with respect to some of the rural deaneries within the archdeaconries of Liverpool and Warrington both in the diocese of Liverpool.

"Whereas it has been represented to us by the Right Reverend Clifford, Bishop of Liverpool, that the arrangements which are hereinafter recommended and proposed with respect to some of the rural deaneries within the said two archdeaconries are
