WHEREAS the Church Commissioners have duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 21st day of February, 1952, in the words and figures following, that is to say:

"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme which we have prepared with the consent of the Right Reverend John, Bishop of Derby (in witness whereof he has signed the Scheme), for effecting the union of the benefice of Dalbury with Long Lane and the benefice of Trusley both situate in the diocese of Derby.

" SCHEME.

"1. *Union of Benefices.* The benefice of Dalbury with Long Lane and the benefice of Trusley shall be permanently united together and form one benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Dalbury, Long Lane and Trusley', but the parishes of the said benefices shall continue in all respects distinct.

"2. *Taking effect of union.* Upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme is published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect and the Reverend Laurence Tuckley if he is then Incumbent of the said benefice of Dalbury with Long Lane shall with his consent (testified by his signature hereto), be the first incumbent of the united benefice.

"3. *Parsonage House.* Upon the union taking effect the parsonage house at present belonging to the benefice of Dalbury with Long Lane shall be the house of residence of the incumbent of the united benefice.

"4. *Patronage.* After the union has taken effect the right of presentation to the united benefice shall be exercised in a recurring series of three turns, the patron of the benefice of Trusley having the first turn, the patron of the benefice of Dalbury with Long Lane who is now entitled to make the next presentation thereto having the second turn and the other patron of Dalbury with Long Lane having the third turn."

And Whereas the provisions of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, and the Union of Benefices Rules, 1926 and 1930, and the Pastoral Re-organisation Measure, 1949, relating to the preparation and submission of this Scheme have been duly complied with:

And Whereas the said Scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that it shall be and become effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette.

"Whereas we are satisfied that it is desirable that the boundaries of the said parishes and of the said chapelry should be altered in the manner hereinafter mentioned:

"And whereas the Right Reverend William, Bishop of Salisbury, consents to the proposed arrangements (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme):

"Now therefore we, the said Church Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme the boundaries of the said parishes of Saint John with Saint Mary, Devizes, and Saint Peter, Devizes, and of the said chapelry of Saint James, Southbroom, shall be altered in the manner described in the Schedule and delineated on the map annexed to this Scheme.

" THE SCHEDULE.

"(a) The territory to be annexed to the parish of Saint Peter, Devizes:—

"All that part (coloured pink on the map annexed hereto) of the parish of Saint John with Saint Mary, Devizes, which is bounded upon the north-west by the parish of Potterne, upon the north by the parish of Saint Peter, Devizes, and upon the remaining sides by an imaginary line commencing at a point on the boundary which divides the parish of Saint John with Saint Mary, Devizes, from the parish of Saint Peter, Devizes, in the middle of Station Road and continuing thence southwards along the middle of Station Road for a distance of five chains and continuing thence southwards in a straight line to a point in the middle of the Devizes Branch Line of the British Railways (Western Region), and continuing thence westwards along the middle of the said railway line to the boundary which divides the parish of Saint John with Saint Mary, Devizes, from the parish of Potterne.

"(b) The territory to be annexed to the parish of Saint John with Saint Mary, Devizes:—

"(i) All that part (coloured green on the map annexed hereto) of the chapelry of Saint James, Southbroom, within the parish of

Bishop's Cannings, which is bounded upon the southwest by the parish of Saint John with Saint Mary, Devizes, upon the northwest by the parish of Saint Peter, Devizes, and upon the remaining sides by an imaginary line commencing at a point on the boundary which divides the parish of Saint Peter, Devizes, from the said chapelry of Saint James, Southbroom, in the middle of Wharf Bridge, which the middle of the Kennet and Avon Canal to a carries Couch Lane over the Kennet and Avon Canal, and continuing thence eastwards along point in the middle of London Road Bridge, which carries London Road over the Kennet and Avon Canal and continuing thence south-westwards along the middle of London Road to a point opposite to the eastern end of the wall or fence which divides the close numbered 20 on the map annexed hereto from the close numbered 21, and continuing thence westwards to and along the last mentioned wall or fence and continuing thence first south-westwards, then generally westwards along the walls or fences forming the southern boundary of close numbered 17 to their end first northwards to and then westwards along the middle of the track or footpath leading from close numbered 17 to Gains Lane to a point opposite its western end in the middle of Gains Lane and continuing thence southeastwards along the middle of Gains Lane to a point opposite the middle of the eastern end of Sidmouth Street and continuing thence westwards along the middle of Sidmouth Street to the boundary which divides the said chapelry of Saint James, Southbroom, from the parish of Saint John with Saint Mary, Devizes.

"(ii) All that further part (coloured brown on the map annexed hereto) of the said chapelry of Saint James, Southbroom, within the parish of Bishop's Cannings, which is bounded upon the southwest by the parish of Potterne, upon the northwest by the parish of Saint John with Saint Mary, Devizes and upon the remaining sides by an imaginary line commencing at a point on the boundary which divides the parish of Saint John with Saint Mary, Devizes, from the said chapelry of Saint James, Southbroom, in the middle of Hare and Hounds Street and continuing thence eastwards along the middle of Hare and Hounds Street to a point opposite its eastern end in the middle of Southbroom Place, and continuing thence generally south-westwards along the middle of Southbroom Place, Southgate and Potterne Road to a point opposite the middle of the northern end of Wick Lane and continuing thence generally southwards along the middle of Wick Lane and then of Drew's Pond Lane to their end opposite the southeastern corner of Drew's Pond and continuing thence south-westwards along the middle of the track or footpath which forms a continuation of Drew's Pond Lane to the boundary which divides the said chapelry of Saint James, Southbroom, from the parish of Potterne.

"(iii) All that part of the parish of Saint Peter, Devizes, which lies to south of the middle of Northgate Street and to the east of the middle of Station Road."

And whereas the provisions of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, relating to the preparation and submission of this Scheme, have been duly complied with:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Salisbury.

"Whereas we are satisfied that it is desirable that the boundaries of the said parishes should be altered in the manner hereinafter mentioned:

"And whereas the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Cyril, Archbishop of York, consents to the proposed arrangements (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme):

"Now, therefore, we, the said Church Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of publication in the *London Gazette* of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme the boundaries of the said parishes of Marske in Cleveland and Emmanuel, Saltburn by the Sea, shall be altered in the manner described in the Schedule and delineated on the map annexed to this Scheme.

"THE SCHEDULE.

"The territory, shown by the pink colour on the map, to be annexed to the parish of Emmanuel, Saltburn by the Sea:—

"All that part of the parish of Marske in Cleveland which is bounded on part of the west by the parish of Upleatham, on the south by the parish of Skelton, on the east and part of the north by the said parish of Emmanuel, Saltburn by the Sea, and on the remaining sides by an imaginary line commencing on the boundary which divides the said parish of Emmanuel, Saltburn by the Sea, from the said parish of Marske in Cleveland at a point in the middle of the bridge or culvert which carries the Saltburn and Whitby Branch line of the British Railways (North Eastern Region) over the brook or stream known as Pitt Hill Stell and extending thence westwards along the middle of the said brook or stream for a distance of 5½ chains or thereabouts to the western side of the track or path leading from Windy Hill to the Infectious Diseases Hospital and continuing thence southeastwards along the south-western side of the said track or path to the main road from Redcar to Saltburn by the Sea and continuing thence southeastwards in a straight line to the north-western corner of the eastern boundary of a detached part of the said parish of Upleatham and continuing thence along the last mentioned boundary to its southern end and then in the same direction to the boundary which divides the said parish of Upleatham from the said parish of Marske in Cleveland."

And whereas the provisions of the New Parishes Measure, 1943, relating to the preparation and submission of this Scheme, have been duly complied with:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949, of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, and of the Ecclesiastical Commissioners (Powers) Measure, 1938, now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme which we have prepared with the consent of the Right Reverend Launcelot, Bishop of Portsmouth (in witness whereof he has signed the Scheme), for effecting the union

of the benefice of Langrish and the benefice of Privett both situate in the Diocese of Portsmouth.

"SCHEME.

"1. *Union of Benefices.* The benefice of Langrish and the benefice of Privett shall be permanently united together and form one benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Langrish with Privett', but the parishes of the said benefice shall continue in all respects distinct.

"2. *Taking effect of union.* Upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme is published in the *London Gazette* the union shall forthwith take effect and the Reverend Edmund Mackay Ellis, if he is then incumbent of the said benefice of Langrish, shall with his consent (testified by his signature hereto), be the first incumbent of the united benefice.

"3. *Parsonage House.* Upon the union taking effect the parsonage house at present belonging to the benefice of Langrish shall be the house of residence of the incumbent of the united benefice.

"4. *Diversion of endowments.* (a) Upon the union taking effect a capital sum of £2,543 18s. 1d. being part of a larger sum at present held by us the Church Commissioners on behalf of the benefice of Privett shall be severed or diverted from the said benefice of Privett and from the united benefice and shall be annexed to and held by us on behalf of the benefice of Rowner in the said diocese of Portsmouth, and (b) upon the union taking effect, or upon the cessation of an annual charge of £20 in favour of the Church of England Pensions Board in trust for the Reverend Francis Peter Syonge to which the revenues of the said benefice of Privett are at present subject, whichever of the said events shall last occur, a part of the endowments of the united benefice, namely a capital sum sufficient to produce £24 per annum, being part of a larger capital sum at present held by us, the said Church Commissioners, on behalf of the said benefice of Privett shall be severed or diverted from the said benefice of Privett and from the united benefice and shall be transferred to and become vested in us to be held as part of and for the benefit of our General Fund and in consideration of the said transfer we shall make out of the said General Fund such periodical payments to the diocesan stipends fund of the diocese of Portsmouth as we from time to time determine to be equitable having regard to the value of the said endowments.

"5. *Patronage.* After the union has taken effect the right of presentation to the united benefice shall be exercised by the patrons of the two benefices alternately, the patron of the benefice of Langrish having the first presentation to the united benefice to be made after the union."

"SCHEME.

"1. *Union of Benefices.* The benefice of Acton Beauchamp with Evesbatch and the benefice of Stanford Bishop shall be permanently united together and form one benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Acton Beauchamp and Evesbatch with Stanford Bishop', but the parishes of the said benefices shall continue in all respects distinct.

"2. *Taking effect of union.* Upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme is published in the *London Gazette* the union shall forthwith take effect and the Reverend James Clifford Wills, if he is then incumbent of the said benefice of Acton Beauchamp with Evesbatch, shall with his consent (testified by his signature hereto), be the first incumbent of the united benefice.

"3. *Parsonage House.* Upon the union taking effect the parsonage house at present belonging to the benefice of Stanford Bishop shall be the house of residence of the incumbent of the united benefice and the parsonage house belonging to the benefice of Acton Beauchamp with Evesbatch, and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall, as soon as conveniently may be, be sold and disposed of by us, the said Church Commissioners, at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient, and the net proceeds of such sale shall be applied in the following manner:—

"(a) A capital sum not exceeding £500 shall be appropriated towards the cost of the improvement of the parsonage house of the united benefice in accordance with plans to be approved by us;

"(b) A further capital sum not exceeding £1,500 shall be appropriated for the provision of a new parsonage house for the benefice of Stoke Lacy in the said diocese of Hereford;

"(c) The remainder of the net proceeds of such sale shall constitute and form part of the Expenses Fund of the diocese of Hereford established pursuant to the said Measures.

"4. *Patronage.* After the union has taken effect the right of presentation to the united benefice shall be exercised by the patrons of the two benefices alternately, the patron of the benefice of Acton Beauchamp with Evesbatch having the first presentation to the united benefice to be made after the union."

"SCHEME

"Whereas the Bishop of the said diocese of Salisbury has forwarded to us, the said Church Commissioners, provisional proposals pursuant to the said Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949, recommending that the union of the benefices of Durweston and Bryanston should be dissolved, that the said benefice

of Durweston should be held in plurality with the benefice of Stourpaine and that the said benefice of Bryanston should be held in plurality with the benefice of Blandford, Saint Mary, all of which benefices are situate in the said diocese of Salisbury:

"And whereas effect can be given to the said proposals so far as they relate to the dissolution of the said union by Scheme prepared by us and confirmed by Order of Your Majesty in Council pursuant to the said Union of Benefices Measures and in so far as they relate to the said pluralities by subsequent orders made by the said Bishop pursuant to the said Pastoral Reorganisation Measure:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Church Commissioners, do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. The union of the benefice of Durweston and the benefice of Bryanston in the said united benefice of Durweston with Bryanston shall be dissolved and the said benefices of Durweston and Bryanston shall thereupon each become a separate benefice with cure of souls within the limits of its separate parish.

On 22nd December, 1951, a Meteor mark VII aircraft, WA 936, from Royal Air Force Station, Coltishall crashed and caught fire within the airfield boundary of R.A.F. Station, Horsham St.

Faith. The fire crew quickly attacked the flames, and soon it was possible to see that there were two occupants of the aircraft. The unconscious pilot was pulled out of the burning wreckage with little delay, but the navigator, who was fully conscious, was still trapped. Leading Aircraftman Dorey, a member of the fire crew who had already worked valiantly in the task of controlling the fire and rescuing the pilot, climbed on to the fuselage and, despite the obvious danger of imminent explosion and the extreme discomfort from the flames and smoke, held the navigator as far away from the flames as he could. This he did to the limit of his physical strength, thus enabling the Medical Officer more easily to administer to the injured man and finally effect his removal from the wreckage. Leading Aircraftman Dorey thereupon collapsed from the effects of the smoke and his almost superhuman exertion and fell into the wreckage, from which he had to be dragged by his comrades. His magnificent conduct was largely responsible for the navigator being rescued alive; unfortunately he died subsequently in hospital.
