WHEREAS the Church Commissioners have duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 12th day of February, 1953, in the words and figures following, that is to say:

"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1952, and the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949, now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme which we have prepared with the consent of the Right Reverend Richard, Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich (in witness whereof he has signed the Scheme), for effecting the union of the benefice of Playford with Culpho and the benefice of Tuddenham, Saint Martin, both situate in the diocese of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich.

" SCHEME.

" 1. *Union of Benefices.*—The benefice of Playford with Culpho and the benefice of Tuddenham, Saint Martin, shall be permanently united together and form one benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Playford with Culpho and Tuddenham Saint Martin', but the parishes of the said benefices shall continue in all respects distinct.

" 2. *Taking effect of union.*

" (a) If upon the date when any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme is published in the London Gazette the benefice of Tuddenham Saint Martin shall be vacant, the union shall forthwith take effect.

" (b) If upon that day the said benefice shall be full, the union shall take effect immediately upon the first vacation thereof, and the incumbent (if any) at the relevant date of the benefice of Playford with Culpho shall be the first incumbent of the united benefice.

" 3. *Parsonage House.*

" (a) Upon the union taking effect the parsonage house at present belonging to the benefice of Playford with Culpho shall be the house of residence for the incumbent of the united benefice, and

" (b) if the parsonage house now belonging to the benefice of Tuddenham Saint Martin shall not have been sold or disposed of under the Parsonages Measures, 1938 and 1947, before the taking effect of the union, or shall not at that date be in process of being disposed of under these Measures, it and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall be sold and disposed of by us, the said Church Commissioners, after the union has taken effect at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient, and the net proceeds of such sale or sales shall be appropriated and held by us for the augmentation of the endowment of the united benefice.

" 4. *Patronage.*—After the union has taken effect the right of presentation to the united benefice shall be exercised by the patrons of the two benefices

in a series of five turns, the patrons of the benefice of Tuddenham Saint Martin having the first, third, and fifth turns, the patron of the benefice of Playford with Culpho who made the last presentation to that benefice, having the second turn, and the other patron of the benefice of Playford with Culpho having the fourth turn."

And whereas the provisions of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1952, the Union of Benefices Rules, 1926 and 1930, and the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949, relating to the preparation and submission of this Scheme have been duly complied with:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that it shall be and become effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette.

"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949, and the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme which we have prepared with the consent of the Right Reverend Percy, Bishop of Norwich (in witness whereof he has signed the Scheme), for effecting the division of the benefice of Sheringham and the union of part thereof to the benefice of Weybourne, both of which benefices are situate in the diocese of Norwich.

" SCHEME.

" 1. *Union of part of the benefice of Sheringham to the benefice of Weybourne.*

" (a) Part, as hereinafter described in this clause of this Scheme, of the benefice of Sheringham shall be severed therefrom and the part so severed and the benefice of Weybourne shall become permanently united together and form one benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Weybourne with Upper Sheringham'.

" (b) All that part of the parish of Sheringham which lies outside the Urban District of Sheringham and is shown by the pink colour on the map annexed to this Scheme shall be assigned to the part of the benefice of Sheringham so severed and shall thereupon become and be a separate and distinct parish for ecclesiastical purposes under the style of 'The Parish of Upper Sheringham' and the parish church of All Saints, Sheringham, shall be the parish church thereof, and the parish of Upper Sheringham and the parish of the said benefice of Weybourne shall continue in all respects distinct.

" (c) A capital sum sufficient to produce an annual sum of £200, being part of a larger capital sum now held by us, the said Church Commissioners, on behalf of the benefice of Sheringham, shall be appropriated and annexed to the united benefice as an addition to the endowment thereof.

" (d) The right of presentation to the united benefice shall be exercised alternately by the Bishop of Norwich for the time being and the patron of the benefice of Weybourne, the patron of the benefice of Weybourne having the first turn of presentation after the union has taken effect.

" (e) The united benefice shall be in the archdeaconry of Lynn and in the rural deanery of Holt.

" 2. *The remainder of the benefice of Sheringham.*

" (a) The remainder of the benefice of Sheringham after the severance of part thereof hereinbefore recommended and proposed shall continue to be a separate benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The Benefice of Saint Peter, Sheringham'.

" (b) All that part of the parish of Sheringham not assigned to the benefice of Upper Sheringham shall belong to the benefice of Saint Peter, Sheringham, and the church of Saint Peter, Sheringham, shall be the parish church thereof.

"(c) The parsonage house at present belonging to the benefice of Sheringham shall be the parsonage house of the benefice of Saint Peter, Sheringham.

"(d) The fund held by us on behalf of the benefice of Sheringham at present producing an annual income of £197 10s. 8d. payable to the incumbent for the time being of the said benefice subject to the employment of an assistant curate within the parish of Sheringham shall be appropriated and annexed to the benefice of Saint Peter, Sheringham, as part of the endowment thereof freed from any trusts or conditions relative to the employment of an assistant curate, and all other the endowments and property of the benefice of Sheringham not appropriated and annexed to the united benefice of Weybourne with Upper Sheringham shall belong to the benefice of Saint Peter, Sheringham.

" 3. Taking effect of the scheme.

"All of the provisions hereinbefore recommended and proposed shall take effect upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme is published in the London Gazette and the Reverend Frederick Slaughter if he is then incumbent of the benefice of Sheringham shall with his consent (testified by his signature hereto), be the first incumbent of the benefice of Saint Peter, Sheringham."

" SCHEME.

"1. *Union of Benefices.*—The benefice of Seagrave and the benefice of Walton le Wolds shall be permanently united together and form one benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Seagrave and Walton le Wolds', but the parishes of the said benefices shall continue in all respects distinct.

"2. *Taking effect of union.*—Upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme is published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect and the Reverend Harry Cope, if he is then incumbent of the said benefice of Seagrave shall, with his consent (testified by his signature hereto), be the first incumbent of the united benefice.

"3. *Parsonage house.*—Upon the union taking effect the parsonage house at present belonging to the benefice of Seagrave shall be the house of residence of the incumbent of the united benefice and as soon as conveniently may be the parsonage house at present belonging to the said benefice of Walton le Wolds and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall be sold and disposed of by us, the said Church Commissioners, at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us

shall seem expedient, and the net proceeds of such sale or sales shall constitute and form part of the Expenses Fund of the diocese of Leicester established pursuant to the said Union of Benefices Measures.

"4. *Patronage.*—After the union has taken effect the right of presentation to the united benefice shall be exercised by the patrons of the two benefices alternately, the patron of the benefice of Walton le Wolds having the first presentation to the united benefice to be made after the union.

"5. *Diversion of Endowments.*—Upon the union taking effect (a) a part of the endowments of the united benefice namely a capital sum sufficient to produce an annual income of £94 now held by us for the benefit of the said benefice of Walton le Wolds and (b) one half of any moneys remaining in the hands of any sequestrators of the said benefice of Walton le Wolds at the close of the sequestration, shall be severed and diverted from the said benefice of Walton le Wolds and from the united benefice of Seagrave and Walton le Wolds and shall be transferred to and be held by us, the said Church Commissioners, as part of and for the benefit of our General Fund and in consideration of the said transfer we shall make out of the said General Fund such periodical payments to the diocesan stipends fund of the diocese of Leicester as we from time to time determine to be equitable having regard to the value of the said endowment and moneys.

"6. *Archdeaconry and Rural Deanery.*—The united benefice shall be in the archdeaconry of Leicester and in the rural deanery of Goscote II."

"SCHEME.

"1. *Union of Benefices.* The benefice of Staverton, the benefice of Helidon and the benefice of Catesby shall be permanently united together and form one benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Staverton with Helidon and Catesby' but the parishes of the said benefices shall continue in all respects distinct.

"2. *Taking effect of union.* Upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme is published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect and the Reverend Cuthbert Edward Guy Glascodine if he is then incumbent of the said benefice of Staverton shall, with his consent (testified by his signature hereto), be the first incumbent of the united benefice.

"3. *Parsonage House.*

"(a) Upon the union taking effect and pending the provision at Staverton of a house approved by us as suitable to be the house of residence for the incumbent of the united benefice, the parsonage house at present belonging to the benefice at Helidon shall be the house of residence of the incumbent of the united benefice.

"(b) Upon the provision at Staverton of a house as aforesaid the parsonage house at present belonging to the said benefice of Helidon and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall be sold and disposed of by us, the said Church Commis-

sioners, at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient.

"(c) So much of the net proceeds of such sale or sales as we, after consulting with the Bishop for the time being of the diocese, shall deem necessary shall be applied by us towards the cost of providing or acquiring at Staverton a house as aforesaid and any balance of the said net proceeds shall constitute and form part of the Expenses Fund of the diocese of Peterborough established pursuant to the 32nd Section of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923.

"SCHEME

MARKING OF IMPORTED JUTE AND COTTON CLOTH.

From March 12, 1953, some changes are made in the Merchandise Marks Order affecting the marking of imported jute cloth and imported grey cotton cloth.

The changes are:

1. Imported woven piece goods wholly or mainly of jute are no longer required to bear an indication of origin either upon importation or upon sale or exposure for sale; and

2. In the case of imported woven piece goods wholly or partly of cotton in the loom state there are extensions in the permitted methods of marking. The indication of origin may now be applied in any of the following ways:—

Woven into or stamped or printed either—

(a) at intervals of 2 yards on the selvedge, or

(b) at one end of the piece and on the material, or

(c) on a label securely attached to one end of the roll or piece:—

Provided that any marking in accordance with (b) or (c) above shall be such that the indication of origin can readily be seen from an inspection of the roll or piece without unrolling or, as the case may be, unfolding more than 2 yards of the roll or piece.

The modification regarding cotton piece goods referred to in (2) applies only to goods in the loom state. The existing provisions covering imported cotton piece goods other than in the loom state remains unchanged. These provide that the indication of origin should be woven into or stamped or printed either

(a) every two yards on the selvedge; or

(b) on labels securely attached to each end of the roll.

These changes are effected by a Direction made by the Board of Trade under Section 3 (1) of the Merchandise Marks Act, 1926, modifying the Merchandise Marks (Imported Goods) No. 10 Order, 1934. The Direction is entitled the Merchandise Marks (Imported Goods) No. 10 Order, (Provisional Exemption) Direction, 1953, and can be obtained from H.M. Stationery Office, price 2d. net.

The direction affords temporary relief and the question whether this relief should be continued by an amendment of the Order in question is being referred to the Standing Committee appointed under Section 4 of the Act.

REGULATIONS FOR THE RECRUITMENT OF TECHNICAL CLERKS IN HER MAJESTY'S STATIONERY OFFICE.

1. Candidates must be at least 22 and under 28 years of age on 1st March, 1953. But

(a) a candidate who has served or is serving on a regular (including a regular short-service) engagement in H.M. Forces may deduct the period of such service from his actual age;

(b) a candidate who has served in H.M. Forces otherwise than on a regular or short-service engagement may deduct the period of such service from his actual age, up to a maximum of two years;

(c) candidates who have served in any established post to which they were admitted with the Certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners, or who have served on established conditions except for sick leave and pension in a post to which such a Certificate would normally apply, may deduct from their actual age any time not exceeding two years which they may have spent in such service before 1st March, 1953.

2. (i) Both men and women may compete under these Regulations.

(ii) Married women who have formerly been established civil servants and have drawn marriage gratuity (other than those who resigned compulsorily on marriage and whose resignation took effect before 15th October, 1946, or who are widows or divorced or who are separated from their husbands, or whose husbands suffer without hope of recovery from total physical or mental incapacity) will not be eligible unless they undertake to refund on appointment the marriage gratuity paid. Provided that this undertaking will not be required if the break between the first period of service (including any period of unestablished service immediately following the period in respect of which the gratuity was paid) and the date of re-establishment is more than seven years.

3. Candidates must be British subjects. They must also satisfy one of the following conditions:—

(a) If natural-born British subjects, they must either

(i) have at least one parent who is, or was at death, a British subject; or

(ii) have resided in Her Majesty's dominions and/or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of their appointment.

(b) If naturalised British subjects, they must have resided in Her Majesty's dominions and/or been employed elsewhere in the service of the Crown for at least five years out of the last eight years preceding the date of their appointment.

(c) If not qualified under (a) or (b) of this paragraph, they must satisfy the Commissioners that they are so closely connected with Her Majesty's dominions either by ancestry, upbringing or residence, or by reason of national service, that an exception may properly be made in their favour.

4. Candidates must have served an apprenticeship of at least five years to the Letterpress, Lithographic, or Bookbinding Trade, or have had practical training for the same period in the production of Printing or Binding; and they must have been recently and for a sufficient time in continuous employment in the trade. A candidate's training and experience must accord with the branch for which he (or she) is competing. Successful candidates, before the issue

of their certificates of qualification, will be required to provide proof, in the form of indentures or certificates of service, of their eligibility under this Regulation. If it is then found that they do not satisfy the requirements they cannot be appointed; the decision of the Commissioners will be final.

5. After the last day for application has been reached, all applications will be scrutinised and a list of such candidates as appear from their application forms to be suitable for the duties of the posts in question will be settled by agreement between the Civil Service Commissioners and the Controller of Her Majesty's Stationery Office.

6. Candidates who are accepted will be admitted to a competitive examination in the following subjects:—

1. English Composition (including handwriting and orthography).
2. Arithmetic.
3. *Either* Technical Knowledge (Printing), *or* Technical Knowledge (Bookbinding).

Candidates must pass to the satisfaction of the Civil Service Commissioners in technical knowledge and in the examination as a whole. Of those candidates who obtain the highest total marks in the written examination, a certain number (to be determined by the Civil Service Commissioners) will be admitted to the second part of the competition, which will be held in London only. This will consist of an informal oral test of the candidate's technical knowledge of the subject in which he is competing, followed by an interview for the assessment of personal qualities before a board on which the Commissioners and Her Majesty's Stationery Office will be represented. The oral test and the interview for each candidate will normally be on the same day, and may, at the discretion of the Commissioners, be combined into a single interview at which technical knowledge and personal qualities will be assessed simultaneously. The Interview Board will award marks which will take into account both the candidate's personal qualities and his technical knowledge as shown at the interview.
