WHEREAS the Church Commissioners have duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 12th day of February, 1953, in the words and figures following, that is to say:

"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1952, and the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949, now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme which we have prepared with the consent of the Right Reverend Richard, Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich (in witness whereof he has signed the Scheme), for effecting the union of the benefice of Playford with Culpho and the benefice of Tuddenham, Saint Martin, both situate in the diocese of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich.

" SCHEME.

" 1. *Union of Benefices.*—The benefice of Playford with Culpho and the benefice of Tuddenham, Saint Martin, shall be permanently united together and form one benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Playford with Culpho and Tuddenham Saint Martin', but the parishes of the said benefices shall continue in all respects distinct.

" 2. *Taking effect of union.*

" (a) If upon the date when any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme is published in the London Gazette the benefice of Tuddenham Saint Martin shall be vacant, the union shall forthwith take effect.

" (b) If upon that day the said benefice shall be full, the union shall take effect immediately upon the first vacation thereof, and the incumbent (if any) at the relevant date of the benefice of Playford with Culpho shall be the first incumbent of the united benefice.

" 3. *Parsonage House.*

" (a) Upon the union taking effect the parsonage house at present belonging to the benefice of Playford with Culpho shall be the house of residence for the incumbent of the united benefice, and

" (b) if the parsonage house now belonging to the benefice of Tuddenham Saint Martin shall not have been sold or disposed of under the Parsonages Measures, 1938 and 1947, before the taking effect of the union, or shall not at that date be in process of being disposed of under these Measures, it and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall be sold and disposed of by us, the said Church Commissioners, after the union has taken effect at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient, and the net proceeds of such sale or sales shall be appropriated and held by us for the augmentation of the endowment of the united benefice.

" 4. *Patronage.*—After the union has taken effect the right of presentation to the united benefice shall be exercised by the patrons of the two benefices

in a series of five turns, the patrons of the benefice of Tuddenham Saint Martin having the first, third, and fifth turns, the patron of the benefice of Playford with Culpho who made the last presentation to that benefice, having the second turn, and the other patron of the benefice of Playford with Culpho having the fourth turn."

And whereas the provisions of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1952, the Union of Benefices Rules, 1926 and 1930, and the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949, relating to the preparation and submission of this Scheme have been duly complied with:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that it shall be and become effectual in law immediately upon the publication of this Order in the London Gazette.

WHEREAS the Church Commissioners have duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 8th day of January, 1953, in the words and figures following, that is to say:

"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949, and the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme which we have prepared with the consent of the Right Reverend Percy, Bishop of Norwich (in witness whereof he has signed the Scheme), for effecting the division of the benefice of Sheringham and the union of part thereof to the benefice of Weybourne, both of which benefices are situate in the diocese of Norwich.

" SCHEME.

" 1. *Union of part of the benefice of Sheringham to the benefice of Weybourne.*

" (a) Part, as hereinafter described in this clause of this Scheme, of the benefice of Sheringham shall be severed therefrom and the part so severed and the benefice of Weybourne shall become permanently united together and form one benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Weybourne with Upper Sheringham'.

" (b) All that part of the parish of Sheringham which lies outside the Urban District of Sheringham and is shown by the pink colour on the map annexed to this Scheme shall be assigned to the part of the benefice of Sheringham so severed and shall thereupon become and be a separate and distinct parish for ecclesiastical purposes under the style of 'The Parish of Upper Sheringham' and the parish church of All Saints, Sheringham, shall be the parish church thereof, and the parish of Upper Sheringham and the parish of the said benefice of Weybourne shall continue in all respects distinct.

" (c) A capital sum sufficient to produce an annual sum of £200, being part of a larger capital sum now held by us, the said Church Commissioners, on behalf of the benefice of Sheringham, shall be appropriated and annexed to the united benefice as an addition to the endowment thereof.

" (d) The right of presentation to the united benefice shall be exercised alternately by the Bishop of Norwich for the time being and the patron of the benefice of Weybourne, the patron of the benefice of Weybourne having the first turn of presentation after the union has taken effect.

" (e) The united benefice shall be in the archdeaconry of Lynn and in the rural deanery of Holt.

" 2. *The remainder of the benefice of Sheringham.*

" (a) The remainder of the benefice of Sheringham after the severance of part thereof hereinbefore recommended and proposed shall continue to be a separate benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The Benefice of Saint Peter, Sheringham'.

" (b) All that part of the parish of Sheringham not assigned to the benefice of Upper Sheringham shall belong to the benefice of Saint Peter, Sheringham, and the church of Saint Peter, Sheringham, shall be the parish church thereof.
