"We, the Church Commissioners, acting in pursuance of the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949, the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1952, and the Diocesan Stipends Fund Measure, 1953, now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme which we have prepared with the consent of the Right Reverend Neville, Bishop of Coventry (in witness whereof he has signed the Scheme), for effecting the union of the benefice of Hampton Lucy and the benefice of Charlecote both situate in the diocese of Coventry.

"SCHEME.

"1. *Union of Benefices.* The benefice of Hampton Lucy and the benefice of Charlecote shall be permanently united together and form one benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Hampton Lucy with Charlecote', but the parishes of the said benefices shall continue in all respects distinct.

"2. *Taking effect of union.* Upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme is published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect and the Reverend Edward Reuben Wallace, if he is then incumbent of the said benefice of Hampton Lucy, shall with his consent (testified by his signature hereto), be the first incumbent of the united benefice.

"3. *Parsonage House.* Upon the union taking effect, the parsonage house at present belonging to the benefice of Charlecote shall be the house of residence of the incumbent of the united benefice, and the parsonage house at present belonging to the benefice of Hampton Lucy and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith, with the exception of approximately 2,800 square yards of land situated to the north and west of the stables, shall, as soon as conveniently may be, be sold and disposed of by us, at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient, and the net proceeds of such sale or sales shall constitute and form part of the Expenses Fund of the diocese of Coventry.

"4. *Diversion of endowment income.*

"(1) Upon the union taking effect a part of the endowment income (calculated in accordance with the schedule hereto) of the united benefice shall be diverted and shall be paid to and be held by us for the benefit of the diocesan stipends fund of the diocese of Coventry, and the amount of the part to be so diverted shall be

"(a) during the incumbency of the united benefice by the said Reverend Edward Reuben Wallace,—the surplus calculated by us for the twelve months to the 31st March in each year of the said endowment income over and above an annual sum of £1,022, and

"(b) after the vacation of the united benefice by the said Reverend Edward Reuben Wallace,—a fixed annual sum of £680.

"(2) The said endowment income and the said surplus and the said annual sums of £1,022 and £680 shall be deemed to accrue from day to day and shall when we deem that circumstances so require be apportionable accordingly.

"(3) Any moneys due to us from the incumbent of the united benefice, or, during any vacancy in the united benefice, from the sequestrators thereof, as the case may be (hereinafter called 'the incumbent or sequestrators') upon the calculation of the amount to be diverted shall be paid by the incumbent or sequestrators to us not later than the 30th June in

each year and shall be recoverable as a debt due to us.

"(4) For the purpose of ascertaining the amount of the said endowment income and of the amount to be diverted, we shall have power to require production by the incumbent or sequestrators of accounts and other documents in relation thereto, and the said accounts for the twelve months to 31st March in each year (or where applicable for a part of the year ending on that date) shall be rendered annually to us within six weeks of that date in such form as we shall prescribe; and in the event of failure by the incumbent or sequestrators to produce such accounts or documents we shall have all legal remedies for enforcing production thereof.

"SCHEDULE.

"For the purpose of this Scheme the endowment income of the united benefice shall without prejudice to the power of decision vested in us by virtue of section 18 of the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949, if any question shall arise, be computed in accordance with our Central Register of Benefice Income, that is to say, by including:—

- "(1) all gross secured income payable by us and any other person or body,
- "and (2) all gross income received from ground rents chief rents or other fixed charges, other glebe rents and any letting of the parsonage house or a formally divided portion thereof,
- "and by deducting therefrom:—
- "(1) the rates payable on the parsonage house if occupied by the incumbent,
- "(2) the rent and rates payable on any house occupied by the incumbent other than the parsonage house,
- "(3) the annual assessment charged upon the incumbent under the Ecclesiastical Dilapidations Measures, 1923 to 1951, in respect of the benefice,
- "(4) the rates payable on the glebe,
- "(5) the cost of collecting glebe rents,
- "(6) any tithe annuity, rentcharge or fee farm rent charged upon the glebe,
- "(7) any other outgoings in respect of the glebe,
- "(8) any charge upon the benefice income in favour of another benefice or any lay person,
- "(9) any payment to a curate or lay worker out of the benefice income,
- "(10) the annual payments in respect of capital and interest in respect of any mortgage of the benefice income,
- "(11) any pension paid to a retired incumbent out of the benefice income,
- "(12) any part of the benefice income diverted to the diocesan stipends fund pursuant to an Order under Section 12 of the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949."

And whereas the provisions of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1952, the Union of Benefices Rules, 1926 and 1930, and the Pastoral Reorganisation Measure, 1949, relating to the preparation and submission of this Scheme have been duly complied with:

"(2) The union shall take effect upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme is published in the London Gazette and the Reverend William Edward Robinson, if he is then incumbent of the said benefice of Nafferton, shall, with his consent (testified by his signature hereto), be the first incumbent of the united benefice.

"(3) After the union has taken effect the right of presentation to the united benefice shall be exercised alternately by the patron of the benefice of Nafferton and by the patrons (or their successors in title) who were patrons of the benefice of Wansford immediately prior to its union with the benefice of Skerne, the said patrons of the benefice of Wansford having the first presentation to the united benefice to be made after the union.

"(4) Upon the union taking effect the parsonage house at present belonging to the benefice of Nafferton shall be the house of residence of the incumbent of the united benefice.

"2. *Union of the Benefices of Hutton Cranswick and Skerne.*

Skerne immediately prior to its union with the benefice of Wansford.

"(4) Upon the union taking effect the parsonage house at present belonging to the benefice of Hutton Cranswick shall be the house of residence of the incumbent of the united benefice.

"3. *Distribution of Endowments.*

Upon the taking effect of the unions hereinbefore recommended and proposed, the endowments and property of the benefice of Wansford and Skerne shall be divided and distributed as follows, that is to say: an annual sum of £50 charged on our General Fund and a capital sum sufficient to produce an annual income of £110 (being part of a larger capital sum held by us for the said benefice) and the house which was the house of residence of the incumbent of the said benefice, together with the whole of the endowments and property of the benefice of Nafferton, shall be assigned and annexed to the united benefice of Nafferton with Wansford, and all other the endowments and property of the said benefice of Wansford and Skerne together with the whole of the endowments and property of the benefice of Hutton Cranswick shall be assigned and annexed to the united benefice of Hutton Cranswick with Skerne."

"Now, therefore, we, the said Church Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme the boundaries of the said parishes of Aylesbury, Holy Trinity, Walton, and Bierton with Hulcott shall be altered in the manner described in the Schedule and delineated on the map annexed to this Scheme.

"1. The territory to be annexed to the parish of Holy Trinity, Walton, comprising:—

"(a) All that part of the parish of Aylesbury (coloured green on the map annexed hereto) which lies to the south of an imaginary line commencing at a point on the boundary which divides the parish of Aylesbury from the parish of Hartwell in the middle of the Thame to Aylesbury Road and continuing thence northeastwards along the middle of the last mentioned road to a point opposite the middle of the northwestern end of Churchill Avenue and continuing thence first southeastwards to and along the middle of the last mentioned Avenue and in continuation thereof northeastwards along the middle of Prebendal Avenue to a point opposite the middle of the northwestern end of Paterson Road and continuing thence southeastwards to and along the middle of the last mentioned road to the boundary which divides the parish of Aylesbury from the parish of Holy Trinity, Walton.

"2. The territory to be annexed to the parish of Aylesbury comprising:—

"(a) All that part of the parish of Holy Trinity, Walton (coloured purple on the map annexed hereto) which lies to the northwest of an imaginary line commencing at a point on the boundary which divides the parish of Holy Trinity, Walton from the parish of Aylesbury in the middle of Paterson Road and continuing thence southeastwards along the middle of the last mentioned road to a point opposite the middle of the southwestern end of Hampden Road and continuing thence northeastwards to and along the middle of the last mentioned road (thereby crossing Prebendal Avenue) to its junction with Penn Road and continuing thence first northeastwards to and then northwestwards along the middle of the last mentioned road to the boundary which divides the parish of Holy Trinity, Walton from the parish of Aylesbury.

"(b) All that part of the parish of Holy Trinity, Walton (coloured brown on the map annexed hereto) which lies to the northwest of an imaginary line commencing on the boundary which divides the parish of Aylesbury from the parish of Holy Trinity, Walton in the middle of Walton Street and continuing thence southeastwards along the last mentioned Street to the point where it crosses the middle of Bear Brook and continuing thence generally southwestwards to and along the middle of the last mentioned brook to the boundary which divides the parish of Aylesbury from the parish of Holy Trinity, Walton

"(c) All that part of the parish of Holy Trinity, Walton (coloured pink on the map annexed hereto)

THE BURIAL GROUNDS (RADCLIFFE) (VARIATION) ORDER, 1955.

WHEREAS by the Burial Act, 1855 (18 & 19 Vict. c. 128), it was, amongst other things, enacted that it should be lawful for Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, from time to time to postpone the time appointed by any Order in Council for the discontinuance of burials, or otherwise to vary any Order in Council made under any of the Acts recited in the said Act, or under the said Act (whether the time thereby appointed for the discontinuance of burials thereunder, or other operation of such Order, should or should not have arrived), as to Her Majesty, with such advice as aforesaid, might seem fit:

And Whereas an Order in Council was made on the 31st day of May, 1923 (S.R. & O. 1923/655) (hereinafter referred to as "the Principal Order"), directing the discontinuance of burials in the Church and Churchyard of Saint Thomas, Radcliffe, in the County of Lancaster:

And Whereas it seems fit to Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, that the Principal Order in so far as it affects burials in the said Church and Churchyard of Saint Thomas, Radcliffe, should be varied:

1. Provisos (a) and (b) of the Principal Order are hereby revoked.
2. The burial shall be allowed after death, in such spaces as are already reserved, of the bodies of Margaret A. Wilkes, Minnie Street, and Ellen Simmonds.
3. The Interpretation Act, 1889 (52 & 53 Vict. c. 63), shall apply to the interpretation of this Order as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.
4. This Order may be cited as the Burial Grounds (Radcliffe) (Variation) Order, 1955.

An explosion occurred in H.M. Submarine SIDON in Portland Harbour on 16th June, 1955, which later caused the submarine to sink. Surgeon Lieutenant Rhodes was among the first to enter the SIDON after the explosion and, in spite of the total darkness and dense smoke, he brought out an injured man to safety. He then put on a Davis Submarine Escape Apparatus and re-entered the submarine with morphia to give further help to the injured. In doing so he greatly prejudiced his chance of escape. He was not a submarine officer and was not familiar with the use of the breathing apparatus or the lay-out inside a submarine. In spite of these handicaps and the pitch darkness his only thoughts were for those within the submarine; he had no hesitation in re-entering the SIDON and he succeeded in helping two more men to escape before the submarine sank. Surgeon Lieutenant Rhodes' gallant and selfless act in helping to save the lives of others cost him his own life.
