SCOTTISH OFFICE**DISEASES OF ANIMALS ACT 1950**

General Licence issued under Article 6(5) of the
Brucellosis (Scotland) Order 1979

in connection with the movement of cattle in Scotland
from certain areas in England

The Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers contained in article 6 (5) of the Brucellosis (Scotland) Order 1979, hereby authorises from 1st January 1980 the movement of cattle, other than cattle described in Schedule 1 to this licence, from any farm, dealers' or market premises situated in the area described in Schedule 2 to this licence to farm premises in Scotland which are occupied by, or associated with, a permanently established herd of cattle subject to and in accordance with the provisions and conditions of the said Order and also in accordance with the conditions set out in Schedule 3 to this licence.

SCHEDULE 1**Cattle excluded from licence**

1. Reactors:
2. Cattle from a herd in respect of which a notice has been received of a failure to pass a test for brucellosis.
3. Cattle from a herd which is suspected of being infected by brucellosis.
4. Cattle from a herd in which an abortion or premature calving has occurred which has not been reported to the appropriate veterinary authorities or which has been so reported but is still under investigation.
5. Cattle which are present in the area described in Schedule 2 to this licence in contravention of any order in relation to brucellosis made under the Diseases of Animals Act 1950.

SCHEDULE 2**Area from which cattle may be moved into Scotland under the licence****In England:**

1. The county of Cumbria.
2. In the county of Lancashire the Boroughs of Lancaster, Blackpool, Fylde, Preston and Wyre and so much of the Borough of Ribbles Valley as lies north and west of the River Ribble.
3. In the county of North Yorkshire so much of the District of Craven as lies west of the River Ribble.

SCHEDULE 3**Conditions**

1. Cattle being moved under the provisions of this licence shall not pass through any area which is not an attested area unless they are travelling by sea or air.
2. Cattle being moved under the provisions of this licence shall not have any contact with cattle with which they were not in contact before the journey commenced.

WAGES COUNCIL**WAGES COUNCIL ACT 1979****Shirtmaking Wages Council (Great Britain)**

The Shirtmaking Wages Council (Great Britain) hereby gives notice of proposals for:

- (1) varying the statutory minimum remuneration as set out in the Wages (Shirtmaking) (No. 2) Order 1979 (Order S (96));
- (2) amending the provisions relating to holidays and holiday remuneration as set out in the Wages (Shirtmaking) (Holidays) Order 1976 (Order S (88)); and
- (3) the revocation of Order S (96) and Order S (88).

The Wages Council intends that the revised provisions shall come into operation on 12th December 1979 in the case of the provisions relating to remuneration and as soon as practicable in the case of the provisions relating to holidays and holiday remuneration.

Particulars of the proposals are contained in the Wages Council's Notice S (97) copies of which may be obtained on application to the Secretary of the Wages Council at the address given below. The Wages Council will consider any written representation with respect to the proposals if made within 14 days from 4th January 1980. Any such representation should bear the writer's address and signature and be sent to the Secretary, Shirtmaking Wages Council (Great Britain), 12 St. James's Square, London SW1Y 4LL. It is desirable that persons making objections should state the precise nature of their objections and quote the number of the Wages Council's Notice of Proposals S (97).
